Agenda Language: Approve Modification No. 1 to Interlocal Agreement No. 4500000109, Texas Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services, for Communication Services.

Purchasing Recommendation and Comments: Purchasing concurs with department and recommends approval of requested action. This procurement action meets the compliance requirements as outlined by the statutes.

Through this Interlocal Agreement, the Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services (DARS) will contract with Travis County Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (TCSDHH) to provide communication services for clients of Texas State Agencies. The Agencies include: Texas Workforce Commission, Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, Attorney General, Health and Human Services Commission, and the Texas Department of State Health Services.

Modification No. 1 will renew the Interlocal agreement for a period of one year effective September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014. The agreement may be renewed upon mutual agreement under the same terms and conditions for two additional one year renewal periods. TCSDHH estimates the modification will provide \$42,000 in revenue during FY14.

DARS is contracting communication services from TCSDHH, which is why the original Interlocal Agreement and Modification No. 1 were created by the DARS Agency. Travis County will sign the modification first and return to DARS for final execution.

Amendment No. 1 of Contract Between Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services and <u>Travis County through</u> <u>Travis County Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing</u>

It is mutually understood and agreed by and between the undersigned parties of the above numbered Contract to amend the said contract as follows:

1. Amend Contract Terms to read:

This amendment is effective on the signature of both parties through August 31, 2014.

This contract may be renewed upon mutual agreement under the same terms and conditions for two (2) additional one-year renewal periods.

2. Replace VII SCOPE OF WORK (C) in its entirety with the following:

C. Request funds by month by state agency. Funds not approved in advance and have not received approval of funds by DHHS before services are provided are not guaranteed to be approved and services are not guaranteed to be reimbursed. Funds shall be requested using the online DHHS Contract Reporting application. Contractor must have internet access (link, user identification and password will be provided to contractor). Funds requested in less than 1 month in advance are not guaranteed to be approved prior to service need.

3. Replace VIII. State Agencies Contracting with DARS-DHHS, 2. Communication Services for the Department of State Health Services-Substance Abuse (DSHS-SA), 2.3 in its entirety with the following:

2.3 Contractor shall not provide services without a DSHS-SA-approved communication access service request form in which the request has been approved by the DSHS Contract Manager. Contractor shall not provide services for any changes made to the request unless the changes have been approved by the DSHS Contract Manager. Contractor shall submit an approved DSHS Contract Manager approved request form and any DSHS Contract Manager approved changes for services billed along with the monthly invoice. Contractor will not be reimbursed for services if a DSHS-SA-approved form is not provided and if services provided were not approved by the DSHS Contract Manager.

4. Replace VIII. State Agencies Contracting with DARS-DHHS, 3. Communication Services for the Department of State Health Services-Health Services (DSHS-HS),.3 in its entirety with the following:

- 3.3 Contract shall provide the following along with the monthly invoice for services provided:
 - Name of Clinic served including Local agency and site numbers
 - Parent/Guardian name, date of birth and PAN number;
 - Participant Name, date of birth and PAN number.

5. Replace VIII. State Agencies Contracting with DARS-DHHS, 4. Communication Services for the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) in its entirety with the following:

- 4.1 Contractor shall provide communication access services to employees and consumers of OAG.
- 4.2 Contractor shall provide certified interpreters for all assignments.
- 4.3 Contractor shall notify the OAG Child Support contact that has requested Services of any cancellation by Contractor no later than twenty-four hours (24) prior to the scheduled Services.
- 4.4 Contractor shall ensure that any individual providing services under this contract, shall: (1) not be left alone with any OAG employees or representatives or any other person associated with the event at which the individual is providing services under this contract; and, (2) ensure that an adult who has gone through and is current with the full OAG background check process be physically present in the immediate area at all times such individual is providing services to or otherwise has contact or access to any OAG employees or representatives or any other person associated with the event at which the individual is providing services under this contract.
- 4.5 Contractor shall prevent or promptly remove any individual providing services under this contract from (i) direct contact with any OAG employee or representative or any other person associated with the event at which the individual is providing services under this contract and (ii) from access to records related to such event, if such individual providing services under this contract is alleged to have committed acts of abuse, neglect or exploitation of children, the elderly or persons with disabilities; or an offense under the Texas Penal Code against the person; against the family; against public order or decency; against public health, safety or morals; against property or an offense under Chapter 481 of the Texas

Health and Safety Code (Texas Controlled Substances Act); or similar offenses under the laws of the federal government, other states, or other jurisdictions; or any act or offense that can reasonably be associated with potential risk of harm or loss, based on the job duties or contractual role(s) of the person in question at any time during the contract period, to the OAG and/or its employees or representatives or any other person associated with the event at which the individual is providing services under this contract.

4.6 Contractor's certified interpreters shall, for assignments that may involve tax information, participate in all training administered by the OAG and execute all statements and certifications provided to them by the OAG which are related to compliance with the United States Internal Revenue Service Requirements for Safeguarding of Federal Tax Information, Including Federal Tax Returns and Return Information in accordance with IRS Publication 1075 (Rev. 12-2007). All such training and completion of statements and certifications shall be included as part of the assignment request and billable in compliance with the DARS-DHHS Communication Access Maximum Rates and Guidelines hourly fee.

All other terms and conditions not hereby amended are to remain in full force and effect.

The terms of this amendment are accepted by the parties of the contract. Persons signing the amendment are authorized to obligate the parties to the terms of the contract.

Proposed Motion:

Consider and take appropriate action to approve the FY'14 Communication Services for State Agencies (CSSA) revenue contract with the Texas Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services.

Summary and Staff Recommendations:
