

Expected attendance: 3000 per day. Max attendance 5000. While it is not expected, no more than 5000 tickets will be issued for the event and we will publicize that the event is sold out. We anticipate 1000-1500 guests to camp on site in a secured area- if it appears this number may be exceeded we will notify the county promptly and will adjust accordingly.

Nature of performances: All performers will be playing music on one of 3 stages, roughly 45 mins to 60 min sets. 1pm to 1am. The original statue from 1989 requests names and addresses of performers and their agents. This information is not shared with the promoters and with over 60 bands from all over the world, acquiring this information would prove very difficult.

Sanitation Health We plan to supply a minimum of 80 Port-o-potties provided a local vendor on site at the event with 6 ADA units. All units will be serviced and pumped nightly. Adequate pump sinks will be provided and maintained with water and paper towels. There will also be several restroom trailers on site, each with running water.

For food service and bar will have required sinks for hand washing. All food vendors are self-contained food trucks and trailers with county and city permitting. We have also arranged for onsite gray water, and grease trap storage maintained by a sanitation vendor. Vendors have been notified that no external gas tanks will be allowed on site. We are expecting 12-15 food vendors.

Traffic Control: See Map Attached... Traffic Control is a high priority for the event producers. We look forward to discussions with TXDOT on how to improve the traffic plan from last year's events at the site. Until those meetings we will present the traffic plan from last year.

We will be very specific with instructions to our attendees. After meeting with TXDot,

County, and city ROW officials, we agreed that my suggestion to have patrons heading eastbound on 183 and 71 both merge onto 71 and exit Spirit of Texas Dr. then loop under Hwy 71 to go westbound to access a safe merging right turn on Old Bastrop Hwy. From here they will turn Right on Dalton and proceed to the festival entrance at Giraffe Pen Rd. If deemed necessary, we plan to utilize message boards to relay event traffic the safest route into the site.

Our event site will have 2 separate entrances, one for local traffic, production, and emergency use only (Sherman Road) and one for public use Giraffe Pen Rd. Dalton Rd will be our main point of entry and we have secured parking on land owned by Jimmy Evans Construction next to the event site. There is .42 mile of road on Giraffe Pen Road to accommodate cars queuing into the parking lot and more if we line up cars from the furthest point from the road. If deemed necessary, we will work with Travis County Sherriff's office to hire staff in patrol cars to be a presence at these vital points of entry.

Directions to the site will be detailed and specific and guests will be strongly encouraged to follow the agreed upon routes. We feel the presence of Travis Co Sheriffs will assist this along with ample legible approved signage that will guide event goers safely to and out of the site to main arteries and keeping traffic out of neighborhoods. Parking at the site will be done quickly and payment for parking will be done after the car is parked to minimize delays.

Egress from the site would require a right turn onto Dalton Ln from Giraffe Pen Road Sheriffs on site can assist to keep traffic flowing for the out at the end of the night to

expedite exit off the property. Patrons will process left on Hergotz and Left on Thompson to the light at US 183 led by visible signage in plain view out of the ROW with property owner's permission. From this point patrons can go left or right onto the highway. I will work with Brian Craig with the city of Austin to time this light during mass exit times to minimize backups at this location.

Once off major arteries 30x30 directional signs will be placed along Dalton Ln for Ingress to let patrons know where to turn. For Egress 30x30 signs will guide patrons from the event back to the highway and will be placed at each turn on the exit strategy. Finally, TXDot has asked that plastic drums be placed in front of a service pole near the turn for Dalton Lane. We will comply with this safety request.

Medical: To provide medical care for patrons at our event we are contracting event specialist EMT group, Capital Medical Services. We will staff a minimum of 1 EMT and 1 Paramedic 24 hours a day when patrons are on site from a highly visible medical station. This staffing number will increase based on programming and ticket sales numbers. Capital Medical Service can also provide a standby ambulance service and the additional personnel to staff it during hours the festival grounds are open should the county deem it necessary. Capital Medical Service will also utilize a stretcher-bearing ATV vehicle to patrol and transport patients within the grounds. All medical staff will be on 2-way radios in direct communication with festival public safety staff.

Security: We have contracted with Vigilant Security and Event Services as our private security provider. Working under the direction of our Public Safety Director, Vigilant security will provide licensed, uniformed level 1 guards for access control, loss prevention and public safety 24 hours a day while patrons are on site. There will be a minimum of 20 security officers staffed during peak hours. All security and event staff will be equipped with 2-way radios with established communications protocols and chain of command. In addition to those officers working traffic and cash-room roles, 2-4 peace-officers dedicated to internal security and crowd management will be retained during hours of operation of the festival grounds. Security officers will maintain a 24-hour presence within the camping and festival grounds. Lost and found will be maintained at the front box office.

