# GRANT CONTRACT BETWEEN <br> THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AND TRAVIS COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE 

OAG Contract No. 1019520

This grant contract is executed between the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) and Travis County District Attorney's Office (GRANTEE) for certain grant funds. The Office of the Attorney General and Travis County District Attorney's Office may be referred to in this contract individually as "Party" or collectively as "Parties."

## Section 1. Purpose of the Contract - PSN Western District

The Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN) is a nationwide commitment to reducing gun crime, links existing local programs together and provides them with necessary tools. PSN takes a hard line against gun criminals, using every available means to create safer neighborhoods; seeks to achieve heightened coordination among federal, state, and local law enforcement; and emphasizes tactical intelligence gathering, more aggressive prosecutions, and enhanced accountability through performance measures. The United States Attorney in each federal judicial district will lead the offensive. The fiscal agent, in coordination with the PSN Task Force, will allocate funds throughout the community.

The Texas Office of the Attorney General, serving as the fiscal agent for the Western District of Texas, will use the grant to continue strategies aimed at preventing and prosecuting violent gun and gang-related crimes. Key elements involve the funding of prosecutors to evaluate, file, and prosecute gang-related crimes in both state and federal court; mentors who will serve as role models to actively educate and support the pro-social behaviors of at-risk youth; and sheriff's deputies tasked with identifying and documenting gang members and enforcing laws will be funded. The U.S. Attorney's Office, along with the PSN task force and subgrantees, will coordinate the planning and implementation of the grant funded initiatives. The purpose of this contract is to provide reasonable contractual controls to ensure that the public purposes of the grant are achieved.

## Section 2 Term of the Contract

This contract shall begin on December 1, 2009 and shall terminate December 31, 2010, unless it is terminated earlier or extended in accordance with another provision of this contract. The OAG is not obligated to reimburse expenses that were incurred prior to the commencement or after the termination of this contract.

## SEction 3 GRANTEE's CONTRACTUAL SERVICES

3.1 GRANTEE's Compliance with the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance for Award Number 2009-GP-BX-0066. The GRANTEE will comply with the terms and conditions as set forth and required in the Cooperative Agreement between the OAG and the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Juvenile Assistance, Award Number 2009-GP-BX-0066, (OAG Award Document), as well as the applicable provisions of the OAG Grant Application or OAG Award Document as supplemented, amended or adjusted.

### 3.2 Establishment of Final Project Budget; Grant Project Narrative; Special Conditions. The GRANTEE's budget is attached as Exhibit A.

The grant project narrative is as follows:
These grant funds will fund a prosecutor to evaluate, file and prosecute gangrelated crimes in both state and federal court.

The Special Conditions, including the OAG Award Document, are attached as Exhibit B.
The OAG, at its sole discretion, will establish the final project targets, outputs, and outcomes. In addition, the OAG, at its sole discretion, may adjust GRANTEE's budget, targets, outputs, and outcomes and/or any other items as deemed appropriate by the OAG, at any time, during the term of this contract. The OAG, at its sole discretion, may supplement, amend or adjust the Special Conditions attached to this contract.

## Section 4 Required Reports

### 4.1 General Matters

4.1.1 Required Reports; Form of Reports; Filings with the OAG. GRANTEE shall forward to the OAG, the applicable reports on forms as specified by the OAG. GRANTEE shall establish written procedures to ensure that it files each document or form required by the OAG in an accurate and timely manner. Unless filing dates are given herein, all other reports and other documents that GRANTEE is required to forward to the OAG shall be promptly forwarded. From time to time, the OAG may require additional information from GRANTEE.

[^0]4.1.2 Cooperation; Additional Information; Immediate Notification and Correction and Inaccuracies. GRANTEE shall cooperate fully with the OAG. In addition to the information contained in the required reports, other information may be required as requested by the OAG. GRANTTEE will immediately notify the OAG in the event GRANTEE discovers that any previously submitted information was inaccurate and forward the correction information to the OAG.

### 4.1.3 Notification of Changes in Organization, Changes in Authorized Official or Grant

 Contact. GRANTEE shall submit within ten (10) business days notice to the OAG of any change of the following: GRANTEE's name'; contact information; key personnel, officer, director or partner; organizational structure; legal standing; or authority to do business in Texas. GRANTEE shall promptly notify the OAG, preferably in advance, of a change in address or main telephone number of GRANTEE. A change in GRANTEE's name requires an amendment to the contract.GRANTEE must submit a written request by the governing body on GRANTEE's letterhead, with original signature, to change an Authorized Official. GRANTEE, by an email, fax or GRANTEE letterhead signed by the Authorized Official, may request a change to the Grant Contact.
4.1.4 Standards for Financial and Programmatic Management. GRANTEE and its governing body shall bear full and sole responsibility for the integrity of the fiscal and programmatic management of the organization.

Such fiscal and programmatic management shall include accountability for all funds and materials received from the OAG; compliance with OAG rules, policies and procedures, and applicable federal and state laws and regulations; and correction of fiscal and program deficiencies identified through self-evaluation and/or the OAG's monitoring processes. Ignorance of any contract provisions or other requirements referenced in this contract shall not constitute a defense or basis for waiving or failing to comply with such provisions or requirements.

GRANTEE shall develop, implement, and maintain financial management and control systems that include appropriate financial planning, including the development of budgets that adequately reflect all functions and resources necessary to carry out authorized activities and the adequate determination of costs; financial management systems, including accurate and complete payroll, accounting, and financial reporting records; cost source documentation; effective internal and budgetary controls; determination of reasonableness, allocation of costs; and timely and appropriate audits and resolution of any findings; and annual financial statements, including statements of financial position, activities, and cash flows, prepared on an accounting basis that complies with State financial laws and State constitution and follows OMBA-87 and Uniform Grant Management Standards, (UGMS).
4.1.5. Security and Confidentiality of Records. GRANTEE shall establish a method to secure the confidentiality of records and other information relating to services provided in accordance with applicable federal and state law, rules and regulations. This provision shall not be construed as limiting the OAG's access to such records and other information.

### 4.2.1 Programmatic Reports

GRANTEE will support the OAG in its progress reporting requirements, including the reporting requirements of outcome measures. The OAG will establish deadlines for the GRANTEE to meet its requirement to report to the OAG. GRANTEE shall report data to the OAG on the following outcome measures:
a. Number of homicides with a firearm experienced during the current reporting period within the targeted PSN site.
b. Number of combined homicides, aggravated assaults, and robberies that are committed with a firearm during the current reporting period within the targeted PSN site.
c. The total number of gang-related* homicides that occurred during the current reporting period.
d. The total number of gang-related* aggravated assaults that occurred during the current reporting period.
e. The total number of gang-related* robberies that occurred during the current reporting period.
f. The total number (gang-related* and non gang-related) of homicides, aggravated assaults, and robberies that occurred during the current reporting period.
-g. Total-number of youth partieipating-in-the program-during the -

-h. Number-of-youth-that-completed-the-program-during the-eurrent-
-reporting period.-
-i. Number-of-youth-that-exited-the-program-during-the-eurent-Feporting-period-without-empleting the program.

