#### **Agenda Language:**

Approve contract award for 700 Lavaca External Video Security Cameras, RFP No. P120025-GM, to the most responsive proposer, Knight Security Systems, LLC.

➤ Purchasing Recommendation and Comments: Purchasing concurs with department and recommends approval of requested action. This procurement action meets the compliance requirements as outlined by the statutes.

On November 8, 2011, Request for Proposal No. P120025-GM was issued through Bid Sync for External Video Security Cameras to be installed at 700 Lavaca. A total of five (5) proposals were received on November 30, 2011. After evaluating the proposals and receiving the Best and Final Offers, the committee recommends awarding to Knight Security Systems, LLC as the most qualified respondent, as its proposal meets all county requirements. The cost of the equipment, software, installation, and support services in the first year is \$74,479.22. Extended equipment warranty and maintenance/support for year one is included; and, the cost for extended equipment warranty and maintenance/support for the first and second renewal years is \$10,403.00 per year.

# CONTRACT BETWEEN TRAVIS COUNTY AND KNIGHT SECURITY SYSTEMS, LLC FOR EXTERNAL VIDEO SECURITY CAMERAS FOR THE TRAVIS COUNTY 700 LAVACA OFFICE BUILDING AND GARAGE

This Contract between Travis County and Knight Security Systems, LLC for External Video Security Cameras for the Travis County 700 Lavaca Office Building and Garage (this "Contract") is entered into by and between the following parties: Travis County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("County") and Knight Security Systems, LLC, a Texas limited liability company ("Contractor").

County requested proposals from qualified companies for the procurement and installation of external video security cameras and associated equipment and services for the Travis County 700 Lavaca Office Building and Garage (collectively, the "Systems and Services") pursuant to Request for Proposal #P120025-GM and its amendments, modifications and addenda (the "RFP") and all requirements, specifications, terms and conditions specified in the RFP; and

Contractor was the successful proposer under the RFP.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth in this Contract and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1.0 CONTRACT PROJECT, PURPOSE AND PRICING SCHEDULE

- 1.1 The purpose of this Contract is to procure external security cameras at the Travis County-owned commercial office building located at 700 Lavaca Street, Austin, Texas, that satisfy or exceed the requirements set forth in RFP# P120025-GM. Contractor's obligations with respect to delivery, installation, configuration, implementation and maintenance of the Systems and Services will be as set forth in this Contract and its attachments, as may be amended from time to time.
- 1.2 County's obligations with respect to payment for the Systems and Services will be as set forth in Contractor's Best and Final Offer in Response to RFP #P120025-GM, dated May 3, 2012, a copy of which is attached to this Contract as **Attachment A** (entitled "Best and Final Offer (BAFO); RFP #P120025-GM: Pricing Schedule").

#### 2.0 CONTRACTOR OBLIGATIONS

2.1 Contractor shall, in a timely manner, install, configure, implement and maintain the Systems and provide the services described in RFP# P120025-GM and in this Contract and its attachments in accordance with their terms and conditions, and in compliance with the assurances, certifications, and all other statements made by

Contractor in its Proposal in Response to RFP# P120025-GM, attached as **Attachment B** (the "Proposal"). All hardware, software and services (or components thereof) provided under this Contract must be the latest improved model meeting specifications in current production at the time of delivery.

- 2.2 Contractor acknowledges and agrees that this Contract includes pricing for all required hardware, software, configuration, installation, implementation, training, accessories, and System warranty and maintenance.
- 2.3 The System shall be secure, comply with all Travis County Information Security Requirements, and provide appropriate levels of confidentiality, integrity, availability and non-repudiation, as such terms are defined in Section 35 of the General Provisions (**Attachment C**). The System must also meet or exceed all federal, state and local government laws and regulations, governing the creation, use, storage, access, accessibility, maintenance, processing and transmission of information assets.

#### 3.0 TERM OF CONTRACT; PERFORMANCE PERIOD

- 3.1 <u>Term of Contract</u>. The term of this Contract will begin upon award by the Travis County Commissioners Court (the "Commissioners Court") and, unless sooner terminated as provided in this Contract, will continue in full force and effect: (i) with respect to the Systems, for life of the Systems, and (ii) with respect to the Services, through successful completion of the Services.
- 3.2 <u>Performance Period</u>. Contractor shall complete staged installation of the Systems and performance of the Services in all 700 Lavaca locations identified on Attachment F to this Contract so that they are fully tested, operational and functioning in accordance with the Performance Criteria exclusive of the Acceptance Test Period (as defined in paragraph 4.4, below) no later than September 24, 2012 (the "Completion Date"). The first stage installation shall include priority cameras labeled as locations #1, 2, 9, 10, 13, and 14 of Attachment F-1 and locations #A, B, C, and D of Attachment F-2, for which installation shall be completed by no later than August 31, 2012. The final installment shall include the remaining cameras located at sites #3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, and 12 of Attachment F-1. The Completion Date is contingent upon receipt of purchase order from County no later than July 23, 2012. If Contractor fails to achieve completion by the Completion Date, Contractor, by execution of this Contract, specifically acknowledges that County will sustain damages for each day the completion extends beyond the Completion Date. Because of the impracticality and extreme difficulty of fixing and ascertaining County's actual damages, Contractor agrees that \$100.00 per calendar day shall be deducted by County from any amounts due Contractor for every day that the Contractor's installation of the Systems and performance of the Services extends beyond the Completion Date.