Minors in Attendance: A legal guardian who is attending the festival with them must accompany all persons under the age of 16 or they will not be admitted. All attendees over 21 who have verifiable proof of their age and who choose to drink will be issued a wristband to clearly differentiate from those underage and to prevent underage drinking.


Tents on Premise: Per request of Travis County, we have notified all tent providers that Flame Retardant Certificates must be permanently attached to. Only one tent will be used for cooking in the backstage area and will not be accessible by the public. Exit signs and extinguishers will be provided at any tent in which it is deemed necessary.

Power: Power for the event will mostly be from onsite Diesel Generators, you will find the locations of the generators. These are:

1. Behind the main stage (175 KVA)
2. Behind the Large Tent Stage (125 KVA)
3. Next to General Store and campgrounds (95KVA)
4. Behind Sponsor Tent (95 KVA)
5. Near tent #6 at entry way (95KVA)

6. Existing power will be used via a code compliant subpanel and distro located at power pole next to the pavilion.

Whenever possible generators are placed behind fences out of the public view. In the case of example 4 and 5, those generators will be fenced and scrimmed to keep public out. Generators will arrive to the site fully fueled with the estimated amount needed for the weekend. Should refueling be required we will bring in a fuel truck from off site after event hours to replenish supplies. The fuel truck will leave the premises following this action.

ALL REQUESTS ARE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL: Local background checks are done on individuals requesting security for private functions. Requests are only filled if there are officers available, we cannot guarantee your request will be filled. Officers are not allowed to work out of Travis County, unless approved by the Sheriff or the Sheriff's designee.

SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION TIMELINE:

- Events that will have less than 500 attendees must be submitted at least 14-business days prior to event.
- Events that will have 500 – 1,000 attendees must be submitted at least 30-business days prior to event.
- Events that will have 1,000 or more attendees must be submitted at least 60-business days prior to event.

OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES: A Travis County Sheriff's Officer's primary responsibility while working in a secondary employment capacity, in uniform or plain clothed, is the enforcement of Federal and State laws and County ordinances; to protect life and property and to keep the peace. DEPUTIES ARE PROHIBITED FROM ENFORCING HOUSE RULES. House rules are defined as rules that are not specifically authorized by state or federal law, and are typically rules of the outside employment Contractor. Officers shall follow all Travis County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) Policies and Procedures.

Officers engaged in a secondary employment job will not refuse to assist any citizen requesting or needing assistance. Officers are expected to take necessary action in an attempt to assist citizens in need of help by calling on-duty officers, taking reports, effecting arrests, or providing any other services related with the duties of a peace officer.

CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES: The Contractor agrees to hold harmless TCSO and all TCSO personnel from losses of any kind caused while at the site of the secondary employment. All traffic control jobs must be approved by the jurisdictional authority, such as TXDOT or Travis County Transportation and Natural Resources before we allow our officers to work. *Scheduling officers DOES NOT constitute safety approval.*

REVOCAATION FOR SECONDARY EMPLOYMENT APPLICATION/PERMIT: The Sheriff's designee will not approve any application by a prospective Contractor that does not meet the requirements of any TCSO Policies and Procedures. Examples for revocation are for informational purposes only and is not intended to be exclusive of other reasons not contained therein: a conflict of interest develops between the County and the outside Contractor; non-payment of employees; Contractor is arrested; the Contractor is under investigation by the District and County Attorney's Office, or any Law Enforcement Agency for violations of law; the Contractor refuses to cooperate with an investigation related to the secondary employment job; the job becomes controversial, such as labor or civil disputes; the Sheriff, acting personally or through a designee, reserves the right to deny any application for secondary employment of law enforcement.

COUNTY-OWNED VEHICLES - \$20 per hour with a 2-hour minimum [A Vehicle User Agreement must be completed to utilize these emergency vehicles]

OFFICERS - \$40 per hour with a 4-hour minimum

\$43 per hour with a 4-hour minimum – for Police Bicycle Certified Officers (these officers may be utilized for large events)

\$50 per hour with a 4-hour minimum – for requests received less than 48-business hours for need of officer

\$50 per hour with a 4-hour minimum – for supervisors if your request requires a supervisor

\$60 per hour with a 4-hour minimum – per officer on all County-approved holidays

\$60 per hour with a 4-hour minimum – plain-clothed officers [Only specially trained officers are utilized for these requests] We reserve the right to determine if your request requires a plain-clothed officer

There is a cancelation fee of the minimum for officers and vehicles if you cancel with less than 24-business hours' notice.

- 2) Texas Administrative Code, § 265.3 General Sanitation (Health and Sanitation for Mass Gatherings).

Promoter/Organizer Mass Gathering Application Procedure:

- a. After completing the permit application requirements as per Health and Safety Code, Chapter 751 and TAC 265.3, the Promoter/Organizer will file the application with the Travis County Commissioner's Court for the Judge's approval and the Health Requirement checklist with the Environmental Health Services Division. The filing is done no less than 45 days prior to the event. The Travis County Judge's office is located at 700 Lavaca, Austin, TX 78701, phone number 512-854-9555.

- b. No later than 10 days before the date of the gathering, the judge shall hold a public hearing on the permit application. At the hearing anyone may testify for or against granting the permit.
- c. After the hearing the judge will enter his finding in the record either granting or denying the permit.
- d. If the permit is granted and the county judge finds that preparations for the gathering will not be completed by the start date, the judge may revoke the permit. The judge must give notice of the revocation 24 hours before the permit is revoked.
- e. The Promoter/Organizer affected by a revocation may appeal to the Travis County District Court .



McLaren Engineering Group (MEG) has reviewed the SL320 Mobile Stage system 2004 version for general use in the United States. The calculations and drawings were produced under the direct supervision and responsible charge of "the undersigned." The final documents are the result of a comprehensive evaluation by MEG and include approved revisions as needed resulting from these engineering reviews. **We believe that the erected system will safely support the approved loading and environmental conditions if properly assembled and used in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations and as noted herein.**

The assessment by MEG only considers the fully erected SL320 Mobile Stage structure and its standard features, including wind walls, adjustable side sound hangers ("ECS"), and front-of-house rigging trusses. Additional items such as auxiliary components, P.A. side platforms, hydraulic systems and erection devices were not considered in this review. The fabrication, design and operational procedures meet or exceed the requirements of ANSI E1.21-2006 "Temporary Ground-Supported Overhead Structures Used to Cover the Stage Areas and Support Equipment in the Production of Outdoor Entertainment Events." The design loads were derived from ASCE 7 and ANSI E1.21. Steel design was performed using AISC-LRFD provisions. Plywood was designed using APA provisions.

The design and construction of the erected stage assembly meets the applicable requirements of IBC-2009 Chapter 16, with the following suitable adjustments:

1. The mobile stage is erected for a very short period of time and protective actions will be taken by trained personnel under specified environmental conditions. Environment loads in ASCE 7 and IBC, including wind, are based on statistical probabilities that relate to time. Reductions in design loads have been taken using the provisions of ANSI E1.21 to account for such conditions. The wind design loads for the mobile stage far exceed the minimum permissible using E1.21.
2. ANSI E1.21 allows reduced wind loads compared with IBC only if weather is monitored and if certain actions by trained personnel can be accomplished. The

procedures in the User's Manual comply with and exceed the minimum requirements of E1.21.

Stageline Mobile Stage Inc. furnished the following material for review:

1. SL320 (2004) Mobile Stage Design Brief, dated July 2004
2. SL320 (2004) Users Manual, dated July 2004
3. Matrix structural computer model analysis results using "Visual Design" software by Civil Design Inc.
4. SL320 (2004) assembly drawings and select detail shop drawings
5. Load test reports for selected components
6. Stageline Mobile Stage Equipment "Wind Resistance and Procedures in Case of Heavy Wind," dated September 27, 2011

The SL320 Mobile Stage is to be used as a performance or similar platform for short-term temporary use in outdoor environments. The mobile stage travels as a tractor trailer; when it arrives on site, the Certified Operator and crew deploy and erect the stage roof and stage platform assembly. The trailer chassis remains in place as the center portion of the stage. The mobile stage bears on grade that is suitable to support the truck and tractor trailer. The Certified Operator in conjunction with the Event Producer are responsible for confirming that the ground bearing conditions are suitable as per the User's Manual.

The mobile stage has a roof, available rigging points, and optional fabric wind walls. The stage is a temporary performance platform and not a legitimate theater stage, and as such, is not subject to the same live loads. The SL320 has a stage live load rating of 100 psf. The SL320 has a roof live load rating of 20 psf unrigged or 16,000 lbs rigged, plus 4,000 lbs of capacity at the side sound hangers ("ECS") on the downstage corners. Standard Stageline stairs and guardrails are appropriate for performance use. Netting must be added to the guardrails for events in which the general public will have access to the stage area.

The stage roof is intended to support rigging loads, wind, and rain. It is not generally intended to support the weight of snow and ice. Use in locations and time periods where snow and ice are a possibility shall be reviewed and approved in writing by a professional engineer for the combined effects of rigged loads, wind, snow, rain and/or ice.

Users must understand and carefully adhere to the Rigging Diagram provided in the User's Manual. If the desired rigging loads deviate from or exceed those specified on the Rigging Diagram, contact Stageline Mobile Stage Inc. for advice. No adjustments or modifications should be made to the SL320 without first being reviewed and approved by Stageline Mobile Stage Inc.

As stated in the SL320 Users Manual, the stage system must be operated under the supervision of Stageline trained and certified personnel.




