BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

This resubdivision final plat consists of three single family lots on 6.016 acres platted from Mesa Oaks. There are no public or private streets proposed with this final plat. Parkland fees in lieu of dedication have been paid to the City of Leander in the amount of \$2,350. Fiscal surety is not required for this short form plat. Water service will be provided by individual water wells; and wastewater service to be provided by on-site septic facilities.

Mesa Oaks is a recorded access easement rather than publicly maintained right-ofway. Section 82.202(d)(5) states each lot in a subdivision shall abut an internal street meeting or exceeding the requirements of this section, and a variance to this section was approved by the Court on March 5, 2013. The variance was justified as the City of Leander and Williamson County, where all roads in Hidden Mesa funnel into, stated no objection to the variance.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

As this resubdivision final plat meets all Travis County standards and was approved by the City of Leander on June 13, 2013, TNR staff recommends approval of the motion.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

This resubdivision final plat was reviewed under the county's water availability rules, and the applicant has provided the results of a walking survey identifying all groundwater wells within 1,000 feet of the subdivision boundary and added the plat notes required under Section 82.212(a)(2)-(6).

A) Preliminary plan - Hills of Bear Creek, Preliminary Plan - FM 1626 - 206 total lots

- City of Austin 2-Mile ETJ in Precinct 3.; and

B) Phasing Agreement for Hills of Bear Creek, Preliminary Plan.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

The subject property consists of a preliminary plan, The Hills of Bear Creek. It is located in the City of Austin's 2-Mile ETJ. It proposes 206 total lots: 197 single family lots, 5 open and drainage lots, 3 open space, wasterwater, amenity center lots, and 1 commerical lot on 77.71 acres. There are 8,094 linear feet of public streets being proposed with this development. The property is bounded by FM 1626 on the north and is adjacent to Johnson Lane. The majority of the single family lots will take access from Johnson Lane and the commercial lot will only take access from FM 1626. Water and wastewater will be provided by the City of Austin.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

As this preliminary plan meets all Title 30 requirements and has been approved by the City of Austin's Zoning and Platting Commission; TNR staff recomends approval.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

The applicant originally was requesting a variance from Title 30-2-158(B(2) Access to Streets (Requires that a new subdivision must have at least two access streets and each of the two access streets must connect to a different external street - FM 1626). The variance was presented to Commissioners Court on March 12, 2013 and was discussed by court. There was opposition from adjacent property owners who opposed the variance. The court recommended the applicant meet with those property owners and there were several meetings that took place. After several meetings and discussions with County Staff, Commissioner Gerald Daugherty and TXDOT; the applicant subsequently agreed to add a connection to FM 1626 and therefore the variance was no longer required.

The applicant also voluntarily agreed to the following conditions with the residents of Bear Creek Park neighborhood and are noted on letter prepared by the applicants engineer, Larry Hanrahan. (See attached letter.) The conditions included the following: 1) adding the connection to FM 1626, 2) reduction in lots from 208 to 196, 3) adding an emergency access through adjacent baseball fields, 4) widening Johnson Lane to collector status, and 5) extend fire flow to residents of the Bear Creek Park neighborhood and others.







Summary of Changes per Commissioners Court Hearing and Agreement with Neighbors

Dear Joe:

After two commissioners court hearings and several meetings and discussions with neighbors of the project (in Bear Creek Park), the applicant has agreed to the following changes to the preliminary plan, as reflected on the attached revised preliminary plan:

- 1. **Name Change**. The name of the project will be The Hills of Bear Creek at the neighbors' request.
- 2. **Second Street Connection**. A street connection is shown to FM 1626. This connection is noted as a "Right In Right Out Only" intersection, per a discussion with the TxDOT Area Engineer. Please see the attached email copy from the Area Engineer regarding this connection.
- 3. **Emergency Ingress/Egress**. An easement is shown in the southwest portion of the site between Larrys Lane and the Optimists Club property. Within this easement, a 20-foot wide all-weather access road is to be constructed.
- 4. **Reduction in Number of Lots**. The number of single family lots has been reduced from 208 to 197 as a result of converting one-third of the lots to a 60-foot width from a 50-foot width. These lots are in the southern portions of the property.
- 5. **Johnson Lane Widening**. Johnson Lane will be widened to 40 feet between Olivers Way and FM 1626. This is reflected in Note 32 on Sheet 4, as the preliminary plan does not show design elements. The widening will need to be shown in construction plans for the first phase of improvements.

The developer agreed to provide additional improvements at the Bear Creek Park neighbors' request which are not reflected on the preliminary plan, but will be provided with the first phase of development:


- 6. **Fire Protection Improvements**. A fire hydrant will be located at the bend in Johnson Lane between Lots 1 and 2, Block B of the Hills of Bear Creek. This hydrant can be used by firefighters in the event of a fire in the Bear Creek Park neighborhood.
- 7. **Pathway**. A pedestrian pathway between Johnson Lane and Olivers Way will be provided. This pathway will likely be constructed of decomposed granite, and located on Lot 1, Block B of the Hills of Bear Creek. The pathway will meander to avoid large trees.





STATE OF TEXAS §

COUNTY OF TRAVIS §

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Johnson 2012, L.L.C., a Texas limited liability company (the "Developer"), and Travis County, Texas, (the "County"), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties", for the purposes and consideration stated herein.

WHEREAS, the Developer is in the process of subdividing that certain 77.708 acre tract of land described in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Developer desires to develop the Property in phases; and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that the Developer will subsequently submit final plats for a total of three phases of the Property for County approval in accordance with the proposed Preliminary Plan for Hills of Shady Hollow (the "Preliminary Plan"), described in Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, the Developer and the County desire to provide for the orderly development of the Property, including (as applicable):

- a) the improvement of arterial/collector street(s) (the Street(s)"), which will provide interior access to and through the Property; and
- b) the new right turn lane of FM 1626, a State road, at Brodie Lane, as suggested by the Developer's traffic impact analysis report (the "Right Turn Lane"); and
- c) an access point for emergency vehicles to serve the development (the "Emergency Access Point").

WHEREAS, the development of the Property will necessitate the construction of the Street(s), the Right Turn Lane, and the Emergency Access Point; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to establish a process to coordinate the improvement of the Street(s), the Road, and the Emergency Access Point with the phased development of the Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these promises and the promises contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1) In the phased development of the Property, the Developer will:
 - upon the execution of this Agreement, dedicate or cause to be dedicated by plat or separate instrument the right-of way and any required slope or drainage easements necessary for the construction of the Streets within the phases being final platted, as shown on Exhibit "C", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, and;
 - II) furnish and install the Emergency Access Point adjacent to Phase 3 and shown on Exhibit "C", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, as part of the submittal of the Phase 2 Final Plat;
 - III) as part of the Phase 1 subdivision improvements, widen Johnson Lane to a forty-foot (40') pavement section between FM 1626 and Olivers Way, as permitted for construction by the City of Austin/Travis County Single Office, and as generally shown on Exhibit "D" of the Phase 1 subdivision improvements;
 - IV) post under a County-approved form the proportionate construction security, and if necessary, provide an Advance Funding Agreement and Indemnification Agreement, for 11% of the cost of improvement of the Right Turn Lane and shown on Exhibit "E", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, upon the earlier of these two events:
 - a. the final plat approval of both Phase 1 and Phase 2
 - b. the final plat approval of more than 125 lots, the basis of which is shown in memorandum form on Exhibit "F", which is attached hereto and made part hereof;
 - V) as each subsequent Phase of the subdivision of the Property is submitted to the Commissioners Court for approval, post, under a County-approved form the construction security for the cost of the improvements to the Street(s) within the Phase being final platted.
- 2) In the phased development of the Property, the County will, subject to the performance by the Developer of its obligations under this Agreement and the Travis County Standards for Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions, approve the subsequent final plats of the Property.

- 3) The right-of-way and any slope or drainage easement dedications, which must be dedicated under this Agreement, shall be in an approved County form and must be free from any encumbrances, conditions, restrictions, rights, or interests, which may, in the reasonable opinion of the Travis County Attorney's Office, adversely affect the County's ability to use the right-of-way or easements for their intended purpose.
- 4) The presently estimated cost of constructing 11% of the Right Turn Lane is \$10,817.34 as shown in Exhibit "G", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 5) If the Preliminary Plan for the Property is revised and approved, the County and the Developer will, to the extent required, either amend this Agreement or enter into an additional or supplemental agreement(s) to coordinate the phasing process and the future improvement of the Street(s) and/or the Right Turn Lane.
- 6) The Developer shall seek Travis County's approval prior to the development of any contiguous parcels that may be adjacent to the property.
- 7) The County and its officers, employees, and successors and assigns will not be liable or responsible for and shall be held harmless by the Developer from any claims, losses, damages, causes of action, suits and liability of any kind for personal injury or death or property damage arising out of or in connection with any actions by or negligence of the Developer under the terms of this Agreement.

8) Miscellaneous.

- a) Beneficiaries. This Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their successors and assigns.
- b) Restrictive Covenant. This Agreement touches and concerns real property located in Travis County, Texas, and, if recorded, will constitute a covenant running with the land. However, this Agreement will not affect the title to the land conveyed to residents of individual lots in a Phase of the Subdivision, who will take their interests free and clear of the conditions of this Agreement without the necessity of any release or consent by the County.
- c) Amendment to Agreement. Any revision, modification, or amendment of this Agreement will be effective only when reduced to writing and signed by the County and the current owners of the affected portion(s) of the Property which is affected. NO OFFICIAL, AGENT, OR EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY HAS ANY AUTHORITY, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED TO AMEND OR MODIFY THIS AGREEMENT EXCEPT PURSUANT TO SUCH EXPRESS AUTHORITY AS MAY BE DELEGATED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT.

- d) Assignment by the Developer. The rights, duties, and responsibilities of the Developer may be assigned only with the consent of the County, which will not be unreasonably withheld or unduly delayed.
- e) Entire Agreement. This is the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. As of this date, there are no other agreements or representations, oral or written, between the Parties in conflict with this Agreement.
- f) Notice. Any notices hereunder will be in writing and addressed to the respective party at the address set forth below for such party, (i) by personal delivery, (ii) by U.S. Mail, certified or registered, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or (iii) by FedEx or other nationally recognized overnight courier service. Notice deposited in the U.S. Mail in the manner hereinabove described will be effective on the earlier of the date of actual receipt or three days after the date of such deposit. Notice given in any other manner shall be effective only if and when received by the party to be notified.

i) Number and gender. All terms or words used in this Agreement, regardless of the number or gender in which they are used, shall be deemed to include any other number or gender as the context may require.

