Summary and Staff Recommendation:

When this was last considered in Commissioners Court the order neglected to include Exhibit "B". Therefore the applicant wanted a corrected Order. We were advised by an Assistant County Attorney to redo the whole process.

The right of way of Paseo Sur was dedicated by the plat of Arroyo Doble Section Four as recorded at Vol. 74 Page 67 of the Plat Records of Travis County, Texas. Paseo Sur was never constructed or maintained by Travis County. The current owners of Lot 12, Block A and Lot 1, Block B have requested that the right-of-way be rejected and revert back to their adjacent lots. The utility companies have indicated that they have no need for the right-of-way. Travis County has inspected the area and does not need it to be retained as a drainage easement. The applicants have collected signatures from many of their neighbors who indicate that they have no objection to the rejection. TNR recommends that the court approve this Order of Rejecting the Dedication of Paseo Sur.

Additional research has shown that there is a 7.5' Public Utility Easement, dedicated by the plat and running along the back of this row of lots, which needs to remain on this tract. There is also a 15' Drainage Easement, dedicated by Vol. 6098 Pg. 259 and running across the back of this row of lots, that needs to remain on this tract. The applicant has also supplied a sign off from the City of Austin Transportation Department stating that they have no need for this right-of-way.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

There is no budgetary impact.

Issues and Opportunities:

This is an opportunity to correct the fact that one of the Exhibits was not specifically noted in the Order.

ORDER REJECTING THE DEDICATION OF AND ABANDONING RIGHT OF WAY FOR PASEO SUR

WHEREAS, streets in the Arroyo Doble Section 4 Subdivision ("the Subdivision") were dedicated to the public pursuant to a plat recorded at Volume 74, Page 67, Plat Records of Travis County, Texas ("the Plat"); and

WHEREAS, among the streets dedicated was Paseo Sur, which lies between Lot 1, Block B, and Lot 12, Block A, Arroyo Doble Section 4 Subdivision, and which was intended to provide for adequate traffic circulation if adjacent property was densely developed; and

WHEREAS, Travis County has not accepted the dedication of Paseo Sur an does not intend to construct a public street in the Paseo Sur right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, adjacent lot owners object to construction of Paseo Sur as a public street and have requested Travis County to formally forego the right to construct a public street there; and

WHEREAS, rejection of the dedication of and abandonment of Paseo Sur will not deny access or utility service to adjacent land within or outside the Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the rejection of the dedication of the north half of the road "Exhibit A" was approved by the Travis County Commissioners Court on August 28, 2000, and recorded at Doc #2000147910 on September 14, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the rejection of dedication omitted "Exhibit B"; and

WHEREAS, the Travis County Commissioners Court ("the Court") has scheduled an agenda item for this date to consider and provide an opportunity for public comment on this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COURT FINDS AND ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The recitals to this Order are true and correct and are incorporated in this Order for all purposes.
- 2. Rejection of the dedication and the abandonment of the public's interest in, Paseo Sur will not interfere with the established legal rights of any person.
- 3. The dedication of Paseo Sur, as described in Exhibit "B", which are attached to and incorporated in this Order, is hereby rejected and abandoned and the public's interest in the right-of-way is relinquished, with the exception of the 7.5' public utility easement dedicated by the Plat and the 15' drainage easement dedicated by instrument filed at Vol. 6098, Page 259, Travis County Real Property Records, the public's interest in both being hereby reserved.
- 4. This Order shall be filed in the Travis County Official Public Records.



Dear Mr. Manilla,

My husband and I, as well as the other adjoining property owners (Larry and Jeanette Ybarra), are very opposed to having a roadway/train crossing placed adjacent to our home and pray that you will deny the Hopkins' request for permission to do so.

The Hopkins purchased the property with full knowledge of the available ingress and egress to the property. They already have full and legal access on to their property via the crossing on Horsethief Trail which is only 1500 feet south of the location they are requesting. If they felt that the new roadway was of material importance to their ability to enjoy the property, they had every opportunity prior to purchasing it to explore the possibility of having the crossing built. They could have made approval of such a crossing a condition of the sale. They chose not to. Attached is a copy of the sales listing for the property as it appeared in the Austin MLS. Access and directions to the property are clearly described.

There is no burden that would be relieved if the crossing is permitted to be built. The crossing would benefit the Hopkins in a minor way but could have serious negative implications to the character of our neighborhood. Viento Del Sur is currently a quiet "back loop" of the neighborhood and is traveled only by those who live here. The proposed crossing would create traffic where none currently exists, thereby turning what is now an interior neighborhood street into an artery for others to use.

There are many other factors which should be considered as well. Safety, noise from additional whistle blowing, easy access to the tracks by children in the area where none currently exists, and what will surely be strong opposition from other neighbors once news of the proposed crossing is made known.

Please do not grant Mr. Hopkins request. Nothing good could come from it.

Gentlemen:

We are writing this letter to notify Travis County and Union Pacific that we oppose the approval of a requested permit by David and Elaine Hopkins to build a drive across our properties. Travis County and Union Pacific own the rights to an easement across our properties located at 13004 and 13100 Viento Del Sur. On the plat records this easement is identified as Paseo Sur. We understand that the Hopkins' have applied for a driveway permit on that easement to gain access to property they purchased last fall located behind us, as well as to gain accessibility to Lowden Lane. They already have access to their property by way of Horsethief Trail, an existing road at the end of the subdivision.

These two properties, including the easement section, have been owned and maintained by us, the owners, for at least 17 consecutive years (Larry and Jeanette Ybarra have lived and maintained their property and the easement for 17 years; the Crosslands have owned and maintained the adjoining property and the easement for approximately 4 years). We were told when we purchased these properties as early as 17 years ago, and have been reassured many times since, that a road would never be built across the easement.

<u>Drainage/Greenbelt Flow</u>: Any driveway or crossover located here would interfere with the natural flow of excess water from the subdivision, very likely causing flooding on either or both of our properties. Flooding or drainage problems would probably occur on other properties in the surrounding area as well.

Increased Traffic: While initially the Hopkins might intend to be the sole users of the driveway, they cannot monitor its use by others. As time goes on, they will not be able to maintain it as a "private" drive and we would not be able to deny others the use of the drive to gain access to properties located there. The longer the road is there, the easier it will be for other property owners in that area to use it as a short-cut to those properties. We foresee that it could eventually become a well-used road for our neighborhood. That will put our children in danger, increase the risk of trespassing, and certainly lower the value of our properties.

Access to Railroad Tracks: In the past, access to the railroad tracks in this neighborhood has been minimal, both by Union Pacific personnel and by the public. Any required inspections by Union Pacific at this section of the tracks were nominal because there wasn't crossover here. The inspectors have been able to park on the road in front of our property and walk back to the tracks, or gain access through Horsethief Trail located at the end of the subdivision. Public access has been almost non-existent in the last 17 years, and there has been only one accident on this section of the tracks during that time (unfortunately, it was a fatality involving a young man). Again, if there is a drive/road through to the tracks, it puts our children in increased danger and increases the risks for Union Pacific, as well as our properties.

Access by Travis County/Other Utilities: The County and other utilities companies have been able to have access to the area in the same manner as the railroad personnel. There have not been any problems with this arrangement as long as we have lived here. Access to the area via a drive/road increases the traffic over the fiber-optic cable area and increases the maintenance required by utility personnel.

Purchase or Permit for the Easement: We were not aware that the Paseo Sur casement was available for purchase by an individual. If that is the case, we request that we be given the option to buy the easement rights. As the owners of the properties on which the easement is located, we feel we should have the first opportunity to buy it. Please let us know what the cost would be to us. In the alternative, we request that we be given the opportunity to apply for a permit across the casement so that we might have superior control of its use. In either case, we would certainly continue to allow the county and railroad personnel to have use of the land.

We adamantly oppose approval of the Hopkins' application to build a drive across the Paseo Sur easement. It appears to us that Mr. Hopkins simply wants a shortcut to his property across our properties, and we will not agree to give him that.

I request that you modify an active contract with Klotz Associates, Inc. (contract number 08AE0209LP) to increase the contract amount by \$ 35,920. This amount will be used to compensate the Consultant for additional construction phase services needed for the Wells Branch Parkway and Thermal Drive Sidewalk Improvement project.

This modification is requested due to ongoing "engineering in the field" nature of the project, the current performance of the low bidder Ceda Tex Services, and additional services needed to accommodate the proposed turn lane on Wells Branch Parkway at Summit Drive, Contract 09AE0284LP, vendor BWR. TNR recommends using Klotz Associates instead of soliciting construction phase services from a new consultant because Klotz is the project design engineer. SUBJECT: Information Regarding Assistance to those Affected by Haiti Earthquake

On January 12, 2010, Haiti experienced an earthquake registering 7.0 on the Richter Scale and subsequent seismic activity that caused extensive damage to property and infrastructure leaving the country and its residents in chaos with little potable water, food or shelter. According to information from the European Union, in addition to an estimated 200,000 deaths and 250,000 persons left injured, over 1.5 million people have been left homeless. Local hospitals and government services do not have the resources to meet the needs of the massive numbers of people presenting for assistance. The U.S. State Department Operations Center suggests that Americans seeking information about family members in Haiti should call 1-888-407-4747.

While there has been an unprecedented outpouring of pledged assistance from the International community targeted at addressing the country's needs, few organizations have the experience and capability to positively impact that community's quickly worsening conditions. The American Red Cross and other established aid organizations are uniquely situated to provide aid and disaster relief in the form of food, medicine and clothing.