Note: *The operational definition for "gang-related" will be established by each local district at the outset of the project and included on all progress reports.
4.2.2 Written Explanation of Variance. GRANTEE is required to provide a written explanation to the OAG for any variances by GRANTEE from projected performance. In addition to the written explanation, GRANTEE shall promptly answer any questions of the OAG, whether in writing or otherwise, in connection with any report presented to the OAG.
4.2.3 Other Program Reports. GRANTEE shall cooperate fully in any social studies, fiscal or programmatic monitoring, auditing, evaluating, and other reviews pertaining to services rendered by GRANTEE which may be conducted by the OAG or its designees.

GRANTEE shall submit service delivery reports required by the contract or self-evaluations of performance and other reports requested by the OAG in appropriate format and on a timely basis and make available at reasonable times and for reasonable periods, client records and other programmatic or financial records, books, reports, and supporting documents for reviewing and copying by the OAG or its designees.

### 4.3 Financial Matters

4.3.1 Annual Budgets. With regard to the use of funds pursuant to this contract, GRANTEE will immediately review Exhibit A and submit a detailed budget to the OAG for its approval.

### 4.3.2 Monthly Request for Reimbursement and Financial Status Report. Grant funds are

 paid on a cost reimbursement basis. GRANTEE will submit, each month, a monthly request for reimbursement for the actual and allowable allocable costs incurred by GRANTEE for project costs to provide services under this contract. The payments made to GRANTEE shall not exceed its actual and allowable allocable costs to provide the services under this contract.The request for reimbursement will be submitted to the OAG in the form and manner as approved by the OAG and will specify the detailed and total expenses for the month, in the following cost categories: (i) personnel and fringe benefits, reported separately, (ii) professional and consulting services, (iii) travel, (iv) equipment, (v) supplies, and (vi) other direct operating expenses. The request for reimbursement must be accompanied by supporting documentation as required by the OAG. The OAG may from time to time require different or additional supporting documentation.

A financial status report is required each month, whether GRANTEE has paid expenses, or is seeking reimbursement.
4.3.3 Fiscal Year End Required Reports. On or before October 15, 2010 and October 15, 2011, or other fiscal year end dates as established by the OAG, GRANTEE will submit fiscal year end required reports.
a. Record of Reimbursement. GRANTEE will submit a reconciled record of its expenses for the prior fiscal year in the following cost categories: (i) personnel and fringe benefits, reported separately, (ii) professional and consulting services, (iii) travel, (iv) equipment, (v) supplies, and (vi) other direct operating expenses.
b. Equipment Inventory Report. GRANTEE will submit an Equipment Inventory Report which provides record of the current inventory of items purchased, disposed, replaced or transferred of any equipment purchased with grant funds.
4.3.4 Annual Independent Financial Audit Report. GRANTEE shall timely submit, via email, to the OAG a copy of its annual independent financial audit - "timely" means on or before

May 31, 2010 and on or before May 31, 2011 for an grantee whose fiscal year ends on August 31 of each year; otherwise, the timely submission to the OAG is on or before nine (9) months after the end of GRANTEE's accounting year. GRANTEE will contract an independent CPA firm to perform an annual financial audit engagement. GRANTEE's independent CPA firm will determine the type of annual financial audit, which may include a compliance attestation in accordance with the requirements of OMB Circular A-133 (audits of State, Local Government, and Non-Profit Organizations) and/or Texas Single Audit Circular (Single Audit or non-Single Audit financial audit). If applicable, GRANTEE will provide the OAG with any and all annual independent financial audits or audited financial statements, related management letters, and management responses of GRANTEE.

### 4.3.5 Timing of Submission of Request for Reimbursement to the OAG; Final Invoice.

 GRANTEE is responsible for submitting bills in an accurate and timely manner, and shall make every reasonable effort to submit monthly billings to the OAG, which cover the previous month's expenses, so that they are received by the OAG on or before the twentieth ( $20^{\text {th }}$ ) working day of each month, or if the $20^{\text {th }}$ falls on a weekend or holiday, the next business day. The OAG will make all reasonable efforts to promptly process and make payments on properly completed billings. GRANTEE may submit a final invoice not later than the earlier of (1) fortyfive (45) calendar days after termination of this contract; or (2) forty-five (45) calendar days after the end of each state fiscal year.
### 4.3.6 Reimbursement of Actual and Allowable Costs. The OAG shall only reimburse costs

 incurred and paid by GRANTEE during the term of this contract. The OAG shall only reimburse GRANTEE for employee costs that are directly related to performing the responsibilities of this contract.4.3.7 Refunds and Deductions. If the OAG determines that GRANTEE has been overpaid grant funds under this contract, such as payments made inadvertently or payments made but later determined to not be actual and allowable allocable costs, GRANTEE shall refund that amount of the OAG reimbursement identified by the OAG as an overpayment. The OAG may offset and deduct the amount of the overpayment from any amount owed to GRANTEE, as a reimbursement, but not yet paid by the OAG to GRANTEE. The OAG may choose to require a payment directly from GRANTEE rather than offset and deduct a specified amount. GRANTEE shall refund any overpayment to the OAG within thirty (30) calendar days of the receipt of the notice of the overpayment from the OAG unless an alternate payment plan is specified by the DAG.

### 4.3.8 Purchase of Equipment; Maintenance and Repair; Title upon Termination.

 GRANTEE shall not give any security interest, lien or otherwise encumber any item of equipment purchased with contract funds. GRANTEE shall permanently identify all equipment purchased under this contract by appropriate tags or labels affixed to the equipment. GRANTEE shall maintain a current inventory of all equipment or assets, which is available to the OAG at all times upon request.GRANTEE will administer a program of maintenance, repair, and protection of equipment or

[^1]assets under this contract so as to ensure the full availability and usefulness of such equipment or assets. In the event GRANTEE is indemnified, reimbursed, or otherwise compensated for any loss of, destruction of, or damage to the assets provided under this contract, it shall use the proceeds to repair or replace said equipment or assets.

To the extent that the OAG reimburses GRANTEE for its purchase of equipment and supplies with funds from this contract, GRANTEE agrees that upon termination of the contract, title to or ownership of all such purchased equipment and supplies, at the sole option of the OAG, shall remain with the OAG.
4.3.9 Direct Deposit. GRANTEE may make a written request to the OAG to be placed on Direct Deposit status by completing and submitting to the OAG the State Comptroller's Direct Deposit Authorization Form. After the direct deposit request is approved by the OAG and the setup is completed on the Texas Identification Number System by the State Comptroller's Office, payment will be remitted by direct deposit and the OAG will discontinue providing GRANTEE with copies of reimbursement vouchers.