Alliance Transportation Group, Inc., (ATG) prepared the Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) in support of the proposed Hills of Shady Hollow Subdivision in Travis County, Texas. The TIA included a recommendation for a right turn lane to be constructed on the southbound Brodie Lane approach to FM 1626. The TIA identified the Hills of Shady Hollow to be responsible for 11% of the construction cost of this right turn lane. This memorandum addresses the storage length recommended for this proposed right turn lane and a development threshold prior to incorporating the right turn lane.

The proposed storage length for a right turn lane on the Brodie Lane approach to FM 1626 is constrained by the intersection spacing between FM 1626 and Hewitt Lane/Bismark Drive. These two intersections are approximately 360 feet apart (measured from curb return to curb return. Following the City of Austin design guidelines (See Figure 1-11 in City of Austin Transportation Criteria Manual), and the recommended minimum storage for turning into an arterial (150 feet) yields a right turn length of 270 feet (including taper).

To evaluate the timing of the proposed improvement, the intersection of Brodie and FM 1626 was analyzed with various development density of residential development included. The first phase of the development is proposed to be 78 lots. Traffic from 78 lots of residential development was added to the intersection. Under this level of development, the intersection analysis indicated that the right turn lane would not be required. The development level was then intensified until the analysis revealed that the intersection level-of-service would require mitigation. The analysis performed indicated that mitigation would be required when 125 lots were constructed.

Based on the analyses performed, a proposed right turn lane with 150 feet of storage (plus 120 foot taper) would be required on Brodie Lane approaching FM 1626. Further, analyses performed indicate that this turn lane would be necessary in conjunction with the final platting of the 125th residential lot of the subdivision. It is noted that should the commercial parcel be developed prior to the 125th residential lot, the threshold development level should be re-evaluated.

As the Hills of Shady Hollow is only responsible for funding 11% of the turn lane, it is our recommendation that the developer post their pro-rata share of the right turn lane construction with the platting of the 125th residential lot.

AGENDA LANGUAGE: Consider and take appropriate action on a request to authorize the filing of an instrument to reject the dedication and abandon the public streets known as Lenape Trail, Lenape Cove, Superview Drive, and Indian Scout Trail, all originally dedicated by The Overlook Estates, Phase 1 subdivision - a subdivision in Precinct Three.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

A Commissioners Court hearing for this rejection of dedication and abandonment of public streets request was originally held on May 22, 2012. Action was not taken at that time. The Court requested that the applicant meet with neighboring property owners who showed concern and/or opposition during the hearing. An additional public hearing was held on July 30, 2013. Neighboring property owners again voiced their concerns and opinions (for and against) the privatization. However, the Court postponed taking action on the item until a later date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The request has been reviewed by TNR staff which finds the request meets Section 82.206(c) of the Travis County Standards for Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions. As such, TNR staff recommends the proposed action.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

Since the hearing of May 22, 2012, additional meetings were held between the developer and the concerned neighboring property owners. It is staff's understanding that the meetings were inconclusive. The responses/opinions have been mixed.

If the request is approved, the developer will then move forward with submitting plans to get permitting for privacy gates at either end of the project.





AGENDA LANGUAGE: Consider and take appropriate action on a request to authorize the filing of an instrument to reject the dedication and abandon the public streets - Lenape Trail, Lenape Cove, Superview Drive, and Indian Scout Trail, all originally dedicated by the plat of The Overlook Estates Phase 1, a subdivision in Precinct Three.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

On May 20, 1986, the Travis County Commissioners Court passed an Order authorizing the filing for record of the plat of The Overlook Estates 1. In that document the developer Spindletop Savings Association President David L. Parsley signed a statement which dedicated the streets, shown on the plat, to the public.

In a letter from the Law Office of Terrence L. Irion, dated March 27, 2012, Mr. Irion presents the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions, for the subdivision, which show that the Association shall maintain, repair, and replace, as necessary, all private improvements in the public right of way and/or the roads themselves, should they become private.

The Attorney for the developers, Mr. Irion requests that the streets of this subdivision be declared private by action of the Travis County Commissioners Court. Therefore the Travis County Commissioners Court shall have the Public Hearing on this date of May 22, 2012, in regards to rejecting the dedication and abandoning these streets.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The request has been reviewed by TNR staff and staff finds the request meets Section 82.206(c) of the Travis County Standards for Construction of Streets and Drainage in Subdivisions. As such, TNR staff recommends rejecting the dedication and abandoning the streets of this subdivision.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

On March 3, 2012, developers and engineers met with the neighborhood, in order to inform them of the proposed change in status of the roads in this subdivision. Mr. Irion has reported, in his letter dated March 27, 2012, that most of the residents who attended the meeting were not opposed to the change. Although it is possible that one or two may speak against this action, no one has contacted staff in this regard. One resident of Ridge at Thomas Springs requested another sign at Thomaswood Lane and Thomas Springs Drive.

The applicant has submitted Statements from utility companies, the City of Austin Transportation, the emergency services district, and the school district stating that they have no objection to this subdivision converting to private streets. Additionally, the applicant has submitted the homeowners association of incorporation, the bylaws of the association, and the covenants, restrictions, and restrictions showing that there is a body in place to maintain the streets.

Some of the lots have been sold and the applicant is collecting letters of approval of conversion from public to private streets.



I represent the owners of the Overlook Estates Phase 1 Subdivision, which was platted and recorded in 1986, but which is just now being developed in phases. The first phase of construction which is being completed at this time will build out the streets and utility infrastructure to serve approximately 35 lots along Linape Trail from Circle Drive. The road construction of this phase will stop short of extending Linape Trail to The Ridge at Thomas Springs.

A subsequent phase will eventually build Linape Trail to the street stub-out at The Ridge at Thomas Springs, but no time table has yet been set for this subsequent construction.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the owners have requested conversion of the plat dedicated public streets in The Overlook Estates to private streets with the right to install a privacy gate at the entrance on Circle Drive. This letter is to request that the publicly dedicated right-of-way shown on the plat for The Overlook Estates Phase I (Lenape Trail, Superview Drive, and Indian Scout Trail) be converted to private streets. We are seeking the conversion for the following reasons.

- The limiting of traffic will provide a safer environment for the children since children can often wander into the street.
- Converting the streets to private will provide the subdivision with a better feeling of security.
- Converting the streets to private will allow to the installation of community landscaping, irrigation, and monumentation without a licensing agreement.
- All of the drainage from the subdivision goes to Barton Creek. All of the drainage from Circle Drive does not necessarily go into Barton Creek. Therefore, by limiting traffic in the subdivision (limiting the "cut through" traffic) it should help limit the pollutant load to the creek.
- The City of Austin would not accept the park lot as a public park. Therefore, converting the streets to private should help reduce any confusion about the park lot being a City or County maintained park.

Included in this application are the unsigned documents for the easements and the Homeowners Association's Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (Items 3, 4 & 5) for legal review. We are awaiting the Homeowners Association Certificate of Incorporation (Item 2). We are awaiting the same letter from AISD Transportation Director (Item 7) and expect to have it shortly. WHEREAS, the streets and roads in the Overlook Estates Phase 1, a subdivision recorded at Vol. 86, Page 152d - 153c, Travis County Plat Records, were dedicated to the public in 1986, and the new owners want to apply to the Commissioners Court to change the status of the streets from public to private; and

Lenape Trail, Lenape Cove, Superview Drive, and Indian Scout Trail hereinafter referred to collectively as ("the Streets"); and

WHEREAS, the Overlook Estates Phase 1 HOA, Inc., (OEP1HOA) a validly existing nonprofit corporation, will maintain the streets when the construction is complete and the Court is notified of completion of construction of the streets and drainage; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of the aforementioned actions, OEP1HOA, Inc. has assumed authority and responsibility to pay applicable taxes on and maintain the Streets and established easements for utilities, drainage, emergency service providers, and other public service providers so that abandonment of the Streets will not substantially impair the rights of the utilities, service providers, and any and all land owners who rely on or use the Streets for access; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin, in whose extraterritorial jurisdiction the Streets are located, has consented to the conversion of the county streets and roads in its extraterritorial jurisdiction from public to private by adoption of Section 30-2-159, Austin/Travis County Subdivision Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the requisite 20-day notices were posted, and the Court held a public hearing to consider and provide an opportunity for public comment on this matter; and

WHERERAS, the Court finds that the abandonment of the Streets will not substantially interfere with the access rights of any affected land owner.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COURT FINDS AND ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The recitals to this Order are true and correct and are incorporated herein.
- 2. The Streets are hereby classified as third class streets.
- 3. The Streets are hereby abandoned and the public's interest in the right-of-way is relinquished, except as to the easements for utilities, drainage, and public service agencies established by such declarations and agreements.

MOTION: DISCUSS AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION ON PHASE I OF THE ACCELERATED ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY AND MOBILITY/ TRANSPORTATION STRATEGY FOR SOUTHEASTERN TRAVIS COUNTY (PRECINCT 4), INCLUDING:

- A. Approval of the construction of a five (5) lane road from Pearce to SH 71 effectively extending Kellam to SH 71 to be completed by May 1, 2014.
- B. Approval of the expansion of Elroy Road to a four(4) lane road from McAngus to Kellam by May 1, 2014.
- C. Approval of a Resolution for an Interlocal Agreement with Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority (CTRMA) for Planning, Design, Engineering and Construction of the road plan.
- D. Discussion of the County's Intent to Issue Certificates of Obligation to fund the planning, Right of Way Acquisition, Engineering and Construction of the roads.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

County governments are statutorily limited in many areas, but they have statutory authority with regard to the construction and maintenance of roads in the unincorporated areas of the county. Fundamentally, the lack of road infrastructure and connectivity is a disincentive for economic expansion and business attraction that would lead to job creation.

This plan starts with an aggressive plan for road construction beginning in the areas in SE Travis County that have the <u>highest potential for attracting new or expanded businesses</u> most quickly.

- (A) Approving the construction of a five (5) lane road from Pearce to SH 71 will take financial advantage of the offer of landowner contributions for total donation of Right of Way, open up significant opportunity for economic development and increased values on that roadway, and increase the safety of school children by offering a bypass from Ross Rd (3 DVISD schools and School Administration Offices) to SH 71, increase mobility of residents and improve traffic management of event traffic. This road needs to be completed expeditiously. The project is shovel ready and will enhance commercial development in the area with access to SH71. In addition, due to the location of Circuit of The Americas and its ability to grow and attract feeder businesses, the greatest potential for near term development and job creation as well as increased property values will be in this region. The road is needed and both interest rates and construction costs are escalating.
- **(B)** Approving the expansion of Elroy Road to a four(4) lane road from McAngus to Kellam will enable mobility of residents and event traffic and replace a 2 lane bridge that is too low and is subjected to flooding. It is a narrow 2 lane road with deep ditches on both sides of the road. This expansion was approved on CAMPO prior to COTA. The need for this road is compelling and waiting will only perpetuate the unsafe conditions. Waiting will also cost taxpayers more money as both the interest rates and construction costs are escalating.
- **(C)** Approval of a Resolution for an Interlocal Agreement with Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority (CTRMA) for Planning, Design, Engineering and Construction of the road plan allows us to partner with the CTRMA which has expertise in planning and executing regional transportation plans. There are tremendous opportunities for the residents and businesses in this region if the planning and execution of those plans are successfully and expeditiously implemented.
- **(D)** Discussion of the County's Intent to Issue Certificates of Obligation to fund the planning, Right of Way Acquisition, Engineering and Construction of the roads. Certificates of obligation are a viable method for financing road construction. In addition, because of the county's excellent AAA bond rating interest rates will be on the lowest end of market rates.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

This strategic initiative will focus primarily on three basic economic opportunity areas-Roads, Education and Jobs. Focusing attention on these three fundamental areas that the county can directly and/or indirectly impact has the greatest chance of success in providing the foundation for meaningful economic opportunity in both the short term and the long term.

Precinct 4 has a disproportionate number of citizens that are economically disadvantaged. 27% of the population is living in poverty compared to 15% in Travis County and 17% in the State of Texas. The average per capita income is only \$19,293 compared to \$25,548 in the State of Texas. 30.2% of Precinct 4 residents did not graduate high school compared to 19.6% in the State of Texas.

When it comes to children, the numbers are even more dire. 85% of the students in Del Valle ISD are considered economically disadvantaged. 80% of the students are Hispanic/Latino.

In the Elroy area because of the lack of development, residents do not have access to basic services that residents in other parts of the county enjoy. This is an area of the county that needs immediate help. Some of these strategies will have to be implemented not consecutively, but concurrently. Business as usual is not good enough. In terms of prioritization, it is time for SE Travis County Precinct 4 to be in the front of the line—not at the end.

A large concentration of Hispanic /Latino residents live in SE Travis County. "The Hispanic Quality of Life Report" although commissioned by the City of Austin and related to the City of Austin, certainly documents that there is a need for action and that the Hispanic/Latino community feels left out. In the introduction to the Report it states "When it comes to the economy, we can feel marginalized when we see new construction, development and prosperity around us, yet don't feel this progress reflected in our neighborhoods or communities." The Report further goes on to say "Hispanics sometimes say they feel invisible, on the outside looking in." It is time for this to stop. Unfortunately, there is no instantaneous magic bullet. The longer we wait and do little or nothing, the longer the cycle of invisibility persists. The cycle of invisibility for children is especially damaging.

This plan provides an accelerated economic opportunity and mobility plan for the residents of SE Travis County in which a foundation is created for economic growth and development including the quality of life for constituents by assessing the assets the area currently has and leveraging those assets.

Assets in the unincorporated areas of SE Travis County that can be leveraged quickly to get results--

- ✓ Residents with a strong willingness to work and entrepreneurial spirit
- ✓ Landowners committed to economic opportunity that have voluntarily come forward to donate Right of Way to build a major 4 lane road plus a turn lane
- ✓ Circuit of the Americas, an internationally recognized entertainment and motorsport venue, providing resources, jobs, and educational partnerships chose to locate in Precinct 4
- ✓ Circuit of the Americas, an economic catalyst for attracting new ancillary businesses
- ✓ A significant amount of underutilized undeveloped land
- ✓ Proximity to SH 130 section 4
- ✓ Proximity to SH 71and potential to connect
- ✓ Proximity to Austin-Bergstrom International Airport

The spin-off developments specifically because of the proximity to COTA will likely generate sales tax and property taxes for DelValle ISD, Travis County, the Central Health District, Austin Community College, and The Elroy Library. This leverages the County's and

States' investments in road infrastructure. This heightened interest in development is a momentum that needs to be capitalized upon before it dissipates.

The road situation for visitors and residents is just "make do". If we want robust economic opportunities, we need to invest in a road system that serves our citizens as well as providing mobility and a platform for new businesses and business expansion. Our road system should signify that we are proud of SE Travis County and that we welcome visitors to it.

FISCAL IMPACT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

The county could issue CO's in March at its usual issuance date. This would result in no tax increase for FY 2014 in that the first debt service payment would be due in 2015.

SUBJECT: CONSIDER AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION ON THE FY 2014 INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF AUSTIN FOR CENTRAL BOOKING AND RELATED JAIL SERVICES

The Travis County Sheriff's Office and the City of Austin Police Department (City) have come to a consensus on the FY 2014 Interlocal for Central Booking and Related Jail Services and are now recommending and respectfully requesting approval from the Commissioners Court for the attached Interlocal Agreement (Agreement). Please see Attachment C. The current Agreement expires on September 30, 2013.

In summary, the total Travis County (County) expenditures budgeted for Central Booking are \$11,616,397 for FY 2014. This amount represents a 5.0% increase in budgeted expenditures over FY 2013.

Budgeted expenses for services provided by the City, and deducted from the total County budgeted direct expense in the cost model, equal \$2,911,881. These budgeted expenses are for magistration, magistration support, a phlebotomist and identification services and increased by 5.2% over the FY 2013 budgeted expense. However, under the terms of this

Agreement 90% of the City's costs will be deducted from the County's costs in the financial model.

Using the updated financial model in Exhibit A of the Agreement (see Attachment A), the City would reimburse the County \$6,389,648 of the above amount, which is a \$201,477, or 3.3%, increase from the amount of reimbursement in FY 2013.

The marginal increase is primarily due to higher Central Booking Expenses in FY 2014. A year to year comparison of costs is included in Attachment B.

Please note that the FY 2014 Agreement will be for one year only and the County and City have agreed to begin negotiations soon for FY 2015.

We jointly support these proposed changes outlined in the Amendment to the Central Booking Interlocal Agreement and recommend approval. Forwarded for your review and consideration.

Attachment C INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN TRAVIS COUNTY AND CITY OF AUSTIN FOR BOOKING AND RELATED SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the following parties: the City of Austin, a Home Rule City primarily located in Travis County, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "City", and Travis County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as "County".

WHEREAS, City and County have each determined that it would be mutually beneficial for County to continue to provide booking and detention services for City's prisoners; and

WHEREAS, City and County have each determined that it would be mutually advantageous for City to continue to provide Magistration and Identification services for the Central Booking Facility operated by County; and

WHEREAS, City and County are authorized to enter into this agreement by TEX. GOV'T. CODE ANN., ch. 791;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, City and County agree as follows:

1.0 Effective Date, Term and Termination

- 1.01 <u>Effective Date</u>. This Agreement shall have an effective date of October 1, 2013. (the "Effective Date").
- 1.02 <u>Term</u>. The Term of this Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2013, and shall continue through September 30, 2014, unless earlier terminated by either party in accordance with this Agreement or applicable law. The Term of this Agreement may also be referred to as the "FY 14 Term".

2.0 Definitions. As used in this Agreement:

- 2.01 "Booking" means the intake process by which persons are received for confinement in the Travis County Jail.
- 2.02 "Central Booking Facility" means that portion of the Travis County Criminal Justice Center at 500 West 10th Street, Austin, Texas, which is under the direct control of the Sheriff and designed primarily for the purpose of intake processing and confining Prisoners.
- 2.03 "City Officer" means any officer or employee of the City of Austin who lawfully presents any person for confinement at the Central Booking Facility. The term "City Officer" shall mean City of Austin police officers.

2.04 "City Prisoner" means:

- 2.04.1 any Prisoner held only for violation of a City ordinance that does not implement state law, regardless of whether the Prisoner has been magistrated;
- 2.04.2 any Prisoner held only for violation of a City ordinance that implements state law but who has not yet been magistrated and committed to the custody of the Sheriff by the lawful order of a magistrate;
- 2.04.3 any Prisoner who has been arrested by a City Officer on any charge or charges other than City ordinance violations but who has not yet been magistrated and committed to the custody of the Sheriff by the lawful order of a magistrate.
- 2.05 "Downtown Austin Community Court" or "DACC" means a division of the City of Austin Municipal Court with jurisdiction to adjudicate all Class C Misdemeanor offenses committed in the downtown area identified by Section 2-10-32(a) of the City Code, as amended from time to time.
- 2.06 "Fiscal Year" means the one-year period beginning on October 1 of one calendar year and ending on September 30 of the next calendar year.
 - 2.06.1 "Fiscal Year 14" and "FY 14" shall mean the one-year period from October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014.
- 2.07 "Identification Services" means the identification, through local records, of individuals booked into the Central Booking Facility, including the storage and maintenance of booking sheets, fingerprint and palm print cards and mug shots, and the response to requests for local criminal history based on the stored records.
- 2.08 "Magistration" means the performance of that duty of a Texas magistrate to inform an arrestee of accusations and rights, allow access to counsel and admit to bail as provided by law, issue commitment orders, review probable cause affidavits for arrest and search warrants, issue protective orders, and other matters authorized by law. A prisoner has been "magistrated" on a charge when, following arrest on the charge, he or she has been taken before a magistrate who has performed the duties prescribed by Art. 15.17 of the Code of Criminal Procedure with regard to said charge.
- 2.09 "Pretrial Services" means the functions performed by the Travis County Pretrial Services Office to determine a defendant's eligibility for release on bond and the conditions of release, and to determine a defendant's indigence status as to whether he/she qualifies for court-appointed counsel.
- 2.10 Phlebotomist means personnel within Central Booking Facility authorized to take blood from Prisoners for purposes of determining alcohol blood level.
- 2.11 "Sheriff" means the Travis County Sheriff, or his/her designees.

3.0 City Payments to County

- 3.01 Cost Model. COUNTY and CITY agree that the amounts to be paid by City to County pursuant to this Agreement shall be computed in accordance with the Cost Model attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof. A Cost Model showing amounts for FY 13 is attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof.
- 3.02 Term. For and in consideration of the services to be rendered by County pursuant to this Agreement during the Fiscal Year that begins on October 1, 2013 and ends on September 30, 2014 ("Fiscal Year 14" or "FY 14"), City shall pay to County the total sum of \$6,389,648, in four equal payments as follows: \$1,597,412 on or before December 31, 2013; \$1,597,412 on or before March 31, 2014; \$1,597,412 on or before June 30, 2014; and \$1,597,412 on or before September 30, 2014.
- 3.05 City will provide Magistration and Identification services-for all prisoners booked into the Central Booking Facility. For purposes of this agreement, these costs will be credited at 90% of actual expense per the cost model.
- 3.06 City and County agree that the payments provided herein fairly compensate the performing party for the service performed under this agreement.
- 3.07 City and County agree to cooperate in developing alternatives to booking of City Prisoners in the Central Booking Facility. If the development of such an alternative may result in a significant reduction of projected bookings of City Prisoners, City and County will enter into renegotiation of this Agreement.
- 3.08 True-Up. The computation of the amounts to be paid by City to County during Term as shown in section 3 above is based upon projected amounts of City Direct Expenses and County Direct Expenses for the Term as included in budget documents and the numbers of prisoners booked in FY 2012 as shown in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Within ninety (90) days after the end of the Term, COUNTY and CITY will exchange information regarding their actual expenditures for each item of expense included City's Direct Expenses and County's Direct Expenses and COUNTY will provide to CITY the actual numbers of prisoners booked during the Term. Using the actual booking numbers and actual expenditures for the Term, the Parties will re-compute the CITY'S Share of Total Central Booking Facility Costs. If the City's Share of Total Central Booking Facility Cost as determined using actual Term booking numbers and expenditures exceeds the total amount of the payments made from CITY to COUNTY during the Term, CITY will make an additional payment to COUNTY in an amount equal to the difference between the total amount paid and the amount to be paid as determined using actual Term booking numbers and expenditures. additional payment shall be made within one hundred fifty 150 days after the end of the Term. If the City's Share of Total Central Booking Facility Cost as determined using Term booking numbers and expenditures is less than the total amount of the payments made by CITY to COUNTY during the Term, COUNTY will make payment to the CITY. Costs and expenses that are not anticipated, disclosed to, and approved by the parties before the effective date of this Agreement and included in the attached cost model will

not be considered properly incurred unless later agreed upon by City and County for the purposes of performing the true up.

4.0 <u>City Use of County Space</u>

- 4.01 County shall allow City the use of designated space within the building at 500 West 10th St. for the provision of magistration services to the Central Booking Facility. This designated space is illustrated by Exhibit B. County shall allow City the use of a suitable designated space for arrest review and report writing. With County approval, City may perform renovations to the arrest review space at its expense. County will provide furnishings and equipment for the arrest review area, magistration courtroom, and magistrate offices. The County will also provide data and phone lines as set out in Exhibit C
- 4.02 County will allow City to use available interview rooms, and the line-up room, that are located within the Central Booking Facility and/or the Travis County Jail.
- 4.03 County will designate two (2) parking spaces for Municipal Court judges within the County's parking garage. County will designate fifteen (15) parking spaces in its San Antonio Street parking garage for use from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. by City Officers who are booking prisoners. City will designate street parking spaces for law enforcement prisoner booking on 10th Street, between Nueces and San Antonio Streets, and on the east curb line of San Antonio Street between 9th and 10th Street.
- 4.04 County and City agree that any future additional space needs by either party will be jointly planned and will be subject to funding by both the City and the County.
- 4.05 County will provide an appropriate space for a Phlebotomist to perform phlebotomy services as needed.

5.0 Maintenance, Utilities and Renovations

- 5.01 Maintenance and housekeeping. County will provide maintenance, housekeeping, utility service and garbage pickup for the space used for magistration and arrest review. County will provide all furnishings within the designated Municipal Court space and shall be responsible for maintenance and replacement of same. Furnishings means all office furniture, office equipment and supplies, and includes but is not limited to word/data processing equipment, desks, chairs, filing cabinets, bookcases, and tables.
- 5.02 Renovations. The City shall make no renovation, alteration or repair to County buildings, fixtures or furnishings without prior authorization from the County's Facilities Management Department.

6.0 Responsibility for Losses

6.01 City and County each acknowledge that the other is self-insured for some losses at the execution of this agreement.

- 6.02 City shall not be liable for any claims, damages and attorney fees arising from the negligent or illegal acts of County employees in relation to the operation of the Central Booking Facility or arising from any condition of the Central Booking Facility that result from County facilities, policies, practices or operations. County shall not be liable for any claims, damages and attorney fees arising from the negligent or illegal acts of City employees in relation to the operation of the Central Booking Facility or arising from any condition or operation of the Central Booking Facility that result from City facilities, policies, practices or operations.
- 6.03 Except as otherwise provided herein, if both County and City are liable for any claims, damages or attorney fees arising from the negligent or illegal acts of City and County employees under this Agreement, City and County shall be liable for the portion of the claims, damages and attorney fees that arise from the negligent or illegal acts of that party as determined by the court adjudicating the matter or as agreed in any settlement.
- 6.04 If any City Officer or employee suffers any loss while on duty, City shall be at risk for the liability for the loss under its workers compensation self-insurance fund. If any County Officer or employee suffers any loss while on duty, County shall be at risk for the liability for the loss under its workers compensation self-insurance fund.
- 6.05 County bears all property losses that result from damages that would be covered by fire and casualty insurance coverage offered by a commercial insurance company. Any insurance proceeds paid to County that relate to damages to the designated Municipal Court space or arrest review space shall be used by County to repair the damages and replace the designated Municipal Court space or arrest review space to its condition before the fire or casualty occurred without regard to fault.

7.0 Operation of the Central Booking Facility

- 7.01 County agrees to operate and maintain the Central Booking Facility in compliance with requirements of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards.
- 7.02 County shall give City Prisoners equal priority with County Prisoners and Prisoners of other governmental entities as to admission and custodial policies of Central Booking Facility.
- 7.03 County shall operate the Central Booking Facility on a twenty-four (24) hour basis, seven (7) days a week. Except as otherwise provided herein, Central Booking Facility staff shall receive, hold and house all City Prisoners tendered to them by City Officers and accepted by the Sheriff.
- 7.04 County and Sheriff have the right to refuse to accept any City Prisoner who is in need of medical attention prior to confinement, any City Prisoner for whom the required booking data has not been completely and accurately furnished in the required format, or any City Prisoner about whom County staff has a reasonable belief that the person is not lawfully being detained. County and Sheriff have the right to reverse the

acceptance of any City Prisoner who is serving time in confinement in lieu of paying a monetary fine after conviction and commitment by a City court if a magistrate has not conducted a hearing on the issue of the indigency of that person and found that person to be financially able to pay the fine. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to require the Sheriff to hold any person in custody contrary to (1) the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, or (2) the Constitution and laws of the United States.

7.05 The City Officer who presents a City Prisoner at the Central Booking Facility will provide complete and accurate information necessary to complete forms required by County for all City Prisoners brought to the Central Booking Facility. County will fingerprint and photograph all Prisoners; provided, however, that County shall not be required to fingerprint and photograph persons who are being booked on misdemeanor charges only and who were fingerprinted and photographed within the preceding one-year period. City will process and file all photographs. City shall classify and file all fingerprints and mug shots. For these purposes the terms "prints" and "photographs" shall include all media, including electronic and digitized media as may be appropriate to maintain optimum efficiency, and as agreed upon by City and County. County will be responsible for providing for its use printers ink, rollers, ink pads, and scanner wipes for the Live Scan System. City will provide fingerprint and palm print cards.

7.06 City and County will maintain a network connectivity link. Except as may be provided in a separate written agreement between the parties, the cost of maintaining the connectivity link and the equipment purchased for that system shall be borne by the party that incurred the expense. County will operate and maintain an identification system that provides electronic images of fingerprints. City shall continue to provide County use of and access to City's digitized mug shot system via a network connection link. City shall provide the equipment necessary to capture, process and transmit digitized mug shot images to the City's database. City shall continue to allow County access to its digitized mug shot database. City shall cooperate with County to facilitate the provision of workstation mapping to allow Central Booking Facility staff to view digitized mug shot images at the Central Booking Facility's release desk.

7.07 City and County shall share information among themselves to facilitate modifications to their reporting requirements, data entry forms, software and hardware of the Central Booking Facility. City and County shall also consult with each other prior to modifying their respective software and hardware, form design, or reporting requirements when these modifications may impact the other's software, hardware, form development or reporting requirements. During design and before final approval of any modification of any form design of shared forms, data elements, reporting requirements, software or hardware used in the Central Booking Facility operations, the party proposing the modifications shall notify the other party in writing of the details of the proposed modifications and allow the other party a reasonable time, considering the size and complexity of the proposed modifications, to review the modifications, evaluate all aspects of the impact of the proposed modifications on that party, and develop suggestions about how to eliminate or minimize any adverse impact and advise the proposing party of the results of the review and evaluation and the suggestions

developed. City and County shall cooperate in both reaching the goals of the proposing party's modifications and minimizing the adverse impact on the other party.

- 7.08 County agrees to provide City Officers access to all Prisoners consistent with their rights guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States of America and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas. County agrees to release Prisoners for investigative purposes to City Officers within limitations imposed by courts and necessary routine Central Booking Facility procedures.
- 7.09 City and County agree to continue using the AP ID number as the "master" person identifier in the local criminal justice process. The Austin Police Department shall provide the AP ID Number to County at the same time the name and fingerprint confirmation are provided. County shall maintain the state mandated Incident Tracking Number (TRN\TRS) and the AP ID Number in the booking record.
- Medical Care. With regard to each person that City officers present for booking, 7.10 City Officers shall notify Central Booking Facility staff of (1) any known or suspected injuries to the person, (2) any known or suspected illnesses of the person, (3) any health complaints made by the person, and (4) any medical treatment given to the person. The Sheriff may refuse to accept a person for booking into the County Jail when, in the judgment of the Sheriff, medical attention is necessary before the person's confinement. If the Sheriff refuses to accept a City Prisoner because the City Prisoner is in need of medical attention prior to confinement, City shall transport the prisoner for hospitalization and/or medical treatment before again presenting the City Prisoner for booking. After a City Prisoner has been accepted by the Sheriff for confinement and booked into the County Jail, County shall provide routine medical attention within the reasonable capabilities of County medical staff on duty in the Central Booking Facility. If a City Prisoner requires hospitalization and/or medical treatment beyond that available from the Central Booking Facility staff, City shall be responsible to pay for such hospitalization and/or treatment, and should any such expense be incurred by County, City shall reimburse County upon request. This Agreement does not create any City liability to third parties for payment of treatment costs of persons taken to a hospital or other treatment provider. Upon request of City, the Sheriff may assign a Sheriff's officer to guard a City Prisoner who has been transported to a hospital by City Officers for medical treatment prior to booking. County shall not be responsible for any costs associated with the hospitalization and/or treatment of any such City Prisoner kept under quard by Sheriff's officers, and should any such expense be incurred by County, City shall reimburse County upon request. City shall not be responsible for any expenses arising from the negligent or illegal acts of County employees.
- 7.11 On any occasions that City Officers who are peace officers want to take custody of a Prisoner for lawful purposes, they shall be permitted to do so if they comply with routine Central Booking Facility procedures. These procedures will necessarily involve a formal assumption of responsibility and liability for the Prisoner.
- 7.12 The County will conduct investigations concerning all grievances and/or complaints filed by Prisoners according to County policy. The County shall investigate all incidents of death or serious bodily injury involving Prisoners in the Central Booking

Facility. The County will cooperate with the City to facilitate joint investigations or separate investigations by the City when it is reasonably likely that City personnel or City interests are involved.

- 7.13 This agreement shall not limit the power of County or the Sheriff to perform booking or detention services for other governmental entities.
- 7.14 If parking is not available within the sallyport for a City officer delivering a City Prisoner to be booked, County officers shall escort the City Prisoner from the sallyport into the Central Booking Facility while the City officer parks his or her vehicle outside the sallyport. As soon as the City officer has parked his or her vehicle, the City officer shall retake custody of the City Prisoner to continue the booking process. The County officer's escort of a City Prisoner from the sallyport as described herein shall not be deemed acceptance of the City Prisoner by the County for the purpose of booking and confinement and County shall retain the right not to accept the City Prisoner as otherwise provided in this Agreement or by law. The purpose of this section is to expedite the Prisoner's entry into the facility, and to prevent Prisoners from being walked into the facility from areas outside the enclosed sallyport.

8.0 <u>Judicial Administration</u>

- 8.01 It is agreed that the City shall provide magistration required at the Central Booking Facility. City and County shall require all persons who perform magistration services to record the exact time at which magistration for each Prisoner is completed. It is also agreed that the City shall provide all support services for the City's magistration duties, including, but not limited to, interpreter services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, both parties to this agreement acknowledge that the Justices of the Peace and other judges and certain other officials retain the powers of their respective offices to provide magistration in the event these services are needed in lieu of magistration by City's Municipal Court Judges. City's magistrates may arraign City Prisoners, and collect fines and costs in appropriate cases for offenses within the jurisdiction of the City of Austin Municipal Court.
- 8.02 City magistrates shall provide magistration services at the Central Booking Facility 24 hours a day, seven days a week, except for one (1) hour break period for each daily shift during which a magistrate will not be available. Courtroom activities shall be given priority by magistrates.
- 8.03 County shall be responsible to provide such access to magistration proceedings by attorneys and members of the public as may be required by law.
- 8.04 Downtown Austin Community Court Arrestees. City shall identify and clearly designate as Downtown Austin Community Court (DACC) Arrestees all persons charged with Class C Misdemeanor offenses committed in the geographical area served by the Downtown Austin Community Court. In accordance with City policies and procedures, City Prisoners who are charged with Class C misdemeanor offenses committed in the geographical area served by the Downtown Austin Community Court (hereinafter referred to as "City DACC arrestees") will not be magistrated at the Central Booking

Facility. The Sheriff will have City DACC arrestees ready for transport upon arrival of City officers on weekdays at 7:30 a.m. City DACC arrestees who are booked into the Central Booking Facility between 9 P.M on Sunday and 8 A.M. on Friday will be detained at the Central Booking Facility for transport by City officers to the Downtown Austin Community Court for magistration. City DACC arrestees who are booked into the Central Booking Facility between 8 A.M. on Friday and 9 P.M. on Sunday will be released to appear at the Downtown Austin Community Court, except that City DACC arrestees who are arrested on capias pro fines will be held for transport to DACC the following business day. This schedule is designed to coincide with the current days and hours of operation of the Downtown Austin Community Court. If the operating days and/or hours of the Downtown Austin Community Court change, the Parties may change the schedule by mutual agreement without the necessity of formal written amendment of this Agreement. City expressly acknowledges and agrees that the detention of City DACC arrestees pending transport by City officers to the Downtown Austin Community Court is pursuant to City policy and City shall be responsible for any liability that results from the policy, unless the liability arises from the negligent or illegal acts of County employees. The Parties expressly acknowledge and agree that the Sheriff retains the right to manage the inmate population at the Central Booking Facility at all times, which includes the right to release City DACC arrestees to appear at the Downtown Austin Community Court as conditions warrant.

8.05 Sheriff staff will collect fines and fees associated with cases within the jurisdiction of the City of Austin Municipal Court for City Prisoners booked into the Central Booking Facility. A Sheriff's staff member and a Municipal Court clerk will reconcile the collections daily. City is responsible for transportation of funds and documentation from the Central Booking Facility to the Municipal Court.

8.06 City and County agree to cooperate in a procedure for the filing of criminal cases into the appropriate court having jurisdiction of the offense. City and County acknowledge that the Municipal Court and its Clerk will not maintain custody of documents filed in cases that are higher than Class C Misdemeanors.

9.0 Pretrial Services

County will continue to provide Pretrial Services at the Central Booking Facility. The Pretrial Services office will not provide coverage for magistration between the hours of 2:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M.

10.0 Breath Testing and Phlebotomy Services

10.01 City shall provide two (2) intoxilyzers for the use of any officer testing persons charged with Driving While Intoxicated or Boating While Intoxicated.

10.02 City shall provide a chemist to maintain and certify the intoxilyzer instruments. This chemist shall be made available to testify in court as required.

10.03 County shall provide one video recording system for the use of any officer testing persons charged with Driving While Intoxicated or Boating While Intoxicated to be

located within the Central Booking Facility. This video system will be serviced and maintained by County. County will provide, at its expense, sufficient videotapes for use by arresting officers.

10.04 Phlebotomy Services

- 1. In order to draw blood samples from certain arrestees, the City will contract with a medical staffing agency to provide phlebotomy services in the County's Central Booking Facility. The City will act as the manager for the administration of the contract, and the County will allocate funding in accordance with the provisions in this Amendment.
- 2. Services will be provided 9PM to 5AM, beginning on Tuesday evenings and going through Sunday mornings. This schedule can be altered upon agreement of both Parties. The Austin Police Department (APD) and the Travis County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) bringing arrestees to the Central Booking Facility during these hours may utilize the contracted phlebotomy services. Other arresting agencies bringing arrestees to the Central Booking Facility may utilize the contracted phlebotomy services under separate MOU's with the City of Austin. However, the APD and TCSO will be given priority if multiple agencies are requesting phlebotomy services at the same time.
- 3. The Parties agree to share the cost of phlebotomy services provided during the hours described in #2 of this Section. The City's share of the cost of phlebotomy services will be based on the City's percentage of bookings utilized in the "True-Up" provision in Section 3.08 of this Agreement and applied to the actual cost of phlebotomy services determined at the end of the fiscal year. The County's share of the cost of phlebotomy services will be based on the percentage of non-City bookings utilized in the "True-Up" provision in Section 3.08 of this Agreement and applied to the actual cost of phlebotomy services during the hours described in #2 of this Section and determined at the end of the fiscal year.
- 4. Only costs incurred during the hours described in #2 of this Section will be shared based on the percentage of actual bookings described in #3 of this Section. Costs associated with blood specimens taken during off peak hours for the APD and TSCO, and costs associated with Contractor staff subpoenaed to court, will be billed by the Contractor to the City and are included in costs described in this Section. However, these costs incurred for TCSO arrestees will be reimbursed 100% by the County to the City.
- 5. The computation of the shared costs, and the costs to be fully reimbursed by the County to the City described in #4 of this Section, will occur during the "True-Up" provision described in Section 3.08 following the close of the fiscal year. The County's payment of its share of the phlebotomy costs will be applied as a credit to the City on the final "True-Up calculation, either reducing the amount the City owes the County, or increasing the amount the County owes the City. City shall provide copies of all fiscal records necessary in performing the "True Up" calculation for County review within 90 days of the close of the fiscal year.
- 6. Included in phlebotomy services are a trained, certified phlebotomist available to take blood samples from certain arrestees during designated hours, and supplies and equipment associated with the taking of blood specimens.

Supplies and equipment may include, but are not limited to: blood draw chair, collections sets, sponge gauze, germicide wipes, Betadine solution, tourniquets, Band-Aids, single use needle holders, surgical masks, medical gloves, and sharps containers.

7. The medical staffing agency contracted by the City will provide all standard insurance associated with phlebotomy services.

11.0 Data Collection/Reporting Requirements and Performance Data.

County agrees to provide to City a quarterly accounting to personnel listed in Section 17.03 of this Agreement:

- 1) the number of persons presented by the City for booking that the Sheriff refuses to accept for medical reasons. The report will contain information on the reasons for refusal, such as an injury or medical reason, without identifying the individual;
- 2) the length of time spent by City officers from the time of arrival at the Central Booking Facility with a City Prisoner until the prisoner is accepted for booking by the County. The reporting will identify the dates and times on which the arrivals and bookings occurred;
- 3) the total number of bookings processed through the Central Booking Facility, detailing those booked by APD, and including charge offense levels and warrants; and
- 4) the total actual cost incurred for booking services during the quarter and fiscal year to date, citing any areas that are exceeding budget and expected to cause the City share to exceed estimated reimbursement.

12.0 Coordinating Committee.

City and County shall each appoint representatives to serve on a Coordinating Committee. The committee will include the following membership:

Presiding Judge of the City of Austin Municipal Court
Clerk of the Municipal Court
City of Austin Municipal Court Magistrate representative
Austin Police Department designates

Travis County County Executive for Justice and Public Safety
Travis County Sheriff's Office - Major of the Corrections Bureau
Travis County Sheriff's Office - Captain of Central Booking Facility
Travis County Sheriff's Office, Lieutenant of Central Booking Facility
Other Travis County Sheriff's Office designates
Travis County Pretrial Services Division Director
Travis County Attorney's Office designate
Representative Defense Attorney

The Coordinating Committee will have an assigned coordinator from the Travis County Sheriff's Office to take meeting minutes, develop meeting agendas, and manage its meetings calendar. The committee shall:

- 12.01 meet at least quarterly to review Central Booking Facility operations and issues;
- 12.02 review and recommend any revisions to City and County procedures related to the operation of the central booking facility;
- 12.03 monitor performance measures and periodically provide status reports to the Commissioners Court and to the City Council;
- 12.04 recommend interlocal revisions to Commissioners Court and City Council, if necessary.

13.0 Records

City and County agree to allow access to and mutual inspection of any and all records relevant to the Central Booking Facility, excluding City and County internal memoranda and files otherwise exempted by law from public disclosure.

14.0 Breach

The failure of either party to comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement shall constitute a breach of this agreement.

15.0 Waiver

The waiver by either party of a breach of this agreement shall not constitute a continuing waiver of such breach or of a subsequent breach of the same or a different provision, unless so stipulated by the party not in breach of this agreement.

16.0 Texas Law to Apply

This agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Travis County, Texas.

17.0 Notice

17.01 All notices sent pursuant to this interlocal agreement shall be in writing and may be hand delivered, or sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested.