3.3 Time is of the essence in the rendering of the Services under this Agreement.

#### 4.0 SCOPE AND TERM OF WARRANTY

- 4.1 Contractor shall provide the following warranties on the Systems and Services:
- [i] <u>First-year Warranty</u>: For the first year following Acceptance, Contractor shall provide all warranty and maintenance services described in Contractor's Service Level Agreement entitled "Knight Security Systems SecurePlan Administration Policy dated January 1, 2012", attached to this Contract as **Attachment D**.
- [ii] <u>Second-year Warranty</u>: Upon expiration of the first-year warranty, County may, at its option, purchase the Extended Equipment Warranty for a second year of Service Level Agreement coverage for the sum specified in **Attachment E**.
- 4.2 <u>Commencement of Warranty</u>. All warranties will begin after installation, configuration, testing and Acceptance by County. "Acceptance" is defined and described in Section 3.4, below.
- 4.3 <u>Cap on Maintenance Fees Increases</u>. For each year after the above-specified warranty periods (First-Year Warranty and Second-Year Warranty) during which County accepts continued warranty and maintenance services under a Service Level Agreement, the annual warranty and maintenance fee will not increase more than five percent (5%) annually over the prior year's warranty and maintenance fee.
- 4.4 <u>Performance Criteria</u>; <u>Acceptance</u>. For the warranty periods specified above, the Systems will conform to applicable functional and performance requirements and specifications furnished either by County or by Contractor and incorporated by reference into this Contract (collectively, the "Performance Criteria"). "Acceptance" of each System or System component delivered to County will occur when County provides Contractor with written notice that the System or System component (i) has been successfully installed (ready for testing and configuration); and (ii) has performed in accordance with the Performance Criteria for a period of fourteen (14) days (the "Acceptance Test Period").
- 4.5 <u>Notice of Warranty Failure and Remedies</u>. During the warranty period, in the event any System or System component fails to function in accordance with the Performance Criteria, County may notify Contractor of such failure and Contractor shall, at no cost to County, repair or replace the defective System (or defective System component) so that the System will perform in accordance with the Performance Criteria. In addition, if any System or System component fails to function in accordance with the Performance Criteria at any time during the Acceptance Test Period, Contractor

shall have 14 days after written notice to remedy or replace the failed component after which period Contractor shall remove the non-functioning component and refund to County the amount paid to Contractor for the non-functioning component. The refund shall be mailed to County within forty-five (45) days of receipt of a written request for such refund from County. Return of non-performing merchandise and delivery of replacement merchandise shall be at Contractor's sole expense.

#### 5.0 CONTRACTOR REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES; IMPLIED SERVICES

- 5.1 Contractor warrants that he has thoroughly examined the general and specific requirements, schedules, instructions and all other Contract documents. Contractor has made all investigations necessary to be thoroughly informed regarding the requirements for materials, equipment and/or services as required by the RFP. Further, Contractor warrants that Contractor is fully satisfied that the RFP specifications accurately describe or indicate that all conditions, site or otherwise, have been taken into account in determining the offered prices. There will be no increase in the quoted Contract prices based upon Contractor's misunderstanding or lack of knowledge about the intent of the RFP solicitation.
- 5.2 Contractor warrants that all of the information provided in the BAFO and its original Proposal in Response to RFP # P120025-GM is true and correct and that Contractor will use its best efforts to provide quality Systems and Services to County. and associated training, maintenance and support services to County. Specifically, this warranty extends to all statements and/or representations made by Contractor in its Proposal.
- 5.3 Contractor warrants that all system services and products provided to County under this Contract will be fully tested, and ready for installation. Contractor further warrants that all hardware, software, and accessories provided under this Contract will function correctly, without error or omissions, and at no additional cost to County.
- 5.4 Contractor acknowledges and agrees that if any services, functions or responsibilities not specifically described in this Contract are required for the proper performance and provision of the Systems and Services, they shall be deemed to be implied by and included within the scope of this Contract to the same extent and in the same manner as if specifically described in this Contract. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Contract, Contractor shall be responsible for providing the facilities, personnel and other resources as necessary to perform and provide the Systems and Services.
- 5.5 Contractor warrants that (i) all applicable copyrights, patents, trade secrets, licenses and other proprietary and intellectual property rights that may exist on materials used in this Contract have been adhered to and (ii) County shall not be liable

for any infringement of those rights and any rights granted to County shall apply for the duration of this Contract. In connection with this warranty, Contractor agrees to and shall indemnify County, its officers, agents and employees from all claims, losses, damages, causes of action and liability of every kind including expenses of litigation, court costs and attorney fees for damages to any person or property arising in connection with any alleged or actual infringement of existing copyrights, patents, trade secrets, licenses and other proprietary or intellectual property rights applicable to materials used in this Contract, unless such infringement is a result of activities undertaken by the County with no involvement from Contractor. In the event that an infringement suit or proceeding arises, Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, secure County's right to continue using the System, and all products and services provided under this Contract or replace or modify all or part of the System, or product or service to render it noninfringing.

#### 6.0 PRICING; PURCHASE ORDER; CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

- 6.1 <u>Pricing</u>. Contractor represents that all prices quoted in the BAFO shall be firm for the period of this Contract; provided, however, that in the event of a general price decline offered by Contractor to all customers, County will receive a pro-rated reduction equivalent to that offered to customers of similar products.
- 6.2 <u>Purchase Order</u>. Contractor will not release any items or perform any services until a purchase order number is assigned by the designated representative of the County Purchasing Office. Contractor will reference contract and purchase order on all invoices submitted to the Travis County Auditor. Upon issuance of a purchase order, the contract administrator will call Contractor with the items needed to be supplied. Contractor must respond by supplying the items at the time required. Failure to act in this manner may result in termination of this Contract.
- 6.3 <u>Contract Administrator</u>. For purposes of monitoring performance, establishing requirements, approving and coordinating schedules, users and equipment, the County department named below shall act as Contract administrator on behalf of Travis County:

#### **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

#### 1.0 **GENERAL DEFINITIONS:**

- 1.1 "Auditor" means the Travis County Auditor or her designee.
- 1.2 "Commissioners Court" means Travis County Commissioners Court.
- 1.3 "County" means Travis County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas.
- 1.4 "County Building" means any County owned buildings and does not include buildings leased by County.
- 1.4 "Is doing business" and "has done business" mean:
  - 1.4.1 Paying or receiving in any calendar year any money or other valuable thing which is worth more than \$250 in the aggregate in exchange for personal services or for purchase of any property or property interest, either real or personal, either legal or equitable; or
  - 1.4.2 Loaning or receiving a loan of money; or goods or otherwise creating or having in existence any legal obligation or debt with a value of more than \$250 in the aggregate in a calendar year;

#### but does not include:

- 1.4.3 any retail transaction for goods or services sold to a Key Contracting Person at a posted, published, or marked price available to the general public;
- 1.4.4 any financial services product sold to a Key Contracting Person for personal, family or household purposes in accordance with pricing guidelines applicable to similarly situated individuals with similar risks as determined by Contractor in the ordinary course of its business; and
- 1.4.5 a transaction for a financial service or insurance coverage made on behalf of Contractor if Contractor is a national or multinational corporation by an agent, employee or other representative of

Contractor who does not know and is not in a position that he or she should have known about this Agreement.