## Section 5 Obligations of OAG

5.1 Monitoring. The OAG is responsible for closely monitoring GRANTEE to ensure the effective and efficient use of grant funds to accomplish the purposes of this contract.
5.2 Maximum Liability of OAG. The maximum liability of the OAG is contained in the attached Exhibit A. Any change to the maximum liability must be supported by a written amendment to this contract.
5.3 Reimbursement of Grantee Expenses. The OAG shall be liable to reimburse GRANTEE for all actual and allowable allocable costs incurred by GRANTEE pursuant to this contract. The OAG is not obligated to pay unauthorized costs.
5.4 Contract Not Entitlement or Right. Reimbursement with contract funds is not an entitlement or right. Reimbursement depends, among other things, upon strict compliance with all terms, conditions and provisions of this contract.

## Section 6 Termination

6.1 Termination for Convenience. Either Party may, at its sole discretion, terminate this contract in whole or in part, without recourse, liability or penalty, upon thirty (30) calendar days notice to the other party.
6.2 Termination for Cause. In the event that GRANTEE fails to perform or comply with an obligation of the terms, conditions and provisions of this contract, the OAG may, upon written notice of the breach to GRANTEE, immediately terminate all or any part of this contract.

### 6.3 Termination Not Exclusive Remedy; Survival of Terms and Conditions.

 Termination is not an exclusive remedy, but will be in addition to any other rights and remedies provided in equity, by law, or under this contract.Termination of this contract for any reason or expiration of this contract shall not release the Parties from any liability or obligation set forth in this contract that is expressly stated to survive any such termination or by it nature would be intended to be applicable following any such termination. The following terms and conditions, (in addition to any others that could reasonable be interpreted to survive but are not specifically identified), survive the termination or expiration of this contract: Sections 4, 7; 11; and 12.

## SECTION 7 Audit rights; Records Retention

7.1 Duty to Maintain Records. GRANTEE shall maintain adequate records to support its charges, procedures, and performances to the OAG for all work related to this contract. GRANTEE also shall maintain such records as are deemed necessary by the OAG, OAG's auditor, the State Auditor's Office or other auditors of the State of Texas, the United States, or such other persons or entities designated by the OAG, to ensure proper accounting for all costs and performances related to this contract.
7.2 Records Retention. GRANTEE shall maintain and retain for a period of four (4) years after the submission of the final expenditure report, or until full and final resolution of all audit or litigation matters which arise after the expiration of the four (4) year period after the submission of the final expenditure report, whichever time period is longer, such records as are necessary to fully disclose the extent of services provided under this contract, including but not limited to any daily activity reports and time distribution and attendance records, and other records that may show the basis of the charges made or performances delivered.

### 7.3 Audit Trails. GRANTEE shall maintain appropriate audit trails to provide

 accountability for updates to mission critical information, charges, procedures, and performances. Audit trails maintained by GRANTEE will, at a minimum, identify the supporting documentation prepared by GRANTEE to permit an audit of the system by tracing the activities of individuals through the system. GRANTEE's automated systems must provide the means whereby authorized personnel have the ability to audit and to verify contractually required performances and to establish individual accountability for any action that can potentially cause access to, generation of, or modification of confidential information.7.4 Access and Audit. GRANTEE shall grant access to and make available copies of all paper and electronic records, books, documents, accounting procedures, practices, and any other items relevant to the performance of this contract, compliance with the applicable state or federal laws and regulations, and the operation and management of GRANTEE to the OAG or its designees for the purposes of inspecting, auditing, or copying such items. GRANTEE will direct any contractor to discharge GRANTEE's obligations to likewise permit access to, inspection of,
and reproduction of all books and records of the subcontractors) that pertain to this contract. All records, books, documents, accounting procedures, practices, and any other items, in whatever form, relevant to the performance of this contract, shall be subject to examination or audit. Whenever practical as determined at the sole discretion of the OAG, the OAG shall provide GRANTEE with up to five (5) business days advance notice of any such examination or audit.
7.5 Location. Any audit of records shall be conducted at GRANTEE's principal place of business and/or the locations) of GRANTEE's operations during GRANTEE's normal business hours. GRANTEE shall provide to OAG or its designees, on GRANTEE's premises (or if the audit is being performed of a subcontractor, the subcontractor's premises if necessary) private space, office furnishings (including lockable cabinets), telephone and facsimile services, utilities and office-related equipment and duplicating services as OAG or its designees may reasonably require to perform the audits described in this contract.

## Section 8 Submission of Information to the OAG

The OAG will designate methods for submission of information to the OAG by GRANTEE. The OAG generally requires submission of information via email or hard copy format. Some reporting requirements must occur via the internet and/or a web-based data collection method.

## Section 9 Corrective Action Plans And Sanctions

The Parties agree to make a good faith effort to identify, communicate and resolve problems found by either the OAG or GRANTEE.
9.1 Corrective Action Plans. If the OAG finds deficiencies with GRANTEE's performance under this contract, the OAG, at its sole discretion, may impose one or more of the following remedies as part of a corrective action plan: increase monitoring visits; require additional or more detailed financial and/or programmatic reports be submitted; require prior approval for expenditures; require additional technical or management assistance and/or make modifications in business practices; reduce the contract amount; and/or terminate this contract. The foregoing are not exclusive remedies, and the OAG may impose other requirements that the OAG determines will be in the best interest of the State.
9.2 Financial Hold. Failure to comply with submission deadlines for required reports, invoices, or other requested information, may result in the OAG, at its sole discretion, placing GRANTEE on immediate financial hold without further notice to GRANTEE and without first requiring a corrective action plan. No reimbursements will be processed until the requested information is submitted. If GRANTEE is placed on financial hold, the OAG, at its sole discretion, may deny reimbursement requests associated with the invoices submitted during the time GRANTEE was placed on financial hold.
9.3 Sanctions. In addition to financial hold, the OAG, at its sole discretion, may impose other sanctions without first requiring a corrective action plan. The OAG, at its sole discretion, may impose sanctions, including, but not limited to, withholding or suspending funding, offsetting previous reimbursements, requiring repayment, disallowing claims for reimbursement, reducing funding, terminating this contract and/or any other appropriate sanction.
9.4 No Waiver. Notwithstanding the imposition of corrective actions, financial hold and/or sanctions, GRANTEE remains responsible for complying with the contract terms and conditions. Corrective action plans, financial hold and/or sanctions do not excuse or operate as a waiver of prior failure to comply with this contract.

## Section 10 General Terms and Conditions

### 10.1 Federal and State Laws, Rules and Regulations, Directives, Guidelines, OMBs and

 Other Relevant Authorities. GRANTEE agrees to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, rules and regulations, directives, guidelines, OMB circulars, or any other authorities[^2]relevant to the performance of GRANTEE under this contract.