The mobile stage assembly is designed to resist a 90 mph 3-second wind gust without the wind walls, and 60 mph 3-second wind gust with the wind walls in place. A Stageline Certified Operator is required to monitor wind forecasts from an official weather information service for the entire period the structure is assembled. Stageline recommends that the Operator use an anemometer to measure wind on site for improved real-time wind monitoring. The Certified Operator shall take recommended actions listed in the User's Manual and in the attached "Wind Resistance and Procedures in Case of Heavy Wind" document, if wind gusts approaching the applicable limit are possible or measured. Depending on the situation, such actions include lowering of the roof if time permits, removal of vulnerable equipment, rapid mitigation of wind resistance from wind walls, and evacuation of personnel to a safe distance from the assembly.

Although not ordinarily required by governmental authorities for temporary structures, seismic loads have been considered for moderate and high seismic regions. The seismic loads do not govern the design, except for sliding in high seismic regions (see Design Brief - Earthquake Section), where lateral anchorage is needed to resist sliding.

MGM acknowledges that the SL320 Mobile Stage is a piece of equipment that serves the live event industry and it is not practical to involve engineers in typical usage. As such, it is the responsibility of the Stageline Certified Operator to adhere to the manufacturer's guidelines. In addition, if the mobile stage is part of a larger event with other structures, it is the responsibility of the Event Producer to understand the requirements of the Stageline equipment, to understand the responsibilities of the Stageline Certified Operator, and coordinate the Stageline mobile stage requirements with the event operational management plan. 

A) Wind weather condition during set-up and dismantling of the stage and windwalls

The windwalls are the elements most at risk in windy conditions and the installation can become problematic. Wait until the wind has subsided before installing windwalls. If this is not possible, roll up windwalls and fasten with ratchet strap to the roof before raising the structure so it does not lash out and hurt anyone. We also suggest increasing your staff to have this operation completed quickly and more safely.

If wind speed exceeds 40 mph (65 km/h), windwalls and stage installation are not recommended. We highly suggest you wait until wind diminishes before completing the set up or dismantling the stage and windwalls.

B) Wind weather forecast condition when stage is up, fully pinned and prior to the start of the event

The Stageline Mobile Stages are designed to resist 3 seconds wind gust up to 90mph (145 Km/h). However, this wind resistance depends on a proper installation of all support equipment and braces. In any weather conditions, the stage must be inspected and all its components must be secured.

If wind gusts are expected to exceed 50 mph (80 km/h) for the upcoming event, roof structure should be lowered to reduce exposed surface and windwalls should be removed.


1. If wind gusts exceed 40 mph, roll up all access doors. Remove all movable parts i.e. speakers, screens or lighting equipment or lower them to the stage floor and make sure they are tied down to limit any movement in the wind.
2. If wind gusts exceed 60 mph (97 km/h), unclasp the windwalls. If the storm intensifies, openings should be slashed in windwall. It is better to sacrifice a windwall than to possibly damage the stage and/or sound and lighting equipment. Floating windwalls are dangerous for people standing near the stage. So, everyone should remain at least 100 ft (30 m) away from the stage.
3. If wind gusts exceed 90 mph (145 km/h), the public and all personnel present must evacuate the premises and remain at least 100 ft (30 m) away from the stage.

Note: The most probable scenario during a violent storm is that the windwalls will be torn away. This is why it is so important to keep all technicians and the crowd at a safe distance.



Step 1 Site Preparation

- Determine the exact location where the stage will be erected.
- For outdoor stages, mudsills are required to distribute the weight (125 PSF to 150 PSF) on the stage legs. This will prevent the legs from sinking and ease the leveling of the stage.
- All base pads and mudsills should be placed only on a horizontal surface.



Step 2 Leg Assembly

Attach an adjustable rubber base pad to each galvanized leg using a 2" snap pin.




The leg sockets on the stage sections fit 1-3/4" sq. stage legs. Use one of the following only:


- 1-3/4" telescoping stage legs. Overlap telescoping section a minimum of 6" and secure with a 2" snap pin as shown at left.
- 1-3/4" non-telescoping stage legs.
- 1-1/2" sq. non-telescoping stage legs with a 1-3/4" sleeve. Overlap sleeve a minimum of 6" and secure with a 2" snap pin as shown at left.

Step 3 Setting the Stage

- Insert legs completely into all four corner sockets (and into intermediate sockets, when required) of the first stage section.



1. Brace each corner and every third bay along each side, using two braces per bay. To install horizontal braces:
 - A. Insert brace pins into stage legs.

- C. Tighten the hex nut on the front of the horizontal brace to secure the bracket.
 - D. Reverse the procedure to remove braces.

B. Diagonal Bracing





Step 9 Guard Rails

Each guard rail section has two T-Locks to secure the guard rail to the Multi-Stage. To install guard rail:



