WHEREAS, community corrections professionals provide services, support, and protection for victims; and

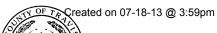
WHEREAS, community corrections professionals advocate community and restorative justice; and

AGENDA LANGUAGE: Consider and take appropriate action on a request to use available Precinct Two 2001 Bond projects savings to fund the engineering and Right-of-Way acquisition for Weiss Lane Bridge Improvements in Precinct One.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

Weiss Lane Safety Improvements and Weiss Lane Bridge are two bond projects approved by voters in the 2011 bond election. Weiss Lane Safety Improvements project will improve existing narrow two-lane road with two 12' travel lands, 4' paved shoulders and turn lanes at key intersections. Weiss Lane Bridge project will replace existing unsafe one-lane bridge with a new two-lane bridge. Weiss Lane Safety Improvements project was set up as a public-public partnership project with City of Pflugerville as approximately 40% of the project is located within City of Pflugerville's jurisdiction. City of Pflugerville volunteered and agreed to take the lead in managing both Weiss Lane Safety Improvements and Weiss Lane Bridge projects. Schedule of these two projects was set for the design to begin in 2014 as funding from City of Pflugerville will not be available until then. Pflugerville ISD is planning for a new middle school close to the intersection of Weiss Lane and Cele Road. Pflugerville ISD Board Members have met with Commissioner and TNR staff to express their desire for an earlier completion of both projects as the traffic will increase after the school opening plus Weiss Lane and bridge is on the school bus route. TNR agrees to expedite the implementation of Weiss Lane Bridge project as it is completely within County's jurisdiction. The Weiss Lane Safety Improvements project will need City of Pflugerville's concurrence on changing the schedule as the engineering cost will be funded by City of Pflugerville. Pflugerville ISD will meet with City of Pflugerville to discuss expediting the Weiss Lane Safety Improvements project.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Staff recommends approval of using 2001 bond projects savings to fund the engineering and right-of-way acquisition costs so to expedite the implementation of the Weiss Lane Bridge project.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

Weiss Lane was located in Precinct Two during 2011 bond referendum. The project is now located in Precinct One after the redistricting. County Attorney's Office, Auditor's Office, and PBO have reviewed and concurred with this recommendation of using 2001 Precinct Two bond projects savings to fund the engineering and right-of-way acquisition for the Weiss Lane Bridge project.

FISCAL IMPACT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

\$150,000 of Precinct Two 2001 bond savings has been reserved in 1490190000 4036 521040 600013 for the engineering and right-of -way acquisition of this project.

AGENDA LANGUAGE: Consider and take appropriate action the use of an Alternative Fiscal Agreement for Estancia Hill Country Subdivision, Phase 1 - Precinct Three.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

The developer of the subject subdivision requests to enter into an alternative fiscal agreement with Travis County. Under the alternative fiscal agreement the plat will be held in abeyance while the street and drainage facilities are constructed.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The request has been reviewed by TNR staff and staff finds the use of the subject agreement meets all Travis County standards. As such, TNR staff recommends the approval of the proposed motion.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

Under Alternative Fiscal the County Executive of TNR holds the plat in abeyance and, upon completion of the items listed below, the Division Director of Development Services authorizes the issuance of a Basic Development Permit for construction of streets and drainage facilities.

Plat Status

Staff has reviewed the plat and all comments have been addressed. It meets current standards and has everything in place such that it could be recommended for approval and recordation at this time.

Restoration/Erosion Control Fiscal

The fiscal for the subdivision restoration and improvements has been posted with the City of Austin in the amount of \$1,178,989.00.

Access to Publicly Maintained Road

Estancia Hill Country Subdivision, Phase 1 takes access from IH-35. IH-35 is maintained by the State of Texas' Department of Transportation.

Waste Water Service

Wastewater service for this subdivision will be provided by the City of Austin.

Construction Plans and Engineer's Estimate of Construction Cost Approved All comments by Travis County staff have been addressed and the reviewer is prepared to sign the cover sheets of the plans and issue permit #11-1998. The estimated cost of the improvements is \$5,613,104.50. This amount includes all costs related to the construction of all streets and drainage facilities (including temporary erosion controls and all structures contributing to the total detention.

The developer has signed the attached statement acknowledging that this action does not imply or guarantee plat approval by the Commissioners Court and that he/she understands the constraints related to the use of alternate fiscal. An Extension of Sixty-Day Period for Completed Plat Application Final Action is also included.

ALTERNATIVE FISCAL POLICY REQUEST AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

STATE OF TEXAS §

COUNTY OF TRAVIS

TO THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS:

The undersigned Owner proposes to subdivide that certain tract of land more particularly described in **Exhibit** "A", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The Owner requests that Travis County's Transportation and Natural Resources Department ("TNR") hold the proposed plat of land in abeyance until all of the proposed subdivision Improvements have been constructed to Travis County Standards for the Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions (the "Standards") to the satisfaction of the County Executive of TNR. In order to qualify for this Alternative Fiscal Policy, the proposed subdivision must meet the access criteria set forth in the Standards.

Under this Policy, the Owner is not required to post fiscal Security to secure the construction of the Improvements, but is required to obtain a Travis County Basic Development Permit. The owner will be required to post fiscal for boundary streets improvements if they are not to be completed during the construction of the Improvements. Additionally, the Owner shall file Security with the submitted Final Plat to secure restoration of disturbed areas should construction not be completed.

Upon satisfactory completion of the Improvements, the submitted plat shall be forwarded by TNR to the Commissioners Court for approval and recording.

If the Owner elects to proceed under this option, the Owner acknowledges and agrees that, until the plat is filed, the Owner may not use the proposed subdivision's description in a contract to convey real property, unless the conveyance is expressly contingent on the recording and approval of the final plat and the purchaser is not given the use or the occupancy of the real property before the recording of the final plat, under penalty of prosecution under Section 12.002 of the Texas Property Code. In addition, the approval of Alternative Fiscal in no way constitutes approval of the proposed plat.

If the plat is to be approved and filed, the Owner must post Security in the amount of 10% of the cost of the completed Improvements and 100% of the cost of the incomplete Improvements to secure the performance of the construction of the Improvements for one year, or more, from the date of the approval of the plat and acceptance of the dedication by the County.

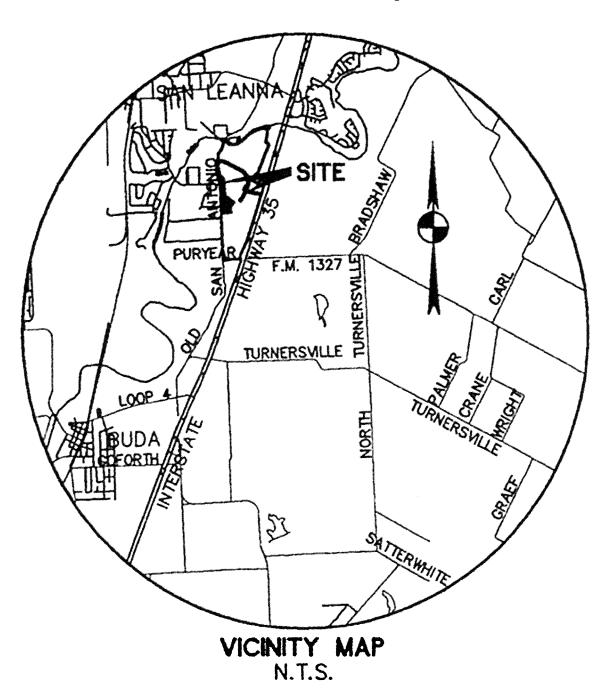

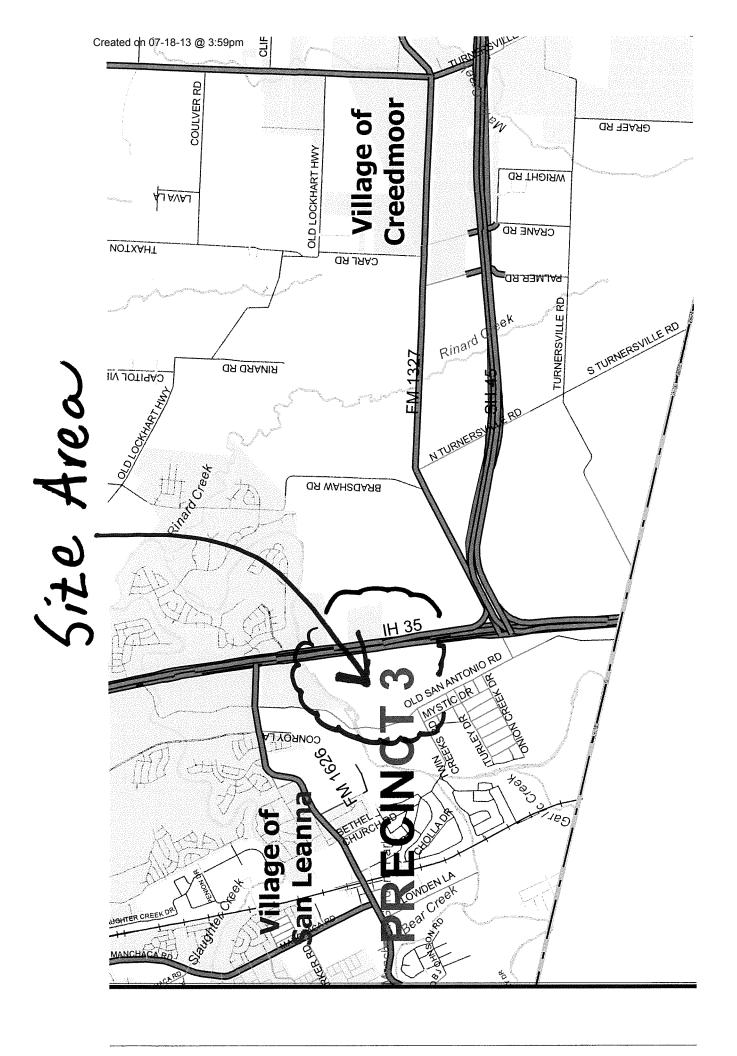

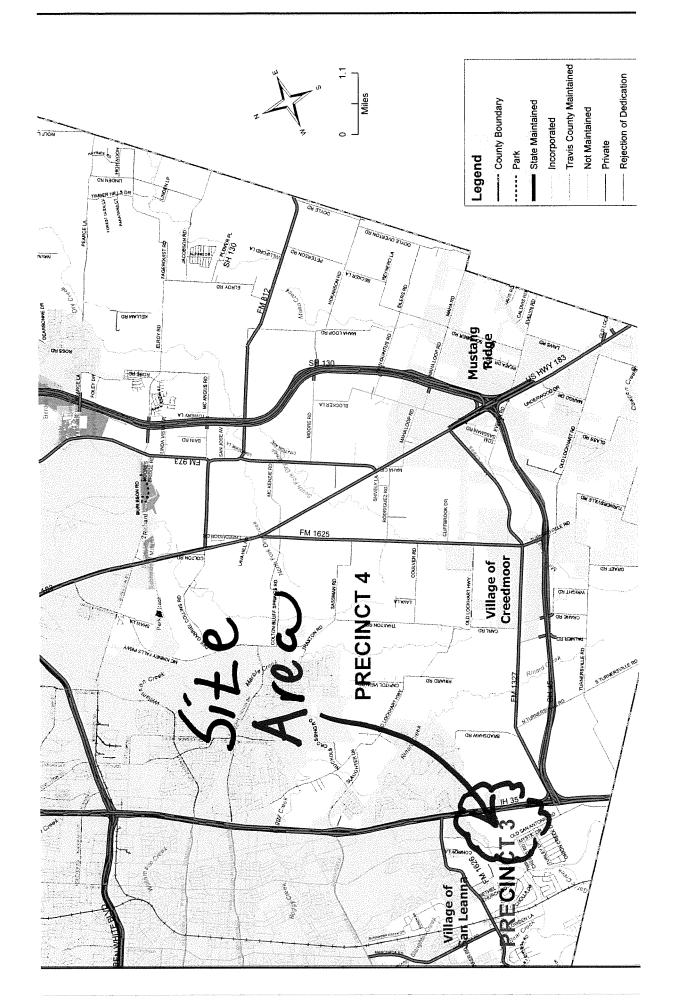

AGENDA LANGUAGE:

Consider and take appropriate action on the following requests in Precinct Four:

- A) Approve a license agreement with 973 Materials, LLC to restore a former soil excavation pit in the Onion Creek Greenway;
- B) Authorize TNR's County Executive to sign a letter to the City of Austin regarding the requirement for fiscal security for re-vegetation and post-mining reclamation; and
- C) Authorize TNR's County Executive to submit to the City of Austin a Declaration of Drainage Area acknowledging the legal restrictions against development of the land.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

On June 30, 2011, Travis County purchased approximately 120 acres of actively mined land in southeastern Travis County for inclusion in the Onion Creek Greenway bond project. The property is located at 5305 FM 973 South and was owned by the Steger family. The Stegers had an agreement with 973 Materials, LLC for the excavation of earthen material. As part of the Purchase Contract approved by the Commissioners Court, the Stegers required that the county enter into a "License Agreement for Temporary Construction Easement" with 973 Materials, LLC to allow excavation of earthen material from the site to continue (see Exhibit D of attached contract). Neither agreement required 973 Materials, LLC to restore the site to its natural land surface elevation.

Mining operations have now been completed and a 43 acre pit exists on the site. TNR Parks would like to use the property in the future as a park facility; 973 Materials, LLC is now in need of a site to dispose of earthen materials from its other operations. The license agreement would allow the pit to be partially refilled with these materials. Once the pit has been partially refilled TNR Parks will develop it for open space and/or recreational purposes. It is also desirable to backfill the pit to eliminate the occurrence of standing water which, on a large scale, could create operational problems for the nearby airport if birds are attracted. Toward that end, a License Agreement is proposed between Travis County and 973 Materials, LLC to restore the site. The terms of the proposed agreement include: (1) filling the existing

43 acre pit with uncontaminated earthen fill material (2) providing all required administrative and technical information necessary in order to obtain approval or clearance for a City of Austin site development plan and county development permit (3) future issuance of site plan and development permits, with the surface land area to be filled to a level of at least two feet above the seasonal high groundwater table to eliminate standing water, and (4) requirement that the pit be filled to within 5 feet of the natural ground elevation in the area within 200 feet of FM 973 and to within 10 feet of the natural ground elevation in the remainder area of the pit. Furthermore, the proposed agreement stipulates that top soil be used as the final layer of fill, with placement of such to ensure that the contour and slope the final surface will facilitate drainage so that water will not pond. Finally, the area is to be covered with coastal Bermuda vegetation after placement of the top soil. Approval of the license would also require 973 Materials, LLC to come into and maintain compliance with all regulatory requirements.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1) Staff recommends the Court approve the License Agreement with Mr. Walter Biel to restore the site for the future use as part of the Onion Creek Greenway.
- 2) Staff recommends authorizing TNR's County Executive to sign the attached letter to the City of Austin regarding the requirement for fiscal security for revegetation and post-mining reclamation.
- 3) Staff recommends authorizing TNR's County Executive to submit to the City of Austin the attached Declaration of Drainage Area acknowledging the legal restrictions against development of the land.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

The pit on the site might not be brought back to its original land surface elevation or be satisfactorily reclaimed and stabilized for many years to come. The License Agreement under 2.0 Terms of License stipulates a five-year agreement to complete restoration of the land area. If completion has not occurred by the fifth year anniversary of the effective date, the agreement shall remain in effect for consecutive terms of one (1) year each until completion, or until either party elects to terminate the agreement, or until restoration is completed before the end of the fifth year. Once the planned restoration of the 43 acre site is complete, the 120 acres are expected to become an integral section of the Onion Creek Greenway in southeast Travis County.

The City of Austin and Travis County each exercise permitting authority over water quality aspects of development in the ETJ and as such site plan approvals for this project are required from each. Typical requirements for site plan approval include (1) the dedication of a drainage easement for the 100-year floodplain area, and (2) the posting of fiscal security to ensure implementation of stormwater control

measures. However, in this case, City staff have agreed (1) to accept in lieu of a drainage easement the attached Declaration of Drainage Area acknowledging the legal restrictions against development of the land, and (2) waive the fiscal posting based on the attached letter stating that the county will require 973 Materials, LLC to implement the stormwater control measures for the site in the event the backfilling project is indefinitely halted. Since this is county land, Travis County ultimately will be responsible for implementing these controls itself if 973 Materials, LLC defaults under the License Agreement. If this occurs, TNR's Parks Division will provide funding if needed to work with the Road & Bridge and the Natural Resources and Environmental Quality (NREQ) Divisions to properly close the site to eliminate ponding, erosion, and sedimentation.

The pit is the result of the excavation of materials located within floodplain. Under normal development procedures the alteration of floodplain cannot increase flows upon neighboring properties; if it does, a Flood Insurance Rate Map revision is required. In this case, the excavation of mined materials has allowed for more temporary storage of stormwater, in effect temporarily reducing the limits of the premining 100-year floodplain. Filling the pit to pre-mining levels will bring the floodplain back to original limits.

FISCAL IMPACT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

If 973 Materials, LLC cannot complete the backfilling task, the operation will be discontinued; in which case the License Agreement requires 973 Materials, LLC to grade the site to drain and to re-vegetate it. The cost to the county to close the site properly ranges from \$0.00, if 973 Materials, LLC completes all of the work required under the License Agreement, up to approximately \$621,483 if the county cannot enforce the License Agreement against 973 Materials, LLC. Any funding needed will be provided by TNR's Parks Division budget and some or all of the work will be performed by TNR's Road & Bridge if necessary.

