A Clarification of the previous Motion was made by Judge Biscoe that we take \$1.1 million from the Corporations; that we earmark \$365,000 of that to cover basic needs services performed by Health and Human Services contracts – that we match the City of Austin's \$500,000 for basic needs contracts, basically; that we leave a little in the Health and Human Services Reserve, to go toward that identified shortfall.

A Clarification of the previous Motion was made by Judge Biscoe that we take \$1.1 million from the Corporations; and of that amount, \$365,000 be earmarked for Health and Human Services.

A Clarification of the previous Motion was made by Judge Biscoe that the intent of the Motion is that this be Health and Human Services money; that PBO accomplish that as PBO does; but the intention of this is to bring the amount available for Health and Human Services contracts to \$500,000.

Clerk's Note: The Court did not take a Vote on the Standing Motion and Second at this time.

A Substitute Motion was made by Commissioner Sonleitner and seconded by Commissioner Gómez that we accept the generous donation of \$1.1 million from the Corporations; that it go into the General Fund category; and that we revisit the budget for Health and Human Services later during Mark-up.