- 1.5 "Key Contracting Person" means any person or business listed in Exhibit A to the Ethics Affidavit attached as Contract Exhibit H.
- 1.6 "Historically Underutilized Business" or "HUB" means any entity or association formed to make a profit in which one (1) or more persons who are educationally or economically disadvantaged because of their identification as members of one of the following groups: African Americans, Hispanic Americans, Asian Pacific Americans, Native Americans or Women of any ethnicity have the following rights:
  - 1.8.1 own at least fifty-one percent (51%) of all classes of shares or other equitable securities and have incidents of ownership, including an interest in profit and loss, equivalent to the percentage of capital, equipment or expertise contributed to the business where ownership is measured as though the community property interest of a spouse is the separate property of that spouse, if both spouses certify in writing that the non-participating spouse relinquishes control over his or her spouse, and his or her community property, and not as if it is subject to the community property interest of the other spouse; and
  - 1.8.2 have a proportionate interest and demonstrated active participation in the control, operation and management of the business's affairs; where control means having recognized ultimate control over all day-to-day decisions affecting the business, and is be known to, and at least tacitly acknowledged in day-to-day operations by employees of the business and by those with whom business is conducted, and holding a title commensurate with that control.
- 1.7 "Purchasing Agent" means the Travis County Purchasing Agent.

#### 2.0 **GENERAL CONDITIONS:**

Contractor represents that Contractor has thoroughly examined the drawings, specifications, schedule, instructions and all other Contract documents. Contractor has made all investigations necessary to be thoroughly informed regarding plant and facilities for delivery of material, equipment and/or services as required by the Contract documents.

#### 3.0 **CONTRACTOR CERTIFICATIONS:**

- 3.1 Contractor certifies that Contractor is a duly qualified, capable, and otherwise bondable business entity, that he is not in receivership or contemplates same, and has not filed for bankruptcy. He further certifies that the company, corporation or partnership is not currently delinquent with respect to payment of property taxes within Travis County.
- 3.2 Contractor warrants that all applicable copyrights and licenses that may exist on materials used in this Contract have been adhered to and further warrants that County will not be liable for any infringement of those rights and any rights granted to County will apply for the duration of this Contract. Contractor shall indemnify County, its officers, agents and employees from all claims, losses, damages, causes of action and liability of every kind including expenses of litigation, and court costs and attorney fees for damages to any person or property arising in connection with any alleged or actual infringement of existing licenses or copyrights applicable to materials used in this Contract.

#### 4.0 **DISPUTES AND APPEALS:**

The Purchasing Agent acts as the County representative in the issuance and administration of this Contract in relation to disputes. Any document, notice, or correspondence not issued by or to the Purchasing Agent or other authorized County person, in relation to disputes is void unless otherwise stated in this Contract. If Contractor does not agree with any document, notice, or correspondence issued by the Purchasing Agent, or other authorized County person, Contractor must submit a written notice to the Purchasing Agent within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the document, notice, or correspondence, outlining the exact point of disagreement in detail. If the matter is not resolved to Contractor's satisfaction, Contractor may submit a written Notice of Appeal to Commissioners Court, through the Purchasing Agent, if the Notice is submitted within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the unsatisfactory reply. Contractor then has the right to be heard by Commissioners Court.

#### 5.0 **FUNDING OUT**:

Despite anything to the contrary in this Contract, if, during budget planning and adoption, Commissioners Court fails to provide funding for this Contract for the following fiscal year of County, County may terminate this Contract after giving Contractor thirty (30) days written notice that this Contract is terminated due to the failure to fund it.

#### 60 **INVOICING/PAYMENTS:**

- 6.1 Contractor shall provide County with an Internal Revenue Form W-9, Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification, that is completed in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code and its rules and regulations before any Contract funds are payable.
- 6.2 Payment will be made by check or warrant by County upon satisfactory delivery and acceptance of products and services and submission of an invoice to the address below:

County Auditor P.O. Box 1748 Austin, Texas 78767

- 6.3 As a minimum, invoices must include: (i) name, address, and telephone number of Contractor and similar information in the event payment is to be made to a different address; (ii) County Contract or Purchase Order number; (iii) identification of products or services as outlined in this Contract; (iv) quantity or quantities, applicable unit prices, total prices, and total amount; and (v) any additional payment information called for by this Contract. County will not pay invoices that are in excess of the amount authorized by the Purchase Order.
- 6.4 Payment will be deemed to have been made on the date of mailing of the check or warrant. For purposes of payment discounts, time will begin upon satisfactory delivery of products and services and/or submission of acceptable invoice, whichever is last. Partial payments will not be made unless specifically requested and approved by County prior to Contract award.
- 6.5 Accrual and payment of interest on overdue payments shall be governed by Tex. Gov't Code Ann., ch. 2251.

#### 7.0 **DISCOUNTS:**

Prompt payment discounts will not be considered in determining low proposals and making awards. In connection with any discount offered, time will be computed from the date of receipt of supplies or services or from the date a correct invoice is received, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed to have been made on the date of mailing of the check, or warrant.

#### 8.0 **OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT:**

If a member of the Commissioners Court belongs to a cooperative association, County may purchase equipment or supplies from the association only if no member of the Commissioners Court will receive a pecuniary benefit from the purchase, other than as reflected in an increase in dividends distributed generally to members of the association.

#### 9.0 **COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES:**

Contractor warrants that no persons or selling agency has been retained to solicit this Contract upon an understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies maintained by Contractor to secure business. For breach or violation of this warranty, County shall have the right to terminate this Contract without liability, or in its discretion to, as applicable, add to or deduct from the Contract price for consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee.

#### 10.0 **ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT OR MORTGAGE:**

- 10.1 <u>Assignment</u>. The parties to this Contract will not assign or transfer any part of this Contract, or any of the rights, interests or obligations under this Contract, directly or indirectly, without the prior written consent and approval of the other party. NO OFFICIAL, EMPLOYEE, REPRESENTATIVE OR AGENT OF COUNTY HAS THE AUTHORITY TO APPROVE ANY ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER UNDER THIS CONTRACT UNLESS THAT SPECIFIC AUTHORITY IS EXPRESSLY GRANTED BY COMMISSIONERS COURT.
- 10.2 <u>Mortgage</u>. Contractor must not execute any mortgage, or issue any bonds, shares of stock or other evidence of interest in County buildings.
- 10.3 <u>Successors Bound</u>. If an assignment or transfer is made in compliance with the provisions of this Contract, the terms, provisions, covenants, obligations and conditions of this Contract will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors in interest and the assigns of the parties to this Contract.
- 10.4 <u>Name Change</u>. If a change of name is required, the Purchasing Agent shall be notified immediately. No change in the obligation of or to Contractor will be recognized until it is approved by Commissioners Court.

#### 11.0 **FORCE MAJEURE:**

If the performance by either party of any of its obligations under this Contract is interrupted or delayed by any occurrence not occasioned by its own conduct, whether such occurrence is an act of God or the result of war, riot, civil commotion, sovereign conduct, or the act or conduct of any person or persons not a party to this Contract, then it will be excused from such performance for such period of time as is reasonably necessary after such occurrence to remedy the effects of the force majeure event.

#### 12.0 TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT:

Failure by either County or Contractor in performing any provisions of this Contract will constitute a breach of Contract. Either party may require corrective action within ten (10) calendar days after date of receipt of written notice citing the exact nature of the other's breach. Failure to take corrective action or failure to provide a satisfactory written reply excusing such failure within the ten (10) calendar days will constitute a default. The defaulting party will be given a twenty (20) calendar day period within which to show cause why this Contract should not be terminated for default. Commissioner's Court may take whatever action as its interest may appear, resulting from such notice. All notices for corrective action, breach, default or show cause, will be issued by the Purchasing Agent or County Attorney only and all replies shall be made in writing to the Purchasing Agent at the address provided herein. Notices issued by or to anyone other than the Purchasing Agent or County Attorney will be null and void, and will be considered as not having been issued or received. County reserves the right to enforce the performance of this Contract in any manner prescribed by law in case of default and may contract with another party with or without competition or further notification to the Contractor. As a minimum, Contractor will be required to pay any difference in the cost of securing the products or services covered by this Contract, or compensate for any loss or damage to the County derived under this Contract, should it become necessary to contract with another source because of Contractor's default, plus reasonable administrative costs and attorney's fees. In the event of Termination for Default, neither County nor its agents or representatives will be liable for loss of any profits anticipated to be made under this Contract.

#### 13.0 **TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE:**

County reserves the right to terminate this Contract upon thirty (30) calendar days written notice for any reason deemed by Commissioners Court to serve the public interest, or resulting from any governmental law, ordinance, regulation, or court order. In the event of such termination, County will pay Contractor those costs directly attributable to work done or supplies obtained in preparation for

completion or compliance with this Contract prior to termination; provided, however, that no costs will be paid that are recoverable in the normal course of doing business in which Contractor is engaged. In addition, no costs that can be mitigated through the sale of supplies or inventories will be paid. If County pays for the cost of supplies or materials obtained for use under this Contract, those supplies or materials will become the property of County and must be delivered to the FOB point shown in this Contract, or as designated by the Purchasing Agent. County will not be liable for loss of any profits anticipated to be made under this Contract.

#### **14.0 CHANGES:**

- 14.1 Unless specifically provided otherwise in this Contract, any change to the terms of this Contract or any attachments to it must be made by written change order signed by both parties. The Purchasing Agent may at any time, by written document, make changes within the general scope of this Contract in any one of the following:
  - 14.1.1 Description of services;
  - 14.1.2 Place of delivery;
  - 14.1.3 Any aspect of this Contract to correct errors of a general administrative a nature or other mistakes, the correction of which does not affect the scope of the contract and does not result in expense to Contractor.
- 14.2 It is acknowledged by Contractor that no officer, agent, employee or representative of County has any authority to change the scope of this Contract or any attachments to it unless expressly granted that authority by the Commissioners Court.
- 14.3 If any change under 14.1 causes an increase or decrease in the cost or time required for performance of any part of the work under this Contract, the Commissioners Court may make an equitable adjustment in the Contract price, the delivery schedule, or both, and modify this Contract. Contractor must submit any "proposal for adjustment" within thirty (30) calendar days after the date of receipt of the written order.
- 14.4 Contractor shall submit all requests for alterations, additions or deletions of the terms of this Contract or any attachment to it to the Purchasing Agent. The Purchasing Agent will present Contractor's requests to Commissioners Court for consideration.

#### 15.0 **COUNTY ACCESS:**

Contractor shall maintain and make available all books, documents, and other evidence pertinent to the costs and expenses of this Contract for inspection, audit or reproduction by any authorized representative of County to the extent this detail will properly reflect these costs and expense. These include all costs; both direct and indirect costs, cost of labor, material, equipment, supplies, and services, and all other costs and expenses of whatever nature for which reimbursement is claimed under this Contract. All required records must be maintained until an audit is completed and all required questions arising therefrom are resolved, or three (3) years after completion of the Contract term, whichever occurs first; however, the records must be retained beyond the third year if an audit is in progress or the findings of a completed audit have not been resolved satisfactorily.

#### 16.0 **SUBCONTRACTS:**

- 16.1 Contractor shall not enter into any subcontracts for any service or activity relating to the performance of this Contract without the prior written approval or the prior written waiver of this right of approval from County. It is acknowledged by Contractor that no officer, agent, employee or representative of County has the authority to grant such approval or waiver unless expressly granted that specific authority by the Commissioners Court.
- 16.2 If a subcontract is approved, Contractor must make a "good faith effort" to take all necessary and reasonable steps to ensure HUBs maximum opportunity to be subcontractors under this Contract. Contractor must obtain County approval of all proposed HUB subcontractors through the Purchasing Agent. Failure by Contractor to make a good faith effort to employ HUBs as subcontractors constitutes a breach of this Contract and may result in termination of this Contract.

#### 19.0 **MONITORING:**

County reserves the right to perform periodic on-site monitoring of Contractor's compliance with the terms of this Contract, and of the adequacy and timeliness of Contractor's performance under this Contract. After each monitoring visit, County will provide Contractor with a written report of the monitor's findings. If the report notes deficiencies in Contractor's performances under the terms of this Contract, it will include requirements and deadlines for the correction of those deficiencies by Contractor. Contractor shall take action specified in the monitoring report prior to the deadlines specified.

#### 20.0 **CIVIL RIGHTS/ADA COMPLIANCE:**

Contractor shall provide all services and activities required by this Contract in a manner that would comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Public Law 93-1122, Section 504, and with the provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, Public Law 101-336 [S.933] if Contractor were an entity bound to comply with these laws. Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment based on race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age or handicapped condition.

#### 21.0 **GRATUITIES:**

County may terminate this Contract if it is found that gratuities of any kind including entertainment, or gifts were offered or given by Contractor or any agent or representative of the Contractor, to any County official or employee with a view toward securing favorable treatment with respect of this Contract. If this Contract is terminated by County pursuant to this provision, County shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies, to recover from Contractor at least three times the cost incurred by Contractor in providing the gratuities.

#### 22.0 **FORFEITURE OF CONTRACT:**

- 22.1 Contractor must forfeit all benefits of this Contract and County must retain all performance by Contractor and recover all consideration or the value of all consideration, paid to Contractor pursuant to this contract if:
  - 22.1.1 Contractor was doing business at the time of submitting its proposal or had done business during the 365 day period immediately prior to the date of which its proposal was due with one or more Key Contracting Persons if Contractor has not disclosed the name of any such Key Contracting Person in its proposal which is expressly incorporated in this Contract; or
  - 22.1.2 Contractor does business with a Key Contracting Person after the date on which the proposal that resulted in this Contract and prior to full performance of this Contract and fails to disclose the name of that Key Contracting Person in writing to each member of the Commissioners Court and to the County Clerk within ten (10) days commencing business with that Key Contracting Person.

#### **23.0 NOTICES:**

23.1 Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Contract by one party to the other shall be in writing and shall be given and deemed to have been given immediately if delivered in person to the address set

forth in this section for the party to whom the notice is given, or on the third day following mailing if placed in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, addressed to the party at the address set forth in this section.

23.2 The address of County for all purposes under this Contract is:

- 23.3 The address of Contractor for all purposes under this contract and for all notices hereunder is the address shown in the Notice of Award.
- 23.4 Each party may change the address for notice to it by giving notice of the change in compliance with 23.01

#### 24.0 **CONSTRUCTION OF CONTRACT:**

- 24.1 <u>Law and Venue</u>. This Contract is governed by the laws of the United States of America and Texas and all obligations under this Contract are performable in Travis County, Texas. Venue for any dispute arising out of this Contract will lie in the appropriate court of Travis County, Texas.
- 24.2 <u>Severability</u>. If any portion or portions of this Contract are ruled invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of it will remain valid and binding.
- 24.3 <u>Headings</u>. Headings and titles at the beginning of the various provisions of this Contract have been included only to make it easier to locate the subject matter covered by that part, section or subsection and are not to be used in construing this Contract.
- 24.4 <u>Computation of Time</u>. When any period of time is stated in this Contract, the time will be computed to exclude the first day and include the last day of period. If the last day of any period falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or a day that Travis County has declared a holiday for its employees, these days will be omitted from the computation. All hours stated in this Contract are stated in Central Standard Time from 2:00 o'clock a.m. on the first Sunday October until 2:00 o'clock a.m. on the first Sunday of April and in Central Daylight Saving Time from 2:00 o' clock a.m. on the first Sunday April until 2:00 o'clock a.m. on the first Sunday of October.

24.5 <u>Gender and Number</u>: Words of any gender in this Contract will be construed to include any other gender and words in either number will be construed to include the other unless the context in the Contract clearly requires otherwise.

#### 25.0 ENTIRE CONTRACT:

All oral and written agreements between Contractor and County relating to the subject matter of this Contract that were made prior to the execution of this Contract have been reduced to writing and are contained in this Contract.

# 26.0 CONTRACTOR LIABILITY, INDEMNIFICATION AND CLAIMS NOTIFICATION:

Contractor shall indemnify County, its officers, agents, and employees, from and against any and all third party claims, losses, damages, causes of action, suits, and liability of every kind whether meritorious or not and, including all expenses of litigation, court costs, and reasonable attorney's fees, arising in connection with the services provided by Contractor under this Contract. It is the expressed intention of the parties to this Contract, both Contractor and County, that the indemnity provided for in this paragraph is indemnity by Contractor to indemnify and protect County from the consequences of Contractor's actions.

#### 27.0 HUB PROCUREMENT PROGRAM:

- 27.1 Pursuant to the Travis County Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) Procurement Program, the Travis County Commissioners Court adopted goals for Certified HUB Subcontractor participation with an Overall 14.1% Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) goal and an Overall 15.0% Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) goal (Sub-goals: 2.5% African-American, 9.9% Hispanic, 1.7% Native/Asian-American) to be observed by the County in its award of contracts and subcontracts to certified HUBs.
- 27.2 It is the policy of Travis County that HUBs shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of County contracts and subcontracts. Contractor shall make a "good faith effort" to take all necessary and reasonable steps to ensure HUBs maximum opportunity to participate as subcontractors. Failure by Contractor or subcontractor to carry out the County HUB Procurement Program shall constitute a breach of contract, and after notification of such breach by the Purchasing Agent may result in termination of this contract.

- 27.3 For purposes of HUB participation, Travis County will count the dollar amount of all firm fixed price/fixed quantity contracts, or the dollar amount of Purchase Orders placed against "Estimated" or "Not to Exceed" contracts.
- 27.4 The following section identifies the specific procedures to be followed with respect to this solicitation for proposals in compliance with the HUB Procurement Program.

#### 27.5 **SECTION 1 - HUB PURCHASES**

- 27.5.1 To be eligible under this program, HUB Proposers and subcontractors must:
  - 27.5.1.1 Be certified as HUB, M/WBE or DBE source by:
    - (A) City of Austin Municipal Government,
    - (B) Texas Unified Certification Program, or
    - (C) State of Texas Building and Procurement Commission
  - 27.5.1.2 Have on file in the Travis County Purchasing Office a proper Bidder's/Proposer's Application.
  - 27.5.1.3 Identify the certifying agency and Item/Service for which is certified.
  - 27.5.1.4 Obtain County approval of all proposed HUB subcontractors through the Purchasing Agent.
  - 27.5.1.5 Complete the HUB Declaration form in the RFP package.
- 27.5.2 Any third party may challenge a firm's HUB status before or after certification. Such challenge must be in writing and submitted to the Purchasing Agent, including all relevant information available. If no merit to the challenge is found, the challenging party will be notified by the Purchasing Agent in writing and the matter will be considered closed. If merit is found, the firm in question will be notified by the Purchasing Agent of the challenge, who made it, and a summary of the allegations. The challenged firm will be required to submit, within a reasonable period of time, information in support of the firm's HUB status. The Purchasing Agent will make an evaluation and notify the parties of a proposed

determination, citing the basis for the decision, and providing an opportunity for an informal hearing to interested parties and affording an opportunity for a written or personal response. The Purchasing Agent will make a recommendation to the Commissioners Court for a final determination. The Purchasing Agent will inform all interested parties of the Commissioners Court's determination and its reasons. A firm's HUB status must remain accurately certified during the challenging procedure and may not be changed unless or until a successful challenge is finalized. (See also Par. 8.0, "CLARIFICATION OR OBJECTION TO PROPOSAL SPECIFICATIONS" in Part I, General Requirements, Section of the RFP.).

#### 28.0 ADDITIONAL GENERAL PROVISIONS:

- 28.1 Contractor must comply with all federal and state laws and regulations, city and County ordinances, orders, and regulations, relating in any way to this Contract.
- 28.2 Contractor must secure all permits and licenses, pay all charges and fees, and give all notices necessary for lawful operations.
- 28.3 Contractor must pay all taxes and license fees imposed by the federal and the state governments and their agencies and political subdivisions upon the property and business of Contractor.
- 28.4 Despite anything to the contrary in this Contract, if Contractor is delinquent in payment of property taxes at the time of providing services, Contractor assigns the amount of Gross Receipts equal to the amount Contractor is delinquent in property tax payments to the Travis County Tax Assessor-Collector for the payment of the delinquent taxes.
- 29.0 **DESIGNATED COUNTY HOLIDAYS 2012-2013:** No services will be performed and deliveries will be accepted on designated holidays, unless specific prior arrangements have been made. Below is the approved holiday schedule. Future schedules are expected to be similar.

#### 30.0 **MEDIATION:**

When mediation is acceptable to both parties in resolving a dispute arising under this Agreement, the parties agree to use a mutually agreed upon mediator, or a person appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction, for mediation as described in Section 154.023 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Unless both parties are satisfied with the result of the mediation, the mediation will not constitute a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communications within the scope of the mediation shall remain confidential as described in §154.073 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, unless both parties agree, in writing, to waive the confidentiality.

#### 31.0 **TIN REQUIRED:**

Contractor shall provide County with an Internal Revenue Form W-9, Request For Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification, that is completed in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code, its rule and regulations, and a statement of entity status in a form satisfactory to the County Auditor before any Contract funds are payable.

#### 32.0 **NON-WAIVER OF DEFAULT:**

- 32.1 The waiver of a breach of any term or condition of this Contract is not a waiver of a subsequent breach of that term or condition, or a breach or subsequent breach of any other term of condition. No official, agent, employee, or representative of County may waive any breach of any term of condition of this Contract unless expressly granted that specific authority by Commissioners Court.
- 32.2 All rights of County under this Contract are specifically reserved and any payment, act or omission shall not impair or prejudice any remedy or right to County under it. Any right or remedy in this Contract shall not preclude the exercise of any other right or remedy under this Contract or under any law, nor shall any action taken in the exercise of any right or remedy be deemed a waiver of any other rights or remedies.

#### 33.0 **CERTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY:**

This provision applies if the anticipated contract exceeds \$100,000. By submitting a proposal in response to the RFP solicitation, Contractor certifies that at the time of submission, Contractor was not on the federal government's list of suspended, ineligible, or debarred contractors. If Contractor is placed on the list between the time of proposal submission and the time of execution of this Contract, Contractor shall notify the Travis County Purchasing Agent. Failure to do so may result in County termination of this Contract for default.

#### 34.0 **INSURANCE AND LIABILITY:**

During the period of this Contract, Contractor shall maintain at his expense, insurance with limits not less than those prescribed below. With respect to required insurance, Contractor shall:

- (i) Name County as additional insured, as its interests may appear.
- (ii) Provide County a waiver of subrogation.
- (iii) Provide County with a thirty (30) calendar days advance written notice of cancellation or material change to said insurance.
- (iv) Provide the County Purchasing Agent at the address shown on Page 1 of this contract, a Certificate of Insurance evidencing required coverages within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of Notice of Award. Also, please assure your certificate contains the contract number as indicated on the Contract Award form when issued by Travis County.
- (v) Submit an original certificate of insurance reflecting coverage as follows:

#### 35.0 **SECURITY COMPLIANCE:**

#### 35.1 Network, Computer, and Information Security Compliance:

The goods and/or services solicited through RFP #120025-GM must be and remain in compliance with applicable Texas law.

The goods and/or services solicited through RFP #120025-GM must be and remain in compliance with all Travis County network, computer, software, and information security policies, standards, specifications, guidelines, processes and procedures already developed or deployed or subsequently developed or deployed and used by or for the Travis County Department of Information and Telecommunications Services ("ITS") and/or a department, office or division of any elected or appointed Travis County official (collectively, the "Travis County Security Requirements" or the "Security Requirements"). Contractor has executed a Travis County Non-Disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement and the documents comprising the Security Requirements have been obtained by Contractor.

- 35.2 **Initial Compliance:** Contractor's goods and/or services shall comply with the Security Requirements, including but not limited to the Travis County Asset Management Policy, Lifecycle Management Standard, Configuration Management Standard, Change Control Standard, and System Development Lifecycle Standard. Contractor's goods and/or services must operate with and be compatible with any and all network security, computer security, software security, and/or information security safeguards, including security hardware, software, appliances deployed by County (the "Security Safeguards").
- 35.3 **Certification of Compliance:** Contractor has performed a self-conducted compliance review of Contractor's goods and/or services and has provided to County, as part of its Proposal, written certification in the form of a completed, signed, and dated compliance review checklist, attesting that Contractor's goods and/or services are compliant with the Security Requirements. An authorized official of Contractor's company has signed and dated the compliance review checklist.

#### **35.4 Ongoing Compliance Upon Execution of Contract:**

Contractor's goods, services, practices, and/or procedures must remain in compliance with the Security Requirements and compatible with the Security Safeguards, including complying with any and all modifications and/or additions to the Security Requirements and/or Security Safeguards that may occur throughout the term of this Contract.

Contractor shall provide the required hardware, software, materials, expertise, and/or labor required to ensure ongoing compliance of the Contractor-provided goods and/or services with the Security Requirements, including operability and compatibility with the Security Safeguards as a part of ongoing maintenance and support.

The Contractor-provided goods, services, practices, and/or procedures must be accredited by the ITS Department Security Manager before being connected into the Travis County Government Network or placed into any County production operation environment. Accreditation is achieved by undergoing a Security Assessment that shows the Contractor supplied goods and/or services are compliant with the Security Requirements and Security Safeguards. This security evaluation of the specific solutions covered by this Contract may reveal aspects of the architecture, implementation, operation, maintenance, and/or other aspect of these solutions that may necessitate incorporating additional solution-specific information security requirements to protect County computers, networks, software, information, and facilities.

#### 35.5 **Notification of Non-Compliance or Incompatibility:**

If Contractor determines, at any time during the Contract term, that Contractor's goods, services, practices, and procedures do not comply with County's current Security Requirements and/or are not compatible with County's current Security Safeguards, the Contractor shall notify the ITS Help Desk by no later than the end of the business day following the confirmation by the Contractor of the non-compliance or incompatibility.