The pit can be used by TNR's Road & Bridge for a spoils site for disposing of clean fill material it obtains from a variety of excavation operations; which will save in haul costs.

THIS CONTRACT OF SALE (this "Contract") is made by and between Leslie Ray Steger, Jo Anna Steger Williams, and Gary Gene Steger, hereinafter referred to as SELLER, and TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, hereinafter referred to as BUYER, for the consideration and upon and subject to the terms, provisions, and conditions hereinafter set forth.

SECTION I - PURCHASE AND SALE

The SELLER hereby agrees to sell and convey to BUYER and BUYER agrees to purchase that interest in real property situated in Travis County, Texas, together with all improvements and fixtures, privileges, and appurtenances pertaining thereto, hereinafter collectively called PROPERTY, described as follows:

Approximately 120 acres, more or less, out of the J. A. Navarro Survey, Abstract 18, Travis County, Texas, and as described in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if set out at length.

SECTION II - CONSIDERATION

BUYER agrees to buy and SELLER agrees to sell the PROPERTY for One Million, Five Hundred Thousand and No/100 DOLLARS (\$1,500,000.00) and other good and valuable consideration. If, after survey of the PROPERTY has been completed, it is determined that the total land area of the PROPERTY is more than 120 acres, the purchase price and consideration stipulated herein shall be increased at a pro-rate rate of \$12,500 per acre for each acre, or part thereof, greater than 120 acres. If, after survey of the PROPERTY has been completed, it is determined that the total land area of the PROPERTY is less than 120 acres, the consideration and purchase price outlined herein shall be decreased at a pro-rate rate of \$12,500 per acre for each acre, or part thereof, less than 120 acres.

SECTION III - COMMITMENT FOR TITLE INSURANCE AND SURVEY

BUYER may obtain a Commitment for Title Insurance (the "Commitment") and legible copies of all recorded instruments affecting the property and recited as exceptions in the Commitment. SELLER will obtain at SELLER'S sole cost, a survey of the PROPERTY

("Survey") and deliver 5 original copies of the survey to BUYER no later than 30 days after the effective date. If BUYER has an objection to items disclosed in such Commitment or Survey, SELLER shall cure the same by date of closing. BUYER may waive any item in the Commitment or Survey and complete the purchase.

The SELLER shall perform, observe, and comply with all of the covenants, agreements, and conditions required by this agreement prior to or as of the closing.

SECTION IV - REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES OF SELLER

The SELLER hereby represents and warrants to BUYER now, through closing and surviving closing, the following:

- A. No one resides on or uses any portion of the PROPERTY as lessees, tenants at sufferance, or trespassers;
- B. SELLER is the fee simple owner of the title to the PROPERTY and is duly authorized and empowered to sell said PROPERTY;
- C. SELLER has paid all taxes, charges, debts, and other assessments due by the SELLER with respect to the PROPERTY;
- D. There will be no unrecorded liens, mortgages, loans, Uniform Commercial Code liens, or other encumbrances against any of the PROPERTY which will not be satisfied out of the Sales Price; and
- E. SELLER shall not further encumber, or allow the encumbrance of, the title to the PROPERTY or modify the terms or conditions of any existing encumbrances, if any, without written consent of BUYER.
- F. As of the Closing Date, SELLER has terminated any agreement with Walter Biel or 973 Materials, LLC or both Walter Biel and 973 Materials, LLC relating to the PROPERTY.

If any representation above is untrue, SELLER shall remedy the deficiency prior to closing. Should SELLER not remedy the deficiency prior to closing, the SELLER shall be in default.

SECTION V - CLOSING

The parties will finalize the transaction by closing on or before 60 days after the date of this Contract, which date is hereinafter referred to as the Closing Date. This date may be extended upon confirmation by the parties.

A. At the closing, SELLER shall deliver to BUYER the following:

- 1. A duly executed and acknowledged General Warranty Deed in a form and substance as the Deed attached as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein as if set out at length, conveying good and indefeasible title in fee simple to all of the Property, free and clear of any and all liens, encumbrances, conditions, easements, assessments, reservations and restrictions, except as permitted herein below and/or approved by BUYER in writing prior to closing.
- 2. An Owner's Policy of Title Insurance (the "Title Policy"), with premium cost to be paid by the SELLER, issued by Independence Title Insurance Company (Laura Brookshire, escrow officer, Arboretum Office) in the full amount of the Sales Price, dated as of the closing, insuring BUYER'S contractual interest to the PROPERTY to be good and indefeasible subject only to those title exceptions contained in the standard, printed form allowed by the State Department of Insurance, however;
 - a. the exception as to restrictive covenants shall be endorsed "None of Record," unless waived by BUYER before closing.
 - b. the exception as to the lien for taxes shall be limited to the year of closing and shall be endorsed "Not Yet Due and Payable".
- 3. Evidence of its capacity and authority for the closing of this transaction.
- 4. All signed releases, affidavits, and other necessary documents to close this transaction.
- 5. Possession of the PROPERTY.
- 6. Evidence that all general real estate taxes for the then current year relating to the Property (if purchased in fee) and interest on any existing indebtedness prorated to the day of closing have been paid.
- 7. Evidence that all special taxes or assessments to the Closing Date shall be paid by Seller.
- B. The SELLER shall pay all cost of releasing existing loans, liens or other encumbrances, title insurance premium, his attorney's fees and all other expenses stipulated to be paid by the SELLER under other provisions of this Contract.
- C. At the closing, BUYER shall perform the following:
 - 1. Pay, by check, the purchase price.
 - 2. Sign any documents a buyer would normally sign to close a similar transaction.

SECTION VI - BREACH BY SELLER

In the event that the SELLER shall fail to fully and timely perform any of its obligations hereunder or shall fail to consummate the sale of the property for any reason, except the BUYER'S default, the BUYER may enforce specific performance of this Contract, bring suit for damages against the SELLER, or seek any other remedy provided by law.

SECTION VII - BREACH BY BUYER

In the event that the BUYER should fail to consummate the purchase of the property, leaving the BUYER in default and the SELLER not being in default hereunder, the SELLER shall have the right to bring suit for damages against the BUYER.

SECTION VIII - MEDIATION

When mediation is acceptable to both parties in resolving a dispute arising under this Contract, the parties agree to use the Dispute Resolution Center of Austin, Texas as the provider of mediators for mediation as described in Section 154.023 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Unless both parties are satisfied with the result of the mediation, the mediation will not constitute a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communications within the scope of the mediation shall remain confidential as described in Section 154.073 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, unless both parties agree, in writing, to waive the confidentiality.

SECTION IX - MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. <u>Survival of Covenants</u>. Any of the representations, warranties, covenants, and agreements of the parties pertaining to a period of time following the closing of the transactions contemplated hereby shall survive the closing and shall not be merged therein.

WHEREAS TRAVIS COUNTY, hereinafter called LICENSOR, whether one or more, who is the owner of approximately 120 acres, more or less, out of the J. A. Navarro Survey, Abstract 18, Travis County, Texas, and as described in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if set out at length, hereinafter referred to as the PROPERTY;

WHEREAS, the LICENSOR is aware that excavation and earth work is required by Walter Biel and 973 Materials, LLC hereinafter called LICENSEE, and that the improvements will require entering onto the PROPERTY for the purpose of removal of earthen fill material and grading; and

WHEREAS, LICENSEE represents to LICENSOR that any agreement with Walter Biel or 973 Materials, LLC or both Walter Biel and 973 Materials, LLC relating to the PROPERTY has been terminated;

NOW, THEREFORE, the LICENSOR grants the following:

1. GRANT OF LICENSE.

LICENSOR does hereby grant and demise unto the LICENSEE and its contractors the right to enter the PROPERTY for the purpose of removal of earthen fill material, without fee to LICENSOR, subject to the conditions as set out below in Section III.

2. TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION AREA.

LICENSEE agrees to limit its construction activities to the area as shown on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof, and otherwise described as the southernmost portion of the PROPERTY, bounded on the west by the easterly right-of-way line of F.M. 973, on the south by the southern boundary line of the PROPERTY, on the east by the westerly right-of-way line for State Highway 130, and on the north by a boundary line between S.H. 130 and F.M 973, running parallel to and One Thousand feet (1,000') north of the southern boundary of the PROPERTY.

3. CONDITIONS.

In consideration for the above mentioned grant of license, LICENSEE agrees to do the following:

3.1 No tree within the Temporary Construction Area may be removed or disturbed without prior approval of the LICENSOR.

- 3.2 Other than changes to topography and elevation, the Temporary Construction Area will be restored to substantially the same condition which existed prior to the construction activities, to include grading and contour of land areas.
- 3.3 Provide reclamation of disturbed land areas, to include installation of a topsoil cover in locations of excavation, and seeding of native grasses in such areas of topsoil.
- 3.4 Without in any way limiting the liability of LICENSEE or its obligations under this License, LICENSEE agrees to maintain during the term of this License Commercial General Liability Insurance in the amounts as may be requested in written notice by LICENSOR from time to time during the term of this License.

4. TERMINATION.

This License shall terminate on March 1, 2012.

LICENSEE AGREES TO AND SHALL INDEMNIFY, SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS, AND DEFEND LICENSOR, ITS AGENTS, OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES FROM ANY AND ALL NEGLIGENCE, LIABILITY, LOSS, COSTS, CLAIMS, INCLUDING ATTORNEYS FEES, OR EXPENSES OF WHATEVER TYPE OR NATURE FOR PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE, ARISING IN WHOLE OR IN PART OUT OF ANY AND ALL ACTS OF COMMISSION OR OMISSION OF LICENSEE, ITS AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES, ARISING OUT OF IN CONNECTION WITH THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT OR LICENSEE'S USE OF THE PROPERTY FOR WHICH A CLAIM, INCLUDING ATTORNEYS FEES, DEMAND, SUIT OR OTHER ACTION IS MADE OR BROUGHT BY ANY PERSON, FIRM, CORPORATION, OR OTHER ENTITY AGAINST LICENSEE OR LICENSOR.

6. NON-ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS

LICENSEE may not assign this License Agreement or any portion or right thereof without the prior written consent of LICENSOR.

7. AMENDMENTS

This License Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both LICENSOR and LICENSEE. IT IS EXPRESSLY ACKNOWLEDGED BY LICENSEE THAT NO OFFICER, AGENT, REPRESENTATIVE OR EMPLOYEE OF LICENSOR HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, TO MODIFY OR AMEND THE TERMS OF THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT UNLESS EXPRESSLY GRANTED THAT SPECIFIC AUTHORITY BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TRAVIS COUNTY.

8. NON-WAIVER AND RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

- 8.1 No act or omission by LICENSOR may constitute or be construed as a waiver of any breach or default of LICENSEE which then exists or may subsequently exist. The failure of either party to exercise any right or privilege granted in this License Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of that right or privilege.
- 8.2 All rights of LICENSOR under this License Agreement are specifically reserved and any act or omission shall not impair or prejudice any remedy or right of LICENSOR under it. This License Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Travis County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("County") and 973 Materials, LLC ("Licensee").

1.0 GRANT AND TERMS OF LICENSE

- 1.1 County hereby grants a License to Licensee, its employees, agents, and independent contractors, to enter and use the 120.725 acre tract described in the deed to the County recorded at Document Number 2011095081, Travis County Real Property Records ("the Property") for the purpose of placing uncontaminated earthen fill material in the existing pit on an approximately 43 acre site adjacent to the southwest boundary of the Property, as provided in this Agreement. Fill material shall not include garbage, new asphalt, weathered asphalt, concrete or other rubble, or soils containing nonweathered asphalt residue, or waste. All fill material must be inert and essentially insoluble.
- 1.2 The Licensee shall, at the earliest feasible date, obtain a City of Austin site plan and County development permit authorizing fill in compliance with the terms of this Agreement.
- Upon issuance of the site plan and development permits, the Licensee 1.3 shall:
- a. within 30 days fill the pit to a level of at least two feet (2') above the seasonally high groundwater table and contour and slope the surface to facilitate drainage to ensure that water will not pond; and
- b. thereafter fill the pit to return the ground elevation to five feet (5') below the natural grade adjacent to the pit for any part of the pit within two hundred feet (200') of a public road, and for the remainder of the pit, to ten feet (10') below the natural grade adjacent to the pit (or any other elevation agreed to in writing by the County), place top soil as the final layer of fill, contour and slope the final surface to facilitate drainage to ensure that water will not pond, and establish coastal Bermuda as final cover (collectively, "Completion"). The Licensee's obligation to place top soil as the final layer of fill is limited to placing the soil contained in the existing berms on the site. At the County's cost, the County may require the Licensee to place additional top soil as part of the final laver.

- obtain, maintain, and upon request allow the County to inspect and copy written certification of the source and content of that material. The Licensee shall also maintain and upon request allow the County to inspect and copy a plan of the site indicating the general location where each load is placed. The County may inspect the site and Licensee's records to determine compliance with this Agreement. If the County has cause to believe Licensee has placed unacceptable materials on the site, the County may require the Licensee to conduct or pay for a certification from a NELAC-certified laboratory that the fill material meets the foregoing requirements.
- 1.5 The Licensee shall at all times establish and maintain positive drainage so as to prevent ponding of water on the site until the pit is completely filled. If positive drainage cannot be achieved, the Licensee shall use sump pumps or other methods approved by County to remove standing water from any source.
- 1.6 The Licensee shall provide and maintain (i) temporary erosion and sedimentation controls for the pit until Completion, and (ii) permanent erosion and sedimentation controls at all points where storm water leaves the site. Unless otherwise approved by the County in writing, broadcasted seeding shall not be used for establishing vegetation as it may attract birds.
- 1.7 The County reserves the right to place or to authorize the placement of fill material on the Property meeting the requirements of Section 1.1. The County and the Licensee shall agree on the general location where each load is placed. The County shall provide for a contour and slope to facilitate drainage to ensure that water will not pond. The County shall obtain and maintain written certification of the source and content of the material. If the County authorizes a third party to place fill material on the Property, the third party shall be responsible for placement and grading unless the third party agrees to pay the Licensee for placement and grading.
- 1.8 Licensee agrees to make no changes to or use of the Property other than those provided in this Agreement.
- 1.9 Licensee acknowledges and agrees that Licensee shall be solely responsible at all times for the actions and the safety of those persons utilizing the Property under this Agreement, including, without limitation, protecting such persons from injury or death and protecting County's property and the property of such persons from loss or damage.

2.0 TERM OF LICENSE

2.1 This Agreement shall terminate upon the earlier to occur of Completion of the fifth anniversary of the Effective Date. If Completion has not occurred by the fifth

anniversary of the Effective Date, this Agreement shall remain in effect for consecutive terms of one (1) year each until Completion occurs or unless either party elects to terminate this agreement by sending written notice to the other party at least thirty (30) days before expiration of the then-current term.

2.2 If the agreement is terminated before Completion, the Licensee shall grade and contour the pit to restore it to a level of at least to five feet (5') below the natural grade adjacent to the pit for any part of the pit within two hundred feet (200') of a public road, grade the pit to achieve a slope of 3:1, or complete any other action agreed to in writing by the County that achieves compliance with 43 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 21, including establishing and maintaining vegetative cover and positive drainage so as to prevent erosion and ponding of water.

3.0 CONSIDERATION

3.1 The consideration for this Agreement, the adequacy of which the Parties acknowledge, is the mutual benefits to the Parties from the Licensee's placement of earthen fill material on the Property.

4.0 PERMITS

- 4.1 Before placing earthen fill material on the Property, the Licensee shall obtain all federal, state, city, and County permits required for Licensee's activities. Thereafter, the Licensee shall comply with all related regulatory requirements.
- 4.2 Without limiting Section 4.1, the Licensee shall implement all measures necessary to ensure the site's compliance with 43 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 21, including installing and maintaining any barriers required under §21.706 and providing a copy of the safety certificate required under, and eliminating any part of the pit violating, §21.708.

5.0 USE AND REPAIRS

LICENSEE FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE USE OF THE PROPERTY AS PROVIDED FOR HEREIN IS MADE ON AN "AS-IS" CONDITION AND BASIS WITH ALL FAULTS. IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED THAT THE CONSIDERATION FOR THE USE OF THE PROPERTY HAS BEEN NEGOTIATED TO REFLECT THAT ALL OF THE PROPERTY IS LICENSED BY LICENSOR AND ACCEPTED BY LICENSEE IN THE "AS-IS" CONDITION. THIS ACCEPTANCE BY THE LICENSEE SHALL BE AN ACKNOWLEDGMENT THAT THERE IS NO LANDLORD/TENANT RELATIONSHIP ESTABLISHED BETWEEN LICENSOR AND LICENSEE HAS NO EXPECTATION OF WARRANTIES AS TO USE OR LICENSEE. HABITABILITY OF THE PROPERTY.

6.0 CONTROL OF TRAVIS COUNTY

6.1 The County retains the right to possession and use of the Property for any purpose that does not prevent reasonable exercise of the license granted to the Licensee by this Agreement.

7.0 INDEMNIFICATION

- 7.2 Licensee shall not discharge, leak, or emit, or permit to be discharged, leaked, or emitted, any material into the atmosphere, ground, sewer system, or any body of water, if that material (as is reasonably determined by the Licensor, or any governmental authority) does or may pollute or contaminate the same, or may adversely affect (i) health, welfare, or safety of persons, whether located on the Premises or elsewhere, or (ii) the condition, use or enjoyment of the building or any other real or personal property. Licensee shall immediately notify Licensor of any release of any Hazardous Material on or near the Premises whether or not such release is in a quantity that would otherwise be reportable to a public agency and shall also

- 8.3 Licensee shall deliver to County an original, signed certificate of insurance meeting the requirements of this section before placing earthen fill material on the Property and on each anniversary of the Effective Date during the term of this Agreement.

