Agenda Language: Approve Modification No. 7 to Contract No. 4400000736 (HTE Contract No. PS090110RE),Capital Investing in Development and Employment of Adults (IDEA) for Workforce Development.

Purchasing Recommendation and Comments: Purchasing concurs with department and recommends approval of requested action. This procurement action meets the compliance requirements as outlined by the statutes.

Through this agreement, Capital Investing in Development and Employment of Adults, Inc. (Capital IDEA) provides workforce development services in Travis County.

During the 2011 contract year Capital IDEA left \$113,869 of their Travis County funding unspent. This is a result of a drawdown of their state funding before the expiration of their Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) program.

Modification No. 7 will award Capital IDEA the unspent 2011 contract funding for their Long Term Training Program. The not to exceed contract amount will be \$913,869; an increase of \$113,869 from the original contract amount of \$800,000.

Modification No. 6 renewed the contact for an additional one year period from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. Contact funds for this renewal period are not to exceed \$800,000.

Modification No. 5 provided for a budget adjustment for 2010 funds.

AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT BETWEEN TRAVIS COUNTY AND CAPITAL IDEA FOR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

PARTIES

This Amendment ("Amendment") of Contract is entered into by the following Parties: Travis County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("County"), and Capital IDEA, a nonprofit agency ("Contractor").

RECITALS

County and Contractor entered into an agreement to provide services for the care of indigents, for public health education and information and/or for other authorized services ("Contract") the Initial Term of which began January 1, 2009, and terminated December 31, 2009 ("Initial Contract Term").

Under the Contract, Contractor agreed to provide personal and professional services for the care of indigents and other qualified recipients and for public health education and information, in accordance with the terms of the Contract, thus providing services which further a public purpose.

Pursuant to the terms of the Contract, the Parties have renewed the Contract for an additional term beginning January 1, 2012, and continuing through December 31, 2012 ("2012 Renewal Term").

The Contract provides for changes to the agreement by written agreement signed by both Parties, and the Parties desire to amend the Contract as to the 2012 Renewal Term.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits received by these changes, and other good and adequate consideration as specified herein, the Parties agree to amend the Contract as follows:

1.0 GENERAL TERMS.

1.1 **<u>2012 Renewal Term</u>**. The Parties acknowledge the renewal of the Contract for an additional oneyear term beginning January 1, 2012, and terminating December 31, 2012 ("2012 Renewal Term").

2.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

2.1 <u>Attachments</u>. The Parties agree to amend Section 5.2 of the Contract ("Attachments"), as to the 2012 Renewal Term, by adding the following:

All attachments included in the 2012 Renewal remain in full force and effect; the attachments listed in this Section⁴ 2.1 are services to be provided pursuant to this Amendment which are in addition to those services already required under the 2012 Renewal.

3.0 FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

3.1 <u>2012 Amended Contract Funds.</u> Contract Funds Amount. The Parties agree to amend Section 3.1, "Contract Funds Amount," by adding the following:

3.1-2012 – Amendment. Subject to the requirements of the Contract, as amended, in consideration of the full and satisfactory performance of the services and activities provided by Contractor under the terms of the Contract, as determined by County, County shall provide an additional amount ("Amendment Amount") not to exceed One Hundred Thirteen Thousand, Eight Hundred Sixty-Nine Dollars (\$113,869.00) for a total amount of Contract Funds not to exceed the following amount during the 2012 Renewal Term as amended herein:

2.2 <u>2012 Amended Maximum Funds</u>. The Parties agree to amend Section 6.1, "Maximum Funds," by adding the following:

6.1-2012 - Amendment. Subject to the requirements of this Contract, as amended, County shall provide Contract Funds not to exceed the following amount during the 2012 Renewal Term:

2.3 2012 Amended Fiscal Year Limitations on Funding. The Parties agree to amend Section 6.2.2, "Fiscal Year Division," by deleting the original language and substituting the following:

6.2.2(a) and (b) -2012 During the 2012 Renewal Term, the fiscal year limitations under 6.2.2(a) shall be:

(a)-2012 January 1, 2012 - September 30, 2012 (75% of Original Total of \$800,000.00)

(b)-2012 October 1, 2012 - December 31, 2012

All other provisions of Section 6.2.2 not specifically changed herein shall remain in full force and effect.

3.0 INCORPORATION

3.1 County and Contractor hereby incorporate the Contract into this Amendment. Except for the changes made in this Amendment, County and Contractor hereby ratify all the terms and conditions of the Contract as amended. The Contract with the changes made in this Amendment constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes any prior undertaking or written or oral agreements or representations between the Parties. All provisions in the Contract not specifically amended herein remain the same and in full force and effect.

4.0 EFFECTIVE DATE

4.1 This Amendment is effective the date it is signed by the last Party. This Contract, as amended, shall remain in effect until further modified or terminated in writing by the Parties, or until the termination date.

Agency: Capital IDEA Program: Prerequisite Enrollment

1. Program goals and objectives: Briefly describe the goals and objectives of the services purchased by Travis County in this contract.

Capital IDEA's goal is to provide long-term educational sponsorship to low-income adults so that they can reach life-long self-sufficiency by entering high-skilled, high-paying careers.

This contract will specifically focus on participants at the prerequisite level of their training and will span a three-month period from October 1, 2012 – December 31, 2012.

Objectives:

- The number of clients ("active participants") at the prerequisite level of their training enrolled in classes during the fall 2012 semester is projected to be 220.
- 80% will successfully complete a prerequisite course during the fall 2012 semester.
- 2. Program clients served:

Capital IDEA focuses on traditionally disadvantaged populations through its outreach at schools, churches, homeless resource centers, and low-income communities both in and outside Travis County. Capital IDEA's enrollment is extremely diverse:

- 100% low-income
- 82% minority (Asian, African-American, Hispanic or self-identified as Other or Biracial)
- 66% have family responsibilities

Eligibility requirements include:

- Living at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Income Guidelines
- Resident of Central Texas (10-County region)
- U.S. Citizen or permanent resident
- 18 years or older
- Have a high school diploma or GED
- Must not have completed a college degree
- Commitment to give back to the community upon graduating
- 3. Program services and delivery:

In addition to Capital IDEA's standard services funded by Travis County of outreach, assessment, counseling, case management, ESOL, specialized education for entry into employer-sponsored training, THEA preparation, high skill education for targeted occupations, wrap-around services, placement, and retention, Capital IDEA will provide the following services focused on active participants at the prerequisite level of their training during the fall 2012 semester:

- Fine-tuning our recruitment efforts and intake process to better educate applicants on the educational requirements of their chosen career;
- Providing more hands-on case management services to help participants navigate the community college system;
- Working with ACC to add additional prerequisite classes that are set aside just for Capital IDEA students a pilot Anatomy & Physiology course is currently underway;
- Partnering with instructors to identify academic barriers as early as possible, and provide timely and appropriate intervention, to ensure course completion;
- Improving our database so we can better track participants at the prerequisite level and allow us to identify further areas of improvement;
- Considering providing additional or increased wrap-around services (child care, transportation assistance, etc.).

Capital IDEA and Austin Community College are collaborating closely on improving the performance of students at the prerequisite level, such as the following efforts:

- Working with ACC Department chairs, instructors and staff to get updates on curriculum changes;
- Providing specialized classes for Capital IDEA students in two courses: Algebra and Anatomy & Physiology in the fall 2012 semester;
- Providing supplemental instruction (teaching assistants) for students in the above courses.

Capital IDEA engages in planning with the Community Action Network (CAN), Health Industry Steering Committee (HISC), regional employers, Austin Interfaith, Austin Community College, Education Austin, St. Edward's University, and Huston-Tillotson University.

Capital IDEA tracks its performance weekly, bi-monthly, quarterly, annually, and upon request. The agency reports the information – including enrollment, employment, retention, and school performance – to the Board and to funding agencies. This regular reporting allows constant performance analysis and improvement. Capital IDEA uses a robust client database managed by Community Tech Knowledge (CTK) to collect and report data. The database tracks over 250 data elements on each Capital IDEA applicant and participants. Assessment, counseling, reporting, and administrative staff use the database directly in everyday work. The validity of the information is tested against documentation by

independent auditors during Capital IDEA's annual audit. The Institutional Relations Officer is responsible for reporting performance outputs and outcomes to Travis County.

• <u>Quality improvement:</u>

Describe the process for identifying problems or other issues in service delivery, designing activities to overcome these problems, and following up to ensure corrective actions have been effective.

The current focus on improving the performance at the prerequisite levels originated in long-term studies of Capital IDEA participants. An in-depth analysis by the Aspen Institute of students enrolled between 2003 and 2008 found that those in taking prerequisite healthcare courses dropped from the program at a significantly higher rate (35%) compared with those in either the College Prep Academy (17%) or in the healthcare programs (11%).

Proposed Motion:

Consider and take appropriate action regarding Travis County Health and Human Services and Veterans Service request to approve funding for Capital Investing in Development and Employment of Adults, Inc. (Capital IDEA).

Summary and Staff Recommendation:

During contract year 2011 Capital IDEA worked to drawdown their state funding before their Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) contract expired in November, 2011. Although they were successful in this effort, they left \$113,869.02 of their Travis County contract unspent. The JET funding will not be available to Capital IDEA during 2012.

As a result of the recent City of Austin HHS re-bidding process, Capital IDEA's social service contract has been reduced significantly during the fourth quarter of calendar year 2012.

Capital IDEA is requesting the remainder of their 2011 Travis County award to "fill the gap" from October 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012 for their Long Term Training Program.

They are projecting to serve 220 clients with 80% successfully completing a prerequisite course during the fall 2012 semester.

The department is recommending the Court approve this contract with Capital IDEA, providing needed services for a diverse population of Travis County residents in need of assistance for the amount of \$113,869.00.