GRANTEE agrees to comply with the applicable Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars A-21, A-87 or A-122 relating to cost principles; OMB Circular A110 relating to administrative requirements; and OMB Circular A-133 relating to audit requirements. GRANTEE also shall comply with all applicable federal and state assurances contained in UGMS, Part III, State Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements, Subpart B, $\qquad$ 14, State Assurances. Further, GRANTEE agrees to comply with the applicable OAG Certifications and Assurances, including but not limited to, the equal employment opportunity program certification, disclosure and certification regarding lobbying, non-procurement debarment certification, drug-free workplace certification, annual single audit certification, compliance with annual independent financial audit filing requirement, compliance with UGMS and the applicable OMB circulars, return of grant funds in the event of loss or misuse, and conflict of interest.10.3 Basis of Accounting: GRANTEE shall adhere to an accounting basis that complies with State financial laws and State constitution and follows OMB A-87 and Uniform Grant Management Standards, (UGMS), and follow OAG fiscal management policies and procedures in processing and submitting for reimbursement GRANTEE's billing and maintaining financial records related to this contract.
10.4 Conflicts of Interest; Disclosure of Conflicts. GRANTEE has not given, offered to give, nor intends to give at any time hereafter, any economic opportunity, future employment, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, trip, favor, or service to a public servant or employee of the OAG, at any time during the negotiation of this contract or in connection with this contract, except as allowed under relevant state or federal law. GRANTEE will establish safeguards to prohibit its employees from using their positions for a purpose that constitutes or presents the appearance of personal or organizational conflict of interest or personal gain. GRANTEE will operate with complete independence and objectivity without actual, potential or apparent conflict of interest with respect to their performance under this contract. GRANTEE must disclose, in writing, within fifteen (15) calendar days of discovery, any existing or potential conflicts of interest relative to their performance under this contract.
10.5 Compliance with Regulatory and Licensing Bodies. GRANTEE agrees that it has obtained all licenses, certifications, permits and authorizations necessary to perform the responsibilities of this contract and currently is in good standing with all regulatory agencies that regulate any or all aspects of GRANTEE's business or operations. GRANTEE agrees to remain in good standing with the Texas Secretary of State, Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts and related Federal governmental bodies related to GRANTEE's right to conduct it business in

Texas. GRANTEE agrees to comply with all applicable licenses, legal certifications, inspections, and any other applicable local ordinance, state, or federal laws.

## Section 11 Special Terms and Conditions

11.1 Independent Contractor Status; Indemnity and Hold Harmless Agreement. GRANTEE expressly agrees that it is an independent contractor and under no circumstances shall any owners, incorporators, officers, directors, employees, or volunteers of GRANTEE be considered an OAG employee, agent, servant, joint venturer, joint enterpriser or partner of the OAG. GRANTEE agrees to take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that each contractor of GRANTEE will be deemed to be an independent contractor and will not be considered or permitted to be an agent, servant, joint venturer, joint enterpriser or partner of OAG.

All persons furnished, used, retained, or hired by or on behalf of GRANTEE or any of their contractors shall be considered to be solely the employees or agents of GRANTEE or the contractors. GRANTEE or contractors shall be responsible for ensuring that there is payment of any and all appropriate payments, such as unemployment, workers compensation, social security, any benefit available to a state employee as a state employee, and other payroll taxes for such persons, including any related assessments or contributions required by law.

To the extent allowed by law, GRANTEE or contractors are responsible for all types of claims whatsoever due to the actions or performance under this contract, including, but not limited to, the use of automobiles or other transportation, taken by its owners, incorporators, officers, directors, employees, volunteers or any third parties and GRANTEE and/or contractors will indemnify and hold harmless the OAG and/or the State of Texas from and against any and all claims arising out of their actions or performance under this contract. To the extent allowed by law, GRANTEE agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the OAG and/or the State of Texas from any and all liability, actions, claims, demands, or suits, and all related costs, attorney fees, and expenses, that arise from or are occasioned by the negligence, misconduct, or wrongful act or omission of GRANTEE, its employees, representatives, agents, or subcontractors in their performance under this contract.
11.2 Publicity. GRANTEE shall not use the OAG's name or refer to the OAG directly or indirectly in any media release, public service announcement or public service disclosure relating to this contract or any acquisition pursuant hereto, including in any promotional or marketing materials, without first obtaining the written consent from the OAG. This section is not intended and does not limit GRANTEE's ability to comply with its obligations and duties under the Texas Open Meetings Act and/or the Texas Public Information Act.
11.3 Intellectual Property. GRANTEE understands and agrees that where funds obtained under this contract may be used to produce original books, manuals, films, or other original material and intellectual property, GRANTEE may copyright such material subject to the royalty-free, non-exclusive, and irrevocable license which is hereby reserved by the OAG and

[^3]GRANTEE hereby grants to the OAG or the state (or federal government, if federal funds are expended in this grant) government. The OAG is granted the unrestricted right to use, copy, modify, prepare derivative works, publish and distribute, at no additional cost to the OAG, in any manner the OAG deems appropriate at its sole discretion, any component of such intellectual property made the subject of this contract.
11.4 Program Income. Gross income directly generated from the grant funds through a project or activity performed under this contract are considered program income. Unless otherwise required under the terms of this contract, any program income shall be used by GRANTEE to further the program objectives of the project or activity funded by this grant, and the program income shall be spent on the same project or activity in which it was generated. GRANTEE shall identify and report this income in accordance with the OAG's reporting instructions. GRANTEE shall expend program income during this contract term; program income not expended in this contract term shall be refunded to the OAG.
11.5 No Supplanting. GRANTEE shall not supplant or otherwise use funds from this contract to replace or substitute existing funding from other sources that also supports the activities that are the subject of this contract.
11.6 No Solicitation or Receipt of Funds on Behalf of OAG. It is expressly agreed that any solicitation for or receipt of funds of any type by GRANTEE is for the sole benefit of GRANTEE and is not a solicitation for or receipt of funds on behalf of the OAG or the Attorney General of the State of Texas.
11.7 No Subcontracting or Assignment Without Prior Written Approval of OAG. GRANTEE may not subcontract or assign any of its rights or duties under this contract without the prior written approval of the OAG. It is within the OAG's sole discretion to approve any subcontracting or assignment. In the event OAG approves subcontracting or assignment by GRANTEE, GRANTEE will ensure that its contracts with others shall require compliance with the provisions of this contract to the extent compliance is needed to support GRANTEE's compliance with this contract. GRANTEE, in subcontracting for any performances specified herein, expressly understands and agrees that it is not relieved of its responsibilities for ensuring that all performance is in compliance with this contract and that the OAG shall not be liable in any manner to GRANTEE's subcontractors).
11.8 No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity. The Parties agree that no provision of this contract is in any way intended to constitute a waiver by the OAG or the State of Texas of any immunities from suit or from liability that the OAG or the State of Texas may have by operation of law.
11.9 Governing Law; Venue. This contract is made and entered into in the State of Texas. This contract and all disputes arising out of or relating thereto shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to any otherwise applicable conflict of law rules or requirements.