The work will be performed through a License Agreement with 973 Materials LLC but may be partially performed by TNR's Road&Bridge forces. This letter states our intent to construct the improvements, including all erosion and water pollution control requirements per the approved plans, in leau of a Letter of Credit. This procedure has been accepted in the past between our agencies (e.g. the U.S. 183 Landfill Remediation Project, permitted and constructed in 1994-95 (SP-94-0074D).

Erosion/sedimentation controls will be installed per the approved plans where needed due to construction activity, as well as revegetation for permanent stabilization. The quantities of temporary and permanent erosion control that are included in the project are described on the attached estimate provided by City staff.

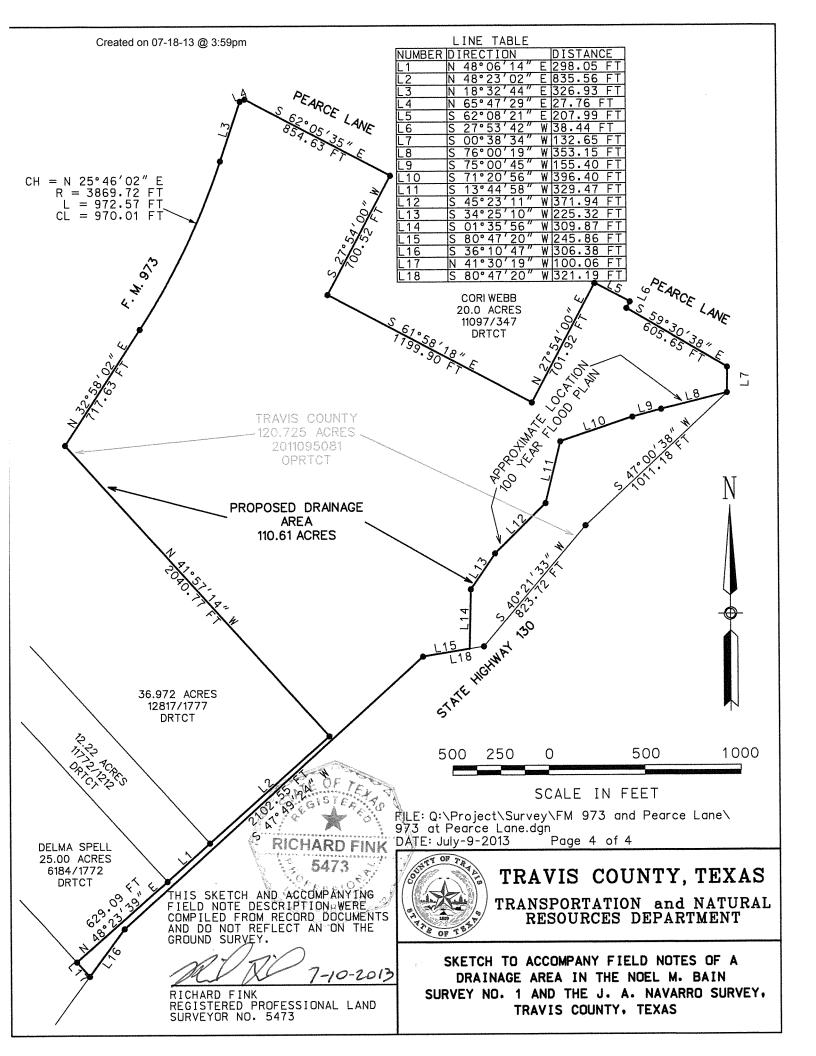

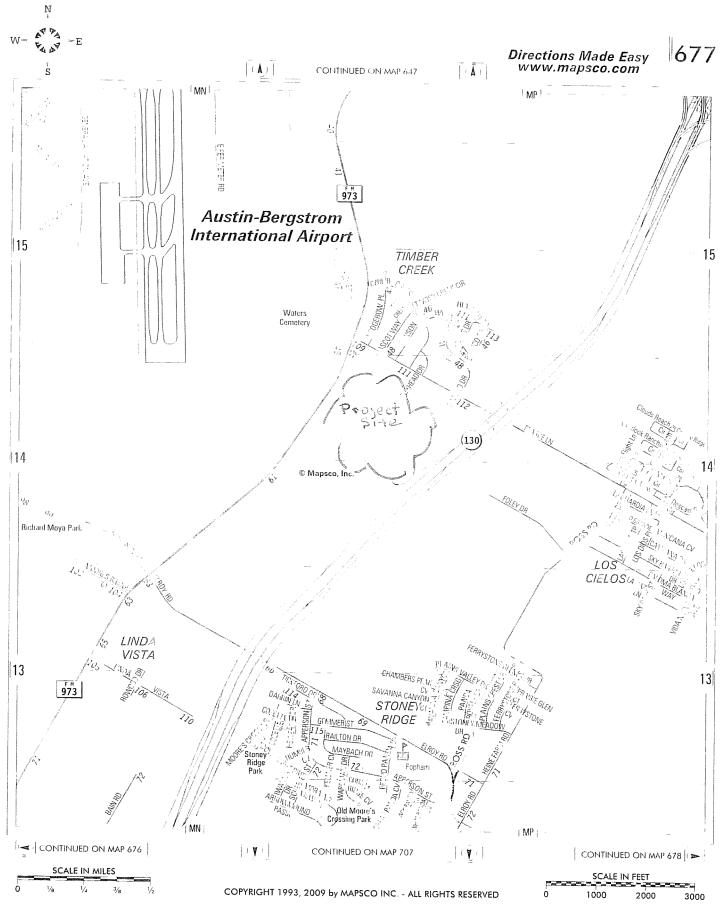

Summary and Staff Recommendation: Staff requests the acceptance of this application to continue the Financial Support Plus 1 Program with City of Austin, Austin Energy. The amount for current program agreement period is \$135,000. This amount is allocated quarterly. These program funds are used to respond to utility assistance requests from households having an income at or below 200% of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines and are unable to meet their household energy needs. The households must be customers of Austin Energy and Travis County residents.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact: We utilize the allocated funds for direct service of utility assistance. Travis County will not receive or deposit these funds as they are internally allocated to our agency by Austin Energy each quarter in the contract period. No matching funds are required. The current contract period is 10/01/12 through 09/30/13.

Issues and Opportunities: The funding allocated by Austin Energy for this program is the largest local program funding received by the department for utility assistance.

Background: Travis County has participated in this program for a number of years. The department utilizes this program, as well as coordinating its efforts with other community resources, faith-based organizations and other local agencies providing services to Travis County residents.

Within the last full program year (FY12), we were able to assist 378 households within Travis County using this program funding. The operation of this program allows our department the ability to provide utility assistance to clients who are experiencing an energy-related hardship. The aim of such services, to assist clients in obtaining self-sufficiency, is consistent with the goal of the Travis County Health and Human Services and Veterans Service department.

at Travis County Correctional Complex

The FY 13 Adopted Budget includes \$153,203 in Capital Acquisition Resources (CAR) for TCSO vehicle radios. The Travis County Sheriff's Office has submitted a request to reallocate \$120,000 of this amount for engineering services replace the boiler system at Building 12 at the Travis County Correctional Complex. This critical request is due to problems with the boiler system where four of the eight boilers have developed leaks and are no longer covered under warranty. Two of the four boilers are scheduled to be replaced this year at Building 12 and a TCSO has an interim solution for the other two leaking boilers until a new system is in place. TCSO has determined that a new system with built-in redundancy is needed should a part of the system fail in the future then the correct water temperatures can be maintained in Building 12 per jail standards. The estimated cost of the engineering work is \$120,000 and will correctly size electronic mixing values, water heaters and provide a scope of work and drawings for the installation and big process.

Funding for the installation of the system to replace four of the eight boiler units is recommended in the FY 14 Preliminary Budget with the remaining other half of the system likely requested as a part of the FY 15 budget process. PBO has worked with the office to identify the \$120,000 needed from funding reserved in the FY 13 budget for the replacement of vehicle radios that can reasonably deferred to a later time. After the reallocation, there will be balance of \$33,203 for radio replacement should resources for radio replacements be needed.

PBO supports the reallocation of CAR project resources of \$120,000 for this critical inmate related project.

During the FY 13 budget process, Commissioners Court approved \$108,000 in CAR funding to replace the large air handling unit for the University Savings Building (USB). This project has not yet been executed. However, the unit at USB is in working condition and is expected to continue working for the foreseeable future.

At this time, there is a large air handling unit at the Ray Martinez Precinct 4 Office Building that is failing and serves a large portion of the building. FMD is requesting that the \$108,000 in CAR funding for the USB air handler be instead used to meet the emergency need at the Ray Martinez Office Building. FMD has stated that it will wait until a future budget cycle to request new funding for the USB large air handling unit and will defer its replacement until new funding is approved by Commissioners Court.

PBO recommends approval of changing the project for which the \$108,000 is intended to address a critical issue. PBO will work with FMD in future budget cycles to ensure that appropriate funding is approved for the USB when needed.

Summary and Staff Recommendation: Staff requests the acceptance and authorization to apply for \$25,000 in funding for the Phase 31 grant period. This requested amount is the same amount awarded in the previous grant period. The funds awarded for this grant are used to provide emergency utility assistance for Travis County's low-income individuals and families who have an income at or below 200% of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact: The awarded funds will be budgeted in the utility assistance GL established for this grant fund. No matching funds are required. We expect a decision to be made concerning our application in the next few months. The current contract period was 04-01-12 through 03-31-13.

Issues and Opportunities: The department has participated in this program for a number of years. Within the most recent program period, the department assisted 128 households with their utility bills.

Other agencies receiving funds for this program use their funding to provide food, shelter and rental assistance for clients. Through coordinating efforts with these agencies with regard to their use of funding as well as ours, duplication of services is prevented and assistance is given in a more efficient and effective manner.

We will use all of the Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds for direct assistance to clients. These funds are used to supplement the Federal, State, and local grant funds to enable the department to extend utility assistance to indigent individuals and families who seek aid from the department.

Proposed Motion: Consider and take appropriate action to approve the contract with Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs for the LIHEAP Weatherization Assistance Program for 2013 - 14.

Summary and Staff Recommendation: Staff requests the acceptance of this contract from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA). The total grant funding for this contract is in the amount of \$823,394. The LIHEAP grant funds awarded to Travis County are used to provide weatherization services and minor home repair assistance for low-income households. Some examples of the program's weatherization services are providing attic and wall insulation, repair or replacement of the heating and cooling household appliances, minor household repairs, and addressing health and safety issues by adding or replacing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. The distribution of assistance will be to qualified Travis County residents with household income levels at or below 125% of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines with household weatherization needs.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact: We will be able to use the LIHEAP funds for administration, materials, labor and training. The funds for materials will be budgeted in the GL accounts for building repairs and maintenance and supplies & equipment. Funding for labor will be budgeted in the corresponding salaries and benefit GL accounts. Funds for training will be budgeted in the applicable registration and travel, meals and lodging GL accounts. No matching funds are required for this grant. This contract period is 04/01/13 through 03/31/14.

Issues and Opportunities: We were able to provide weatherization services for 68 dwelling units with use of these grant funds in the last allocation period. The department utilizes this program to obtain a goal of assisting low-income households in achieving a level of energy efficiency, giving priority to households with one or more persons age 60 or above and/or an individual with a disability. Priority also is given to those households with young children age five and under and to those with the lowest incomes that pay the highest portion of their incomes for home energy.

It should be noted that this contract is made available electronically to Travis County from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. Therefore, in addition to the Commissioners Court authorizing Judge Biscoe to sign the hard copy of the contract, it is also necessary for the Judge to authorize the County Purchasing Agent to sign off on the electronically transmitted contract.

SECTION 1. PARTIES TO THE CONTRACT

This Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program ("LIHEAP") Weatherization Assistance Program Contract (hereinafter "Contract") is made by and between the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, a public and official agency of the State of Texas ("Department")) and Travis County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("Subrecipient").

SECTION 2. CONTRACT TERM

Subrecipient shall implement a Weatherization Assistance Program ("WAP") in accordance with the provisions of Part A of the Energy Conservation in Existing Buildings Act of 1976, as amended (42 U.S.C. §6861 et seq.) ("WAP Act"), the sections of the U.S. Department of Energy ("DOE") implementing regulations codified in 10 C.F.R. Parts 440 and 600 ("WAP Regulations") as indicated herein, any applicable Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") Circulars, the Texas WAP State Plan, the Texas LIHEAP State Plan; the implementing State regulations at Title 10, Part I, Chapter 5, Subchapters A, E and G of the Texas Administrative Code as amended or supplemented from time to time ("State Rules"), the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Act of 1981 as amended (42 U.S.C. §8621 et seq.) ("LIHEAP Act"), and the implementing regulations codified in 45 C.F.R. Part 96 ("LIHEAP Regulations").

Subrecipient shall, on an equitable basis throughout its service area, develop and implement a WAP in the counties and in accordance with the term of the Contract and the "Budget and Performance Statement" attached as Exhibit A, the Certifications attached hereto as Exhibit B, the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act of 1996 ("PRWORA") Requirements for the WAP attached hereto as Exhibit C, the Documentation of Disability requirements attached hereto as Exhibit D, the LIHEAP Priority List attached hereto as Exhibit E, and all such Exhibits incorporated herein for all relevant purposes; the assurances, certifications, and all other statements made by Subrecipient in its funding under this Contract; and with all other terms, provisions, and requirements herein set forth. Subrecipient shall develop and implement the WAP to assist in achieving a prescribed level of energy efficiency in the dwellings of low-income persons. WAP services will be provided to owner occupied units as well as rental units. Priority will be given to in no particular order (1) households with Elderly Persons as defined in State Rules, (2) Persons with Disabilities as defined in State Rules, (3) households with young children that are age five (5) or younger, and/or (4) households with a high energy burden and households with high energy consumption. Subrecipients are allowed to perform weatherization measures as detailed in Exhibit E of this Contract. If Subrecipient leverages with any Department of Energy weatherization funds, all federal and state DOE rules and requirements will apply including but not limited to income calculation requirements as outlined in Department of Energy - Weatherization Program Notice 13-3. The work will be completed in accordance with the International Energy Conservation Code and the minimum requirements set in the State of Texas adopted International Residential Code or in jurisdictions authorized by State law to adopt later editions.

SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

- A. In consideration of Subrecipient's satisfactory performance of this Contract, Department shall reimburse Subrecipient for the actual allowable costs incurred by Subrecipient in the amount specified in the "Budget and Performance Statement" attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- B. Department's obligations under this Contract are contingent upon the actual receipt by Department of adequate 2013 LIHEAP federal program funds. If sufficient funds are not available to make payments under this Contract, Department shall notify Subrecipient in writing within a reasonable time after such fact is determined. Department may then terminate this Contract and will not be liable for the failure to make any payment to Subrecipient under this Contract. Department acknowledges that it has received obligations from those sources which, if paid, will be sufficient to pay the allowable costs incurred by Subrecipient under this Contract.
- C. Department is not liable for any cost incurred by Subrecipient which:

- Created in in \$440.22 of the WAP Regulations, except that pursuant to \$5.2(b)(34) of the State Rules the dwelling unit shall be eligible for weatherization assistance if it is occupied by a family unit whose income is at or below 125 percent of the poverty guidelines updated periodically in the Federal Register by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services under the authority of 42 U.S.C. §9902(2) "Poverty Income Guidelines" as;
 - (2) is incurred to weatherize a dwelling unit which is designated for acquisition or clearance by a federal, state, or local program within twelve months from the date weatherization of the dwelling unit is scheduled to be completed;
 - (3) is incurred to weatherize a dwelling unit previously weatherized with weatherization assistance program funds, except as provided for in §440.18(e)(2) of the WAP Regulations;
 - (4) is for Subrecipient's administrative costs incurred in excess of the maximum limitation set forth in Section 8 of this Contract:
 - (5) is not incurred during the Contract Term;
 - (6) is not reported to Department on a monthly expenditure or performance report within forty five (45) days after the termination of the Contract Term;
 - (7) is subject to reimbursement by a source other than Department; or
 - (8) is made in violation of any provision of this Contract or any provision of federal or state law or regulation, including, but not limited to those enumerated in this Contract.
- D. Subrecipient shall refund, within fifteen (15) days of Department's request, any sum of money paid to Subrecipient which Department determines has resulted in an overpayment or has not been spent in accordance with the terms of this Contract. Department may offset or withhold any amount otherwise owed to Subrecipient under this Contract against any amount owed by Subrecipient to Department arising under this or any other Contract between the parties.
- E. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Contract to the contrary, the total of all payments and other obligations incurred by the Department under this Contract shall not exceed the sum of \$823,394.00.

SECTION 5. METHOD OF PAYMENT/CASH BALANCES

- A. Each month, Subrecipient may request an advance payment of LIHEAP WAP funds under this Contract. As per the Uniform Grant Management Standards, 34 T.A.C. §20.421 et seq ("UGMS"), Subrecipient's requests for advances shall be limited to the amount needed and be timed to be in accordance with actual immediate cash requirements of the Subrecipient in carrying out the purpose of this Contract.
- B. The timing and amount of cash advances shall be as close as administratively feasible, not to exceed a 30-day projection of the actual disbursements by the Subrecipient to direct program costs and the proportionate share of any allowable indirect costs.
- C. Subsection 4(A) notwithstanding, pursuant to §5.17 of the State Rules, the Department reserves the right to use a modified cost reimbursement method of payment for all funds, whereby reimbursement of costs incurred by a Subrecipient is made only after the Department has reviewed and approved backup documentation provided by the Subrecipient to support such costs for all funds if (1) Department determines that Subrecipient has maintained excess cash balances; (2) Department identifies any deficiency in the cash controls or financial management system maintained by Subrecipient; (3) Department identifies any deficiency in the quality of weatherization work performed by Subrecipient; (4) Department determines that a modified cost reimbursement method would benefit the program; (5) Department's funding sources require the use of a modified cost reimbursement method; or (6) Subrecipient fails to comply with any of the reporting requirements of Section 10.
- D. All funds paid to Subrecipient under this Contract are paid in trust for the exclusive benefit of the eligible dwelling units of the weatherization assistance program and for the payment of the allowable expenditures identified in Section 8 of this Contract.

