Review and approve requests regarding grant programs, applications, contracts and permissions to continue:

- A. Amendment to the contract with the Corporation for National and Community Service (through the OneStar Foundation) for Health and Human Services and Veterans Service, to deobligate unspent funds from the FY 12 award for the AmeriCorps Program; and
- B. Approve permission to continue the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program and use Health and Human Services and Veterans Service's budget for related operating expenses until the forthcoming FY 12 agreement is fully executed.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND ATTACHMENTS:

Item A is an amendment to the existing AmeriCorps Contract to close out the current grant. As part of the Closeout process, the grantor has asked the County to deobligate \$11,000. Since the grant goes through the Onestar Foundation, the contract modification also deobligates \$111.11 to Onestar for a total deobligation of \$11,111.11.

Item B is an extension of an existing Permission to continue. The department expects the Contract to be ready in the third quarter, but an additional continuation is needed to avoid a gap in service.

This contract amendment will deobligate \$11,111.11 from the AmeriCorps grant due to the county being unable to spend the full amount of funding that was awarded by the Corporation for National and Community Service through the OneStar Foundation. The decrease is split between Travis County (\$11,000) and the OneStar Foundation (1,111.11). The funding deobligation is related to AmeriCorps staff members leaving the program before their term was completed and does not reflect any problems on Travis County's part. PBO recommends approval of this grant deobligation.

1. Brief Narrative - Summary of Grant: What is the goal of the program? How does the grant fit into the current activities of the department? Is the grant starting a new program, or is it enhancing an existing program?

Travis County 4-H CAPITAL uses the AmeriCorps members to expand its after-school programs.

2. Departmental Resource Commitment: What are the long term County funding requirements of the grant?

There are no county funding requirements once the grant ends. There is a cash and in-kind match required while the grant is in progress.

3. County Commitment to the Grant: Is a county match required? If so, how does the department propose to fund the grant match? Please explain.

The grant requires a cash and in-kind match totaling \$419,106. These matches will come from 4-H CAPITAL, the Texas AgriLife Extension Service, and TCHHSVS. The grant is revenue neutral. It will not increase the General Fund budget.

4. Does the grant program have an indirect cost allocation, in accordance with the grant rules? If not, please explain why not.

The grant allows for a 4% indirect cost allocation for the county and 1% (\$3,019) for the OneStar Foundation. The county is not claiming its 4% allocation because this would raise the cost per FTE from its current \$15,052 to \$15,680 and make it uncompetitive.

5. County Commitment to the Program Upon Discontinuation of Grant by Grantor: Will the program discontinue upon discontinuance of the grant funding? (Yes/No) If No: What is the proposed funding mechanism: (1) Request additional funding (2) Use departmental resources. Travis County 4-H CAPITAL will continue to offer after-school programs once the grant ends but not at as many locations.

The grant allows 4-H CAPITAL to increase the number of sites where it offers after-school programs without increasing General Fund expenditures. This increases the departmental performance measure for educational program participants.

Proposed Motion:

Consider and take appropriate action to approve an amendment deobligating \$11,111.11 in funding from the FY'12 grant for the Travis County CAPITAL AmeriCorps Project.

Summary and Staff Recommendations:

The grant funds 12 full-time, 14 half-time and 4 quarter-time AmeriCorps members who provide after-school enrichment programs each week during the school year at local schools as well as help staff summer camps. The programs focus on science and technology, environmental education, outdoor education, and life skills. Four current Travis County staff provide program coordination and support for the day-to-day activities of the AmeriCorps members.

Travis County will not be able to spend all of the \$298,922 in FY'12 grant funds due to certain AmeriCorps members leaving before completing their terms of service. Therefore, the grant award for the current year is being reduced.

TCHHSVS staff recommends approving this amendment.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

The initial grant award of \$301,941 is being reduced to \$290,829.89. The initial award was comprised of \$298,922 for Travis County and an administrative fee of \$3,019 for the OneStar Foundation. Travis County's share is being reduced by \$11,000 to \$287,922 and the OneStar Foundation fee is being reduced by \$111.11 to \$2,907.89.

The grant requires a combination of cash and in-kind matches totaling \$419,106. These matches come from 4-H CAPITAL, the Texas AgriLife Extension Service, and TCHHSVS. The grant is revenue neutral. It will not increase the General Fund budget. The FY'12 grant runs from 8/1/11 – 7/31/12.