If the County determines at any time during the Contract term that Contractor's goods, services, practices, and procedures do not comply with County's current Security Requirements and/or compatibility with County's current Security Safeguards, the County shall notify Contractor by no later than the end of the business day following the confirmation by Contractor of the non-compliance or incompatibility.

#### 35.6 Remedy of Non-Compliance or Incompatibility:

In the event that either County or Contractor is notified of a non-compliance and/or incompatibility, Contractor shall:

- 1.) Determine the effort and cost to bring Contractor's goods, services, practices, and procedures into compliance and compatibility;
- 2.) Provide a draft working plan, including schedule, work effort and cost details, to remedy the non-compliance or incompatibility to County no later than 5 working days after notification of the non-compliance and/or the incompatibility to County has been confirmed.

County, at its sole discretion, shall determine whether Contractor must bring some, all, or none of the non-compliant or incompatible Contractor's goods, services, practices, and procedures into compliance with County's current Security Requirements and/or into compatibility with County's current Security Safeguards. Any instance of non-compliance or compatibility that the County does not require to be brought into compliance or compatibility will be noted as an exception. County may choose, in its sole discretion, at any time, to remove the exception and require compliance and/or compatibility.

Contractor shall be responsible for all costs associated with bringing Contractor-supplied goods, services and/or Contractor processes and practices into compliance with the Security Requirements and compatibility with the Security Safeguards.

County may, at its sole discretion, provide some, all or none of the hardware, software, materials, expertise, and labor that may be required from time to time to bring the Contractor-supplied goods, services, practices, and/or procedures into compliance with the Security Requirements and the Security Safeguards.

# 35.7 Connectivity and Access to County Network, Systems, Software, and/or Information:

Contractor and Contractor personnel who will be providing and/or maintaining goods and/or services, and who may from time to time access County systems, networks, software, and/or information, must be familiar with, and agree to adhere to and comply with the Security Requirements that pertain to and govern access to County computers, networks, software, and information including without limitation the Travis County Government Asset Protection Policy, Access Control Standard, Remote Access Standard, Security Awareness Policy, and Third Party Security Awareness Standard.

36.0 **CONFLICT OF INTEREST QUESTIONNAIRE:** If required by Chapter 176, Texas Local Government Code, Contractor shall complete and file a Conflict of

Interest Questionnaire with the County Clerk, Elections Division, 5501 Airport Blvd., Austin, Texas 78751. Contractor shall update this Questionnaire by September 1 of each year for the duration of this Contract, as required by Chapter 176 of the Local Government Code. In addition, if any statement on a submitted Questionnaire becomes incomplete or inaccurate, the Contractor shall submit an updated Questionnaire. Contractor should note that the law requires the County to provide access to a filed Questionnaire on the official Travis County Internet website.

Cameras should be part of the existing exterior IP-based enterprise system and operate on a scaled system of installation on a per-camera (versus per controller) basis and become operative to an intelligent monitoring system.

Nineteen cameras should be positioned as specified on Attachments F-1 and F-2 (see below). All efforts for design, delivery & install, implementation, and subsequent maintenance shall be made towards fulfilling the requirements.

Attachment F-1 (the 700 Lavaca Camera Placement drawing) illustrates the desired locations for camera placement and the field of view for each. Thirteen locations are specified with two cameras at one location for a total of 15 cameras. Thirteen cameras will be fixed position and two will be PTZ.

Attachment F-2 (the Garage Camera Placement drawing) illustrates the desired locations for four fixed position cameras and the field of view for each. All cameras shall be internet protocol (IP)-driven cameras.

Contractor will provide ongoing maintenance and support post-implementation.

#### **2.0 TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS:**

2.1 <u>Camera Licensing for Video Management System (VMS)</u>: Each camera shall include a license key that is obtained through OnSSI (On-Net Surveillance Systems, Inc.) in order to connect to the county VMS. The license must be installed and configured to conform to the current video recording rate, recording location, schedule, and other general settings. All configuration must be done be an OnSSI-certified technician or engineer.

#### 2.2 Building Exterior Cameras:

The preferred form factor for the fixed cameras shall be mini dome with weather resistant properties. The garage cameras will incorporate vandal resistant properties. The cameras shall be capable of HD or megapixel resolution with motion detection. Compression technology must include the option to use H.264, MPEG, and JPEG.

#### 2.2.1 **POWER**

The preferred power source shall be power over Ethernet (POE).

#### 2.2.2 DAY/NIGHT VIEWABILITY

All cameras shall have day/night capability. The main target (doors, glass walls, etc.) shall be viewable at all times during the day and within 80 feet when at night. The night/dim light feature for the PTZ will not be a consideration.

#### 2.2.3 RESOLUTION

a) The resolution (HD or megapixel) must meet forensic review level quality.

NOTE: Primary targets can vary from 8' wide x 80' long to 40 degree tilt x 120 degree horizontal view. Travis County has available photographs taken from each assigned camera's vantage point. These are available to the Proposer in conjunction with the execution of the non-disclosure agreement.

- b) The determination of the respective camera lens shall take into consideration the Horizontal Field of View (HFV) and the specific target under ideal conditions and lighting.
- c) Pixels per square foot shall be between 50 and 80 PPS such that a clear image of a face is readily possible under forensic review.

#### 2.2.4 NETWORK PROTOCOLS

The camera shall incorporate the use of SNMP (Simple Network Management Protocol) and any other protocol necessary for connection to the VMS.

#### 2.2.5 DEVICE SECURITY

The camera must support a user-defined password that can be set at the camera and accepted by the VMS.

# **SecurePlan** Administration Policy

January 1, 2012

Knight Security Systems *SecurePlan* service level agreement is a comprehensive and extensive customer support program that includes routine preventative maintenance, priority support, software upgrades, and premium service plan. *SecurePlan* may also include system health monitoring that will alert Knight Security of system issues proactively.

The *SecurePlan* agreement covers the operation of an electronic system for the term specified in the signed agreement between Knight Security Systems and our customer. *SecurePlan* coverage is limited to the list of equipment provided by Knight Security and agreed upon by the Customer. If no such list was provided by Knight, the equipment covered is limited to that equipment installed by Knight Security within 90 days immediately prior to the date on the *SecurePlan* agreement.