SECTION 6. COST PRINCIPLES AND ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

- A. Except as expressly modified by law or the terms of this Contract, Subrecipient shall comply with the cost principles and uniform administrative requirements set forth in 34 T.A.C. §20.421, Uniform Grant Management Standards and 10 T.A.C. §5.10. All references therein to "local government" shall be construed to mean Subrecipient.
- B. Uniform cost principles for political subdivisions are set forth in Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") Circular A-87 as implemented by 2 C.F.R. Part 225. Uniform administrative requirements for political subdivisions are set forth in OMB Circular A-102. OMB Circular A-133 "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations," sets forth audit standards for governmental organizations and other organizations expending Federal funds. The expenditure threshold requiring an audit under Circular A-133 is \$500,000.
- C. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Contract, Department shall only be liable to Subrecipient for costs incurred or performances rendered for activities specified in the WAP Act and LIHEAP Act.

SECTION 7. TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION

- A. Department may terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, at any time Department determines that there is cause for termination. Cause for termination includes but is not limited to Subrecipient's failure to comply with any term of this Contract. Department shall notify Subrecipient in writing no less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of termination.
- B. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to limit Department's authority to withhold payment and immediately suspend Subrecipient's performance under this Contract if Department identifies possible instances of fraud, abuse, waste, fiscal mismanagement, or other serious deficiencies in Subrecipient's performance. Suspension shall be a temporary measure pending either corrective action by Subrecipient or a decision by Department to terminate this Contract.
- C. Notwithstanding any exercise by Department of its right of termination or suspension, Subrecipient shall not be relieved of any liability to Department for damages by virtue of any breach of this Contract by Subrecipient. Department may withhold any payment due to Subrecipient until such time as the exact amount of damages due to Department is agreed upon or is otherwise determined in writing between parties.
- D. Department shall not be liable for any costs incurred by Subrecipient after termination or during suspension of this Contract.
- E. Notwithstanding any exercise by Department of its right of termination or suspension, Subrecipient shall not be relieved of any liability to Department for damages by virtue of any breach of this Contract by Subrecipient.
- F. Subrecipient's failure to expend the funds provided under this Contract in a timely manner may result in either the termination of this Contract or Subrecipient's ineligibility to receive additional funding under WAP, or a reduction in the original allocation of funds to Subrecipient.

SECTION 8. ALLOWABLE EXPENDITURES

- A. The allowability of Subrecipient's costs incurred in the performance of this Contract shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Sections 4 and 5 of this Contract and the regulations set forth in §440.18 of the WAP Regulations, subject to the limitations and exceptions set forth in this Section.
 - To the maximum extent practicable, Subrecipient shall utilize funds provided under this Contract for the purchase of weatherization materials. Subrecipient shall weatherize eligible dwelling units using only weatherization materials which meet or exceed the standards prescribed by DOE in Appendix A to Part 440 of the WAP Regulations, State of Texas adopted International Residential Code (IRC) or jurisdictions authorized by State law to adopt later editions.
- B. For units where Subrecipient leverages with any Department of Energy weatherization funds, all weatherization measures installed must have an approved State of Texas Energy Audit savings-to-investment ratio (SIR) of one or greater unless otherwise indicated as health and safety or incidental repair items. Weatherization measures installed shall begin with those having the greatest SIR (on approved State of Texas Energy Audit) and proceed in descending order to the measures with the smallest SIR or until the maximum allowable per unit expenditures are achieved.

Allowable expenditures under this Contract include:

- (1) the purchase and delivery of weatherization materials as defined in §440.3 of the WAP Regulations;
- (2) if Subrecipient leverages with any Department of Energy weatherization funds, labor costs for doors, primary windows and storm windows that will result in approved energy savings with a SIR of one or greater in accordance with §440.19 of the WAP Regulations;

- Created the 69st 80f3 weatherization materials and labor for heating and cooling system tune ups, repairs, modification, or replacements. Whenever available, heating and cooling systems must have an Energy Star rating;
 - (4) transportation of weatherization and repair materials, tools, equipment, and work crews to a storage site and to the site of weatherization work:
 - (5) maintenance, operation, and insurance of vehicles used to transport weatherization materials;
 - (6) maintenance of tools and equipment;
 - (7) purchase or lease of tools or equipment;
 - (8) employment of on-site supervisory personnel;
 - (9) storage of weatherization materials, tools, and equipment;
 - (10) incidental repairs (such as repairs to roofs, walls, floors, and other parts of a dwelling unit) if such repairs are necessary for the effective performance or preservation of weatherization measures (If incidental repairs are necessary to make the installation of the weatherization measures effective, the cost of incidental repair measures charged to WAP funds awarded under this Contract shall not exceed the cost of weatherization measures charged to WAP);
 - (11) allowable health and safety measures; and
 - (12) allowable base load reduction measures.
- C. Health and Safety funds not expended may be moved to the labor, materials, and program support category. These changes will require a Contract action; therefore, Subrecipient must provide written notification to the Department at least forty-five (45) days prior to the end of the Contract Term before these funds can be moved.
- D. Administrative costs incurred by Subrecipient in performing this Contract are to be based on actual programmatic expenditures and shall be allowed up to the amount outlined in the "Budget and Performance Statement" attached hereto as Exhibit A. Allowable administrative costs may include reasonable costs associated with Subrecipient's administrative personnel, travel, audit fees, office space, equipment, and supplies which are necessary for the administration of WAP. Administrative costs are earned based upon the allowable percentage of total allowable expenditures, excluding the allowance for Department/LIHEAP Training Travel or special equipment purchases. Subrecipient may use any or all of the funds allowed for administrative purposes under this Contract for the purchase and delivery of weatherization materials. These changes will require a contract action; therefore, Subrecipient must provide written notification to the Department at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the Contract Term before these funds can be moved.
- E. To the maximum extent practicable, Subrecipient shall secure the services of volunteers to weatherize dwelling units under the direction of qualified supervisors.

SECTION 9. RECORD KEEPING REQUIREMENTS

- A. Subrecipient shall comply with the record keeping requirements set forth at §440.24 of the WAP Regulations and §5.22 of the State Rules and with such additional record keeping requirements as specified by Department.
- B. For each dwelling unit weatherized with funds received from LIHEAP WAP under this Contract, Subrecipient shall maintain a file containing the following information, including the following Department forms found in the Community Affairs Division section of the Department's website at http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/community-affairs/wap/guidance.htm#forms:
 - (1) Signed and completed Application for Weatherization Services indicating the ages of the residents, presence in the household of children age five (5) or younger, Elderly Persons (60 years or older), as defined in the State Rules, and Persons with Disabilities as defined in the State Rules. Date of Application for Weatherization Services and associated documents must be within 12 months of the start date indicated on the Building Weatherization Report (BWR);
 - (2) Twelve month consumer billing history for utilities;
 - (3) Consumption disclosure release form (for access to consumption data for use in surveys and studies);
 - (4) Eligibility and Eligibility documentation:
 - For units where Subrecipient leverages with any Department of Energy weatherization funds the following Definition of Income must be adhered to:
 - I. INCOME: Income means Cash Receipts earned and/or received by the applicant before taxes during applicable tax year(s) but not the Income Exclusions listed below in Section C. Gross Income is to be used, not Net Income.
 - II. CASH RECEIPTS: Cash Receipts include the following:
 - money, wages and salaries before any deductions;
 - ii. net receipts from non-farm or farm self-employment (receipts from a person's own business or from an owned or rented farm after deductions for business or farm expenses);

- Created on 0 11/18-13 cm large payments from social security, railroad retirement, unemployment compensation, strike benefits from union funds, worker's compensation, veteran's payments, training stipends, alimony, and military family allotments;
 - iv. private pensions, government employee pensions (including military retirement pay), and regular insurance or annuity payments:
 - v. dividend and/or interest;
 - vi. net rental income and net royalties;
 - vii. periodic receipts from estates or trusts;
 - viii net gambling or lottery winnings; and
 - ix. any other required by Federal Laws.
 - III. INCOME EXCLUSIONS: The following Cash Receipts are not considered sources of Income for the purposes of determining applicant eligibility:
 - i. capital gains;
 - ii. any assets drawn down as withdrawals from a bank;
 - iii. money received from the sale of a property, house, or car:
 - iv. one-time payments form a welfare agency to a family or person who is in temporary financial difficulty;
 - v. tax refunds;
 - vi. gifts, loans, or lump-sum inheritances;
 - vii. college scholarships;
 - viii. one-time insurance payments, or compensation for injury;
 - ix. non-cash benefits, such as the employer-paid or union-paid portion of health insurance;
 - x. employee fringe benefits, food or housing received in lieu of wages;
 - xi. the value of food and fuel produced and consumed on farms;
 - xii. the imputed value of rent from owner-occupied non-farm or farm housing;
 - xiii. Depreciation for farm or business assets;
 - xiv. Federal non-cash benefit programs such as Medicare, Medicaid, Food Stamps, school lunches, and housing assistance;
 - xv. combat zone pay to the military;
 - xvi. Child Support;
 - xvii. Reverse mortgages;
 - xviii. Payments for care of Foster Children; and
 - xix. Any other required by Federal Laws.
 - b. Documentation/verification of client income for the thirty (30) days preceding their application for all household members eighteen (18) years and older, or Declaration of Income Statement (DIS) (if applicable). In order to use the DIS form, each Subrecipient shall develop and implement a written policy and procedure on the user of the form, including policies requiring a client statement of efforts to obtain documentation of income with a notarized client signature; as outlined in §5.407(e) of the State Rules. Proof of income documentation requirements are the same for both single and multifamily housing. All proof of income must reflect earnings from within 12 months of the start date indicated on the Building Weatherization Report (BWR).
 - c. No dwelling unit shall be weatherized without documentation that the dwelling unit is an eligible dwelling unit as defined in §440.22 of the WAP Regulations, except that pursuant to §5.2(b)(34) of the State Rules the dwelling unit shall be eligible for weatherization assistance if it is occupied by a family unit whose income is at or below 125 percent of the Poverty Income Guidelines;
 - (5) BWR to include certification of final inspection and Justification for Omission of Priorities if applicable;
 - (6) invoices of materials purchased or inventory removal sheets;
 - (7) invoices of labor;
 - (8) If a rental unit, Landlord Agreement form, Landlord Financial Participation form and Landlord Permission to Perform Assessment & Inspections for Rental Units" form and all other landlord forms found in the Community Affairs Division section of the Department's website at http://www.tdhca.state.tx.us/community-affairs/wap/docs/10-WAPLandlord.pdf;
 - (9) "Notice of Denial and Appeal Rights," if applicable;
 - (10) Signed and dated "Building Assessment" form, to include at a minimum, existing efficiencies of all heating and cooling appliances;
 - (11) "Attic Inspection" form (local design allowed);
 - (12) "Wall Inspection" form (local design allowed);

Created Doc Other Batter of 2009 weather ization carbon monoxide readings for all combustible appliances;

- (14) Documentation of post weatherization carbon monoxide readings for all combustible appliances;
- (15) "Blower Door Performance Standards and Data Sheet";
- (16) "Duct Blower Data Sheet" (if applicable);
- (17) Refrigerator metering information;
- (18) Signed client "Refrigerator Replacement Form" (if applicable);
- (19) Completed, signed and dated "LIHEAP Priority List" form (if applicable);
- (20) A complete copy of the approved State of Texas Energy Audit (if applicable);
- (21) A complete "Energy Audit Data Collection Form" (local design allowed);
- (22) A complete electronic copy of the approved State of Texas Energy Audit (if applicable);
- (23) Signed client receipt of the "Unified Weatherization Elements Notification Form" that includes Lead Hazard information, identification of Mold Like Substance, and State Historical Preservation information; and
- (24) Signed client receipt of "Mold-Like Substance Notification and Release Form for Texas Weatherization Programs"
- C. For each multi-family project weatherized with funds received from LIHEAP under this Contract, Subrecipient shall maintain a master file containing the following information:
 - (1) "Multifamily Project Building Data Checklist";
 - (2) "Multifamily Project Completion Checklist";
 - (3) "Landlord Permission to Perform an Assessment and Inspections for Rental Units";
 - (4) "Landlord Agreement" form;
 - (5) "Landlord Financial Participation Form"; and
 - (6) Significant Data Required in all Multifamily Projects
- D. Materials standards documentation for weatherization material purchased under this Contract must be maintained. These standards must meet the requirements according to Appendix A to Part 440 of the WAP Regulations.
- E. Subrecipient shall give the federal and state funding agencies, the Comptroller General of the United States, and Department access to and the right to reproduce all records pertaining to this Contract. All such records shall be maintained for at least three years after final payment has been made and all other pending matters are closed. Subrecipient shall include the requirements of this Subsection in all subcontracts.
- F. All LIHEAP WAP records maintained by Subrecipient, except records made confidential by law, shall be available for inspection by the public during Subrecipient's normal business hours to the extent required by the Texas Public Information Act (Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code).
- G. All subrecipients must conduct a full household assessment addressing all possible allowable weatherization measures.

SECTION 10. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- A. Subrecipient shall electronically submit to Department no later than fifteen (15) days after the end of each month of the Contract Term a Performance Report listing demographic information on all units completed in the previous month and an Expenditure Report listing all expenditures of funds under this Contract during the previous month. These reports are due even if Subrecipient has no new activity to report during the month. Both reports shall be submitted electronically.
- B. Subrecipient shall electronically submit to Department no later than forty-five (45) days after the end of the Contract Term a final expenditure and programmatic report utilizing the Monthly Expenditure Report. The failure of Subrecipient to provide a full accounting of all funds expended under this Contract may result in ineligibility to receive additional funds or additional contracts. After forty-five (45) days, any expenditures not reported to the Department will result in funds being reallocated to LIHEAP purposes.
- C. Subrecipient shall submit to Department no later than forty-five (45) days after the end of the Contract Term an inventory of all vehicles, tools, and equipment with a unit acquisition cost of \$5,000.00 or more and a useful life of more than one year, if purchased in whole or in part with funds received under this or previous weatherization assistance program Contracts. The inventory shall reflect the tools and equipment on hand as of the last day of the Contract Term.
- D. Subrecipient shall update the Previously Weatherized Units database no later than fifteen (15) days after the end of each month of the contract for units weatherized under this Contract.
- E. Subrecipients are required to determine if households assisted under this Contract shall be reported as duplicated or unduplicated by accessing the LIHEAP Household Database located in the Community Affairs Contract System.

- F. CreSubprecipient 18-18 submit other reports, data, and information on the performance of this Contract as may be required by DOE pursuant to §440.25 of the WAP Regulations, by U. S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), or by the Department.
- G. If Subrecipient fails to submit, in a timely and satisfactory manner, any report or response required by this Contract, including responses to monitoring reports, Department may withhold any and all payments otherwise due or requested by Subrecipient hereunder. Payments may be withheld until such time as the delinquent report or response is received by Department. If the delinquent report or response is not received within forty-five (45) days of its due date, Department may suspend or terminate this Contract. If Subrecipient receives LIHEAP WAP funds from the Department over two or more Contracts of subsequent terms, funds may be withheld or this Contract suspended or terminated by Subrecipient's failure to submit a past due report or response (including a report of audit) from a prior Contract Term.
- H. Subrecipient shall provide the Department with a Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number and a Central Contractor Registration (CCR) System number. The DUNS number must be provided in a document from Dun and Bradstreet and the current CCR number must be submitted from a document retrieved from the www.sam.gov website. These documents must be provided to the Department prior to the processing first payment to Subrecipient. Subrecipient shall maintain a current DUNS number and CCR number for the entire Contract Term.

SECTION 11. CHANGES AND AMENDMENTS

- A Any change, addition or deletion to the terms of this Contract required by a change in federal or state law or regulation is automatically incorporated herein and is effective on the date designated by such law or regulation, so long as approved by the Department.
- B. Except as specifically provided otherwise in this Contract, any changes, additions, or deletions to the terms of this Contract shall be in writing and executed by both parties to this Contract. If any Party returns an executed copy by facsimile machine or electronic transmission, the signing party intends the copy of its authorized signature printed by the receiving machine or the electronic transmission, to be its original signature.
- C. Written requests for Contract amendment must be received by the Department by no later than forty-five (45) days prior to the end of the Contract Term.

SECTION 12. PROGRAM INCOME

Subrecipient shall account for and expend program income derived from activities financed in whole or in part with funds provided under this Contract in accordance with the Uniform Grant Management Standards, Common Rule, §_.25 and OMB Circular A-102, Attachment, 2e.

SECTION 13. INDEPENDENT SUBRECIPIENT

It is agreed that Department is contracting with Subrecipient as an independent contractor.

SECTION 14. PROCUREMENT STANDARDS

- A. Subrecipient shall comply with OMB Circular A-102 and 10 T.A.C. § 5.10. If leveraging DOE funds, Subrecipient shall also comply with 10 C.F.R. § 600.236(b-i).
- B. Subrecipient may not use funds provided under this Contract to purchase personal property, equipment, goods, or services with a unit acquisition cost (the net invoice unit price of an item of equipment) of more than \$5,000 unless Subrecipient has received the prior written approval of Department for such purchase.
- C. Upon the termination or non-renewal of this Contract, Department may transfer title to any such property or equipment having a useful life of one year or more or a unit acquisition cost (the net invoice unit price of an item of equipment) of \$5,000 or more to itself or to any other entity receiving Department funding.