17.02 Notices sent to County pursuant to this interlocal agreement shall be delivered or sent to:

- 17.04 When notices sent are hand delivered, notice shall be deemed effective upon delivery. When notices are mailed by registered or certified mail, notice shall be deemed effective three (3) days after deposit in a U.S. mail box or at a U.S. post office.
- 17.05 Either party may change its address for notice under this Interlocal Agreement by providing a notice of the change in compliance with this paragraph to all other parties.

18.0 Current Revenue

19.01 The City shall pay for services rendered by the County, pursuant to this interlocal agreement, from current revenue funds.

19.0 <u>Legal Construction, Severability</u>

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provisions had never been contained herein.

20.0 Entire Agreement

20.01 Except as provided in Section 1.0, this agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and contains all of the covenants and agreements between the parties, with respect to said matter. Each party to this agreement acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises, agreements, oral or otherwise, have been made by any party or anyone acting on behalf of any party which is not embodied herein and that no other agreements, statement, or promise not contained in this agreement shall be valid or binding. No modification concerning this instrument shall be of any force or effect, excepting a subsequent amendment in writing signed by the parties. No official, representative, agent or employee of County, has any authority to modify this agreement except pursuant to express authority to do so granted by the Commissioners Court of Travis County.

20.02 The following exhibits are part of this contract, and constitute promised performances of the parties to this agreement:

21.0 Parties Bound

This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties to it and their respective legal representatives, successors and assigns where permitted by this Agreement. Each party confirms that its respective governing body has duly authorized this Agreement.

22.0 No Conferring of Third Party Rights

Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to confer upon any person, other than the parties hereto, any benefits, rights, or remedies under or by reason of this Agreement.

23.0 Gender and Number

Words of gender used in this agreement shall be held and construed to include any other gender and words in the singular number shall be held to include the plural and vice versa unless this agreement requires otherwise.



(ACC) Internship Program for the Fall Semester by Four Departments

The FY 13 Adopted Budget includes an earmark against the Allocated Reserve to assist departments that are unable to internally fund the cost of participating in the ACC Internship Program. The internship program pays selected ACC students \$12 per hour for 20 hours per week for 16 weeks. The estimated cost for three interns is \$12,426. This cost is split with \$4,038 of the cost falling to the FY 13 budget and \$8,388 of the cost falling to the FY 14 budget because the 16 week internship begins on August 26th and ends December 13th. The remaining earmark against the FY 13 Allocated Reserve is \$14,497.

Reclassify Position # 30000550

Facilities Management Department (FMD) requests approval for a new Office Assistant position, grade 10 (entry level is \$24,681). Permanent funding is available from within existing FMD personnel accounts to cover the cost of the position. Recently a senior staff member retired. Funding for this vacated position is \$96,592. This position is temporarily occupied by a full time employee that will be in the department for up to 90 days. Salary for this employee is \$53,440, a delta of \$43,152. Upon departure of the employee temporarily occupying position # 30000550, FMD intends to request reclassification of this position from a Senior Project Manager, grade 26 down to a Project Manager, grade 24, at the entry level of \$63,638. This reclassification would result in ongoing savings of \$32.954, which would more than fully fund the requested Office Assistant position without any additional resources being required.

At the current time, the FMD Maintenance and Repair Division is supported by one Office Specialist (service call desk). The Office Specialist is fully occupied with processing work requests/work order and coordinating the dispatch of service technicians. There is not an available staff person to assist the division with basic office duties such as stocking printers/copiers, processing incoming/outgoing mail, making deliveries and serving as the receptionist for visitors to the Maintenance and Repair Division. The lack of this basic administrative support results in these duties being picked up by senior staff members, diverting their available work hours from their critical job functions.

Office space for this new Office Assistant is available at the third floor of the University Savings Building. Necessary furniture, phone lines and computer support is also available or will be procured from departmental resources. This request is fully funded by FMD, no additional resources are being requested, except for authorization of the new full time position.

PBO Recommendation:

Health and Human Services and Veterans Service is requesting Commissioners Court approval of a grant amendment for the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA).

On May 28th, Commissioners Court approved a grant supplement to Travis County that represented unspent 2012 CEAP grant funds. This amendment to the supplement funds finalizes the movement of \$127,730 from the Assurance 16 component to the direct services Utility Assistance component of the grant budget. This request has already been approved by TDHCA.

There are no indirect costs associated with this grant, no County match is required and no there is no commitment by the Court to fund services if funds are discontinued.

PBO recommends approval of this request.

1. Brief Narrative - Summary of Grant: What is the goal of the program? How does the grant fit into the current activities of the department? Is the grant starting a new program, or is it enhancing an existing one?

The program assists low-income households with heating and cooling energy utility assistance with priority given in no particular order to elderly, persons with disabilities, households with a child 5 years of age or under, households with high energy burden and households with high energy consumption. This program funding helps in meeting the department's goal of achieving energy self-sufficiency for low-income families and individuals within Travis County. The CEAP program guidelines allow assistance for those households seeking utility assistance to address a crisis situation relating to household energy bills. The type of assistance may be to address the crisis energy situation or a multiple payment term of assistance may be used.

This contract amendment 1 was requested by the department to move the funds budgeted in the Assurance 16 component (\$127,730) to the direct services Utility Assistance component to ensure full utilization of the grant award. TDHCA approved the department's request with this contract amendment.

The additional \$127,730 in direct services will assist approximately an additional 448 eligible households with utility assistance following the program guidelines.

Proposed Motion: Consider and take appropriate action to approve the contract #58120001710 amendment 1 with Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) for the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program Grant in 2013.

Summary and Staff Recommendation: Staff requests the acceptance of this contract #58120001710 amendment 1 from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. The grant funding will be \$1,263,589. The department requested TDHCA to transfer the budgeted allocation of the Assurance 16 category (\$127,730) to the direct services category -Utility Assistance. This request will ensure full utilization of the grant award. approved the budget request with this contract amendment.

The CEAP grant funds will be used to respond to requests for utility assistance from County residents who have a household income level at or below 125% of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines and who are unable to meet their household energy needs.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact: We will be able to use the CEAP funds for direct services, and administration. The funds for direct services are budgeted in the corresponding indigent utility assistance GL accounts. No matching funds are required. The contract period is 04/01/13 through 07/31/13. All CEAP expenses that occur during this time period will use this funding allocation until these funds are exhausted or the end of the period. Essentially suspending the 2013 CEAP grant contract expenses until August 1, 2013.

Background: The Health and Human Services & Veterans Service department has provided the CEAP program and its great value to the community for the past eighteen years. The department coordinates its efforts with other community resources such as faith-based organizations and local agencies providing services to low-income residents of Travis County to ensure residents will attain the assistance they are seeking.

In the current grant period for the CEAP grant, the department has assisted over 2,382 households within Travis County. The operation of this grant allows our department the ability to provide assistance to clients who are experiencing an energy-related hardship. The aim of such services, to assist clients in obtaining self-sufficiency, is consistent with the goal of the Travis County Health and Human Services and Veterans Service department.

It should be noted that this is the eighteenth year that the CEAP contract and amendments have been electronically made available to Travis County. Therefore, in addition to the Commissioners Court authorizing Judge Biscoe to sign the hard copy of the contract amendment, it is also necessary for the Judge to authorize the County Purchasing Agent to sign off on the electronically transmitted contract amendment 1.

PBO Recommendation:

Health and Human Services and Veterans Service is requesting Commissioners Court approval of a grant amendment for a Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program grant from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA). This would increase the grant award by \$261,110.

This action will amend the grant budget from \$2,637,219 to \$2,898,329. The additional funds will allow the department to continue to assist low-income households with heating and cooling energy utility assistance. There are no indirect costs associated with this grant, no County match is required and no there is no commitment by the Court to fund services if funds are discontinued.

PBO recommends approval of this request.

1. Brief Narrative - Summary of Grant: What is the goal of the program? How does the grant fit into the current activities of the department? Is the grant starting a new program, or is it enhancing an existing one?

The program assists low-income households with heating and cooling energy utility assistance with priority given in no particular order to elderly, persons with disabilities, households with a child 5 years of age or under, households with high energy burden and households with high energy consumption. This program funding helps in meeting the department's goal of achieving energy self-sufficiency for low-income families and individuals within Travis County. The CEAP program guidelines allow assistance for those households seeking utility assistance to address a crisis situation relating to household energy bills. The type of assistance may be to address the crisis energy situation or a multiple payment term of assistance may be used.

The department utilizes funding from the CEAP program for providing clients with case management services to address other household issues other than those encompassing energy needs.

This contract amendment 1 is adding an additional \$261,110 in funding to the grant award bringing the total award for this grant to \$2,898,329. The department anticipates this will serve approximately 673 more eligible households in Travis County.

Proposed Motion: Consider and take appropriate action to approve the contract amendment 1 with Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) for the Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program Grant for 2013.

Summary and Staff Recommendation: Staff requests the acceptance of this contract amendment 1 from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. This contract amendment increases the grant award by \$261,110 bringing the funding level to \$2,898,329. The department anticipates with this additional funding there will be approximately 673 more eligible households within Travis County assisted.

The CEAP grant funds are used to respond to requests for utility assistance from County residents who have a household income level at or below 125% of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines and who are unable to meet their household energy needs.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact: We are able to use the CEAP funds for direct services, administration, and case management services. The funds for direct services will be budgeted in the corresponding indigent utility assistance GL accounts. No matching funds are required. The contract period is 01/01/13 through 12/31/13.

Background: The Health and Human Services & Veterans Service department has provided the CEAP program and its great value to the community for the past eighteen years. The department coordinates its efforts with other community resources such as faith-based organizations and local agencies providing services to low-income residents of Travis County to ensure residents will attain the assistance they are seeking.

Within the past year for this program, the department assisted more than 2,382 households within Travis County. The operation of this grant allows our department the ability to provide assistance to clients who are experiencing an energy-related hardship, and provide case management services to clients. The aim of such services, to assist clients in obtaining self-sufficiency, is consistent with the goal of the Travis County Health and Human Services and Veterans Service department.

It should be noted that this is the eighteenth year that the CEAP contract amendments have been electronically made available to Travis County. Therefore, in addition to the Commissioners Court authorizing Judge Biscoe to sign the hard copy of the contract amendment, it is also necessary for the Judge to authorize the County Purchasing Agent to sign off on the electronically transmitted contract amendment 1.

PBO Recommendation:

This grant contract will continue funding AmeriCorps members working in the Travis County 4-H CAPITAL after-school programs throughout the county. About 1% of the grant funds go to the One Star Foundation, a quasi-state organization that serves to pass-through the federal funds from the Corporation for National and Community Service. During FY 13, the budget for this program was moved to a special fund, Fund 0149, at the request of the grantor. This fund has been budgeted in the FY 14 Preliminary Budget.