# **Priority Dispatch with GUARANTEED Same Day Service**

SecurePlan customers receive PRIORITY DISPATCH SERVICE. If a service request is received by Knight Security from a customer with a current SecurePlan agreement in effect, and in accordance with the service call procedures provided by Knight Security Systems on a normal business day, Knight Security will initiate a response to address the reported issue before 5pm of that business day. Should the request for service be received after noon, Knight Security will respond no later than 5pm of the next business day. Failure by Knight Security to respond within these parameters shall result in a credit to the customer's account equivalent of one month of SecurePlan service. For customers with multi-location SecurePlan agreements, this credit shall be limited to the location of the service request only.

Knight Security personnel will evaluate the reported issue and make a determination regarding the best course of action to remedy the issue. In some cases, Knight Security's service response will consist of remote troubleshooting, diagnosis and resolution of the issue. In such cases, Knight Security, having responded in accordance with the above prescribed timeframes, will have rendered Service in accordance with this policy. Alternatively, Knight Security may dispatch a service technician to the site to investigate and resolve the issue in accordance to the response policy above. Priority Dispatch does not guarantee that a particular system issue will be entirely resolved within on the same day. Priority Dispatch guarantee shall not apply to service requests not covered by *SecurePlan*, regardless of when the determination of noncoverage is made.

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# Labor and travel cost during normal business hours is included.

Services under the *SecurePlan* agreement shall be performed during Knight Security's normal business hours which are generally, Mon-Fri, 8:00am to 5:00pm, excepting major national holidays. All the labor cost, including travel time, for service work qualifying under this *SecurePlan* agreement are provided at no charge. Additional charges for labor and travel will apply for service responses made the Knight Security that do not qualify under the *SecurePlan* coverage. Evening or weekend service requested by the customer will incur additional charges, minimum 2 hours. Note: normal business hours response (whether on site or remotely delivered service) may require that the Knight Security technician work past 5pm to resolve a customer issue, this event does not constitute evening service rates. Knight Security will strive to resolve the system issue at each service event; however, we may require additional service time on site. If Knight determines an additional trip will be required, this service call will be scheduled for the next business day, or at the customer's convenience.

# **SecurePlan** provides a 25% discount on labor rates

As a *SecurePlan* customer, a 25% discount shall be apply to all chargeable service labor rates charged as well as labor related to system additions. For Service labor, this discount applies to all billable work performed on components covered by SecurePlan at a particular location. For System additions, a 25% discount on labor will be applied to all system additions which are less than 50% of the initial value of the system covered by SecurePlan at this location. Should the customer have systems serviced or installed by Knight Security that are not covered by SecurePlan, this labor discount would not apply.

# Device repair or replacement

As long as the *SecurePlan* agreement is in effect (which may be long after the manufacturer warranty expires), Knight will repair or replace any defective part of the System without charge to Purchaser, including consumable components (i.e. batteries) and parts that fail due to normal wear and tear on the system. Knight may use new or used parts of the same quality. Knight may keep all replaced components.

SecurePlan does not cover repairs that are needed because of any accident, act of God, vandalism, terrorism, misuse or abuse of the System, customer's failure to properly use the System, system service or programming changes made by anyone other than Knight Security, or a Knight Security authorized service provider, or any other reason except a defect in the

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equipment or Knight's installation. Service labor and materials provided by Knight Security which are excluded from *SecurePlan* coverage will be charged to customer.

# System software upgrades and license fees

The *SecurePlan* agreement includes manufacturer system software maintenance coverage over the term of the agreement. While software maintenance plans and coverage may vary slightly among manufacturers, generally this will provide for all software patches and new major software releases. Unless required to remedy a system issue covered by *SecurePlan*, Knight Security will apply eligible software patches and upgrades during the next scheduled system maintenance period.

Knight Security, at its discretion, may refrain from implementing software upgrades or patches for which the customer may be eligible if Knight Security's anticipates that the upgrade would jeopardize system stability or performance. In some cases, upgrading of system software may require an upgrade to underlying system hardware, or computers accessing the system. **SecurePlan** does not cover upgrade of system hardware or computers that may be required to accommodate software upgrades.

# **FREE Loaner Equipment**

In some cases, system components may need to be sent to the manufacture to be repaired – even if covered by the manufacturer warranty. Such repairs may take several weeks and incur shipping charges. In cases where failed system components must be repaired or replaced, Knight Security will substitute a component of similar quality and function within 3 business days of the service request until such time as the permanent component is available. Provided the loaner replacement component is of equal or higher quality, Knight Security may, at its discretion, elect to leave the replacement loaner unit as a permanent service replacement part of the system and continue to be covered under the *SecurePlan* as original equipment. Knight Security will also cover all shipping costs for the repair.

# **Scheduled Functional Tests**

Based upon the terms of the *SecurePlan* agreement, Knight Security will schedule annual, quarterly or monthly visits to your site for a technician to test overall functionality and operation of the system as well as conduct a physical inspection of all components. If repairs are required and qualify under *SecurePlan*, Knight Security Systems will provide repairs to the system and the equipment. If component damage or deficiencies are discovered that are not

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covered by SecurePlan Knight Security technician will note the deficiency and advise the Customer of an estimated cost to perform a repair. Further, if software patches or upgrades are available for the system, this updates will be applied during the scheduled Preventative Maintenance. All activity shall be documented in an inspection and test report provided to the Customer.

# **System Health Monitoring**

Selection of the System Health Monitoring Option in conjunction with a *SecurePlan* agreement, allows Knight Security to automatically receive alerts from your system. The types of alerts will vary with each system and may include hard drive failure, power outages, network outages, or component failure. These alerts will enable Knight Security to proactively identify and respond to system issues without the need for a service call. Knight Security does NOT review or monitor video or security related alarms arising from normal system operations except for purposes of resolving system issues.

Should Knight Security personnel receive a system generated alert, Knight Security will initiate a service order and a response as deemed appropriate including the initiation of remote diagnostic activity prior to notification of the customer. In accordance with the *SecurePlan* priority response policy, System Heath Monitoring alert received before noon on a standard business shall be addressed before 5pm the same day. Alerts received after 12 noon, Knight Security will respond no later than 5pm of the next business day.

The System Health Monitoring requires a network connection from the monitored system to the Internet in order to connect with the Knight Security system health monitoring platform. Knight Security will utilize methods to establish a secure network connection between the Customer location and the Knight Security Customer Support Center. Unless specifically indicated in the *SecurePlan* agreement, the Customer must provide and maintain the Internet connection local to the system as well as an appropriate and compatible network "firewall" with VPN capabilities.