SECTION 95. TUBCON PRATERS

- A. Subrecipient may not subcontract the primary performance of this Contract, including but not limited to expenditure and performance reporting and drawing funds through the Community Affairs Contract System. Subrecipient may subcontract for the delivery of client assistance without obtaining Department's prior approval. Any subcontract for the delivery of client assistance will be subject to monitoring by the Department as per Section 20. Subrecipient shall inspect all subcontractors' work and shall be responsible for ensuring that it is completed in a good and workmanlike manner. Subrecipient shall make no payment to subcontractor until all work is complete and has passed a final inspection.
- B. In no event shall any provision of this Section 15, specifically the requirement that Subrecipient obtain Department's prior written approval of a subcontractor, be construed as relieving Subrecipient of the responsibility for ensuring that the performances rendered under all subcontracts are rendered so as to comply with all of the terms of this Contract, as if such performances rendered were rendered by Subrecipient. Department's approval under this section does not constitute adoption, ratification, or acceptance of Subrecipient's or subcontractor's performance hereunder. Department maintains the right to monitor and require Subrecipient's full compliance with the terms of this Contract. Department's approval under this Section does not waive any right of action which may exist or which may subsequently accrue to Department under this Contract.
- C. Every initial assessment, every approved State of Texas Energy Audit, and every final inspection is the sole responsibility of the Subrecipient. Subrecipients may request in writing that the Department permit the Subrecipient to subcontract the performance of assessments, audits and final inspections. The Department will review each request separately to determine whether the request will be granted.

SECTION 16. AUDIT

- A. Subrecipient shall arrange for the performance of an annual financial and compliance audit of funds received and performances rendered under this Contract, subject to the following conditions and limitations:
 - (1) Subrecipients expending \$500,000 or more in federal financial assistance for any fiscal year ending on or after December 31, 2003, shall have an audit made in accordance with Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996, 31 U.S.C. 7501 and OMB Circular No. A-133, "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations" issued June 30, 1997. For purposes of this Section 16, "federal financial assistance" means assistance provided by a federal agency in the form of grants, contracts, loans, loan guarantees, property, cooperative agreements, interest subsidies, insurance or direct appropriations, but does not include direct federal cash assistance to individuals. The term includes awards of federal financial assistance received directly from federal agencies, or indirectly through other units of state and local government.
 - (2) Subrecipient shall utilize funds budgeted under this Contract to pay for that portion of the cost of such audit services properly allocable to the activities funded by Department under this Contract, provided however that Department shall not make payment for the cost of such audit services until Department has received a satisfactory audit report, as determined by Department, from Subrecipient.
 - (3) Subrecipient shall submit two (2) copies of such audit report and any associated management letter to the Department's Compliance and Asset Oversight Division within the earlier of thirty (30) days after receipt of the auditor's report(s), or nine (9) months after the end of the audit period. Subrecipient shall make audit report available for public inspection within thirty (30) days after receipt of the audit report(s). Audits performed under this Section 16 are subject to review and resolution by Department or its authorized representative. Subrecipient shall submit such audit report to the Federal clearinghouse designated by OMB in accordance with OMB A-133.
 - (4) The audit report must include verification of all expenditures by budget category, in accordance with the final "Monthly Expenditure Report" submitted to close out each year during the Contract Term.
- B. The cost of auditing services for a Subrecipient expending less than \$500,000 in total Federal awards per fiscal year is not an allowable charge under Federal awards.
- C. Subsection A of this Section 16 notwithstanding, Department reserves the right to conduct an annual financial and compliance audit of funds received and performances rendered under this Contract. Subrecipient agrees to permit Department or its authorized representative to audit Subrecipient's records and to obtain any documents, materials, or information necessary to facilitate such audit.

- D. Cresubrecipiers 1 and compliance audit(s) of funds received under this Contract. Subrecipient further understands and agrees that reimbursement to Department of such disallowed costs shall be paid by Subrecipient from funds which were not provided or otherwise made available to Subrecipient under this Contract.
- E. Subsection A of this section notwithstanding, Subrecipients expending less than \$500,000 in Federal financial assistance may arrange for the performance of an annual financial statement audit. Such audit should include verification as required in Subsection 16(A)(4) of this Section.
- F. Subrecipient shall take such action to facilitate the performance of such audit or audits conducted pursuant to this section as Department may require of Subrecipient.
- G. Subrecipient shall procure audit services through an open, competitive process at least once every five years. The auditor shall retain working papers and reports for a minimum of three years after the date of issuance of the auditor's report to the auditee. Audit working papers shall be made available upon request to Department at the completion of the audit, as a part of a quality review, to resolve audit findings, or to carry out oversight responsibilities consistent with the purposes of this part. Access to working papers includes the right to obtain copies of working papers, as is reasonable and necessary.
- H. For any fiscal year ending within or immediately after the Contract Term, Subrecipient must submit an "Audit Certification Form (available from the Department) within sixty (60) days after the Subrecipient's fiscal year end.

SECTION 17. MANAGEMENT OF EQUIPMENT AND INVENTORY

- A. Subrecipient acknowledges that any vehicles, tools, and equipment with a unit acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more and a useful life of more than one year, if purchased in whole or in part with funds received under this or previous weatherization assistance program Contracts, are not assets of either the Subrecipient or the Department but are held in trust for the Weatherization Assistance Program and as such are assets of the Weatherization Assistance Program. Any equipment, tools, or vehicles having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit must receive prior approval from the Department before the purchase is made.
- B. Subrecipient shall develop and implement a property management system, which conforms to the uniform administrative requirements referenced in Section 6. Subrecipient shall not use, transfer, or dispose of any property acquired in whole or in part with funds provided under this or a previous weatherization assistance program Contract except in accordance with its own property management system.
- C. Upon termination or non-renewal of this Contract, the Department may transfer the title of equipment to a third party named by the Department. Such a transfer shall be subject to the following standards:
 - The equipment shall be appropriately identified in the award or otherwise made known to the recipient in writing.
 - (2) The Department will issue disposition instructions after receipt of final inventory.
- D. Subrecipient shall establish adequate safeguards to prevent loss, damage, or theft of property acquired hereunder and shall promptly report to Department any loss, damage, or theft of property with an acquisition cost of five thousand and no/100 dollars (\$5,000) or more.
- E. In addition to the inventory of tools and equipment required under Section 10, Subrecipient shall take a physical inventory of all WAP materials and shall reconcile the results with its property records at least once every year. Any differences between quantities determined by the inventory and those shown in the property records shall be investigated by Subrecipient to determine the cause of the difference.

SECTION 18. BONDING AND INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

A. If Subrecipient will enter in to a contract for weatherization activities with a third-party in the amount of \$25,000 or greater, Subrecipient must execute with the contractor a payment bond in the full amount of the contract. If the Subrecipient enters into a contract with a prime contractor in excess of \$100,000, a performance bond in the full amount of the contract is also required. These bonds must be executed by a corporate surety authorized to do business in Texas, a list of which may be obtained from the State Insurance Department. Such assurances of completion will run to the Department as obligee and must be documented prior to the start of weatherization activities.

- B. Crestific Chief 18 that @maintain adequate personal injury and property damage liability insurance. Subrecipient is encouraged to obtain pollution occurrence insurance in addition to the general liability insurance. Generally, regular liability insurance policies do not provide coverage for potential effects of many health and safety measures, such as lead disturbances and other pollution occurrence items. Subrecipient should review existing policies to determine if lead contamination is covered. If it is not, Subrecipients should consider securing adequate coverage for all construction projects.
- C. Subrecipient should consider securing adequate coverage for all units to be weatherized. The Department strongly recommends the Subrecipient require their contractors to carry pollution occurrence insurance to avoid being liable for any mistakes the contractors may make. Each Subrecipient should get a legal opinion regarding the best course to take for implementing the pollution occurrence insurance coverage.
- D. Subrecipients must also require all independent subcontractors to have general liability insurance. Subrecipients' insurance must cover the pollution occurrence insurance coverage for their independent subcontractors or the independent subcontractors must obtain the coverage.

SECTION 19. LITIGATION AND CLAIMS

Subrecipient shall give Department immediate written notice of any claim or action filed with a court or administrative agency against Subrecipient and arising out of the performance of this Contract or any subcontract hereunder. Subrecipient shall furnish to Department copies of all pertinent papers received by Subrecipient with respect to such action or claim.

SECTION 20. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND MONITORING

- A. Department may issue technical guidance to explain the rules and provide directions on the terms of this Contract. Installation of weatherization materials shall be in accordance with the Material Installation Standards Manual.
- B. Department or its designee may conduct on and off-site monitoring and evaluation of Subrecipient's compliance with the terms of this Contract. Department's monitoring may include a review of the efficiency, economy, and efficacy of Subrecipient's performance. Department will notify Subrecipient in writing of any deficiencies noted during such monitoring. Department may provide training and technical assistance to Subrecipient in correcting the deficiencies noted. Department may require corrective action to remedy deficiencies noted in Subrecipient's accounting, personnel, procurement, and management procedures and systems in order to comply with State or Federal requirements. Department may conduct follow-up visits to review the previously noted deficiencies and to assess the Subrecipient's efforts made to correct them. Repeated deficiencies may result in disallowed costs. Department may terminate or suspend this Contract or invoke other remedies Department determines to be appropriate in the event monitoring reveals material deficiencies in Subrecipient's performance, or Subrecipient fails to correct any deficiency within a reasonable period of time, as determined by the Department. Department or its designee may conduct an ongoing program evaluation throughout the Contract Term.

SECTION 21. LEGAL AUTHORITY

- A. Subrecipient assures and guarantees that it possesses the legal authority to enter into this Contract, to receive and manage the funds authorized by this Contract, and to perform the services Subrecipient has obligated itself to perform hereunder. The execution, delivery, and performance of this Contract will not violate Subrecipient's constitutive documents or any requirement to which Subrecipient is subject and represents the legal, valid, and binding agreement of Subrecipient, enforceable in accordance with its terms.
- B. The person signing this Contract on behalf of Subrecipient hereby warrants that he/she has been authorized by Subrecipient to execute this Contract on behalf of Subrecipient and to validly and legally bind Subrecipient to all terms, provisions and performances herein set forth.
- C. Department shall have the right to suspend or terminate this Contract if there is a dispute as to the legal authority of either Subrecipient or the person signing this Contract on behalf of Subrecipient, to enter into this Contract or to render performances hereunder. Subrecipient is liable to Department for any money it has received from Department for performance of the provisions of this Contract, if the Department has terminated this Contract for reasons enumerated in this Section 21.

SECTION 22. OZOMPŽIANČE WITH LAWS

- A. <u>FEDERAL</u>, <u>STATE AND LOCAL LAW</u>. Subrecipient shall comply with the LIHEAP Act, the WAP Regulations, the LIHEAP Regulations, any applicable Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars, the Texas DOE WAP State Plan, LIHEAP State Plan, the State Rules, and all federal, state, and local laws and regulations applicable to the performance of this Contract.
- B. <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT OF</u> 1988. The Subrecipient affirms by signing this Contract that it is implementing the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988.
- C. PRO-CHILDREN ACT OF 1994. Subrecipient shall follow the requirements of the Pro-Children Act of 1994, (20 U.S.C. Sec. 6081 et seq.) which requires that smoking not be permitted in any portion of any indoor facility owned or leased or contracted by an entity and used routinely or regularly for the provision of health, day care, education, or library services to children under the age of 18 if the services are funded by Federal programs either directly or through States or local governments by Federal grant, contract, loan or loan guarantee.
- D. <u>LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY</u> (LEP). Subrecipients must provide program applications, forms, and educational materials in English, Spanish, and any appropriate language, based on the needs of the service area and in compliance with the requirements in Executive Order 13166 of August 11, 2000. To ensure compliance, the Subrecipient must take reasonable steps to insure that persons with Limited English Proficiency have meaningful access to the program. Meaningful access may entail provide language assistance services, including oral and written translation, where necessary.

SECTION 23. PREVENTION OF FRAUD AND ABUSE

- A. Subrecipient shall establish, maintain, and utilize internal control systems and procedures sufficient to prevent, detect, and correct incidents of waste, fraud, and abuse in the WAP and to provide for the proper and effective management of all program and fiscal activities funded by this Contract. Subrecipient's internal control systems and all transactions and other significant events must be clearly documented and the documentation made readily available for review by Department.
- B. Subrecipient shall give Department complete access to all of its records, employees, and agents for the purpose of monitoring or investigating the WAP. Subrecipient shall fully cooperate with Department's efforts to detect, investigate, and prevent waste, fraud, and abuse. Subrecipient shall immediately notify the Department of any identified instances of waste, fraud, or abuse.
- C. Subrecipient may not discriminate against any employee or other person who reports a violation of the terms of this Contract or of any law or regulation to Department or to any appropriate law enforcement authority, if the report is made in good faith.

SECTION 24. CERTIFICATION REGARDING UNDOCUMENTED WORKERS

Pursuant to Chapter 2264 of the Texas Government Code, by execution of this Contract, Subrecipient hereby certifies that Subrecipient/Local Operator, or a branch, division, or department of Subrecipient does not and will not knowingly employ an undocumented worker, where "undocumented worker" means an individual who, at the time of employment, is not lawfully admitted for permanent residence to the United States or authorized under law to be employed in that manner in the United States. If, after receiving a public subsidy, Subrecipient, or a branch, division, or department of Subrecipient is convicted of a violation under 8 U.S.C. Section 1324a(f), Subrecipient shall repay the public subsidy with interest, at a rate of five percent (5%) per annum, not later than the 120th day after the date the Department notifies Subrecipient of the violation.

SECTION 25. CONFLICT OF INTEREST/NEPOTISM

- A. Subrecipient shall maintain written standards of conduct governing the performance of its employees engaged in the award and administration of contracts.
- B. No employee, officer, or agent of Subrecipient shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by federal funds if a real or apparent conflict of interest would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when the employee, officer, or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for an award.

- C.Credited of fivers, 18 semples es 59 and agents of the Subrecipient shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors, or parties to subagreements. Subrecipients may set standards for situations in which the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is an unsolicited item of nominal value. The standards of conduct shall provide for disciplinary actions to be applied for violations of such standards by officers, employees, or agents of the Subrecipient.
- D. Subrecipients who are local governmental entities shall, in addition to the requirements of this Section, follow the requirements of Chapter 171 of the Local Government Code regarding conflicts of interest of officers of municipalities, counties, and certain other local governments.
- E. Failure to maintain written standards of conduct and to follow and enforce the written standards is a condition of default under this Contract and may result in termination of the Contract or deobligation of funds.

SECTION 26. POLITICAL ACTIVITY AND LOBBYING PROHIBITED

- A. Funds provided under this Contract shall not be used for influencing the outcome of any election, or the passage or defeat of any legislative measure. This prohibition shall not be construed to prevent any official or employee of Subrecipient from furnishing to any member of its governing body upon request, or to any other local or state official or employee or to any citizen information in the hands of the employee or official not considered under law to be confidential information. Any action taken against an employee or official for supplying such information shall subject the person initiating the action to immediate dismissal from employment.
- B. Funds provided under this Contract may be used directly or indirectly to hire employees or in any other way fund or support candidates for the legislative, executive, or judicial branches of government of Subrecipient, the State of Texas, or the government of the United States.

SECTION 27. NON-DISCRIMINATION AND EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

- A. A person shall not be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, be subjected to discrimination under, or be denied employment in the administration of or in connection with any program or activity funded in whole or in part with funds made available under this Contract, on the grounds of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, political affiliation or belief.
- B. Subrecipient agrees to carry out an Equal Employment Opportunity Program in keeping with the principles as provided in President's Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965.
- C. Subrecipient will include the substance of Section 27 in all subcontracts.

SECTION 28. CERTIFICATION REGARDING CERTAIN DISASTER RELIEF CONTRACTS

The Department may not award a Contract that includes proposed financial participation by a person who, during the five year period preceding the date of this Contract, has been convicted of violating a federal law in connection with a contract awarded by the federal government for relief, recovery, or reconstruction efforts as a result of Hurricane Rita, as defined by Section 39.459, Utilities Code, Hurricane Katrina, or any other disaster occurring after September 24, 2005; or assessed a penalty in a federal, civil or administrative enforcement action in connection with a contract awarded by the federal government for relief, recovery, or reconstruction efforts as a result of Hurricane Rita, as defined by Section 39.459, Utilities Code, Hurricane Katrina, or any other disaster occurring after September 24, 2005.

By execution of this Contract, the Subrecipient/Local Operator hereby certifies that it is eligible to participate in this Program and acknowledges that this Contract may be terminated and payment withheld if this certification is inaccurate.

SECTION 29. TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FUNDS

- A. Training and technical assistance funds shall be used for State sponsored, LIHEAP sponsored, and other relevant workshops and conferences provided the agenda includes topics directly related to administering WAP in accordance with §5.532 of the LIHEAP State Rules. For Training & Technical Assistance other than State or LIHEAP sponsored, Subrecipient must receive prior written approval from the Department.
- B. Travel funds are to be used only for Department-approved training events. Subrecipient shall adhere to OMB Circular A-87 {2 CFR 225} and either its board-approved travel policy, or in the absence of such a policy, the State of Texas travel policies.