PBO recommends approval of this grant contract.

1. Brief Narrative - Summary of Grant: What is the goal of the program? How does the grant fit into the current activities of the department? Is the grant starting a new program, or is it enhancing an existing one?

Travis County 4-H CAPITAL uses the AmeriCorps members to expand its after-school programs.

(Grant Funds: The amount of grant funds listed on the Notice of Grant Award (NOGA) is \$301,696. Of this total, \$298,671 goes to Travis County and \$3,025 goes to the OneStar Foundation for administration. Only the grant funds going to Travis County are included in the total shown above.)

(County Cost Share: Funding for the \$375,876 in Personnel is coming from keeping four slots vacant in the AgriLife Extension General Fund budget (\$174,399), while the remaining \$201,477 is coming from fee-for-service contracts between Travis County and the schools hosting after-school programs. Funding for the \$51,691 in Operating expenses is coming from the AgriLife General Fund budget (\$6,659) and from the fee-for-service contracts (\$45,032). The grant instructions allow Travis County to claim 10% of the total of the Grant Funds and County Cost Share for Personnel and Operating expenses as an Indirect Cost match.)

There are no county funding requirements once the grant ends. There is a match required while the grant is in progress.

The grant allows for a 4% indirect cost allocation for the county and 1% for the OneStar Foundation. TCHHSVS has not claimed its 4% allocation because this would increase the cost per member service year. Therefore, TCHHSVS requests permission to not claim an indirect cost amount for FY'14 but explore the possibility of including some indirect costs in the future.

Consider and take appropriate action to approve a \$301,696 grant from the Corporation for National and Community Service through the OneStar Foundation to fund the Travis County CAPITAL AmeriCorps Project in FY'14.

Summary and Staff Recommendations:

The grant will help fund 16 full-time and 16 half-time AmeriCorps members who will provide after-school enrichment programs each week during the school year. These programs focus on science and technology, environmental education, outdoor education, and life skills. Travis County staff will provide program coordination and support for the day-to-day activities of the AmeriCorps members.

TCHHSVS staff recommends approving this grant.

Budgetary and Fiscal Impact:

The \$301,696 grant requires a match totaling \$500,191. This match will come from 4-H CAPITAL and TCHHSVS. The grant is revenue neutral. It will not increase the General Fund budget. The FY'14 grant will run from 8/1/13 – 7/31/14.

Issues and Opportunities:

Studies show that students who participate in after-school programs have fewer behavior problems, handle conflict better, show improved social skills and enhanced academic performance. AmeriCorps members provide much needed staff to increase the number of after-school programs in Travis County. Travis County 4-H CAPITAL programs differ from more traditional programs by offering hands-on activities that reinforce key concepts in the curriculum.

The Travis County CAPITAL AmeriCorps Project has been in existence since 2003. It has served more than 16,000 youth to date.



Truth-in-Taxation Requirements State law requires that local taxing jurisdictions make taxpayers aware of tax rate proposals. The Texas Constitution sets out the general requirements for truth-intaxation and the Tax Code provides the specific requirements. A taxing unit must publish its effective and rollback tax rates before adopting an actual tax rate. Currently, the Travis County Tax Assessor-Collector coordinates publication of this advertisement for all local taxing entities. The advertisement ran in the Austin American Statesman on August 17th. A taxing unit must also publish special notices and hold two public hearings before adopting a tax rate that exceeds the lower of the rollback rate or the effective rate.

Tax Rate in Preliminary Budget The Commissioners Court provided policy direction in February 2013 that the tax rate used to develop the Fiscal Year 2014 Preliminary Budget be "at or near" the effective tax rate. The Court provided further policy guidance that a tax rate within 3% of the effective tax rate is considered "near" for purposes of developing the Preliminary Budget. The underlying rationale that drives this policy is based on the premise that modest growth in the tax rate over time is the best approach to respond to the increasing cost of delivering services. Revenue realized from the effective tax rate is often not sufficient to keep pace with rising costs. Consistent with this policy direction, the Preliminary Budget was submitted to the Commissioners Court on July 22nd, and reflected a tax rate of 49.46 cents per \$100 of taxable value. The tax rate was based on estimates provided by the Travis Central Appraisal District of what the tax roll was expected to be when certified. The Chief Appraiser has since certified the 2013 appraised values and while the 2013 total value has changed slightly, it did not result in a different effective tax rate or proposed tax rate.

Setting the Proposed Tax Rate, Public Notices and Public Hearings The vote to set the proposed tax rate that the Commissioners Court will be asked to consider during the budget mark-up process must occur by noon on Thursday, September 5th, which is the second day of the budget mark-up process. After proposing a tax rate increase and scheduling two public hearings, the governing body must notify the public of the dates, times and places for these hearings, and provide information about the proposed tax rate at least seven days before the public hearings. Public hearings on the proposed tax rate are planned for 9 am on Tuesday, September 17th and 9 am on Friday, September 20th. In addition, Travis County will hold a public hearing on the proposed Fiscal Year 2014 budget on September 24th.

Estimated Annual Tax Bill Impact The following table depicts the impact on the annual tax bill in Fiscal Year 2013 and 2014 for a Travis County resident owning an average-valued or a median-valued home. The taxable values shown in the table reflect the 20% homestead exemption that we provide to our qualifying residents. While we are required to show the average taxable homestead value of \$222,431 and average tax bill of \$1,100 in our public notices, we have included information on median homestead values for your review.

The average taxable homestead value will increase from \$214,567 in 2013 to \$222,431 in Fiscal Year 2014 based on information from the Travis Central Appraisal District. Applying the proposed tax rate, which is no more than 3% above the effective tax rate, the average of all Travis County homesteads will see a modest increase in the annual County tax bill of approximately \$27, which is an increase of about \$2 per month. These figures reflect the taxable value required by law for the public notices. The increase in the annual tax bill on the median taxable value is approximately \$20, or about \$1.70 per month.

STAR Flight Fees for FY 2014

As a part of the annual budget process, the County Executive, Emergency Services has recommended increases to the *STAR Flight* Helicopter fees and the Ground Ambulance - Critical Care (Specialty) Fees as outlined in the attached memorandum.

STAR Flight is proposing to increase helicopter fees as follows:

The Travis County resident Lift Off fee would rise from \$3,400 to \$3,900, with a loaded mileage fee (loaded mileage is a one-way charge when a patient is in the helicopter in transport) increase from \$85 to \$105. The Non-Travis County Lift Off fee would rise from \$7,500 to \$8,700. The Non-Travis county residents would pay \$4,800 more on the Lift Off fee than the Travis County residents.

STAR Flight in their proposal indicates the following:

The fee increases are based on increased ongoing operating and maintenance costs increases from FY 11 Adopted through the FY 14 Preliminary of \$504,665, primarily related to the following:

- Personnel cost increases of \$271,828 related to the market salary adjustments of \$154,132 that
 were implemented in April 2012 and STAR Flight Medical Director funding of \$91,000 shifted
 from the EMS Interlocal in 2012.
- Helicopter and related equipment repairs of \$101,415,
- \$81,000 for contract billing costs, and
- \$55,597 for an increase in fuel costs.

Additionally, in the FY 14 Preliminary Budget there are estimated one-time costs for helicopter maintenance of \$283,379.

The current resident Lift-Off fee is below the Medicare allowable reimbursement rate and should be increased to achieve maximum reimbursement in some portions of Travis County and Out-of-County areas.

Medicare determines reimbursement by zip code. Each zip code is classified as Urban, Suburban,
 Rural and Frontier with higher reimbursements as you move from Urban to Frontier. Currently,
 the Travis County contract billing company (Intermedix) has stated that they see some patients in

the outlying areas of Travis County that may be under the Medicare allowable in the Rural and Frontier zip code classifications.

In FY 12, a total of 40, or 7.0% of all 569 flights were related to Medicare payments of \$134,693, or 5.3% all payments of \$2,527,662. The flights below the Medicare allowable reimbursement rate in Travis County are a subset of the 40 flights billed at \$134,693. Based on information from Intermedix, there were lost recovery opportunities of approximately \$29,000 per year related to the Medicare allowable reimbursement rate.

• Further, if **STAR** Flight picks up a Travis County resident in Burnet or Llano County then **STAR** Flight may be under the allowable for that flight at this time.

The recommended fees would still be competitive within the air medical industry based on information from the Travis County billing company (Intermedix), patients and County residents served by other air medical providers.

STAR Flight fees have not been increased since 2010.

The following schedule provides a summary of Travis County Lift Off fees since FY 2001.

The Ground Ambulance-Critical Care (Specialty) service has not been used to transport a patient since 2010. This service was almost needed twice this year and these rates are requested for adjustment in the event it may be used.

The Planning and Budget Office supports this requested increase to the STAR Flight fees.

Due to data confidentiality issues as well as the uncertainty surrounding the timing and amount of payments, PBO does not expect any material revenue increase to be included in the Fifth Revenue Estimate. Emergency Services and the **STAR** Flight management team have completed a review of our current fee structure. We recommend to the Commissioners Court that the following increases be approved:

STAR Flight Helicopter

Lift Off Fee

Travis County resident fee from \$3,400 to \$3,900

Non Travis County lift-off fee from \$7,500 to \$8,700

Mileage Fee (Loaded/One Way) \$85 to \$105

STAR Flight Ground Ambulance- Critical Care (Speciality)

Base Fee \$990 to \$1,500

Mileage Fee \$12.50 to \$15.00

The fee increases are based upon increased cost (salaries, fuel, operations) and address increased maintenance costs along with reduced reimbursements and settlements that are occurring as a result of tough economic times. The uninsured also impacts the total cost of the services since little reimbursement is achieved.

In addition, there are some areas of Travis County and areas of out-of-county that the current resident lift-off fee is below the Medicare allowable and should be increased to achieve maximum reimbursement.

See Attachment A for a complete history of fee increases in prior years.

The recommended fees are still very competitive within the air medical industry, especially when you consider the capability and safety equipment of the **STAR** Flight aircraft and personnel.

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Travis County has not increased STAR Flight fees since 2010.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND ATTACHMENTS:

The Fiscal Year 2014 Preliminary Budget includes a Security Reserve of \$1,737,515, which includes sufficient funding for Category A recommendations from the Kroll Report, items recommended by the Security Committee, and a third party assessment of the Heman Marion Sweatt Courthouse.

Background on the Kroll Report

In January 2013, a Purchase Order was issued to Kroll Advisory Solutions to provide an independent review of the physical security at the Travis

County North Campus located on Airport Boulevard. Primary stakeholders who reside at the North Campus include:

County Clerk's Office
Tax Assessor Collector's Office
Counseling and Education Services
Records Management and Communication Resources
District Clerk's Office
Emergency Services Division
Employee Wellness and Health Clinic
Sheriff's Office – Ruiz Building

The team of experts from Kroll attended meetings on-site to ascertain from each tenant their particular concerns related to the physical security for their individual offices and the site in general. In addition, the Kroll team made unannounced on-site visits to observe security procedures that are currently in place at the site, attempted to breach or bypass the various measures and protocols at the site, and visited the site in the evening to observe the security for the site after business hours. The results of Kroll's findings have been documented in a detailed report that was presented to the Commissioners Court on May 28, 2013.

Kroll included in their report a series of recommendations for each department and for the general campus grounds that were prioritized under Categories A, B, or C. In the May 28, 2013 presentation, recommendations in Category A were discussed by the Commissioners Court. These recommendations address security vulnerabilities that the consultant believes need priority attention in order to meet best practices. At the July 9, 2013 meeting, the Commissioners Court received information on the various options for providing the recommended level of security staffing for the Airport Boulevard campus. The options included security provided by Constables versus security provided by a private security company. The cost of Category A recommendations, including the continued use of Constables for extended coverage at the site, is \$950,722. This funding is included in the Security Reserve.

Background on other Security Items

As a part of the annual budget process, the Planning & Budget Office forwards departmental requests to fund security related matters to the Travis County Security Committee for consideration. The Security Committee met on June 27, 2013 to discuss the submitted requests and

develop recommendations for the Commissioners Court to consider for funding in the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget. The Fiscal Year 2014 Preliminary Budget includes \$786,793 in reserve to fund requests considered by the Security Committee.

Included in this amount is \$331,692 to fund four FTEs in the Travis County Sheriff's Office to provide additional coverage at the Juvenile Justice Complex. This request was made by Juvenile Probation and supported by the Sheriff's Office. Based on direction from the Commissioners Court, the Planning and Budget Office revisited the request with Juvenile Probation. Juvenile Probation has revised the request to \$39,780 for Fiscal Year 2014 for additional contracted armed guard services. Juvenile Probation may revisit the request for additional officers as a part of the 2015 budget process. This change would result in \$291,912 in savings in the reserve that could be reallocated for other needs should the revised request be approved by the Commissioners Court.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

As a follow-up to the July 9, 2013 and July 23, 2013 presentations, staff recommends to the Commissioners Court the following:

- 1. Accept the Kroll report.
- 2. Approve a position of Security Director or Manager and allocate funding from reserves to begin the hiring process.
- 3. Decide under which department the Security Director or Manager will be housed.
- 4. Decide on which option to choose for providing the recommended level of security staffing for the Airport Blvd. campus (e.g. private vs. Constables).
- 5. Approve itemized list of Category A recommendations from the Kroll report.
- 6. Approve items recommended by the Security Committee and the Planning and Budget Office, including the revised request from Juvenile Probation.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

The options provided to the Commissioners Court for consideration include security services at the County's North Campus that could be provided by Constables, or by a private security company at a lower estimated cost.

FISCAL IMPACT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

The fiscal impacts of funding these recommendations (specifically Category A recommendations and items considered by the Security Committee), are included in the Security Reserve in the Fiscal Year 2014 Preliminary Budget.

On March 27, 2012, the Commissioners Court approved Modification No. Two to the property management service agreement with Sentinel Lavaca Management Corporation (Sentinel). This occurred following the receipt of a letter from Sentinel dated January 4, 2012 (Attachment One) offering to provide property management services for additional timeframes. Under this modification (Attachment Two), the County approved for Sentinel to continue providing the property management services for the 700 Lavaca building through September 30, 2013. Also included in this Modification No. Two was the establishment of three twelve month extension options, with the monthly fee being reduced by \$1,000 per month in each option year. - ➤ IFB No.: B1305-010-JE, Travis County Jail (TCJ) Extended Life Project Phase II, was issued on June 12, 2013 for the replacement of the primary exhaust system for the Travis County Jail, the kitchen exhaust system, isolation cell exhaust system, installation of roof mounted ventilators, and electrical modifications for the new Control system, located at 500 West 10th Street, Austin, Texas 78701.
- ➤ Of the eighty-eight (88) bids either downloaded or viewed via Travis County's third party e-procurement vendor system, BidSync, only one (1) bid was received in response to this solicitation when subject IFB was opened on July 24, 2013 at 2:00 P.M., CST. The sole bid from Forsythe Brothers Infrastructure, LLC with a bid amount of \$1,480,000.00 was found to be significantly higher than the estimated amount prepared by the Engineer of Record which was also verified by the TCSO Engineer.
- One vendor who attended the Pre-Bid but did not respond and five (5) others that viewed the solicitation online, were contacted by the Purchasing Office inquiring as to why they did not bid on the project. One bidder indicated that they did not prepare enough time to respond; three indicated that they could not fulfill the required work and two indicated they did not respond due to current workload.

➤ The Travis County Sheriff's Office recommends rejecting the sole bid. The bid received, if accepted, would increase the expenditures for the service nearly \$500,000.00 above the current estimate. The Travis County Sheriff's Office recommends re-bid at this time.

With this enhancement, we will be able to replace many of our manual procedures and instead, immediately and electronically send the UOCAVA (Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act) voter an email with a link to an individualized web page. This page will contain a uniquely serialized ballot specific to the voter (in accordance with Texas Election Code Chapter 52) along with instructions and attachments for the return of the voted ballot. Private portals and digital signatures will ensure that his/her ballot is safely delivered and his/her anonymity protected. The voter will then be able to print and vote the ballot and return it by mail to the County.

The Travis County Clerk Elections Division recommends moving forward with this enhancement. The cost for the modification is \$19,950. Funds are available in FY13 Funds Reservation 30000676, Commitment Item 510310.

RFP No. 1305-002-CW was issued on May 31, 2013. A total of fifty-four (54) vendors were solicited and four (4) proposals were received. After the evaluation process and receipt of the Best and Final Offers, the evaluation committee and Travis County HRMD recommends contract award to the highest ranked Proposer. Based on the total score, the evaluation committee and Travis County HRMD recommends contract award to Total Administration Services Corporation d/b/a TASC.

This contract will provide for the Administration of the FSA and QTB Accounts for Travis County and its eligible employees who enroll for these services.

Travis County has established a Flexible Benefit Plan within the meaning of Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 called T-Flex. The T-Flex Plan allows employees to choose child care and medical care coverage. A Medical Expense FSA is used to pay for eligible medical expenses which aren't covered by your insurance or other plan with pre-tax dollars. The Dependent Care FSA can pay for eligible dependent care expenses such as after school care, baby-sitting fees, daycare services, nursery and preschool with pre-tax dollars.

Travis County has also established a qualified transportation benefits pursuant to Internal Revenue Code section 132 (QTB). The QTB



The Records Management and Preservation Fund, outlined in Section 118.0216 of the Texas Local Government Code, is for, "the records management and preservation services performed by the county clerk after the filing and recording of a document in the records of the office of the clerk." This section also states, "the county clerk shall prepare an annual written plan for funding the automation projects and records management and preservation services performed by the clerk."

The County Clerk's Records Archive Fund, outlined in 118.025 of the Local Government Code, states that the fee for "Records Archive" under Section 118.011(f) is for, "the preservation and restoration services performed by the county clerk in connection with maintaining a county clerk's records archive." This section states, "the county clerk shall prepare an annual written plan for funding the preservation and restoration of the county clerk's records archive."

This document serves as the written plan for both of these funds.

Long Term Plan for the Use of these Funds

The Travis County Clerk's library of permanent real property records dates prior to 1836 and contains over 30,000,000 pages of documents. There are three important categories of these documents:

April 1999 – present	Documents are electronically imaged and have a computerized
	index.
1987 – 1999	Documents are microfilmed and have a computerized index.
1836 – 1987	Documents are microfilmed and have microfilmed copies of
	handwritten indexes.

Our primary goals are to use these funds to:

 Provide and maintain systems for managing the receiving, filing, storage, retrieval, and public access of records in the Clerk's Office

This includes projects to acquire, implement, manage, update, and replace systems that handle paper, microfilm, and electronic records.

• Improve public access to County Clerk records

This enhances the public's ability to locate the records they are seeking by building advanced databases and improving internet access to information.

 Provide appropriate physical and electronic storage sites for libraries with the ability to retrieve information as needed

This includes maintaining physical storage sites for paper, microfilm, and electronic medium as well as electronic storage of data and back-up systems.

 Reduce the use of paper documents filed in our Recording, Civil/Probate, and Misdemeanor Divisions

This is accomplished by improving our ability to electronically accept newly filed documents and convert existing paper and microfilm records to electronic records.

 Remove personal identifiers from documents before they are made available on the internet

Redaction of certain personal information such as Social Security and bank account numbers is done to help protect individuals from identity theft.

- Digitize existing County Clerk records and redact personal identifiers
 Digitizing paper and microfilm records increases protection of documents from disaster, dramatically increases the ability to track and locate documents, provides a clearer more readable image of documents, and greatly improves efficiency for the retrieval of documents by the public.
- Make certain that appropriate disaster recovery and business resumption systems are in place

Ensuring that a detailed structure is in place to prevent loss of these records in the event of a disaster is directly associated with protecting the archive and therefore, related to the primary intent of this legislation.

- Apply special preservation methods to documents of significant historic value Modern preservation techniques should be applied to paper documents that merit special consideration, such as Sam Houston's will.
- Support personnel necessary to support these goals.

This allows us to provide salaries, benefits, training, space, and equipment for individuals charged with managing these priorities.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND ATTACHMENTS:

As part of our FY13 ad hoc reclassification request, we requested Position 30000982 (currently vacant) be reclassified from a Ct Srvs Mgmt Coord to the new job title of Court Services Director. This request is being submitted separately from the other reclassification requests that have already been approved by Court because this position required the development of a new job description.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Clerk's Office has been working with HRMD and PBO on this reclassification effort.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

This position will manage activities in both the Civil/Probate and Misdemeanor Records Court Divisions of the County Clerk's office within a complex court system. This position is essential because of the need to prepare and manage the simultaneous implementation of the:

- 1. New document management system (DMS) for Clerk's records in misdemeanor, civil and probate courts,
- 2. New efiling system mandated by the Texas Supreme Court and the Office of Court Administration, and
- New Conference of Urban Counties (CUC) project to implement a case management system (CMS) for criminal courts and clerks' offices and to review options for a CMS for civil and probate courts and clerks' offices.

These projects are large scale, require extensive organization across multiple divisions, and will include contract/project management most likely in more than one facility.