Issues and Opportunities:

Studies show that students who participate in after-school programs have fewer behavior problems, handle conflict better, show improved social skills and enhanced academic performance. AmeriCorps members provide much needed staff to increase the number of after-school programs in Travis County as well as enhance existing programs. Travis County 4-H CAPITAL programs differ from more traditional programs by offering hands-on activities that reinforce key concepts in the curriculum.

Travis County 4-H CAPITAL is a non-profit organization affiliated with the Texas AgriLife Extension Service. The Extension Service provides a variety of educational programs for county youth and adults.

PBO Recommendation:

HHS&VS is requesting a Permission to Continue funding the salaries and benefits of three Office Specialists dedicated to the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) grant for the third quarter of the grant period (June-August 2012). The county continues to negotiate with TDHCA over the contract language regarding the procedures for purchasing audit services.

The department has indicated that it fully expects the contract to be fully executed during the third quarter of the grant period. The grant funds will reimburse the county for these PTC expenditures once the grant contract is executed. PBO recommends approval of this PTC.

1. Brief Narrative - Summary of Grant: What is the goal of the program? How does the grant fit into the current activities of the department? Is the grant starting a new program, or is it enhancing an existing program?

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs has released to Travis County a draft of the 2012 CEAP grant contract. The contract states the award for this grant will be \$2,901,313. This funding provides \$455,078 for salary expenses relating to the allowable tasks of the 3 full-time and 2 part-time temporary workers, and other department staff providing outreach and case management activities. This grant funding also provides \$2,445,035 for utility assistance relating to the three utility component budgets and \$1,200 for training and travel expenses.

The program assists low-income households with heating and cooling energy utility assistance. This helps in meeting the program goal of achieving energy self-sufficiency for low-income families and individuals. Program guidelines allow households to seek utility assistance to address a crisis situation relating to household energy bills or the household situation may need a copayment or multiple payment term to achieve energy self-sufficiency.

The department also utilizes funding from this CEAP program for providing clients with case management services to address other household issues other than those encompassing energy needs.

2. Departmental Resource Commitment: What are the long term County funding requirements of the grant?

No additional funds are required.

3. County Commitment to the Grant: Is a county match required? If so, how does the department propose to fund the grant match? Please explain.

There is no County match required and no commitment by the Court to fund services if funds are discontinued.

This grant's funding source (Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs) only allows for reimbursement costs related to salaries of current and/or temporary staff performing allowable functions associated with case management, administrative and direct services support (outreach). There is no indirect cost allocation.

Funding made available from this program has a dramatic impact on the number of requests that can be met by the department for utility assistance and household appliance issues from Travis County residents.

Proposed Motion: Consider and take appropriate action on the request from Travis County Health and Human Services & Veterans Service for permission to continue funding temporary employees funded by the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) in the 2012 program year until a fully executed contract is obtained from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs.

Program Summary: The department has requested permission to continue these salaries in the amount of \$60,276. for five temporary employees in the 2012 CEAP grant for the next three months, ending August 31, 2012. The grant period for 2012 began January 1, 2012. Prior permission to continue requests for these salaries were approved by Commissioners Court on December 27, 2011 and March 27, 2012. TDHCA has provided a draft of the 2012 CEAP grant contract and the department continues to negotiate with TDHCA over the contract language regarding the procedures for purchasing audit services. The department anticipates the grant contract should be fully executed within the next three months.

These office specialists are needed to continue the services provided by this grant program pending the approval of the grant contract. The department deems it

necessary to retain this staff for maintaining a level of continuity for serving the residents of Travis County with this program assistance.

This funding will be used to fund the revenue and expenditure budgets for the next three months' worth of salary and benefits. The grant will reimburse the General Fund upon execution of the grant contract.

TCHHSVS staff recommends approving the permission to continue.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

The \$60,276. will come from salary savings of vacant slots 171 and 270. No matching funds are required. The current contract period is from 01-01-12 and ends 12-31-12.

Issues and Opportunities: The department uses CEAP funds for direct assistance for qualified clients in Travis County, allowable administrative and case management costs, and allowable direct services support costs for outreach. The grant allows the department to provide assistance to clients who are experiencing an energy-related hardship. This program is designed to assist clients in obtaining energy self-sufficiency and is consistent with the goal of the Travis County Health and Human Services and Veterans Service Department. In the last program year, funds from the CEAP grant were used to assist more than 5,133 households within Travis County.
