AGENDA LANGUAGE:

CONSIDER AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION REGARDING TRAVIS COUNTY APPOINTMENT TO THE CENTRAL HEALTH BOARD OF MANAGERS.

SUMMARY AND IGR COORDINATOR RECOMMENDATION:

The term of **Clarke Heidrick**, a Travis County appointee to the Central Health Board of Managers, expires on December 31, 2013. Because Mr. Heidrick had served on the Board for longer than six years, the Court issued a Call for Applications on Tuesday, October 15, with a deadline of Friday, November 15. On November 19, the Court appointed a subcommittee to review the applications and make a recommendation to the Court. The subcommittee held two meetings, during the second of which it met with Clarke Heidrick.

The subcommittee recommends that the Commissioners Court reappoint Clarke Heidrick to the Central Health Board of Managers for a term to run from January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2017.

BACKGROUND:

Central Health/Travis County Healthcare District (TCHD) Board of Managers:

- ★ Nine members, with four-year staggered terms (no term limits)
 - o Four appointed by the Travis County Commissioners Court
 - Four appointed by the Austin City Council
 - One appointed jointly by the two bodies
- ★ The term of one of the County appointees, Clarke Heidrick, expires at the end of 2013

★ Subject to the Uniform Appointment Process

The Uniform Appointment Process governs appointments to six key boards and commissions, including the Central Health Board of Managers, and requires the Court to issue a Call for Applications, then review the applications and make a final decision. The process applies to vacancies and to any person who has served six years or more on a board or commission and is seeking reappointment.

On October 15, the Court approved a Call for Applications and an application packet, and set a deadline of Friday, November 15, for applications. Six qualifying applications were received. On November 19, the Commissioners Court appointed a subcommittee consisting of Commissioner Bruce Todd, Sherri Fleming, and Deece Eckstein to review the applications submitted, recommend which applicants, if any, should be interviewed, and recommend a series of questions to be asked of candidates.

ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES:

The subcommittee met on Friday, November 22 and reviewed the six qualifying applications:

- Dr. Rodolfo Barrera
- Dr. Alexandra Ely
- Clarke Heidrick
- Rudolph Metayer
- Todd Sazenski
- Dr. Jay Stein

The consensus of the group was that, notwithstanding the qualifications and experience of the other applicants, Clarke Heidrick stood out as the best candidate for three reasons:

- 1) He has served on the Central Health board since its inception in 2004, and knows the institutional history of the organization as well as, if not better, than anyone;
- 2) He has an excellent attendance and participation record, contributing to the board as a whole as well as serving on and adding value to key subcommittees;

A seventh applicant, Tod Marvin, was disqualified because he does not live in Travis County.

- Members of the Court Subcommittee have found him to be very responsive when information on Central Health is requested of him; and,
- 4) He understands the challenges facing Central Health during this time of its rapid expansion and of dramatic changes in the health care industry, and is committed to preserving its sense of mission going forward.

The subcommittee met with Mr. Heidrick on Monday, December 2. In addition to Mr. Heidrick's service on the board and his desire to continue, the following topics were discussed:

- Focus with the construction of the new medical school, changes to the health insurance market under the Affordable Care Act, and changes to health care delivery sought under the Medicaid 1115 Waiver, Mr. Heidrick believes it is important for Central Health to focus on four core areas:
 - Mental health
 - Women's health
 - Outpatient specialty care
 - o Expanded access to primary care
- Transparency the subcommittee stressed that transparency is a concern for the Commissioners Court, both in the way that Central Health management presents information to the Court and, especially, in the operations of the Community Care Collaborative partnership with Seton. Mr. Heidrick agreed that is a concern.
- The medical school since Central Health is a major investor in the construction of the new medical school, it is important that the connection between its academic medicine mission and Central Health's indigent care mission be strong, well-defined – and clearly explained to the community.
- Women's health Because of Seton's identity as a Catholic health care institution, it is important that Central Health ensure that women's health care needs are met in the community. Mr. Heidrick explained that there is a subcommittee on the Central Health board on women's health access on which he serves, and that he is very committed to that issue.

After its meeting with Mr. Heidrick, the subcommittee decided to recommend his reappointment to the Commissioners Court, and to express its appreciation to the other community leaders who applied.

4. Financial Relationships:

Hospital Corporation of America/HCA (St. David's Hospital) or one of its affiliates. Other lawyers at my law firm have provided legal services to various St. David's entities. These services are unrelated to the work of Central Health and I have had no personal involvement in them. The law firm's revenues from this work over the last 3 years have been less than .2% of the firm's total revenue for the same period and have not had (and will not have in the future) a material effect on my compensation, since none of those revenues are attributable to me for purposes of the firm's compensation system.

<u>University of Texas System</u>. Other lawyers at my law firm have provided legal services to University of Texas System. These services are unrelated to the work of Central Health and I have not had any personal involvement in any of this work. The law firm's revenues from this work for the last 3 years are less than .1% of its total revenue for the same period and have not had (and will not have in the future) a material effect on any income, since none of those revenues are attributable to me for purposes of our firm's compensation system.

8. From time to time I identify clients of my law firm who provide goods or services to Central Health. Thus far, those have included Texas Mutual Insurance Company (provides workers' compensation insurance to Central Health) and O'Connell Robertson & Associates, Inc. (which has provided architectural and engineering services to Central Health). I have not been involved in any of these procurements, but, from time to time, have been personally involved in the representation of those clients of our firm, and, accordingly, have abstained from voting on any contracts between Central Health and any of these entities.