Due to the cost of sorting, packing and transporting, these organizations are usually unable to accept individual in-kind donations or collections of clothing, food or cleaning supplies. The Red Cross has suggested that financial contributions to established aid organizations make the greatest impact.

To ensure that your contribution finds its way to the area in need in a timely manner, the FBI advises that you:

- Do not respond to any unsolicited (spam) incoming e-mails, including clicking links contained within those messages;
- Be skeptical of individuals representing themselves as surviving victims or officials asking for donations via e-mail or social networking sites;
- Be cautious of e-mails that claim to show pictures of the disaster areas in attached files because the files may contain viruses and could infect your computer. Only open attachments from known senders;

PBO Recommendation:

Juvenile Probation is requesting Commissioners Court approval of the annual grant application to the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division for the existing Juvenile Assessment Center Grant Program. The supplemental funding supports the program, which provides juveniles with a comprehensive Adolescent Severity Inventory (substance abuse), a mental status examination and screening for developmental disabilities at the front end of the referral process to the department so they can be directed to the appropriate services.

This is the continuation of an existing grant that was first approved in FY 99. The required grant match is met through the department existing budget and no additional resources are needed. In addition, the grant does not require the service level be continued after termination of the grant cycle. PBO recommends approval of this request.

1. Brief Narrative - Summary of Grant: What is the goal of the program? How does the grant fit into the current activities of the department? Is the grant starting a new program, or is it enhancing an existing program?

The Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) Program's purpose is to develop programs that promote greater accountability in the juvenile justice system. Screening and assessing all youth at the front end of the referral process to TCJPD ensures proper service delivery and case management for youth with substance abuse issues, mental health disorders, and/or developmental delays. Proper screening and further assessments where indicated affords juveniles a greater opportunity to change their life-course when given proper supports at onset of activity in the juvenile justice system. The goal of this program is to screen and assess all youth who are referred to TCJPD in a timely fashion and direct them to appropriate services that may be needed to due substance abuse, mental health issues, and/or developmental delays in order to divert them from a path of serious, violent and chronic delinquency.

The grant will pay for one FTE Counselor and/or Therapist (licensed) at 100%). TCJPD will use existing general funds for the 10% required match through a portion of current staff salary, (Counselor and/or Therapist-non-licensed). This staff member works 100% of time on this grant. The total salary is \$32,686. To meet the match requirement, \$12,235 (or 37%) has been calculated which represents the total salary and fringe benefits for this one staff person.

2. Departmental Resource Commitment: What are the long term County funding requirements of the grant?

N/A. There are no long term County commitments.

3. County Commitment to the Grant: Is a county match required? If so, how does the department propose to fund the grant match? Please explain.

The Juvenile Accountability Block Grant program requires a grantee match of at least 10%, which is calculated on the total project costs, not on the amount requested from CJD. The match of \$12,235 requested for the existing .37 staff person represents the 10% match requirement and is being used for personnel and fringe. This cash match will be met through the TCJPD's existing budget; no new funds are being requested for this match.

4. Does the grant program have an indirect cost allocation, in accordance with the grant rules? If not, please explain why not.

A 2% indirect cost rate has been calculated at \$2,159.

5. County Commitment to the Program Upon Discontinuation of Grant by Grantor: Will the program discontinue upon discontinuance of the grant funding? (Yes/No) If No: What is the proposed funding mechanism: (1) Request additional funding (2) Use departmental resources. The Department intends to request subsequent year continuation funding for the Juvenile Assessment Center through proposals submitted to the Federal and State government, as well as private foundations. As previously presented to the Court, the County will have the opportunity to consider investment in the assessment center as well as other areas of Substance Abuse Services only after all other sources of funding have been exhausted.

The Juvenile Assessment Center will continue to improve systems of screenings and assessments which result in more appropriate treatment placement.

In Travis County, juvenile offenders with unidentified challenges (mental health issues, substance abuse, and developmental delays, to name a few) have lower success rates of compliance with societal rules in general and more stringent rules of probation in particular. If these challenges remain unidentified, these same youth return to Court as a result of non-compliance or subsequent offenses.

Juveniles referred to TCJPD receive assessments to screen for metal health and substance abuse issues through the Juvenile Assessment Center (JAC) prior to adjudication. By accurately assessing youth early in the process, juvenile offenders are directed to the most appropriate treatment services to receive the proper support needed in order to reduce the likelihood of re-offending. The JAC rapidly screens and assesses referred youth; increases efficiency, and reduces the number of supervision violations by identifying challenges at the front-end of the juvenile-justice process, challenges underlying substance abuse, mental health, educational, and developmental obstacles. In FY 08, 35% (608/1,745) juveniles indicated a need for further mental health assessments. Furthermore, 46% (615/1,327) indicated a need for further substance abuse screening. Those whose mental health assessment identified a mental health need had a lower rate of recidivism (13%) than those in the general population who did not (21%). Conversely, those identified as having a substance abuse treatment need had a higher recidivism rate (22%) than those in the general population who did not (14%).

Often problems are identified after adjudication or disposition, many times resulting as an issue of non-compliance or even subsequent offenses. In FY08, there were 5,789 youth referred to the Travis County Juvenile Probation Department for a criminal offense/violation of probation. All Juveniles referred to Travis County Juvenile Probation Department (TCJPD) receive a Substance Use Survey (SUS) Screening Inventory. When indicated by the SUS, a Comprehensive Assessment Severity Inventory (CASI) is completed by a qualified credential counselor. The assessment will then undergo a multi-disciplinary staffing that will identify the needed services and any additional assessments. 

REASON FOR NON-ROUTINE ACTION

The Juvenile Probation Department needs to fill a vacancy created by the retirement of Juvenile Probation Director at the Domestic Relations Office. The Department wants to internally promote an employee with the title of Attorney VI and provide the employee with an eight (8) percent pay increase. However, due to fact that the Attorney VI job classification is currently in a higher pay grade (28) than the job classification of Juvenile Probation Dir (27), the requested action cannot be processed as a promotion. According to Travis County Code § 10.03008, a promotion can only occur "when an employee accepts the offer of a job assigned to a higher pay grade".

As a result, the personnel action must be processed under County Code §10.03009 (Voluntary Job Change). According to this section of the Code,

- (b) The Elected and Appointed Officials and Department Heads have flexibility in determining the amount of pay adjustment. The pay adjustment may be any of the following:
 - (1) If the employee returns to a job from which he or she was promoted within the last 12 months, the decrease is equivalent to the amount of the promotional increase, or
 - (2)If not returning to a former position, the adjustment is from minimum up to midpoint, (may use Pay Determination Guide) or:
 - (3)If not returning to a former position, there is a decrease of 5% for each pay grade that the position is lower than the former position.

Under the conditions specified under this section of the Code, a non-routine action is required to process this personnel action with the requested salary increase.

Issues

Under current policy, a salary increase cannot accompany a voluntary job change. The proposed salary increase would place the employee above midpoint in pay grade 27, which contradicts (b)(2) above. Additionally, since the employee is not returning to a former position, (b)(3) above would indicate a 5% decrease is another potential outcome.

Analysis

Juvenile Probation's request indicates that the Department views the action as a functional promotion due to the increased supervisory and administrative requirements inherent in the Director job. However, the employee resides in a higher pay grade due to the fact that the Attorney VI job classification is an advanced professional job, to which the market has attached greater value.

HRMD views this situation as an anomaly situation brought about primarily by the fact that the market sometimes places higher value on advanced professional jobs than it does on managerial jobs. In this case, the Department's perspective is reasonable, and there is little question that this action constitutes a functional promotion within the Department's operational environment. It would be processed as such except for the fact that the current policy defines promotions solely by the pay grade occupied by the incumbent. The increased supervisory and administrative responsibilities that the incumbent will assume warrant the requested salary increase that would typically accompany a promotion. The proposed eight percent increase is consistent with the Court's promotion policy and the internal equity situation with other similarly situated positions within the Department. It should also be noted that the incumbent will still be using the skill set consistent with a practicing attorney in the conduct of official duties. Under these conditions, HRMD agrees with Juvenile Probation's proposed course of action as a reasonable proposal under the current constraints of the County Code.

HRMD Recommendation

HRMD strongly supports the request made by Juvenile Probation. Per PBO, funding is available for the request.

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

The City of Austin site plan reviewer requested that the County provide a unified development agreement for the New Precinct One Office Building Project so that the County can secure the permit for the construction of the project. The City Reviewer's comment is as follow:

"This site covers two tracts. For the proposed site plan, please provide an approved and recorded <u>Unified Development Agreement</u> that clearly ties these lots together for the construction, use, and maintenance of the proposed Detention facility. Please submit this document to this reviewer. This reviewer will coordinate with the Legal Department for review and approval. For any legal document questions please contact Annette Bogusch - WPDRD Legal Liaison (974-6483). Please be aware this process takes some time..."

Facilities Management Department (FMD) zoned the two tracts, plus the vacated ROW that divided them so that it is all one site - at least according to the Zoning Department. Watershed Protection and Development Review Department sees two tracts where there were three tracts and now is one tract.

Facilities Management Department recommends approval of the attached Unified Development Agreement which was reviewed by Tenley Aldredge, Travis County Assistant Attorney so that the City of Austin can grant the County the needed permit to start the construction of the New Precinct One Office Building.

DECLARATION OF EASEMENTS AND RESTRICTIVE COVENANT REGARDING UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT

AND MAINTENANCE OF DRAINAGE FACILITIES

This Declaration of Easements and Restrictive Covenant Regarding Unified Development and Maintenance of Drainage Facilities for New Precinct One Office Building, (this "Declaration"), is executed this _____ day of______, 20 Travis County, ("Declarant") and is as follows:

RECITALS

- Declarant owns land particularly described as out of and a part of the Jesse C. A. Tannehill League, Abstract No. 22 in Travis County, Texas, same being the Tracts conveyed to Travis County, Texas by the following instruments;
 - All of the 1.797 acres of land conveyed by deed executed on September 1. 15, 1951, filed for record on September 17, 1951 recorded in Volume 1200, Page 421 of the deed records of Travis County, Texas; (Tract One).
 - All of the 0.373 of one acre of land conveyed by Quitclaim deed executed 2. on August 18, 2009 recorded in Document 2009139972 of the official public records of Travis County, Texas; (Vacated Right -of-Way).
 - All of the 2.153 acres of land conveyed by special warranty deed executed 3. on December 26, 2002, filed for record on December 27, 2002 recorded in Document 2002250681 of the official public records of Travis County, Texas. (Tract Two).

Tract One, Tract Two and the Vacated Right -of-Way are collectively referenced as the "Property", and are described on EXHIBIT A, attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

B. Definitions:

Owners. The term "Owner" means, individually, and the term "Owners" means, collectively, Declarant and all future owners of the fee interest or any portion of the Property (whether such fee interest is obtained through a purchase from Declarant or through a purchase at a foreclosure sale or trustee's sale or through a deed in lieu of foreclosure) and their successors and assigns.

Facilities. The term "Facilities" means those drainage facilities that convey and receive stormwater runoff from the Property and that are described on EXHIBIT B, attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Declarant has agreed to impose upon the Property these covenants and conditions C. for the benefit of the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, Declarant declares that the Property is subject to the following covenants, conditions and restrictions, which run with the Property and bind all parties having right, title, or interest in or to such portion of the Property or any part, their respective heirs, successors, and assigns, and which inure to the benefit of each Owner. Each contract, deed or conveyance of any kind conveying all or a portion of the Property will conclusively be held to have been executed, delivered, and accepted subject to the following covenants, conditions and restrictions, regardless of whether or not they are set out in full or by reference in said contract, deed or conveyance.

SPECIFIC AGREEMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS:

- 1. <u>Recitals Incorporated</u>. The above Recitals and all terms defined therein are incorporated into this Restrictive Covenant for all purposes.
- 2. <u>Unified Development</u>. For purposes of site plan review, modification, or approval by the City of Austin, the Property will be constructed as a unified development/single site. Any proposed modifications to Tract One, Tract Two, or the vacated Right-of-Way or any portion of either Tract or the vacated Right-of-Way will be construed as a modification to a single site, requiring review of Tract One, Tract Two, and the vacated Right-of-Way in accordance with the provisions of the Land Development Code of the City of Austin. This section applies to, but is not limited to, the extent of impervious coverage, parking, and landscaping of the Property.
- 3. <u>Easement to the Owners</u>. Declarant hereby grants and conveys and by these presents does GRANT AND CONVEY unto the Owners, a non-exclusive easement for the inspection, monitoring, operation, maintenance, replacement, upgrade and repair, as applicable, of the Facilities in, upon and across portions of the Property as more particularly described in **EXHIBIT** C attached hereto and incorporated by reference (the "Easement Tract").

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same perpetually to the Owners and its successors and assigns, together with the privilege at any and all times to enter the Easement Tract for the purpose of operating, inspecting, monitoring, maintaining, replacing, upgrading and repairing, as applicable, the Facilities. This easement is made and accepted subject to all easements, covenants, restrictions, liens, and other encumbrances of record in Travis County, Texas affecting the Easement Tract.

4. <u>Easement to the City of Austin.</u> Declarant hereby grants and conveys and by these presents does GRANT AND CONVEY unto the City of Austin, whose address is Post Office Box 1088, Austin, Texas 78767-1088, Attn: Planning and Development Review Department, a non-exclusive easement for the inspection, monitoring, operation, maintenance, replacement, upgrade and repair, as applicable, of the Facilities in, upon and across the Easement Tract.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same perpetually to the City of Austin and its successors and assigns, together with the privilege at any and all times to enter the Easement Tract for the purpose of operating, inspecting, monitoring, maintaining, replacing, upgrading and repairing, as applicable, the Facilities. This easement is made and accepted subject to all easements, covenants, restrictions, liens, and other encumbrances of record in Travis County, Texas affecting the Easement.

- 5. <u>Maintenance</u>. The Owners shall continuously maintain the Facilities in accordance with the requirements of the City and in a good and functioning condition. The portion of the Property on which the Facilities are located may not be used for any purpose inconsistent with or detrimental to the proper operation of the Facilities. Each Owner is jointly and severally liable for the maintenance of the Facilities.
- 6. Notice of City Entry. The City shall give the Owners thirty (30) days' prior written notice of the City's intent to enter all or part of the Easement Tract for the purpose of operating, maintaining, replacing, upgrading, or repairing, as applicable, the Facilities; provided, however, that in the event of an emergency, the City shall be required to give prior notice within a reasonable period of time. Reasonableness shall be determined in accordance with the nature of circumstances of the emergency. The City shall have the right to enter the Easement Tract without prior written notification for the purpose of monitoring and inspection only.
- Joint Access. Joint access must be provided between Tract One, Tract Two, and the vacated Right-of-Way on Site Plan No. SPC-2009-0283C, over an area more particularly described in **EXHIBIT D**, attached and incorporated by reference. The joint access must allow pedestrian and/or vehicular traffic to move freely to the adjacent public right-of-way, or between Tract One, Tract Two, and the vacated Right-of-Way, or both. Any change of any aspect of Tract One, Tract Two, or the vacated Right-of-Way may not interfere with this joint access. Each Owner is responsible and liable for maintaining the Owner's property contained within the access area described in **EXHIBIT D** in such a manner as to provide the required joint access.
- 8. Parking. All parking for developments within Site Plan No.SPC-2009-0283C must be reciprocal. In this Declaration, "reciprocal parking" means that the parking within Site Plan No. SPC-2009-0283C must serve Tract One, Tract Two, and the vacated Right-of-Way. Any change of any aspect of Tract One, Tract Two, or the vacated Right-of-Way may not interfere with the reciprocal parking agreement between the Tracts and the vacated Right-of-Way. Each Owner is responsible and liable for maintaining the Owner's property to allow the required reciprocal parking.
- 9. <u>Breach Does Not Permit Termination</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, no breach of this Declaration entitles the Owners to cancel, rescind or otherwise terminate this Declaration, but such limitations do not affect in any manner any other rights or remedies which the Owners may have hereunder by reason of any breach of this Declaration.

- 10. Excusable Delays. Whenever performance is required of the Owners, the Owners shall use all due diligence to perform and take all reasonable and necessary measures in good faith to perform within a reasonable time; provided, however, that if completion of performance is delayed at any time by reasons of acts of God, war, civil commotion, riots, strikes, picketing, or other labor disputes, unavailability of labor or material, damage to work in progress by reason of fire or other casualty, or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the Owner (financial inability, imprudent management or negligence excepted), then the time for performance as herein specified will be extended by the amount of delay actually so caused.
- 11. <u>Conveyance</u>. Intentionally Deleted.

12. General Provisions.

- A. <u>Inurement</u>. This Declaration and the restrictions created hereby inure to the benefit of and bind Owners, and their successors and assigns. When an Owner conveys all or any portion of the Property, that former Owner will thereupon be released and discharged from any and all further obligations, if any, under this Declaration that it had in connection with the Property conveyed by it from and after the date of recording of such conveyance, but no such sale releases that former Owner from any liabilities, if any, actual or contingent, existing as of the time of such conveyance.
- B. <u>Duration</u>. Unless modified, amended, or terminated in accordance with Paragraph 12(K), this Declaration remains in effect in perpetuity.
- C. <u>Non-Merger</u>. This Declaration will not be subject to the doctrine of merger, even though the underlying fee ownership of the Property, or any parts thereof, is vested in one party or entity.
- D. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Declaration must be deemed to be independent and severable, and the invalidity or partial invalidity of any provision or portion hereof does not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision.
- E. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Declaration, and the exhibits attached hereto contain all the representations and the entire agreement between the parties to this Restrictive Covenant with respect to the subject matter hereof. Any prior correspondence, memoranda or agreements are superseded in total by this Declaration and the exhibits attached hereto. The provisions of this Declaration will be construed as a whole according to their common meaning and not strictly for or against any Owner.

- F. <u>Captions</u>. The captions preceding the text of each section and subsection hereof are included only for convenience of reference and will be disregarded in the construction and interpretation of this Declaration.
- G. <u>Governing Law; Place of Performance</u>. This Declaration and all rights and obligations created hereby will be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. This Declaration is performable only in the county in Texas where the Property is located.
- H. Notices. Any Notice to the Owners or the City must be in writing and given by delivering the same to such party in person, by expedited, private carrier services (such as Federal Express) or by sending the same by certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid to the intended recipient's last known mailing address. All notices under this Declaration will be deemed given, received, made or communicated on the date personal delivery is effected or, if mailed, on the delivery date or attempted delivery date shown on the return receipt.
- I. <u>Negation of Partnership</u>. None of the terms or provisions of this Declaration will be deemed to create a partnership between or among the Declarant, any Owner, or the City of Austin in their respective businesses or otherwise; nor will it cause them to be considered joint ventures or members of any joint enterprise.
- J. <u>Enforcement</u>. If any person, persons, corporation, or entity of any other character, violates or attempts to violate this Declaration, it will be lawful for the City of Austin, its successors and assigns, to prosecute proceedings at law, or in equity, against the person or entity violating or attempting to violate this Declaration and to prevent said person or entity from violating or attempting to violate such covenant. The failure at any time to enforce this Declaration by the City of Austin, its successors and assigns, whether any violations hereof are known or not, does not constitute a waiver or estoppel of the right to do so.
- K. Modification and Amendment. This Declaration may only be modified, amended or terminated upon the filing of a written modification, amendment or termination document in the Official Records of Travis County, Texas, executed, acknowledged and approved by (a) the Director of the Planning and Development Review Department of the City of Austin or successor department; and (b) all of the Owners of the Property at the time of the modification, amendment, or termination.

In March 2009 the Commissioners Court approved changes to the **STAR** Flight Dispatch Matrix. Once those changes were being implemented in the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system, priority conflicts between mission types were identified. The attached dispatch matrix provides recommended changes that will remove those conflicts.

In addition, the new dispatch matrix clarifies Austin based hospitals. This designation was originally applied to hospitals in the core of Travis County. Just as Travis County continues to grow and population densities change, so does our community's medical centers. This dispatch matrix expands what are considered Austin based hospitals and allows the residents of Travis County and Central Texas to select the hospital that meets their personal and healthcare needs.

The recommended changes are highlighted in red for easy identification and review.

The service area and approval processes previously approved by the Commissioners Court remain unchanged.

STAR FLIGHT Dispatch Matrix

STAR Flight is a specialized emergency medical/public safety resource tasked with six (6) *primary and six (6) secondary response missions. Rapidly prioritizing multiple **STAR** Flight requests can be difficult. This matrix defines dispatch protocols for **STAR** Flight helicopters and assists in managing competing requests for service. All calls should be triaged using the Austin/Travis County **STAR** Flight Triage Cards or Medical Priority Dispatch (for in system medicine/trauma)

Response areas have been broken into three categories In System (Austin/Travis County), Out of System (Nineteen County Primary Service Area exclusive of Travis County), and Out of Area (Requests in a County not in the Out of Systems Primary Service area)

Response types have been broken into five Categories (Scene, Hospital, Rescue, Search, Law and Fire). Each Category may also have sub-sections that may require additional call screening or approval processes. The typing for each mission type allows for additional risk/benefit assessment and appropriateness review. The mission type has been assigned a priority, which is shown in the top of the matrix cell for each response area. These priorities are to be used similar to Medical Priority Dispatch priorities for comparing one call to another.

*Scene – Medical: The priority is first response in Travis County and the rapid transport of time sensitive and critical medicine patients.

- <u>First Response</u> (Travis County only)-**STAR** Flight's priority is the rapid delivery of ALS personnel/equipment
 and stabilization of medicine patients. Initial unit recommendations on MPD Priority 1 and 2 medical calls,
 Communications will use the CAD response time estimation of the closest ALS resource (>20 minutes) to
 determine if a **STAR** Flight response is warranted.
- <u>Secondary Response</u>- On scene requests for STAR Flight assistance for medical patients should normally be
 made by ON SCENE system credentialed personnel. The majority of medicine patients seen and treated by
 ALS resources can be stabilized in the field and do not require aero medical transport. Exceptions may include
 STROKE or STEMI ALERT patients with transport times greater than the notification, response, scene and
 transport times of STAR Flight. STAR Flight may be requested for clinical capability beyond the on scene
 resources (PAI, Blood Administration)

*Scene - Trauma: The priority is the rapid transport of TRAUMA ALERT and when appropriate TRAUMA TRANSPORT patients.

 <u>First Response</u> (Travis County) - The inclusion of **STAR** Flight in the initial unit response should be based on several factors, which include severity/number of patients, response time of the closest ALS transport units and transport time to University Medical Center at Brackenridge (adult patients) or Dell Children's Hospital (pediatric).

<u>Secondary Response</u>- (Travis County)- On scene requests for **STAR** Flight for trauma patients can be requested by ON SCENE system credentialed personnel. This should take into account the notification, response, estimated scene and transport times of **STAR** Flight. Under normal circumstances there should be some time savings to justify the increased expense and risk associated with aero medical transport. The ATCEMS System has currently identified 5 minutes as that patient benefit time. This does not include pin-in, entrapment or multi-patient situations. **STAR** Flight may be requested for clinical capability beyond the on scene resources (PAI, Blood Administration)

(Outside Travis County)- At the request of EMS, Fire or Law Enforcement personnel with credible information

- *Hospital Medical: Tertiary hospitals may not be equipped to provide definitive care to critical or time sensitive medicine patients. These requests should be treated the same as scene medicine patients, based on the tertiary hospitals report of whether the patient is stable or not and the time sensitivity of their illness.
- *Hospital Trauma: Tertiary hospitals are typically not equipped to provide definitive care to TRAUMA ALERT and some TRAUMA TRANSPORT patients. These requests should be handled the same as any other trauma patient that requires rapid transport to a Trauma or Specialized Care Center.
- *Rescue Life Threat: Any situation that poses a known and verified threat to the safety of the victim/patient. It is not dependent upon injury at the time of request. Examples include person trapped on the roof of their car, house or in a tree surrounded by water, victims of falls from cliffs or patients with significant medical illnesses/traumatic injuries in inaccessible or delayed transport environments.
- Rescue Non-Life/Non-Verified Threat: Any situation where there is NO verified threat to the safety of the victim/patient. Examples include boats taking on water, patients in inaccessible environments with minor medical conditions or injuries (lacerations, sprains etc)
- *Search Life Threat: Any situation that poses a known and verified threat to the safety of the victim/patient. A confirmed missing person is considered an emergency. It is not dependent upon injury at the time of request. Examples include confirmed missing persons with known last points seen, especially the young/elderly or those with diminished mental capacity or pre-existing medical conditions. (Autistic, Alzheimer's, Downs Syndrome etc).
- **Search Non-Life/Non-Verifies Threat:** Any situation where there is NO verified threat or point last seen. Examples include missing/overdue hikers/bikers, rafters/tubers and boaters in large undefined search areas.
- Law Life or Public Safety Threat: Requests for assistance from Law Enforcement agencies for aviation support that is a direct threat to law enforcement officers or general public safety. Examples include officer needs assistance in difficult access areas, vehicle pursuits or suspects with direct, verifiable threat to law enforcement personnel or the general public
- Law Non-Life/Non-Verified Threat: Requests for assistance from Law Enforcement agencies for surveillance, searches for fleeing suspects with no direct threat to law enforcement officers or the general public. Examples include suspects that fled from traffic stops, unarmed robbery or minor assaults or thefts.
- **Fire Life or Residential Structure Threat:** Requests for assistance from Fire agencies for aviation support that is a direct, verified threat to life or residential structures. Examples include fires threatening residential structures. Sub-divisions, general public or fire fighter safety.
- **Fire Non-Life/Non-Residential Structure Threat:** Requests for assistance from Fire agencies for aviation support. Examples include surveillance only or suppression in difficult to reach areas with ground resources or limited ground resources with no threat to general public, fire fighters or residential structures.

 - Remember: it takes an average of 10 minutes to rig the helicopter for rescue operations

Law and Fire

- Out-of-System MUST have STAR Flight Command approval.
- Remember: it takes an average of 10-15 minutes to rig (and remove) the FIRE Bucket

Diverting

- Only to a higher priority call
- In-System Scene
 - ♦ Divert from medical scene to trauma scene based system status (i.e. JUDGMENT CALL- consider flight time, ground response, number / condition of patient(s))
- Out-of-System
 - ♦ The **STAR** Flight Command MUST approve of ALL OUT-of-SYSTEM diversions. Someone from **STAR** Flight Command group with Operational Authority will be available by cell phone/pager at all times for diversion or mission approvals. This number will be continuously updated in Communications
- Fire Bucket
 - Prior to diverting from a Fire Bucket operation, contact Pilot or Crew Chief to confirm estimated time it
 will take to remove bucket and if necessary re-fuel

The **STAR** Flight management team has completed a review of our current fee structure. We recommend to the Commissioners Court that the following increases be approved:

Travis County resident lift-off fee from \$2,700 to \$3,400

Non Travis County resident lift-off fee from \$7,000 to \$7,500

The current Travis County resident lift-off fee is below the Medicare allowable and should be increased to achieve maximum reimbursement for these transports. The increase will also address increasing maintenance costs along with reduced reimbursements and settlements that are occurring as a result of tough economic times. The **STAR** Flight Business Plan recommended an increase for FY10 for Travis County residents.

The Non Travis County resident lift-off fee increase is based upon increasing maintenance costs and reduced reimbursement and settlements that are occurring as a result of the tough economic times. The *STAR Flight* Business Plan recommended this increase for FY10 for Non Travis County residents.

The proposed fee increases are still very competitive within the air medical industry, especially when you consider the capability and safety equipment of the *STAR Flight* aircraft and personnel.