SECTION 30. WARNTER ANCE OF EFFORT

Funds provided to Subrecipient under this Contract may not be substituted for funds or resources from any other source, nor may they in any way serve to reduce the funds or resources, which would have been available to or provided through Subrecipient, had this Contract never been executed.

SECTION 31. DEBARRED AND SUSPENDED PARTIES

By signing this Contract, Subrecipient certifies that neither it nor its current principle parties are included in the Excluded Parties List System (EPLS) maintained by the General Services Administration (GSA). Subrecipient also certifies that it will not award any funds provided by this Contract to any party that is debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in federal assistance programs under Executive Order 12549. Subrecipient agrees that prior to entering into any agreement with a potential subcontractor that the verification process to comply with this requirement will be accomplished by checking the System for Award Management (SAM) at www.sam.gov and including a copy of the results in its project files.

SECTION 32. NO WAIVER

No right or remedy given to Department by this Contract shall preclude the existence of any other right or remedy, nor hall any action taken in the exercise of any right or remedy be deemed a waiver of any other right or remedy. The failure of Department to exercise any right or remedy on any occasion shall not constitute a waiver of Department's right to exercise that or any other right or remedy at a later time.

SECTION 33. ORAL AND WRITTEN AGREEMENTS

- A. All oral and written agreements between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Contract have been reduced to writing and are contained in this Contract.

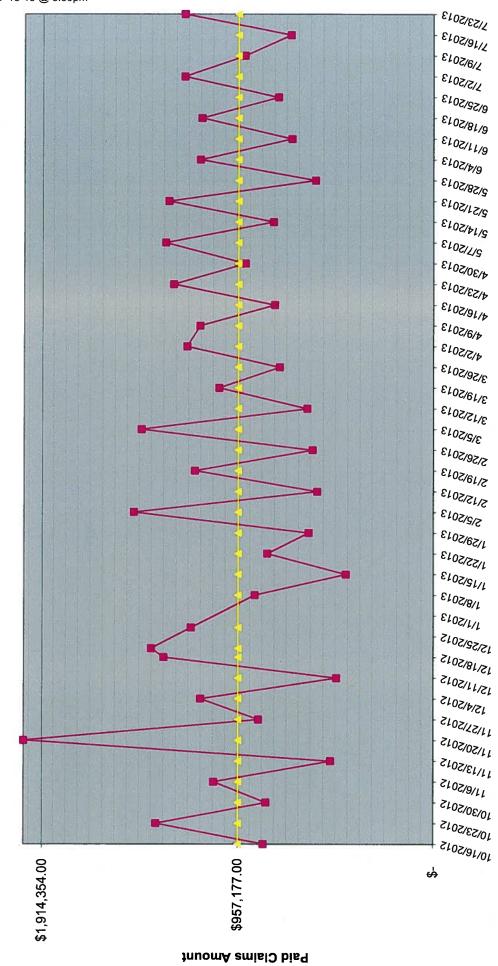

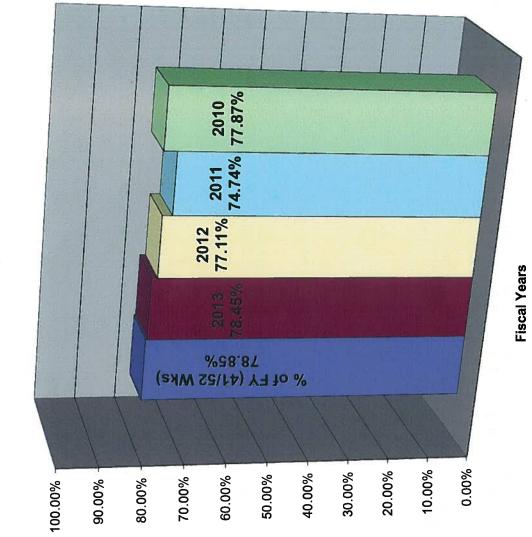

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND ATTACHMENTS:

As a part of the annual budget process, the Planning & Budget Office forwards departmental requests to fund security related matters to the Travis County Security Committee for consideration. The Security Committee met on June 27, 2013 to discuss the submitted requests and develop recommendations for the Commissioners Court to consider for funding in the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget. Currently, the Planning & Budget Office is recommending a security reserve in the Preliminary Budget of approximately \$786,793 to fund requests considered by the Security Committee.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The requests include 4 FTEs to be added to Courthouse Security for the Travis County Sheriff's Office to provide additional coverage at the Juvenile Justice Complex. This request was made by Juvenile Probation and supported by the Sheriff's Office.

In addition to the requests recommended by the Security Committee, the Planning & Budget Office also recommends including in the Security Reserve an additional \$950,722 to fund various recommendations made by Kroll Advisory Services for the North Campus location.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES: N/A

FISCAL IMPACT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

A Security Reserve is included in the Fiscal Year 2014 Preliminary Budget. The reserve is established at \$1,737,515 to accommodate consideration of the Security Committee recommendations and the Kroll Advisory Services recommendations for implementation in Fiscal Year 2014.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND ATTACHMENTS:

In January 2013, a Purchase Order was issued to Kroll Advisory Solutions to provide an independent review of the physical security at the Travis County North Campus located on Airport Boulevard. Primary stakeholders who reside on the North Campus include:

Emergency Services Division Employee Wellness and Health Clinic Sheriff's Office – Ruiz Building

The team of experts from Kroll attended meetings on-site to ascertain from each tenant their particular concerns related to the physical security for their individual offices and the site in general. In addition, the Kroll team made unannounced on-site visits to observe security procedures that are currently in place at the site; attempted to breach or bypass the various measures and protocols at the site; and visited the site in the evening to observe the security for the site after business hours. The results of Kroll's findings have been documented for the Commissioners Court in a detailed report that was presented to them on May 28, 2013.

Kroll included in their report a series of recommendations for each department and for the general campus grounds which were prioritized under Categories A, B, or C. In the May 28, 2013 presentation, Category A recommendations were discussed by the Commissioners Court. Category A recommendations address a security vulnerability that needs priority attention to meet best practices. In a July 9, 2013 Commissioners Court discussion, the Court received information on the various options for providing the recommended level of security staffing for the Airport Blvd. campus. The options included security provided by Constables vs. contracted security provided by a private security company.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

As a follow-up to the July 9, 2013 presentation, and based on the Kroll report, staff recommends to the Commissioners Court the following:

- 1. Accept the Kroll report.
- 2. Approve a position of Security Director and allocate funding from reserves to begin the hiring process as soon as possible.
- 3. Decide under which department the Security Director will be housed.
- 4. Decide on which option to choose for providing the recommended level of security staffing for the Airport Blvd. campus (e.g. private vs. Constables).
- 5. Approve itemized list of Category A recommendations from the Kroll report.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

AGENDA LANGUAGE:

Consider and take appropriate action on a proposed license agreement with Allan-Thrasher, L.L.C., to use the County owned parking lot at 416 W. 11th Street from date of approval through April 30, 2014 during hours the parking lot is not required for County use.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

Facilities Management Department (FMD) was approached by Mr. Dan Ross with the Allan House about the possibility of leasing the County owned parking lot at 416 W. 11th Street for use of their quests. The Allan House is located at 1104 San Antonio Street, directly to the west of the County owned parking lot. The requested use would be as needed for events and would only occur after County business hours during the week or on weekends, at times the parking would not be needed for County employees. Mr. Ross indicates that they would be agreeable to a charge of \$100 for each event where they used the County lot.

FMD coordinated with Christopher Gilmore of the County Attorney's office to prepare the proposed license agreement at Attachment One. The term of the license agreement will be from date of approval until April 30, 2014. Under the terms of the agreement, Allan-Thrasher, L.L.C., (Licensee) is require to contact FMD in writing with three days written notice of an event when they wish to use the parking lot. Within three days prior to event. Licensee is also required to pay the \$100 event fee, made out to Travis County. The type events held at the Allan House that might require additional parking includes weddings, receptions, corporate functions and charitable events. Licensee had provided proof of the required insurance coverage as attached as Exhibit B of the license agreement.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Facilities Management Department recommends approval of the license agreement between Travis County and Allan-Thrasher, L.L.C.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

The County recently bought the property including the parking lot at 416 W. 11th Street. A new facility is in the planning stage and is anticipated to begin construction in May 2014. Until that time, that parking lot is used for employee parking during County business hours, but is not used after hours and on weekends. Allowing the Allan House to use the parking would make use of the parking asset and provide revenue to the County. At Attachment Two is a schedule of events at the Allan House for the period of March through December 2013. Based on the scheduled event, there is the potential for 9 uses of the parking lot through the end of FY 13, and 26 uses in the first quarter of FY 14. Potential revenue is thus \$900 for FY 13 and \$2,600 in the first quarter of FY 14. It is possible that the Allan House may not require overflow parking for all of these events.

FISCAL IMPACT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

\$100 in revenue for each use of the parking lot. Potential revenue for FY 13 is \$900 and for first quarter of FY 14 is \$2,600.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF TRAVIS

This License Agreement (this "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Travis County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("County"), and Allan-Thrasher, L.L.C., a Texas limited liability company ("Licensee").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, County is the owner of certain property located at 416 W. 11th Street. Austin, Texas (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Licensee desires to exercise certain rights and privileges on a portion of the Property, specifically to provide additional event parking, and County desires to grant such permission to Licensee under the terms and condition set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, County and Licensee, in consideration of the mutual promises herein expressed and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, covenant and agree to and with each other as follows:

1:0 **GRANT OF LICENSE**

- 1.1 County grants a License (the "License") to Licensee to enter, use and occupy that portion of the Property designated on Exhibit A, attached to this Agreement and made a part of this Agreement for all purposes (the "Licensed Area"), for the purpose of providing additional event parking for the Allan House ("Licensed Use").
- Licensee agrees to make no structural changes to any portion of the Licensed Area. Licensee agrees to leave the Licensed Area in the same and as good a condition as when it was received, normal wear and tear excepted, as determined by existing County policy. Licensee shall not install any furniture, movable trade fixtures or equipment in or on the Licensed Area.
- 1.3 At its own additional expense, Licensee shall provide, and ensure compliance with, its own policies and procedures during Licensee's use of the Licensed Area as reasonably necessary to ensure the safety and integrity of the persons and

property brought onto the Licensed Area for the purposes authorized under this Agreement.

- 1.4 Licensee acknowledges and agrees that Licensee shall be solely responsible at all times for the actions and the safety of those persons utilizing the Licensed Area under this Agreement, including, without limitation, protecting such persons from injury or death and protecting the property of such persons from loss or damage, and protecting the Licensed Area from damage.
- 1.5 Licensee agrees to take all reasonable measures to minimize noise and any other type of interference with or disruption of normal business for the duration of the License Term, as defined below. Disregard of County staff requests to reduce the amount of noise or other disturbance caused by Licensee's activities may be grounds for revocation of the License.

2.0 TERM OF LICENSE

2.1 The License will commence upon the Effective Date of this Agreement and will continue in full force and effect until April 30, 2014 (the "License Term"). Licensee is granted permission to enter and use the Licensed Area as needed after regular Travis County business hours between the hours of 5:30 pm and 2:00 am on the weekdays and any time during the weekends (the "Hours of Operation"). Licensee acknowledges and agrees that such dates and times are subject to postponement and/or rescheduling due to any cause or reason beyond the control of the Licensee or as determined to be necessary by the County. Licensee agrees to provide written notice three days prior to an event to County's Facilities Management Department Director at email roger.ei-khoury@co.travis.tx.us or delivered to 1010 Lavaca, Suite 400, Austin, Texas, 78701. The notice must include information regarding the dates and times of the event.

3.0 PAYMENT TO COUNTY

- 3.1 In consideration of the License granted hereunder, Licensee shall pay to Travis County the amount of \$100.00 per event to cover County's administrative, utilities and related costs within three days prior to the event without need of a County invoice.
- 3.2 Licensee shall pay County the sum set forth in this Section 3.1 and 3.3 to: Travis County, Facilities Management Department, P.O. Box 1748, Austin, Texas 78767.
- 3.3 With respect to any additional expenses incurred by County, County shall invoice Licensee for the actual costs so incurred, and Licensee shall remit payment to County for the invoice amounts within thirty days of receipt of invoice(s).

4.0 SMOKING

4.1 THERE SHALL BE NO SMOKING ON THE PROPERTY AT ANY TIME. LICENSEE AGREES NOT TO USE ANY EQUIPMENT OR MATERIAL THAT IS INTENDED TO PRODUCE AN OPEN FLAME.

5.0 PERMITS

- 5.1 Licensee will be solely responsible for the costs and the securing of any permits, licenses or other authorizations required by the City of Austin or other local governmental entities for use of the Licensed Area under this Agreement. All taxes, excise or license fees of every kind and character, on account of the Licensed Use or on account of the ownership of Licensee's property imposed by federal, state, county or city government shall be paid by Licensee.
- 5.2 Licensee will comply with federal, state, county and city regulations, laws and ordinances that in any manner affect Licensee's operations. Any violation of said statutes, rules, regulations or ordinances will constitute a material breach of this Agreement and shall entitle County to terminate this Agreement immediately upon delivery of written notice to the Licensee.
- LICENSEE ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT HAVING BEEN GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO INSPECT THE LICENSED AREA PRIOR TO EXECUTION OF THIS AGREEMENT, LICENSEE IS RELYING SOLELY ON ITS OWN INVESTIGATION OF THE LICENSED AREA AND NOT ON ANY INFORMATION PROVIDED OR TO BE PROVIDED BY COUNTY. LICENSEE AGREES TO ACCEPT THE LICENSED AREA "AS-IS" AND WITH ALL FAULTS AND WAIVES ALL OBJECTIONS OR CLAIMS IN THIS REGARD AGAINST COUNTY (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY RIGHT OR CLAIM OF CONTRIBUTION) ARISING FROM OR RELATED TO THE LICENSED AREA OR TO ANY HAZARDOUS MATERIALS IN THE LICENSED AREA. COUNTY WILL NOT BE LIABLE OR BOUND IN ANY MANNER BY ANY VERBAL OR WRITTEN STATEMENTS, REPRESENTATIONS OR INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED AREA, OR THE OPERATION THEREOF FURNISHED BY ANY REAL ESTATE BROKER, AGENT, EMPLOYEE, SERVANT OR OTHER PERSON. LICENSEE FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE USE OF THE LICENSED AREA AS PROVIDED FOR IN THIS AGREEMENT IS MADE ON AN "AS-IS" CONDITION AND BASIS WITH ALL FAULTS. IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED THAT THE CONSIDERATION FOR THE USE OF THE LICENSED AREA HAS BEEN NEGOTIATED TO REFLECT THAT ALL OF THE LICENSED AREA IS LICENSED BY COUNTY AND ACCEPTED BY LICENSEE IN THE "AS-IS" CONDITION. THIS ACCEPTANCE BY THE LICENSEE IS AN ACKNOWLEDGMENT THAT THERE IS NO LANDLORD/TENANT RELATIONSHIP ESTABLISHED BETWEEN COUNTY AND LICENSEE. LICENSEE HAS NO EXPECTATION OF WARRANTIES AS TO USE OR SUITABILITY OF THE PROPERTY.

6.0 USE AND REPAIRS

- 6.1 Licensee will not use the Licensed Area for any purpose other than that set forth herein. Further, Licensee will repair or replace any damage to the Property caused by Licensee.
- 6.2 Licensee shall take good care of the Licensed Area during the License Term and keep it free from waste and nuisance of any kind. Licensee shall repair, replace, or reimburse County for any damage to the Property caused by Licensee, including any damage caused by the misuse or negligence of Licensee.
- 6.3 Upon termination of this License, Licensee shall deliver to County the Licensed Area together with all keys to the Licensed Area. Unless County otherwise agrees, any installed furniture, fixtures or equipment items must be removed by Licensee upon termination of this Licensee in a good and workmanlike manner and Licensee agrees to repair any damage resulting therefrom and to leave the Licensed Area in as good a condition as it was in prior to removal of the installed item, reasonable wear and tear excepted. Any such equipment or fixtures not removed shall become the property of County.

7.0 CONTROL OF TRAVIS COUNTY; TERMINATION

- 7.1 Licensee shall at all times obey the direction and commands of the Facilities Management Department, Travis County Sheriff's Department or their designated representatives, while on the Property.
- 7.2 Any disregard of the directions, restrictions, rules or regulations referenced in this Section 7 shall be grounds for County's immediate revocation of the License granted hereunder and termination of this Agreement.
- 7.3 In addition, County shall have the right to revoke the License and this Agreement shall automatically and immediately terminate if any of the following events occurs: (i) Licensee fails in any manner to adhere to the terms of this Agreement; (ii) Licensee breaches this Agreement and fails to remedy the breach within 30 days following receipt of County's written notice by certified mail to Licensee of the breach; (iii) County conveys or transfers the Property; (iv) the Travis County Commissioners Court determines that this License no longer serves the public interest or that it is no longer in the best interest of Travis County to continue this License; (v) a governmental law, ordinance, regulation, or court order requires termination; or (vi) County and Licensee mutually agree to such termination.
- 7.4 Upon termination of this Agreement, Licensee shall remove or cause to be removed all tangible personal property Licensee may have placed on the Licensed Agrea during the License Term.

8.0 INDEMNIFICATION

- 8.1 TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, LICENSEE AGREES TO AND SHALL INDEMNIFY, SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS, AND DEFEND COUNTY, ITS AGENTS, OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES FROM ANY AND ALL NEGLIGENCE, LIABILITY, LOSS, COSTS, CLAIMS, INCLUDING ATTORNEYS FEES, OR EXPENSES OF WHATEVER TYPE OR NATURE FOR PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE, ARISING IN WHOLE OR IN PART OUT OF ANY AND ALL ACTS OF COMMISSION OR OMISSION OF LICENSEE, ITS AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES, ARISING OUT OF IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT OR LICENSEE'S USE OF THE LICENSED AREA FOR WHICH A CLAIM, INCLUDING ATTORNEYS FEES, DEMAND, SUIT OR OTHER ACTION IS MADE OR BROUGHT BY ANY PERSON, FIRM, CORPORATION, OR OTHER ENTITY AGAINST LICENSEE OR COUNTY.
- 8.2 Licensee will not discharge, leak, or emit, or permit to be discharged, leaked, or emitted, any material into the atmosphere, ground, sewer system, or any body of water, if that material (as is reasonably determined by County, or any governmental authority) does or may pollute or contaminate the same, or may adversely affect (i) health, welfare, or safety of persons, whether located on the Property or elsewhere, or (ii) the condition, use or enjoyment of the building or any other real or personal property. Licensee must immediately notify County of any release of any Hazardous Material on or near the Property whether or not such release is in a quantity that would otherwise be reportable to a public agency and must also comply with the notification requirements of any applicable state, local, or federal law or regulations.

9.0 INSURANCE

9.1 Without in any way limiting the liability of Licensee or its obligations under this Agreement, Licensee agrees to maintain during the term of the License Commercial General Liability Insurance with minimum bodily injury and property damage limits of \$100,000 per occurrence and \$1,000,000 in the aggregate or a Combined Single Limit of \$500,000 with Travis County named as an additional insured. Licensee has provided County with a certificate from its carrier evidencing such insurance, which certificate is attached hereto as **Exhibit B** and made a part hereof.

10.0 NON-ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS

10.1 Licensee may not assign this Agreement or any portion or right thereof without the prior written consent of County.

11.0 AMENDMENTS

11.1 This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both County and Licensee. IT IS EXPRESSLY ACKNOWLEDGED BY LICENSEE THAT NO OFFICER, AGENT, REPRESENTATIVE OR EMPLOYEE OF TRAVIS COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, TO MODIFY OR AMEND THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT UNLESS EXPRESSLY GRANTED THAT SPECIFIC AUTHORITY BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TRAVIS COUNTY.

12.0 SAFETY

12.1 County reserves the right to prohibit persons from entering or otherwise using the Licensed Area or the Property at any time safety may be a concern.

13.0 NON-WAIVER AND RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

- 13.1 No act or omission by County may constitute or be construed as a waiver of any breach or default of Licensee which then exists or may subsequently exist. The failure of either party to exercise any right or privilege granted in this Agreement will not be construed as a waiver of that right or privilege.
- 13.2 All rights of County under this Agreement are specifically reserved and any act or omission will not impair or prejudice any remedy or right of County under it. Any right or remedy stated in this Agreement will not preclude the exercise of any other right or remedy under this Agreement, the law or at equity, nor will any action taken in the exercise of any right or remedy be deemed a waiver of any other rights or remedies.

14.0 VENUE AND CHOICE OF LAW

14.1 The obligations and undertakings of each of the parties to this Agreement are performable in Travis County, Texas, and this Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any dispute arising out of this Agreement will lie in the appropriate court of Travis County, Texas.

15.0 NOTICES

- 15.1 <u>Written Notice</u>. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement by one Party to the other must be in writing and given and deemed to have been given immediately if delivered in person to the address set forth in this section for the Party to whom the notice is given, or on the third day following mailing if placed in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, addressed to the Party at the address hereinafter specified.

16.1 When mediation is acceptable to both parties in resolving a dispute arising under this Agreement, the parties agree to use a mutually agreed upon mediator, or a person appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction, for mediation as described in Section 154.023 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Unless both parties are satisfied with the result of the mediation, the mediation will not constitute a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communications within the scope of the mediation will remain confidential as described in §154.073 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, unless both parties agree, in writing, to waive the confidentiality.

17.0 SEVERABILITY

17.1 If any portion or portions of this Agreement are ruled invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of it will remain valid and binding.

18.0 ENTIRETY OF AGREEMENT

18.1 This Agreement represents the sole, entire and integrated Agreement between County and Licensee with respect to the subject matter herein and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements either oral or written.

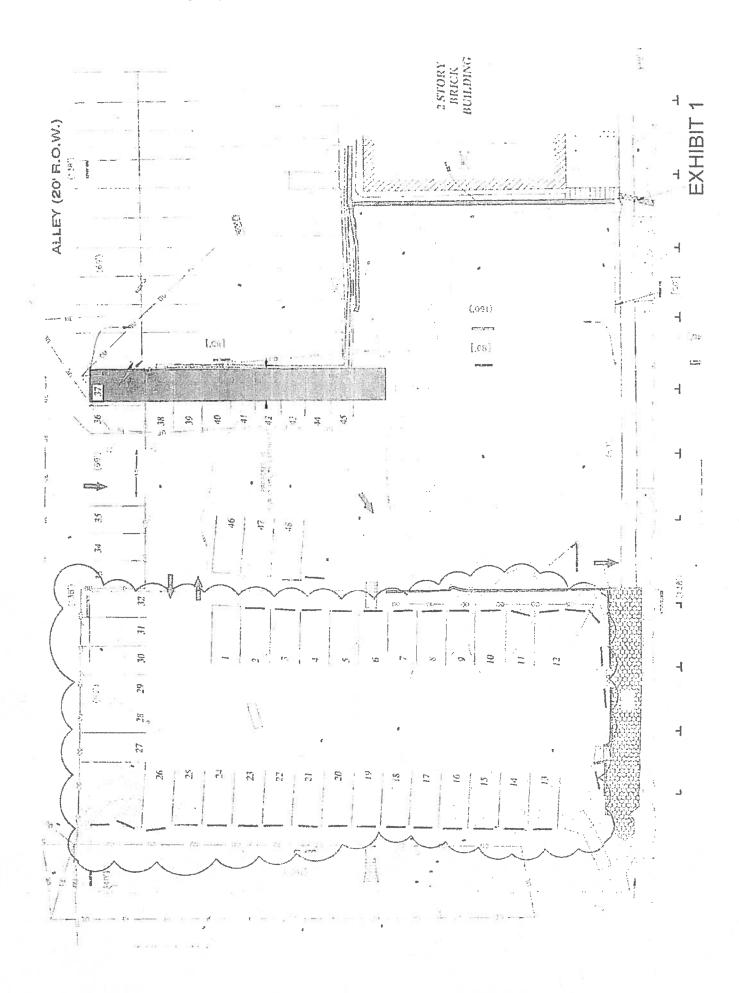

Agenda Language: DECLARE LISTING OF CERTAIN EQUIPMENT AS MISSING AND AUTHORIZE REMOVAL FROM THE FIXED ASSET INVENTORY, PURSUANT TO SECTION 3.10.4 OF THE TRAVIS COUNTY FIXED ASSET POLICY AND PROCEDURES MANUAL.

Section 3.10.4 of the Travis County Fixed Asset Policy and Procedure Manual requires that "missing" assets shall be retained on the inventory list for a minimum of three years, after which time, the Purchasing Agent makes a request of the Commissioners Court to remove the item(s) from the inventory.

Many of the items on the list have been eligible for Court consideration for a number of years (all have been listed as missing since 2009 and before) prior to them being listed as missing, but were never carried forward to Court. However, we have taken a very conservative approach and are only bringing them forward now as the final step to removing item(s) from the inventory.

Date:

Attached is the Third Revenue Estimate for the Fiscal Year 2014 budget process. This estimate includes revenue by category and expenditures in total for the General Fund and each of the Special Funds. A summary of available resources by fund has also been provided. As in past years, some contracts have not been included in the Third Revenue Estimate because we have not had verification that they will continue next year. A portion of these will be included in later revenue estimates when documentation has been received. Others may be certified during the year. The revenue impact of Legislative actions not requiring Commissioners Court approval has been incorporated in the Third Revenue Estimate. Those bills requiring Commissioners Court approval will be incorporated in future revenue estimates, if so approved.

General Fund

The estimate of General Fund available resources for Fiscal Year 2014 is \$607.9M. This consists of \$496.8M in on-going resources and \$111.1M in one-time funding, of which \$14.8M is related to a Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) accounting rule change for compensated absences.

The collection rate utilized in the Third Revenue Estimate is 98%. This slightly conservative collection rate is consistent with the rate used in last year's estimate. General Fund revenue is projected to grow by \$15.7M in Fiscal Year 2014. Please note, that while dramatic changes are not expected, Travis Central Appraisal District's certified tax roll will not be available until the Fourth Revenue Estimate.

The following chart compares our Fiscal Year 2013 Forecast and Fiscal Year 2014 Estimate for each General Fund revenue category:

- a. Most of the increase is from new construction and a tax rate set at 3% over the effective rate. \$2.02B in new construction added \$8.5M in revenue. In addition, the Samsung rebate decreased by \$2.8M.
- b. New legislation reinstated the previously high percentage of Mixed Beverage Tax Revenue the State sends to counties. The estimated \$.9M benefit to Travis County is offset by \$.6M in grant proceeds that will be certified when received during Fiscal Year 2014.
- c. In Fiscal Year 2013, an environmental fine of over \$1M was received. We do not anticipate this unusual occurrence to repeat itself in Fiscal Year 2014.
- d. During Fiscal Year 2013, two \$.6M payments were received from Seton for EMS Star Flight because of timing. Contractually, only one \$.6M payment will be received in Fiscal Year 2014. We took a conservative view regarding revenue from sales of property, surplus equipment and recycling materials.
- e. Transfers from the Road and Bridge Fund to the General Fund are expected to decline by \$.8M. Road and Bridge no longer has the resources available to make transfers.

Other Funds

The Road & Bridge Fund is estimated to have total resources of \$15.8M, down from \$19.9M. Revenue is not keeping pace with expenditures. Section 152.123 of the Texas Tax code requires that each year a greater percentage of the monies retained for motor vehicle sales tax collection be shifted from the Road and Bridge Fund to the General Fund. In Fiscal Year 2013, the General Fund received 80% or \$6.0M and the Road and Bridge Fund received 20% or \$1.5M. Next year the split will be 90%/10%, followed by 100% going to the General Fund in Fiscal Year 2015.

Conclusion

This estimate should give you an adequate framework for your early budgetary discussions. As we refine these estimates, we will continue to work closely with PBO as they develop the budget. This two-way communication between our offices will also help ensure that the County's reserves and fund balances are budgeted at healthy levels.

CONSIDER AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION ON GREATER AUSTIN WORKPLACE CAMPAIGN ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014, TRAVIS COUNTY COMBINED CHARITIES CAMPAIGN.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND ATTACHMENTS:

In September 2012, the County lost its fiscal agent that distributes contributions from employees to charitable organizations for our annual Travis County Combined Charities Campaign. The Judge's Office scrambled to quickly find another fiscal agent, but was unsuccessful and the 2012 campaign was canceled.

On January 22, 2013, the Commissioners Court recommended a workplace campaign that facilitates contributions from county employees, and authorized staff to move forward and negotiate a contract with United Way of Greater Austin.

United Way of Greater Austin provides similar services to many local businesses and governmental entities. Their experienced and dedicated staff will provide increased visibility in the workplace and support county staff while conducting the Travis County Combined Charities Campaign.

The contract has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office.

GREATER AUSTIN WORKPLACE CAMPAIGN ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014

Travis County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, enters into this Agreement with United Way for Greater Austin ("United Way"). This Agreement is based on the premise that the Travis County Combined Charities Campaign ("TCCCC") is owned by Travis County and its employees, and that every non-profit agency admitted by the County has a right to participate in the workplace campaign on a fair and equitable basis. This Agreement shall not be considered a means for Travis County to make a donation to a charitable entity. No public funds will be utilized for the support of any non-profit corporation involved in this campaign; whether through matching or donations. This Agreement is solely to facilitate employee contribution to charitable agencies. Incidental use of County space is allowable by law; as well as the acceptability of County employees volunteering their time while not neglecting their assigned duties.

United Way agrees to manage the receipts of the campaign in compliance with the Accountability and Governance Standard of United Way-Worldwide. United Way will in no way intentionally use its role as fiscal agent to assert its interests over the interests of other charitable organizations participating in the campaign.

This Contract is exempted from the bidding requirements of the County Purchasing Act pursuant to Section 262.024(a)(4) of the Local Government Code as this is a Contract for professional services. The UNITED WAY is an independent United Way; neither UNITED WAY nor its employees claim to be employees of the COUNTY nor do they claim any benefits from the COUNTY other than contract payments for services rendered.

- 1. Role and Duties of United Way
 - A. Provide customized campaign planning and implementation that would include campaign collateral including brochures, posters, and pledge forms. Kick-off training will be in mid-September. The County-wide campaign will be October 1 October 31, 2013.
 - B. Marketing support including, but not limited to:
 - 1. The development of customized campaign messaging.
 - 2. The access to the United Way Speakers Bureau.
 - 3. Customer service for donors and non-profit agencies.
 - 4. Access and information for employees to United Way's Navigation Center: 2-1-1
 - 5. Opportunities for Travis County Leadership Donors to participate in Women's Leadership Programs, Young Leaders, and other leadership events.
 - 6. Training and support to Travis County Liaisons.

- C. No Travis County employee will be coerced to participate in the Campaign; employees are free, however, to volunteer their time.
- D. Serve as the fiscal agent for the Travis County Combined Charities Campaign.
- E. Provide Travis County employees, Travis County administration, and participating federations and funds with assurance of timely, accurate, and cost effective delivery of employee contributions to designated non-profit agencies.
- F. Process employee pledge forms. The following procedures will be observed:
 - 1. United Way will be provided all collected and completed campaign report envelopes, including pledge forms, cash, and checks, on a weekly basis throughout the campaign.
 - 2. Patriot Act certification of designated non-profit agencies.
 - 3. United Way will safeguard all monies received by it. Any losses shall be reimbursed by the United Way.
- G. Process cash and checks within five business days of receipt at United Way at the end of the campaign.
- H. Generate and distribute the following reports to applicable federations/funds by the first quarter following the first payment from Travis County. Donor pledge information is available to all agencies via an online portal provided by United Way regardless if payment has been made.
 - 1. A designation report.
 - 2. An acknowledgement report.
- I. Distribute all donations to the applicable agencies by February 28, 2015.
- J. Distribute all payroll deduction contributions to applicable non-profits as collected from the County on a quarterly basis, beginning in the month of May. Each agency might not receive the full amount of designations due to uncollectible pledges.
- K. Distribution of campaign proceeds to applicable agencies will include all designated and undesignated contributions to each agency. Undesignated contributions are shared on a pro-rata basis between all participating agencies based on the amount of designations per agency.
- L. Provide to Travis County, an itemized accounting by Mid-September 30, 2014. Copies of all receipts will be available upon TCCCC's request and will be available to the participating agencies upon request.

- M. Provide to Travis County, upon request, access to the employee payroll deduction campaign pledge forms. United Way must keep the pledge forms and all financial records relating to the distribution of contributions for at least three years.
- N. Provide campaign activities that are conducted fairly and equitably to promote unified solicitation on behalf of all participants.

2. Travis County Responsibilities:

- A. Pursuant to Local Government Code Section 155.001 (a)(4), at the request of an employee, provide payroll deduction, and forward the employee contributions to United Way monthly.
- B. Forward to United Way timely, accurate pledge result details
- C. Forward to United Way payment details for accurate payout of designations and donor acknowledgments.

3. Cost and Compensation of United Way

A. United Way may retain at the average rate of thirteen and one-quarter percent (13.25%) per donation, with maximum of \$250, for the services described in Section 1. However, United Way will not retain a fee for donations made to United Way ("Make the Greatest Impact", Success By 6, Target Graduation, Financial Opportunity).

4. Term of Agreement

This Agreement will be effective beginning September 1 and will continue through the final distribution of September 30, 2014.

5. Notice

- A. Written Notice. All notices between the parties and related to this Contract shall be given to the other party in writing. If a notice is delivered in person to the address in this section for the party to whom the notice is given, that notice is deemed to have been given immediately. If a notice is placed in the United States mail, postage prepaid, by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, addressed to the address in this section for the party to whom the notice is given, that notice is deemed to have been given on the third Working Day following mailing.
- B. County Address. The address of County for all purposes and notices under this Contract is:

C. United Way Address. The address of United Way for all purposes and notices under this Contract is:

- D. Change of Address. Each party may change its address for notice by giving Notice of the new address. County and United Way shall give Notice to each other of any change in its address, including a change in the person to whom attention is directed, within fifteen (15) Days of the change.
- 6. Right of Inspection and Audit. United Way shall give the COUNTY, or any of its duly authorized representatives, access to and the right to examine all books, accounts, records, reports, files, and other papers, things, or property belonging to or in use by United Way pertaining to this Contract at reasonable times and for reasonable periods. These rights to access shall continue as long as the records are retained by United Way.

7. Dispute Resolution

When mediation is acceptable to both parties in resolving a dispute arising under this Agreement, the parties agree to use a mutually agreed upon mediator, or person appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction for mediation as described in the Tex. Civ. Prac. and Rem. Code, 154.023. Unless both parties are satisfied with the result of the mediation, the mediation will not constitute a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communications within the scope of the mediation must remain confidential as described in Tex. Civ. Prac. and Rem Code 154.073, unless both parties agree, in writing, to waive the confidentiality.

8. Miscellaneous

- A. Computation of Time. When any period of time is stated in this Contract, the time shall be computed to exclude the first day and include the last day of the period. If the last day of any period falls on a Saturday or Sunday or a day that County has declared a holiday for its employees these days shall be omitted from the computation.
- B. Number and Gender. Words of any gender in this Contract shall be construed to include any other gender and words in either number shall be construed to include the other unless the context in the Contract clearly requires otherwise.
- C. Headings. The headings at the beginning of the various provisions of this Contract have been included only to make it easier to locate the subject matter covered by that section or subsection and are not to be used in construing this Contract.

- D. Assignability. Neither party may assign any of the rights or duties created by this Contract without the prior written approval of the other party. It is acknowledged by United Way that no officer, agent, employee, or representative of COUNTY has any authority to assign any part of this Contract unless expressly granted that authority by the Travis County Commissioners Court.
- E. Binding Contract. This Contract shall be binding upon the successors, assigns, administrators, and legal representatives of the parties to this Contract.
- F. Entire Agreement. All oral and written agreements between the parties to this Contract relating to the subject matter of this Contract that were made prior to the execution of this Contract have been reduced to writing and are contained in this Contract.
- G. LAW AND VENUE. THIS CONTRACT IS GOVERNED BY THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS AND ALL OBLIGATIONS UNDER THIS CONTRACT SHALL BE PERFORMABLE IN TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS.

H. Amendments.

- 1. Written Amendment. Unless specifically provided otherwise in this Contract, any change to the terms of this Contract or any attachments to it shall be made in writing and signed by both parties. No modification concerning this Contract shall be of any force or effect, excepting a subsequent modification in writing signed by the Party to be charged.
- 2. IT IS ACKNOWLEDGED BY UNITED WAY THAT NO OFFICER, AGENT, EMPLOYEE, OR REPRESENTATIVE OF COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY TO CHANGE THE TERMS OF THIS CONTRACT OR ANY ATTACHMENTS TO IT UNLESS EXPRESSLY GRANTED THAT AUTHORITY BY THE TRAVIS

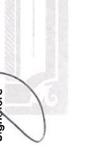

Upon request of the Auditor, we want to call your attention to a unique situation we have with a temporary employee we are using to assist us in designing, acquiring, and funding a new voting system for Travis County. Reimbursement of travel costs for this employee are being held pending your approval.

The Clerk's Office is working with some of the nation's top experts in computer science, cryptography, statistics, and human factor/usability engineering to develop a set of specifications for a voting system. This effort is in response to a request by representatives of the community serving on the County Clerk's Election Study Group who determined that Travis County's new voting system needs to provide more security, accuracy, voter convenience, transparency, accountability, and economy than those systems available on the market.

Collecting and assimilating these specifications from technical experts, activists, federal and state agencies, and election administrators is a daunting challenge. We knew we had to find a unique individual to fill that role. After discussing the pros and cons of using an employee versus a consultant, we determined the best choice, if possible, was to have a person employed by Travis County who would be directly representing our interests. However, we also knew it would be extremely difficult to find someone to fit this role.

Much to our delight and amazement, we found a person with expertise in business, computer science, cryptographic science, voting technology, and high level technical writing. Bryce Eakin's education is in economics and computer science. He has an MBA from Oxford University. He studied with one of the nation's leading experts in voting security at Rice University. Mr. Eakin was willing to accept the position as our temporary employee because of his passion for elections, his admiration for Travis County's demand for higher standards, and his belief that this project could set a new standard for voting systems in the country.

Mr. Eakin has already completed an initial draft of the RFP that will be used to give vendors a first glance at the specifications that are being developed. This draft will be presented on July 28, 2013, at a vendor meeting in Austin just prior to the Texas Secretary of State Elections Conference. Mr. Eakin also prepared the submission for the Department of Defense grant and will be working to prepare other materials as we continue to seek additional funding sources.

Mr. Eakin serves as a temporary employee (grade 31 at \$50/hour). His salary and travel expenses are paid from the County Clerk's Elections Division Special Revenue fund (also called the 10% fund). We confirmed with the Secretary of State that expenditure of these funds for this purpose is acceptable.

We want to make sure the Court understands that Mr. Eakin lives in Houston and is temporarily staying in New York City. We have been working remotely with Mr. Eakin using email and conference calls. On occasion we have requested that he travel to Austin for meetings with our team of experts, and for a presentation to the Election Study Group. We know of two meetings in the near future when we will be asking him to come to Austin. In July, we are asking him to attend the meeting with potential vendors, the Clerk's Office, and the Purchasing Office. In August we will ask him to appear with us in Commissioners Court for a presentation on the new voting system. Future trips to Austin will be requested sparingly, but will be likely as we move through this process.

We realize having an out-of-county and/or out-of-state employee is unusual, and we cannot imagine another circumstance when we would find this practical or necessary. However, for this particular situation, it serves the County well and provides us with an incredible resource who is personally invested with Travis County. We also believe this arrangement is much less expensive than if we had hired a consultant.

The Auditor's Office has said that they have no criticism of this arrangement, but they felt Commissioners Court needed to be aware that we have a temporary employee who is living out of the area.

We look forward to hearing your thoughts on this matter. Thank you.

FY14 Plan for Use of the County Clerk's Records Management and Preservation Fund 0108 and Records Archive Fund 0129

The Records Management and Preservation Fund, outlined in Section 118.0216 of the Texas Local Government Code, is for, "the records management and preservation services performed by the county clerk after the filing and recording of a document in the records of the office of the clerk." This section also states, "the county clerk shall prepare an annual written plan for funding the automation projects and records management and preservation services performed by the clerk."

The County Clerk's Records Archive Fund, outlined in 118.025 of the Local Government Code, states that the fee for "Records Archive" under Section 118.011(f) is for, "the preservation and restoration services performed by the county clerk in connection with maintaining a county clerk's records archive." This section states, "the county clerk shall prepare an annual written plan for funding the preservation and restoration of the county clerk's records archive."

This document serves as the written plan for both of these funds.

Long Term Plan for the Use of these Funds

The Travis County Clerk's library of permanent real property records dates prior to 1836 and contains over 30,000,000 pages of documents. There are three important categories of these documents:

April 1999 – present	Documents are electronically imaged and have a computerized
	index.
1987 – 1999	Documents are microfilmed and have a computerized index.
1836 – 1987	Documents are microfilmed and have microfilmed copies of
	handwritten indexes.

Our primary goals are to use these funds to:

 Provide and maintain systems for managing the receiving, filing, storage, retrieval, and public access of records in the Clerk's Office

This includes projects to acquire, implement, manage, update, and replace systems that handle paper, microfilm, and electronic records.

• Improve public access to County Clerk records

This enhances the public's ability to locate the records they are seeking by building advanced databases and improving internet access to information.

 Provide appropriate physical and electronic storage sites for libraries with the ability to retrieve information as needed

This includes maintaining physical storage sites for paper, microfilm, and electronic medium as well as electronic storage of data and back-up systems.

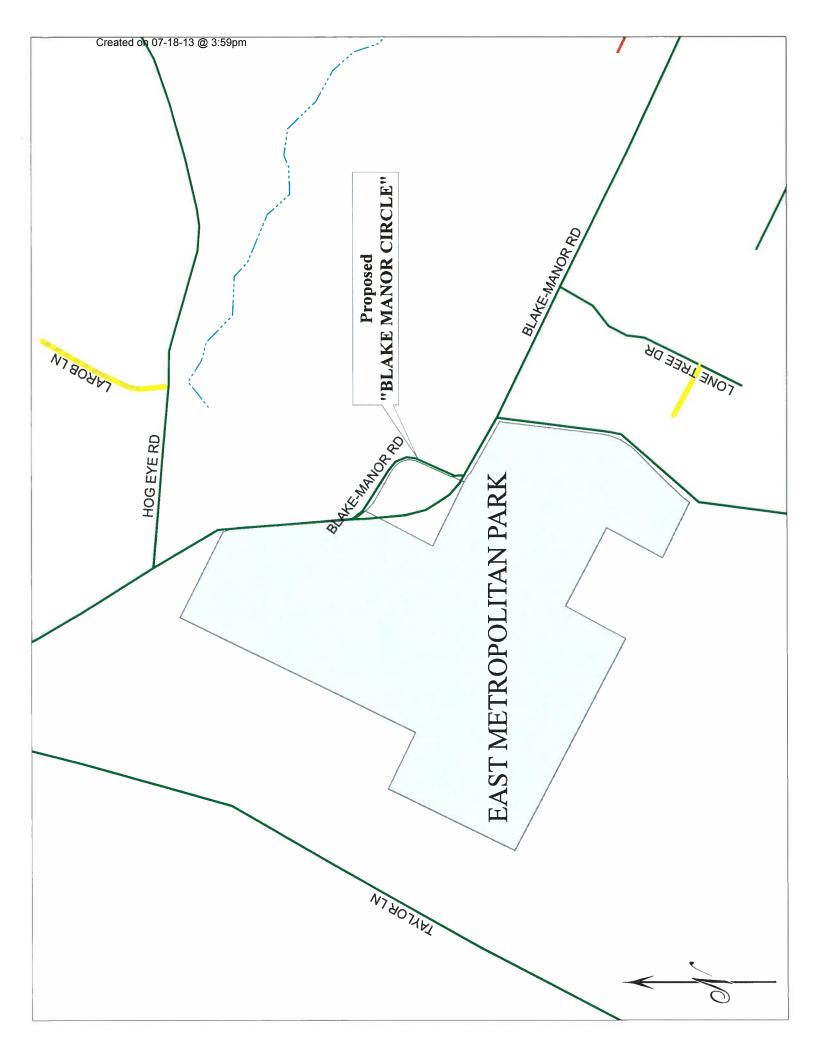

CONTRACT BETWEEN THE TRAVIS COUNTY HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION AND VICKIE SCHUBERT

This Contract (the "Contract") is entered into to be effective as of July __, 2013, by Travis County Housing Finance Corporation, a Texas public nonprofit corporation (the "Corporation") and Vickie Schubert ("Schubert").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Corporation has certain financial reporting and review needs; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation desires to engage Schubert to render certain services related to its financial reporting and review needs; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation desires to enter into an agreement with Schubert as hereinafter provided to assure the effective preparation of financial reports;

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree to the terms and conditions stated in this Contract.

1.0 **DEFINITIONS**

In this Contract, "Contract Funds" means all funds paid by the Corporations to Schubert pursuant to this Contract.

2.0 CONTRACT PERIOD

This Contract shall continue in full force for the Contract Period which commences on August 1, 2013, and terminates on November 30, 2013.

3.0 PERFORMANCE

3.1 <u>Responsibilities</u> . During the Contract Period, Schubert shall prepare (a) more	nthly
financial statements by the day of each month for the previous month (so long as	s the
Corporation provides the necessary information by the day of each month, if not, Sch	ubert
will have days after receipt of the necessary information to complete the monthly rep

3.2 <u>Civil Rights/ADA Compliance</u>. Schubert shall comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Public Law 93-1122, Section 504, and with

the provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, Public Law 101-336 [S.933]. Schubert shall not discriminate against any employee, applicant for employment, or participant in any of its programs based on race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age or handicapped condition.

3.3 <u>W-9 Taxpayer Identification Form</u>. If requested, Schubert shall provide the Corporation with an Internal Revenue Form W-9 Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification that is completed in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code, its rules and regulations, and a statement of entity status in a form satisfactory to the Corporation before any Contract Funds are paid to Schubert.

4.0 CORPORATION PERFORMANCE

4.1 <u>Compensation</u>. For the satisfactory completion of the services to be provided under this Contract, the Corporation will pay Schubert a fee of \$50 per hour. Schubert estimates that the services will require approximately __ hours per month and will obtain the Corporation's written approval for any charges of more than __ hours per month. Corporation will not be liable for additional charges unless Schubert and Corporation agree to additional charges in advance and in writing. For any services not described herein that are requested by the Corporation, the Corporation agrees to pay Shubert a fee of \$85 per hour.

Schubert will submit an itemized invoice each month describing the services furnished and the amount being billed for each item.

The Corporation shall pay such invoices within ____ days of receipt unless it raises a good faith objection to any of the charges thereon, in which case the parties will work together to resolve such objection as quickly as possible.

5.0 **ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS**

5.1 <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The parties expressly acknowledge and agree that Schubert is an independent contractor and assumes all of the rights, obligations and liabilities applicable to it as an independent contractor. Schubert shall not be considered an employee of the Corporation or gain any rights against the Corporation pursuant to the Corporation's personnel policies.

6.0 CONFIDENTIALITY

Schubert agrees to keep confidential at all times all information received from the Corporation and will not disclose any information to any person or entity without the express written consent of the Corporation or unless required by applicable law.

7.0 SURVIVAL OF CONDITIONS

The confidentiality provisions of this Contract shall survive beyond the end of this Contract.

8.0 <u>INDEMNIFICATION AND CLAIMS NOTIFICATION</u>

- 8.1 Indemnification. **EXCEPT FOR** THE CORPORATION'S **GROSS** NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT FOR WHICH EITHER IS ADJUDGED BY A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION TO BE LEGALLY LIABLE, SCHUBERT AGREES TO AND SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CORPORATION. ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, LOSSES, DAMAGES, NEGLIGENCE, CAUSES OF ACTION, SUITS AND LIABILITY OF EVERY KIND, INCLUDING ALL EXPENSES OF LITIGATION, COURT COSTS, AND ATTORNEY'S FEES, FOR INJURY OR DEATH OF ANY PERSON, FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION BY SCHUBERT, OR FOR DAMAGE TO ANY PROPERTY. ARISING OUT OF IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION AND USE OR OPERATION OF THE PROJECT. EXCEPT AS AFORESAID, IT IS THE EXPRESSED INTENTION OF THE PARTIES TO THIS CONTRACT THAT THE INDEMNITY PROVIDED FOR IN THIS PARAGRAPH IS FOR SCHUBERT TO INDEMNIFY AND PROTECT THE CORPORATION FROM THE CONSEQUENCES OF ITS OWN NEGLIGENCE ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS CONTRACT. WHETHER THAT NEGLIGENCE IS THE SOLE OR CONCURRING CAUSE OF THE INJURY, DEATH OF DAMAGE.
- 8.2 <u>Claims Notification</u>. If any claim or other action, including proceedings before an administrative agency, is made or brought by any person or entity against Schubert or the Corporation, the party against whom the claim is made shall give the other party written notice of such claim or other action within three (3) business days after being notified of the claim or action or the threat of it. The notice shall include the name and address of the person or entity making such claim, the basis of the claim, the court or administrative agency where the claim was initiated or is threatened to be initiated, and the name of the person(s) against whom the claim is made or threatened, and the notifying party shall provide copies of all pertinent documents to the other party.

9.0 SUSPENSION

If Schubert fails to comply with any provision hereof, and after the Corporation has notified Schubert in writing of the provision of the Contract that Schubert is not in compliance with and such failure to comply continues for a period of 10 days after the Corporation has notified Schubert, the Corporation may suspend this Contract in whole or in part.

10.0 TERMINATION

- 10.1 <u>Reasons for Termination</u>. The Corporation shall have the right to terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, if Schubert has failed to comply with any material term or condition of this Contract, and such failure to comply shall continue for a period of more than ten (10) days after written notice of such failure has been given to Schubert.
- 10.2 <u>Notification</u>. The Corporation shall notify Schubert in writing at least ten (10) days before the date of the Corporation's termination of this Contract, the reasons for

termination, the effective date of termination and, in the case of partial termination, the portion of the Contract to be terminated.

10.3 <u>Continued Liability</u>. Notwithstanding the exercise by the Corporation of its right to suspend or terminate, Schubert shall not be relieved of any liability to the Corporation for damages due to the Corporation by virtue of any breach of this Contract or otherwise pursuant to this Contract.

11.0 NON-WAIVER OF DEFAULT

No payment, act or omission by a party may constitute or be construed as a waiver of any breach or default of such party which then exists or which may subsequently exist. All rights of the parties under this Contract are reserved and any payment, act or omission shall not impair or prejudice any right or remedy of a party hereto. The pursuit of any right or remedy under this Contract or by law shall not preclude the exercise of any other right or remedy under this Contract or pursuant to law, nor shall any action taken in the exercise of any right or remedy be deemed a waiver of any other right or remedy.

12.0 AMENDMENTS

Any amendment to any term of this Contract shall be effective only if it shall be in writing and signed by both parties hereto.

13.0 ASSIGNABILITY; BINDING AGREEMENT

Neither party may assign any of the rights or obligations under this Contract without the written consent of the other party hereto. This Contract shall be binding upon the successors, assigns and legal representatives of the parties hereto.

14.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

All oral and written agreements between the parties hereto that were made prior to the execution hereof have been reduced to writing and are contained in this Contract. All exhibits hereto are made a part of this Contract.

15.0 LAW AND VENUE

This Contract is governed by the laws of the State of Texas and all obligations under this Contract shall be performable in Travis County, Texas.

16.0 **SEVERABILITY**

If any portion of this Contract is ruled invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of it shall remain valid and binding.

17.0 NOTICES

20.0 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

When mediation is acceptable to both parties in resolving a dispute hereunder, the parties agree to use the Dispute Resolution Center in Austin, Texas, as the provider of mediators. Mediation will not constitute a final and binding resolution of any dispute unless both parties agree. All communications within the scope of the mediation shall remain confidential unless both parties agree, in writing, to waive the confidentiality.

21.0 INTERPRETATIONAL GUIDELINES

- 24.1 <u>Computation of Time</u>. When any period of time is stated in this Contract, the time shall be computed to exclude the first day of such period and to include the last day of such period. If the last day of any period falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, those days shall be omitted from the computation.
- 24.2 <u>Gender</u>. Words of any gender in this Contract shall be construed to include the other gender.

24.3 <u>Headings</u>. The headings at the beginning of each provision of this Contract have been included only to make it easier to locate the subject matter covered by that section or subsection, and are not to be used in construing this Contract.