Except where state law establishes mandatory venue, GRANTEE agrees that any action, suit, litigation or other proceeding (collectively "litigation") arising out of or in any way relating to this contract shall be commenced exclusively in the Travis County District Court or the United States District Court in the Western District, Austin Division, and to the extent allowed by law, hereby irrevocably and unconditionally consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of those courts for the purpose of prosecuting and/or defending such litigation. GRANTEE hereby waives and agrees not to assert by way of motion, as a defense, or otherwise, in any suit, action or proceeding, any claim that GRANTEE is not personally subject to the jurisdiction of the abovenamed courts, the suit, action or proceeding is brought in an inconvenient forum and/or the venue is improper.
11.10 Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance Number. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance Number (CFDA) number for the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Justice Assistance program is 16.609 , titled "Community Prosecution and Project Safe Neighborhoods."
11.11 PSN Additional Unallowable Costs. For additional unallowable costs, see the Office of Justice Programs' Guide and Financial Management Guide. Unallowable costs for PSN grant funds include, but are not limited to, the following:
a. Gun locks (for details, see www.projectchildsafe.org);
b. Gun buy back programs; and
c. Air-time to run the national public service announcements "Mothers," "Sentenced," and "Family Prison."

## SECTION 12 Construction or Contract and Amendments

By executing this contract, GRANTEE agrees to strictly comply with the requirements and obligations of this contract, including Exhibits A and B, which are attached and incorporated herein.
12.3 Amendment. This contract shall not be modified or amended except in writing, signed by both parties. Any properly executed amendment of this contract shall be binding upon the Parties and presumed to be supported by adequate consideration.
12.4 Partial Invalidity. If any term or provision of this contract is found to be illegal or unenforceable, such construction shall not affect the legality or validity of any of its other provisions. The illegal or invalid provision shall be deemed severable and stricken from the contract as if it had never been incorporated herein, but all other provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
12.5 Non-waiver. The failure of any Party to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms or conditions herein, irrespective of the length of time of such failure, shall not be a waiver of that party's right to demand strict compliance in the future. No consent or waiver, express or implied, to or of any breach or default in the performance of any obligation under this contract shall constitute a consent or waiver to or of any breach or default in the performance of the same or any other obligation of this contract.
12.6 Official Capacity. The Parties stipulate and agree that the signatories hereto are signing, executing and performing this contract only in their official capacity.

Awards under the FY 2009 Project Safe Neighborhoods grant program will be used to fund innovative ideas in reducing gun violence and will carry the following NEPA special condition:

None of the following activities will be conducted either under the OJP federal action or a related third party action: 1) New construction; 2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property either (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places or (b) located within a 100 -year flood plain; 3) A renovation which will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size; 4) Research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment; or 5) Implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals. Consequently, the subject federal action meets OJP's criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4(b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Additionally, the proposed action is neither a phase nor a segment or a project which when viewed in its entirety would not meet the criteria for a categorical exclusion.


Paso, who will serve as role models to actively educate and support the pro-social behaviors of at-risk youth, and sheriff's deputies in Bexar and Medina Counties tasked with identifying and documenting gang members and enforcing laws will be funded. The U.S. Attomey's Office, along with the PSN task force and subgrantees, will coordinate the planning and implementation of the grant funded initiatives.

Congratulations on your recent award. In establishing financial assistance programs, Congress linked the receipt of Federal funding to compliance with Federal civil rights laws. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice is responsible for ensuring that recipients of financial aid from OJP, its component offices and bureaus, the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) comply with applicable Federal civil rights statutes and regulations. We at OCR are available to help you and your organization meet the civil rights requirements that come with Justice Department funding.

## Ensuring Access to Federally Assisted Programs

As you know, Federal laws prohibit recipients of financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in funded programs or activities, not only in respect to employment practices but also in the delivery of services or benefits. Federal law also prohibits funded programs or activities from discriminating on the basis of age in the delivery of services or benefits.

## Providing Services to Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Individuals

In accordance with Department of Justice Guidance pertaining to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964,42 U.S.C. § 2000d, recipients of Federal financial assistance must take reasonable steps to provide meaningful access to their programs and activities for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP). For more information on the civil rights responsibilities that recipients have in providing language services to LEP individuals, please see the website at http://www.lep.gov.

## Ensuring Equal Treatment for Faith-Based Organizations

The Department of Justice has published a regulation specifically pertaining to the funding of faith-based organizations. In general, the regulation, Participation in Justice Department Programs by Religious Organizations; Providing for Equal Treatment of all Justice Department Program Participants, and known as the Equal Treatment Regulation 28 C.F.R. part 38, requires State Administering Agencies to treat these organizations the same as any other applicant or recipient. The regulation prohibits State Administering Agencies from making award or grant administration decisions on the basis of an organization's religious character or affiliation, religious name, or the religious composition of its board of directors.

The regulation also prohibits faith-based organizations from using financial assistance from the Department of fustice to fund inherently religious activities. While faith-based organizations can engage in non-funded inherently religious activities, they must be held separately from the Department of Justice funded program, and customers or beneficiaries cannot be compelled to participate in them. The Equal Treatment Regulation also makes clear that organizations participating in programs funded by the Department of Justice are not permitted to discriminate in the provision of services on the basis of a beneficiary's religion, For more information on the regulation, please see OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj gov/ocr/etfbo.htm.

State Administering Agencies and faith-based organizations should also note that the Safe Streets Act, as amended; the Victims of Crime Act, as amended; and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, as amended, contain prohibitions against discrimination on the basis of religion in employment. Despite these nondiscrimination provisions, the Justice Department has concluded that the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) is reasonably construed, on a case-by-case basis, to require that its funding agencies permit faith-based organizations applying for funding under the applicable program statutes both to receive DOI funds and to continue considering religion when hiring staff, even if the statute that authorizes the funding program generally forbids considering of religion in employment decisions by grantees.

## STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF TRAVIS

## RECITALS

Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 233 authorizes counties to adopt a fire code and the regulations necessary to administer and enforce it, including requiring building permits.

The Commissioners Court adopted a fire code on February 1, 2005. The fire code requires permits for the construction of commercial establishments and public buildings in the unincorporated areas of Travis County, Texas, allows the County to impose standards to protect the health, safety, welfare and property of the general public, and governs the safe-guarding of life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises in Unincorporated Travis County.

The Fire Code provides for the issuance of permits and collection of fees. The fees adopted were based on the type of building proposed and reflected the amount necessary to cover the cost of administering and enforcing the fire code. Section 71.054 of the Travis County Code attaches Table 71-A to Chapter 71, the Fire Code to establish the fees applicable to the services being requested which are to defray the reasonable costs of administering the Fire Code.

Since its original adoption, these fees have not been revised. Upon reviewing the current cost of administering and enforcing the fire code, the Fire Marshal has found that the fees stated in Table 71-A are no longer adequate to defray these costs. Texas Local Government Code, section 233.065 provides that the fees "must be set in amounts necessary to cover the cost of administering and enforcing" the fire code.

ORDER

Pursuant to Chapter 233 of the Texas Local Government Code and sections 1.0051 and 1.0052 of the Travis County Code, the Commissioners Court orders the following:

1. The Table 71-A, attached to Chapter 71, the Fire Code by section 71.054 (a) is deleted and the Table 71.A in the form attached to this order is adopted.

Subject: Travis County Fire Code Fee Schedule Revision
The fire code fee schedule, Travis County Code Table 71-A, has not been revised since 2005 when International Fire Code 2003 was adopted as Travis County Fire Code.

The original fee schedule was a good starting place for adoption of the fire code but experience has shown us a few areas that are in need of revision.

Conversations with one commissioner have pointed out the need for a standardization of cost estimates for different types of construction and different occupancies. A proposal to include a cost estimate table is incorporated in my proposed new fee schedule.

Applicants have pointed out that the fees collected are greater than necessary for some types of structures, such as marinas, open air markets, etc. Statutory requirements of Local Gov't Code $233.065(\mathrm{~d})$ state that fees "must be reasonable and reflect the approximate cost of the inspection personnel, materials, and administrative overhead." The proposed fee schedule also covers this type of permitting situation.

I am submitting to you a copy of our old fee schedule as published and a copy of my proposed new fee schedule with comments relating to how the new proposal is different from the old fee schedule.

The proposed fee schedule may increase our revenue, but only slightly. If the revenue is increased it will be used for enforcement of the fire code.

# Building and Construction Permits 

## Building Permits

## Building Permit

The only change to this section of our fee schedule is the addition of a Building Valuation Table. The Valuation Table is needed to set a standard for the cost basis of a project. I have chosen the 2003 International Code Council's Building Valuation Table. I reviewed several commercial building permit applications received by our office over the past two years in which the applicant provided an estimated cost of construction. The projects reviewed and used for comparison would have gone out for competitive bid. The square footage costs of the projects used for comparison are just above or just below those of the 2003 Valuation Table. The 2006 and 2009 Building Valuation Tables have an increased cost estimate that is 18 to 20 per cent above the 2003 Table. I believe the 2003 Building Valuation Table better reflects cost in Central Texas.

## Special Project

This permit is new to our fee schedule. I recommend adding this fee because of statutory requirements. We are allowed to charge fees which cover the cost of administering our Fire Code. Some projects do not take as much review time nor do they require as many inspections. An open air structure would be an example.

Utilizing this fee will more accurately reflect the amount of work required for such a project but will also ensure that we charge enough to cover our cost in reviewing, permitting and inspecting the project.

## Express Permit

This permit is new to our fee schedule. This permit would be utilized for projects such as the addition of a normally unoccupied structure to a previously approved project or a change in occupancy classification where the building does not change.

## Site Plan

This permit is new to our fee schedule. We are often asked to review subdivision plans for approval of fire apparatus access roads, water supplies, etc. This fee will be utilized to cover our time and expense for site plans.

## Construction Permits

## Automatic Fire Extinguishing Systems

No change in fees.

## Fire Alarm and Detection System

No change in fees.

## Fire Pump System

New fee. Inspecting and witnessing the testing of a new fire pump installation takes approximately two hours plus plans review, travel and administrative time. A fee should be charged for this service to cover our cost.

## Fire Sprinkler System

This is an old fee that has been revised. Our old fee ( $\$ 260.00$ ) did not take into consideration multiple fire sprinkler risers in multi-story buildings, which require multiple inspections. This proposed new fee will more accurately reflect the time involved in review, inspection and testing of fire sprinklers.

## Fire Standpipe System

This fee was collected under our old fee schedule but is being broken out to more clearly state that a fee is required.

## Private Water Supply

New fee. Commercial and public buildings are being built in areas without public water supply utilizing dry hydrants, cisterns, tanks, etc. Additional time is required to review plans for these systems and then inspect the system once installed.

## Underground Fire Line

New fee. This fee applies to underground fire sprinkler lines. A special license is required for this installation. The above ground fire sprinkler installer does not always install the underground, either because of license requirements or the underground being bid separately. An underground fire sprinkler line must be inspected prior to cover up. A two hour hydrostatic test is also required. This fee will allow us to recover our costs in the plans review, permitting and inspection of underground fire lines.

## Tank Installation

This fee was in our old fee schedule. We have changed the application of this fee from "each set of plans submitted" to "each tank or set of tanks located within a single containment system" in order to be able to separate each type of system being reviewed and inspected.

## Service Fees

Service fees have not changed except to add travel time and state there is a two hour minimum charge.

Purchasing Recommendation and Comments: Purchasing concurs with department and recommends approval of requested action. This procurement action met the compliance requirements as outlined by the statutes.
The contract is for Refuse Collection services. The Commissioners Court approved the award of this contract on January 23, 2007.

This modification will extend the contract for an additional twelve (12) months, from February 1, 2010 through January 31, 2011, and will incorporate changes to some locations. There are no price increases this year as in the previous two years. The contract amount will be decreased by $\$ 5,827.36$ (estimated).

On November 16, 2009, Jon White of the TNR department was contacted via e-mail on whether Waste Management had received any violations from Feb. 1, 2009 through present. Mr. White forwarded an email to Mr. Jonas Rosenthal/Civil Environmental Enforcement Investigator for TNR, who in turn, sent an email to Kathy Roecker/TCEQ requesting review of WMT's compliance record at TCEQ for 2009. Ms. Roecker responded stating the WMT files did not indicate violations for the 2009 calendar year from January $1^{\text {st }}$ to present.

Modification No. 14 was previously issued to incorporate changes to add a container for a two (2) month period to the Mary Quinlan Park location, effective August 15, 2009. It was approved by the Purchasing Agent on August 19, 2009.

SUBJECT: Requests for installation of wood privacy fencing along the property line between the Anderson Mill Road right-of-way and three residential lots in the Anderson Mill Estates subdivision

## SUMMARY OF BRIEFING AND STAFF RECOMMEDATION

In early 2003, Travis County TNR staff initiated contact with property owners along Anderson Mill Road (see Exhibit "A" for location), to advise the local community of plans for widening of the roadway as part of a voter-approved, County Bond Program. Plans for the Anderson Mill Road project dictated the acquisitions of numerous parcels of land for additional right-of-way. Many property owners were involved, and TNR staff worked to minimize disruption and hardships to all interested parties.

As part of the right-of-way acquisition process, the parcels to be acquired were appraised by an independent appraiser. Mr. John Coleman, MAI, of the Aegis Group, Inc. performed many of the appraisals for this project, to include appraisal of Parcel \#15 (Lavery), \#16 (Wenzlaff), and \#17 (Porter). In his appraisals, and with regard to wood privacy fencing, he set forth that "The existing privacy fence is to be replaced by Travis County to the new right-of-way line". Because of this underlying assumption, no compensation was included or recommended in the appraisal for the property owner, for any aspects of their fencing improvements.

All three of these owners retained the legal services of the Barron and Adler law firm. In discussions and negotiations for the purchase of right-of-way, the parties were able to reach an agreement regarding acceptable compensation for the land and improvements being obtained via purchase under the threat of condemnation. The current disputes (or claims) center around responsibility for fencing, and the three purchase contracts addressed this matter differently. Since the time period when the construction phase was nearing completion, the three property owners have asserted that they expected the County to replace their fences at the County's cost. Today, this is likely why none of them have replaced their fences.

This letter is regarding the completion of the above referenced project. When the Anderson Mill Road project was completed, I believed that Travis County was to install a permanent privacy fence at the right-of-way line of my property for the following reasons:

1. As per page 3-36 of that appraisal report, "The existing privacy fence is to be replaced by Travis County to the new right-of-way line."
2. As per the License Agreement for the temporary Construction Area, signed 1-18-2006, "The temporary construction Area will be restored to substantially the same condition which existed prior to the construction activities."

Attached is the License Agreement that your people had our group sign in order for the construction crews to enter our property and perform the road work.

This license is date 1-18-2006. It was negotiated in good faith with your people.
It specifically states that our land "will be restored to substantially the same condition which existed prior to the construction."

As explained by your people, prior to anyone signing, this included, among other things, the fence that was already at our property lines and that the construction crew tore down after the License Agreement was signed.

We negotiated in good faith to allow your crews onto our land; in consideration of this License, they installed a "temporary" fence to protect our property, and agreed to the condition that our lands were to be restored to what they were prior to construction. This included our permanent fence being restored at our property lines.

This contractual agreement supersedes any previous documents, including the Purchase Agreement to which you refer and, as such, takes precedence over them.

I hope that you will abide by this contractual obligation. Since the construction crews have already benefitted from this contract, the remainder of it is legally binding on the County to fulfill the rest of the contract.

## PROPOSED MOTION:

A. Consider and take appropriate action on a preliminary plan in Precinct 3: Ammaron Hills Subdivision Preliminary Plan - 15 lots on 42.57 acres - 14500 FM 2769 Rd. - Water and wastewater service to be provided by on-site septic and well- City of Austin ETJ).

## SUMMARY AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

This subdivision preliminary plan consists of lots 15 total lots (14 single-family and (1) drainage, and public utility easement lot). There are 1,368 linear feet of proposed for the extension and improvement of Navajo Pass associated with the plan. The lots will take access from Navajo Pass and Lake Mountain Lane. The preliminary plan was approved by the City of Austin Zoning and Platting Commission on October 19, 2009.

As this preliminary plan meets all Travis County standards and has been approved by the City of Austin, TNR staff recommends approval of the plan.

## ISSUES:

During the public hearing at the Zoning and Platting Commission no one spoke in opposition, however, a gentleman did show up with concerns regarding the potential loss of parking for the existing church at Navajo Pass and FM 2769 Rd. Also, two citizens, Mr. Roger Tyler and Ms. Holly O'Conner returned written letters of protest (attached) with concerns focusing on the availability of water in the area and their troubles with their existing water wells.

Travis County Interim Rules does require a developer to provide a ground water availability study done prior to final plat approval, however, the current existing regulations within Title 30 do not require a study. While staff acknowledges that residents of this part of western Travis County have raised the issue of some of their wells going dry, there is nothing in the code that requires the applicant to address this issue at this stage of the preliminary plan process.

The applicant proposes private water wells for each of the 14 residential lots proposed. Staff has discussed TCEQ permitting requirements with Ms. Teresa Rogers of the TCEQ. Ms. Rogers explained that no TCEQ permit would be required for individual private water wells; however, private water wells are subject to the rules of the Texas Water Well Drillers Association which is regulated by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulations. All private water wells must be installed by a licensed Texas Water Well Driller and all associated rules will apply. A TCEQ permit is only required when a person, or entity, becomes a seller of water.

## PROPOSED MOTION:

Consider and take appropriate action on a plat for recording in Precinct 3: Palomino Ranch Subdivision (Long Form plat - 9 total lots: 8 single family lots and 1 private street lot - 109.5 Acres - Nameless Road - Fiscal posted with the County - Sewage service to be provided by on-site septic Leander ETJ).

## SUMMARY AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

This subdivision consists of nine lots on 109.15 acres: eight single-family lots and one private street lot. There would be 3,210 linear feet of private streets proposed with this plat. Parkland dedication fees in the amount of $\$ 850.66$ were paid to the County. Access to the proposed private street (Palomino Ranch Drive) would be off of Nameless Road. The applicant wishes to come out of alternative fiscal as the developer has built all necessary infrastructure and all required inspections have been completed and approved by TNR staff.

This subdivision is not subject to Interim Rules because it was filed prior to the effective date of the ordinance. The applicant proposes private water wells for each of the 8 residential lots. Each lot in this proposed subdivision averages more that than 10 acre each and will be served by individual water wells. TCEQ regulations regarding wells is that no TCEQ permit would be required for individual private water wells, however, a TCEQ permit is only required when a person, or entity, becomes a seller of water.

The Commissioner's Court approved the Preliminary Plan for this subdivision on February 8, 2005.

As this application meets all Travis County standards, TNR staff recommends approval of the proposed plat.

## RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF HAYS COUNTY SUPPORTING THE JOINING OF THE AREAS OF THE HAYS TRINITY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT WITH THE AREAS OF SOUTHWEST TRAVIS AND WESTERN COMAL COUNTIES THAT ARE ALSO WITHIN THE HILL COUNTRY PRIORITY GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT AREA BUT DO NOT HAVE GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTSRICTS AS REQUIRED UNDER TWC CHAPTER 36

WHEREAS, Groundwater Conservation Districts (GCDs), as created by Chapter 35 \& 36 of the Texas Water Code (TWC $35 \& 36$ ) are the State's preferred method of groundwater management through local control; and

WHEREAS, the Priority Groundwater Management Area (PGMA) process of the TCEQ, defines a priority groundwater management area as a region that is experiencing critical groundwater problems or is expected to have such problems within the next 25 years; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the groundwater supply limitations of the Trinity aquifer; the Texas Water Commission designated the Hill Country PGMA in June 1990 to include Bandera, Blanco, Gillespie, Kendall, and Kerr, parts of northwestern Comal, western Hays, and southwestern Travis counties,

WHEREAS, the Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation District (HTGCD) was the last GCD created within the Hill Country PGMA, being confirmed by popular election on May 3, 2003 and northwestern Comal and southwestern Travis have remained without GCDs since the designation of the Hill Country PGMA; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Water Code (TWC), Chapters 35 and 36, and Title 30 Texas Administrative Code ( 30 TAC ) $\S 293.19(\mathrm{~b})$, and $\S 294.44$, TCEQ staff has prepared a report ("Groundwater Conservation District Recommendation for Hill Country Priority Groundwater Management Area.") that conveys the Executive Director's petition to the Commission for actions to establish groundwater management in Hill Country PGMA territories that are not part of a GCD; and,

WHEREAS, the report considers various alternative approaches for creating a single multi-county GCD or multiple GCD's for southwest Travis, western Hays and northwestern Comal counties; and,

WHEREAS, the multi county GCD including for southwest Travis, western Hays and northwestern Comal counties accomplishes the state's preferred approach to new GCD creation is for multi-county GCDs managed by locally elected boards, with greater administrative efficiency and greater capacity to fund operations at lower cost to rate payers; and

WHEREAS, clear, flowing surface waters of creeks, streams sourced by spring flows from the Trinity aquifer, give Hill County counties along the Balcones escarpment (or I-35 corridor) part of their unique sense of place, as well as increasing property values and driving eco-tourism; and

WHEREAS, the Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation District's board endorses the report's recommendation to create a new multi-county Trinity GCD to include both southwest Travis and northwestern Comal and the PGMA Portion of Hays County because this approach will provide effective and efficient management of the Trinity aquifer along the I-35 corridor growth drivers.

NOW, therefore be it resolved that the Hays County Commissioners Court respectfully requests the TCEQ to support effective groundwater management authority and regulation for all portions of the Trinity within the Hill Country PIGMA, including western Hays County, western Comal County, and southwestern Travis County; that the Court go on record as supporting regional solutions to water challenges in Hays County and the adjoining counties; and that the TCEQ, in cooperation with local stakeholders and/or legislators work to implement a solution that will address local needs within a regional context while maintaining locally elected boards, including the options and alternatives discussed in the TCEQ director's draft report.

The Executive Director of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has completed a draft report (Groundwater Conservation District Recommendation for Hill Country Priority Groundwater Management Area -Western Comal and Southwestern Travis Counties $\rightarrow$ ) to address groundwater management in the Hill Country PGMA. This notice is to announce the availability of the draft report and the opportunity to provide comments on the draft report. The TCEQ draft report may be accessed on the agency's PGMA webpage at: http://www.tceg.state.tx.us/permitting/water supply/groundwater/pgma.html and staff will provide a hard copy of the draft report if requested.

With this notice, the Executive Director of TCEQ respectfully requests you review and consider the draft report. The Executive Director will welcome written comments received before close of business Jonuary 11, 2010, and the report will be finalized after all written comments have been considered. Written comments regarding the draff report may be directed to Mr. Leon Byrd at TCEQ, MC-147, P.O. Box 13087, Austin, Texas 78711-3087, or via email at cbyrd@tceg.state.tx.us. All written comments received will be placed in the TCEQ's official files.

The purpose of this report is to identify and evaluate the areas in the Hill Country PGMA not included in a groundwater conservation district (GCD) and evaluate and recommend whether one or more GCDs be created, whether the identified areas be added to an existing GCD, or whether a combination of these actions be taken. The TCEQ draft report identifies two areas in the Hill Country PGMA that are not currently part of a groundwater conservation district (GCD). The two areas are the western Comal and southwestern Travis territories. The Executive Director concludes and recommends that the western Comal County territory be added to the Trinity Glen

Rose GCD and the southwestern Travis County territory be added to the Barton Springs/Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (BS/EACD) in accordance with 30 TAC Chapters 293 and 294. The Executive Director concludes that this recommended action will provide for effective boundaries for the management of the groundwater resources under the authorities of the Trinity Glen Rose GCD and the BS/EACD, and adequate funding to finance required or authorized groundwater management planning, regulatory, and district operation functions under the authorities of the Trinity Glen Rose GCD and the BS/EACD.

Subsequent Actions. When the final report is completed, the Executive Director will file the report with the Chief Clerk of the TCEQ, mail copies of the report to county clerks and public libraries in the county, and post the report on the agency's Internet homepage. Within 30 days of filing the report, the Executive Director will prepare a summary of report findings and recommendations, and note report availability. The summary will be mailed to the stakeholders who have received this notice. The Executive Director will refer the report to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH), and request a contested case hearing be conducted in the Hill Country PGMA. Notice of the SOAH hearing will be published in at least one newspaper with general circulation in the area and mailed to stakeholders at least 30 days before the date chosen for the hearing.

After the hearing, the SOAH administrative law judge will file a proposal for decision with the Chief Clerk of the TCEQ, and the Chief Clerk will set the issue for the three-member Commission of TCEQ to consider at a regularly scheduled public meeting in Austin. If the TCEQ recommends that the areas in the Hill Country PGMA that are not in a GCD be added to the Trinity Glen Rose GCD and the BS/EACD, respectively, it will issue an Order and provide the Order to the Commissioners Courts of Comal and Travis counties, the Trinity Glen Rose GCD, and the BS/EACD for additional consideration and action.

## SUMMARY OF BRIEFING AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Adjoining property owners of lots on Lakeplace Lane have been involved in a property boundary dispute for more than five years. The various issues and points of disagreement between these owners (Dr. O'Connell and Dr. Stassen - Mr. John and Ms. Leah Lloyd) have finally been resolved. One component central to the former dispute was future ownership and use of a very small, pie-shaped wedge of land held by Travis County. This land area is 0.0031 of an acre, or 135 square feet, and is depicted in the sketch attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

The subject tract was conveyed to the County as part of a right-of-way vacation within the original 1915 Plat of Lakeshore Addition. Today, this land area is not needed for any public use, and is considered excess / surplus right-of-way. Additionally, TNR staff can not envision a plausible scenario in which this property would be needed for any public purpose. Consequently, TNR believes that the disposition (sale) of this ROW is prudent, warranted, and in the public's best interest. For a copy of the written request to purchase this ROW, please see the letter dated September 1, 2009, from the attorney representing the proposed buyers (O'Connell and Stassen), and attached as Exhibit "B". The owners have completed all the necessary and required steps and actions required for the purchase of excess, unused ROW, and are willing to pay the $\$ 4,100$ appraised value for the 135 square feet. This value is equivalent to just over $\$ 30$ per square foot, or $\$ 1.3$ million per acre, and was provided in an appraisal of the subject tract by W.F. Smith Company.

TNR recommends approval of this proposed sale. Through this agenda item, staff is asking the Commissioners' Court to consider the matter, and if a sale is approved by the Court at the appraised value, to direct a Commissioner of Sale. Typically, this individual is the County Commissioner for the precinct in which the property is located.

## FISCAL AND BUDGETARY IMPACT

The proposed sales price for the requested transaction is $\$ 4,100$. If consummated, these funds would go to the County's General Fund. No other direct financial considerations are associated with this proposed action.

The law firm of Clark, Thomas \& Winters, a Professional Corporation represents Drs. Deborah O'Connell and William Stassen ("Clients"), owners of the property located at 4109 Lakeplace Lane, Lot 113 Lakeshore Addition in Austin, Travis County, Texas. Our Clients request the disposition of excess right-of-way for one parcel of land that is adjacent to their residence.
